## BOILERS CLOSE OUT NONCONFERENCE PLAY WITH HOME & AWAY WEEKEND

• Purdue wraps up its nonconference schedule with its second home and away weekend, hosting IPFW Friday and visiting Oxford, Ohio, Sunday for a challenging road date at Miami. The RedHawks were the preseason favorites in the Mid-American Conference after winning 20 games and advancing to the second round of the 2012 NCAA Tournament. The Boilermakers have won four straight games against MAC school dating back to the 2011 season opener at Toledo.

• Since September 2012, Purdue has dropped its last five road games and is 1-8 away from the Boilermaker Soccer Complex dating back to the final game of 2011.

• The Boilermakers continued their high-scoring ways the weekend of Sept. 6-8, recording seven goals in the two games. Purdue rallied for a 5-3 win against a Dartmouth team that was 13-4 and surrendered only 13 goals in 2012. It was the program's first-ever game against an Ivy League opponent. Sunday vs. Seattle, the preseason favorite in the Western Athletic Conference, the Boilers had to settle for a 2-2 draw after Seattle equalized twice in the first half.

## FIVE DIFFERENT BOILERS SCORE IN DARTMOUTH WIN

• Purdue matched its season high with five goals in the Sept. 6 home win against Dartmouth, receiving scores from five different players. It marked the first time since October 2011 and ninth time in program history that five Boilers found the back of the net in the same game.

• Purdue actually trailed 2-1 in the 58th minute against Dartmouth. But the Boilers scored three times in just over five minutes to take control of the game. **Mollie Kuramoto** accounted for the equalizer in the 60th minute, **Hadley Stuart** provided the go-ahead goal in the 64th minute and **Chinyelu Asher** scored what proved to be the game winner early in the 66th minute to cap the wild stretch. Freshmen

**Maddy Williams** and **Mikayla Lasky** also scored in the victory.

## WILLIAMS' SIX GOALS MATCHES PROGRAM HIGH IN FIRST SIX GAMES

• With six goals entering the weekend, **Maddy Williams** has matched Jessica Okoroafo (2009) for the most by a Boiler in the first six games of a season. Williams has scored in four of the first six games, highlighted by multi-goal efforts in wins against Akron and Northern Illinois. Okoroafo scored in five of the first six games of 2009, including twice in game No. 2 at Butler, and finished her senior season with eight goals.

• Last season, **Jordan Pawlik** scored six times in the first five games in which she played. She missed Purdue's fourth and fifth games of the season due to injury and scored her sixth goal in the team's seventh game. Pawlik finished the year with nine goals, the most by a Boiler since 2007.

## STUART & HAIRSTON ONE-TWO IN BIG TEN IN ASSISTS; BOILERS SECOND IN GOALS

• With a combined 13 assists entering the weekend, **Hadley Stuart** (7) and **Alex Hairston** (6) are ranked one-two in the Big Ten as of Sept. 10. Both players have recorded two multi-assist games this year and recorded an assist in four of the first six games. **Maddy Williams** is second in the Big Ten with her six goals.

• As a team, the Boilermakers are second in the Big Ten with 20 goals as of Sept. 10. Only Illinois (21) has scored more. Purdue leads the league in assists (22), shots (138) and corner kicks (43).

## PROFICIENT GOAL SCORING EARLY IN 2013

• Purdue's 13 goals in the first four games this year represents a program high to begin a new season. The 20 goals in the first six games were good for second most in program history.

• The 20 goals are the most over any six-game stretch since scoring 22 late in the 2007 season. November 2007 also marked the last time the team scored three-plus goals in three consecutive games as well, which Purdue accomplished this year in the games against Akron 5, Xavier 3 and Northern Illinois 4).

• The Boilermakers have scored in each of their first six games of the season for the first time since 2009. The 2000 and 2003 teams also managed to find the back of the net at least once in each of the first six games.

## STUART ASSISTS ON THREE SCORES FOR NEW SINGLE-GAME RECORD

• **Hadley Stuart** assisted on three of the Boilers' four scores in the Aug. 30 home win against Northern Illinois to establish a new Purdue single-game record. She also scored the team's fourth goal to cap off a five-point night. Stuart enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with seven assists, helping setup seven of the Boilers' 17 goals scored by teammates. With two goals and an assist for the second Friday in a row, **Maddy Williams** also had five points in the NIU win.

• Meanwhile, **Alex Hairston** posted multi-assist efforts in the win against Northern Illinois and Dartmouth. With five career multi-assist games, she has established a new Purdue all-time record.

## NINE GOALS AGAINST OVER A THREE-GAME STRETCH

- Purdue has surrendered nine goals over a three-game stretch twice this season, the most allowed over a three-game nonconference stretch since the 2003 NCAA Tournament (10). However, that three-game segment from 2003 featured a 7-0 loss at eventual national champion North Carolina in the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Tournament. The Boilermakers gave up 11 goals over the final three games of 2012 (vs. Big Ten rivals Wisconsin, Minnesota and Penn State).
- The 14 goals against is the most over the first six games of the season since Purdue's 1998 inaugural campaign (20). From 2001 through 2009, the Boilers surrendered four-plus goals in a game only three times. Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, it has happened 10 times.

## BOILERMAKERS SCORE EIGHT GOALS BUT SETTLE FOR WEEKEND SPLIT

- Purdue managed to score eight goals during the season-opening weekend, a program high in the first two games of a new campaign. But after rolling to a 5-0 win against Akron, the Boilers surrendered four goals on only eight shots in a 4-3 loss to Xavier. Purdue dominated the shot (34-8) and corner kick (12-1) counts but still lost the game after the Musketeers jumped out a 2-0 lead in the first six minutes.
- The Xavier game marked only the third time in program history the Boilers have scored three goals in a loss. An August 2012 overtime loss at Louisville (4-3), a September 2002 overtime win at Oakland (4-3) and an October 1999 loss to Iowa (6-3) represent the three previous games in program history that saw both teams score at least three goals. The Boilermakers have now been involved in a game that has featured seven-plus goals 18 times, compiling a 11-7 record in those games.

## SIX BOILERS SCORE IN SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND

- Six different Purdue players found the back of the net during the season-opening weekend. **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Maddy Williams** led the way with two goals apiece. Kuramoto matched her goal total from her underclassman seasons (2010-11) in one weekend while becoming just the third player in program history to score in each of the first two games of a new year.
- Williams had two goals and an assist in the season opener against Akron. She's become the seventh player in program history to score in her first collegiate game and joined Lauren Sesselmann, who currently plays professionally for FC Kansas City of the NWSL, as the only Boilers to post a multiple-goal effort in their debuts. Williams was the fourth Purdue player overall, and first since 2009, to score twice in a season opener.
- **Hadley Stuart** had a goal and two assists in the Akron win. She scored in a season opener for the second year in a row. **Alex Hairston** scored in the first game of the 2011 and 2012 seasons. Annette Kent is the only other Boiler to find the back of the net in the first game of consecutive seasons, scoring in four straight from 2000-03.

## EARLIEST GOAL SCORED TO START A SEASON

- When **Chinyelu Asher** scored only 68 seconds after the opening kickoff of the season-opening win against Akron it marked the fastest that Purdue had ever scored to begin a new campaign. Previously, the quickest goal in program history came in 2003 when Jennie Moppert found the back of the net four minutes and 52 seconds after the opening kick. Overall, it was team's fastest goal since Kaitlyn Blacha scored 21 seconds into a Halloween 2010 home game against Penn State.
- Xavier turned the tables on the Boilers Aug. 25 and scored only two minutes and 34 seconds into the game. It was the earliest goal that Purdue had allowed since Penn State found the back of the net only two minutes and 16 seconds after kickoff in the 2012 season finale.

## THREE GOALKEEPERS SEE ACTION IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- Each of Purdue's three goalkeepers – **Clara Kridler**, **Caitlyn McCullough** and **Jordan Ginther** – saw action in the first two games of the season. Since the start of the 2000 season, only four times prior had three different 'keepers taken the field in the same game. The 2009 season (vs. Ohio and vs. Ball State) marked the only time before that it happened in the same year, much less back-to-back games.
- Kridler, McCullough and Ginther teamed up to post a shutout in the season opener. It marked the fourth time in the last five years (and seventh time total) that the Boilers opened with a clean-sheet effort.

## HAIRSTON SISTER ACT

- A group of 11 true freshmen joined the program this fall. Among that group is **Alex Hairston's** sister **Juliana**, giving the Boilers their first set of sister teammates since Karah and Tricia Henderson in 1998 and 1999 (the program's first two seasons).
- Jennie (2000-03) and Addie (2004-07) Moppert were also sisters that both played for Purdue, but their college careers did not overlap. However, Jennie Moppert was a volunteer assistant coach during the 2005 season while Addie was a sophomore.

## KURAMOTO RETURNS TO ACTIVE ROSTER

• **Mollie Kuramoto** returned to the active roster as a redshirt-junior this season. She served as a team captain in 2012 despite missing the season due to a knee injury suffered in the spring of 2012. She led the team in assists in 2011 as one of the team's top central midfielders.

• Kuramoto started at center mid in the preseason exhibition game with Louisville and the first four games of the new season. She started 35 of the 37 games in which she played during her underclassman season (2010-11).

• Kuramoto has compiled a 3.99 GPA through the end of the 2013 spring semester. She is a two-time Distinguished Big Ten Scholar and Academic All-Big Ten honoree. In the spring, she was one of three Purdue student-athletes selected for induction in the Mortar Board Class of 2013. Dating back to 1979, only 34 Purdue student-athletes have been inducted into Mortar Board. Honorees are selected for their superior scholarship, dedicated service to the university community, and outstanding and constant leadership.

## HAIRSTON, PAWLIK & STUART AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

• After teaming up to account for 17 of the Boilers' 27 goals as the top three point accumulators last season, **Alex Hairston**, **Jordan Pawlik** and **Hadley Stuart** have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch as the new campaign begins. **Jordan Frick**, **Mollie Kuramoto**, Pawlik and Stuart are serving as team captains this season.

• Hairston led the team with eight assists last year, four coming on game-winning goals. She also scored four times, including the game-winner in each of the first two contests of the season. The Portland, Ore., native tied a Purdue record with an assist in four straight games, helping setup seven goals over that stretch. She started all 39 games her first two seasons.

• Pawlik made an instant impact in her first season with the program. Her nine goals (in only 17 games) were the most by a Boiler since 2007. The Fort Wayne native posted the fourth hat trick in program history in a win against Missouri Valley Conference champion Evansville and also found the back of the net against Louisville, West Virginia, Michigan State, Wisconsin and Minnesota.

• Stuart was an ironwoman at the top of the Purdue attack until injuries caught up with her in October. She recorded a point (goal or assist) in five straight games early in the season, posting the longest such streak by a Boiler since 2009. She produced her four goals and seven assists in what amounted to only 15 games of action.

## KRIDLER A TWO-YEAR STARTER AT GOALKEEPER

• Goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** looks to close out her career as a three-year starter. Entering the season, she had started 38 of the 39 games the last two years, all but the 2012 Senior Night game against Penn State.

• Kridler accounted for 178 saves as the starter in 2011 and 2012 and ranked fourth all-time in program history (183) entering her senior year. She has joined all-time saves leader Lauren Mason (2003-06) as the only goalkeepers in program history to record 80-plus saves in consecutive seasons. No Purdue 'keeper has ever accomplished the feat in three straight years.

• **Jordan Pawlik** and Kridler were named to the Preseason All-Big Ten Teams by CollegeSportsMadness.com.

## IRONWOMEN CASELLA & LOVE BACK AS EXPERIENCED SOPHOMORES

• **Kim Love** not only started every game of 2012 as a freshman center back, but she also went the distance in every game. She was the first Boiler to not leave the pitch at any point since 2010. However, Love was sidelined during the first three games of 2012 due to a minor knee injury. She returned for the Kansas game on Sept. 1 and went the distance at center back.

• **Melissa Casella** did not get a chance to start until the fifth game of the 2012 season, but after that she too did not leave the pitch again for the rest of year. Casella finished the season third on the team in minutes played while holding down the defensive midfielder position.

• Both players are back as experienced sophomores. They started and went the distance in the Aug. 17 exhibition game against Louisville. Freshman center back **Holly Gregory** was the only other Boiler to play the entire game in the overtime affair.

## 2012 HIGHS & LOWS

• Purdue played well at home in its first season at the new-look Boilermaker Soccer Complex, but a rash of injuries eventually caught up to the team in October and led to disappointing finish to a 2012 campaign that began promisingly. The Boilermakers were 7-4-2 entering the month of October but dropped their final six games of the year.

• The Boilermakers went 6-4-2 at home to post their first winning record at their home pitch since 2009. But Purdue struggled on the road all year, earning just one win in seven games away from West Lafayette. During the 2013 season, the Boilers have the advantage of playing six of their 11 Big Ten games at home.

• Purdue has welcomed back nine starters and all seven players who scored goals last year. The goal scoring went from feast to famine last year. The Boilers scored in nine consecutive games from Aug. 31 through Sept. 30, the longest streak since 2009. However, a shutout streak that spanned 431 consecutive minutes followed, marking the first time the Boilers had been blanked in three straight games since 1999.
