

## **PURDUE BASKETBALL POSTGAME NOTES**

**Purdue (16-6, 7-4) vs. Maryland (20-2, 9-1)**

**February 2, 2016 • Keady Court at Mackey Arena • Attendance: 6,024**

**No. 5 Maryland Terrapins 87, Purdue Boilermakers 67**

### **GAME NOTES**

- The Boilermakers are now 1-6 against the Terrapins all-time
- Purdue is now 2-6 when trailing at the half and 2-4 when playing a ranked opponent
- The Purdue defense allowed 24 points by Shatori Walker-Kimbrough in the first half and 41 points in the game, each setting opponent season-high records (previous records held by Rachel Banham vs. Minnesota, 1/14/16)
- With Walker-Kimbrough's 41 points, she surpassed Kelsey Michell's 37 points (Ohio State, 1/15/15) for the most points scored in Mackey Arena and tied the Purdue opponent all-time high of 41 points scored (tied Lindsay Whalen, Minnesota, 2/1/02)
- Walker-Kimbrough notched a new Purdue opponent field goals made record with 17 (previous 15, last by Jantel Lavender, Ohio State, 2/7/08)
- The Terrapins went 65.5 percent, good for the second best field goal percentage for an opponent in program history (Tennessee, .673, Dec. 2, 1995)
- The Boilermakers set a season-low no blocked shots (previous low of one vs. Maine, 12/21/15)

### **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- Ashley Morrisette's 20 field goal attempts were a career-high (previous 19 vs. Green Bay, 11/19/14)
- Morrisette lead the team for the fifth time this season and ninth time in her career as the team's scoring leader with her 19 points
- April Wilson's eight assists are good for her 18<sup>th</sup> time overall and her seventh time in the Big Ten this season as the assist leader
- Dominique McBryde scored ten points against Maryland, the seventh time in her career having games in double figures
- McBryde's five rebounds made her the team's rebound leader for the third time this season, all of which have come in Big Ten play
- Nora Kiesler tallied two steals tonight, setting a career-high (previous one, last vs. Minnesota, 1/14/16)
