THE SCENE SETTER

- The No. 15-ranked Purdue men's basketball team puts its seven-game Challenge win streak on the line, traveling to No. 14-ranked Louisville for the annual inter-conference showdown.
- The contest will be televised by ESPN with expert analysis from **Dan Shulman**, **Jay Bilas** and **Molly McGrath**. Tip is scheduled for 7:16 p.m. ET from the KFC Yum! Center (22,090).
- On the radio call, veteran broadcaster **Larry Clisby**, entering his 34th season, will provide play-by-play commentary, while **Rob Blackman** will provide brilliant color commentary. **Wes Scott** will serve as producer on the Purdue Radio Network and **TuneIn.com**. Coverage begins one hour before tip with the Purdue Basketball pregame show.
- Live stats will be provided by StatBroadcast.com and live updates will be available on Purdue Basketball's official Twitter account, @BoilerBall.

THE BOILERMAKER NOTEBOOK

- Purdue won its fourth straight game with a 79-68 win over NJIT. The Boilermakers are now at least 5-1 for the 10th time in **Matt Painter's** 12 years at Purdue.
- The NJIT contest ended Purdue's play in the Cancun Challenge and was Purdue's 10th straight victory in holiday tournament action, dating to the 2014 Maui Invitational.
- **Caleb Swanigan** was named tournament MVP after averaging 17.5 points, 11.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists while shooting 64.5 percent from the field and 75.0 (27-of-36) percent from the free throw line.
- According to **KenPom.com**, Purdue ranks 18th nationally in offensive efficiency and 24th in defensive efficiency. Louisville enters the game second in defensive efficiency.
- Purdue ranks in the nation's top 30 in assists, 3-point percentage, field goal percentage, rebound margin, scoring margin and 3-pointers per game. Purdue and Texas Tech are the only teams nationally to rank in the top 25 in 3-point pct. and rebound margin.

THE BIG NUMBERS

- **7:** Purdue's winning streak in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge, the second-longest winning streak in event history.
- **10:** Consecutive wins during in-season tournaments (6 at neutral sites).
- **47.5:** Scoring average through five games for Swanigan, Haas and **Vincent Edwards**.
- **41-15:** Purdue's record over last 57 games after opening 2014-15 with an 11-8 record.

- Purdue improved to 18-1 all-time against schools from the state of New Jersey ... Purdue is now 14-3 all-time on Nov. 26.
- The victory was Purdue's 10th in a row during in-season tournaments, dating to the 2014 EASports Maui Invitational ... this game was part of the Cancun Challenge.
- The win was the 275th non-conference victory in Mackey Arena history ... Purdue is 275-37 at home against non-conference opponents.
- Purdue is now 42-15 over its last 57 games after starting the 2014-15 season with an 11-8 mark.
- Purdue shot a season-high 29 3-pointers in the win ... it tied for the 11th-most 3-point attempts in a game in school history.
- Purdue had its eighth 20-point scorer of the season when Caleb Swanigan scored 22 points.
- Purdue has had 37 turnovers in its last 80 minutes played.
- Purdue had two runs of 9-0 or longer, and has now had eight runs of 9-0 or longer in six games this year ... opponents have had three.
- Purdue will close out November with a 40-2 record under Coach Painter in home November games.
- Over the last three games, Purdue is now 37-of-75 (.493) from 3-point range.
- Purdue was 18-of-20 (.900) from the free throw line and has now made 104 free throws this year ... opponents have shot 87.
- Purdue went 2-of-2 on and-one chances, and is now 10-of-11 (.909) on and-ones this year.
- Purdue had seven players dish out at least two assists and had 21 assists on 26 made baskets.
- NJIT's **Damon Lynn** tied a record for most 3-pointers made by a Purdue opponent (8) and attempted the second-most trifectas against Purdue in school history (13) ... the 13 3-pointers made by NJIT tied for the sixth most in a game against Purdue.

SERIES HISTORY

- Purdue and Louisville will meet for the 17th time Wednesday night in Louisville, the Boilermakers' first visit to Louisville since Dec. 6, 1997.
- Purdue is 4-4 against ranked Louisville teams. This will be the first meeting where both teams are ranked since Dec. 13, 1977, a 68-66 Louisville win in Louisville.
- Five of the 16 meetings have been decided by two points or less and another one in overtime. All told, 11 of the 16 meetings have been decided by single-digits.

RETURNING TO THE SCENE

- Purdue will play its second game in the KFC Yum! Center in three years after losing to Cincinnati in overtime during the 2015 NCAA Tournament, 66-65. In that game, the Boilermakers led by seven after a **Dakota Mathias** 3-pointer with 51 seconds left, but a pair of missed free throws and a late turnover helped the Bearcats rally.
- A **Vincent Edwards**' 3-pointer on the final play of the game was just long and the Bearcats advanced to face Kentucky in the second round.

REMINISCING ABOUT SPIKE

- Only one active Purdue player has faced Louisville, but it came in a memorable performance.
- Little-known freshman **Spike Albrecht** came off the bench to score 17 points on 4-of-5 shooting from long distance in Michigan's loss to the Cardinals in the 2013 NCAA Championship game, single-handedly keeping the Wolverines in the game in the first half.

KEEP THE STREAK GOING

- Purdue has won seven straight games in the event, the second-longest winning streak in Challenge history, while owning a 9-6 record overall in the event.

BALANCING ACT

- Through six games this year, Purdue has five players averaging at least 11.0 points per game.
- Purdue has three regulars shooting at least 50.0 percent from 3-point range and four players shooting at least 53.0 percent from the field.
- Purdue has six players averaging at least 1.8 assists per game.

SIZZLING FROM DISTANCE

- Purdue matched the temperature outside in Cancun, with a display of long-distance shooting that few Purdue fans have ever seen.
- During the two games in Cancun, Purdue made 28-of-46 (.609) from 3-point range, including a white-hot 17-of-22 (.773) from long distance during the second halves of games.
- Against Auburn, the 17 3-pointers were the second most in a game in school history, set last year against when the Boilermakers hit 18 trifectas against Vermont (Nov. 15, 2015).
- The 65.4 percent shooting from deep was a school-record 3-point percentage with a minimum of 20 attempts, breaking the record of 61.5 percent (16-of-26) against Ohio State on Feb. 7, 1998.
- Meanwhile, Purdue recorded the 19th-best field goal percentage in a game in school history (.643) and the 14th-best field goal percentage in a half after shooting 76.0 percent (19-of-25) in the second half against the Tigers.
- Purdue cooled off against NJIT from long distance, but still managed to connect on nine 3-pointers. Over the last three games, Purdue is averaging 12.3 3-pointers made per game and is shooting 37-of-75 (.493) from long distance during that span.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- Purdue has now won 10 straight holiday tournament games, dating to the 2014 EASports Maui Invitational.
- Purdue's wins have come against Missouri (21 points), BYU (2), North Carolina A&T (41), Vermont (28), Old Dominion (22), Florida (15), Georgia State (8), Utah State (24), Auburn (25) and NJIT (11).
- Purdue will compete in next year's Battle 4 Atlantis with Villanova, Arizona, Tennessee, North Carolina State, SMU, Western Kentucky and Northern Iowa.

20-20 VISION

- Purdue has already had eight 20-point performances by four different players this year. Purdue had 13, 20-point showings all of last year.

NOVEMBER REIGN

- Purdue has dominated the opposition at home during the month of November, going 40-2 (.952) under head coach **Matt Painter**. The lone losses was on Nov. 9, 2012, to Bucknell (70-65), and Nov. 14, 2016, vs. No. 3-ranked Villanova (79-76).
- The loss to Villanova snapped a 16-game home winning streak during the month of November.
- The two losses came to Bucknell and to Villanova, who is coached by **Jay Wright**, a Bucknell grad.
- Going back further, Purdue is 75-8 (.904) all-time at Mackey Arena during the month of November.
- Painter owns a 56-14 (.800) record during the month of November.

SHARING IS CARING

- The Boilermakers have assisted on 68.2 percent (118-of-173) of its made field goals, good for fifth nationally in assist rate (A / FGM).

- Against Villanova, Purdue had 26 assists on 28 made field goals for an assist rate of 92.9 percent, the second-best rate in school history.
- Purdue has had at least 20 assists in four-of-six games this year, ranking seventh nationally in assists per game (19.7).

TURNOVERS LIMITING PROGRESS

- Purdue has had a tough time with turnovers already this year, ranking 281st nationally in turnovers per game (15.5). Purdue has had at least 14 turnovers in every game this year.
- Over the last two games, Purdue has had 37 turnovers, resulting in 41 points for its opponents. Foes are averaging 17.7 points off Purdue turnovers per game.
- Purdue defeated Auburn 96-71 despite 21 turnovers.
- Purdue has actually won three straight games when committing 20 or more turnovers (Auburn, Incarnate Word, Illinois), and is 11-7 under Painter when having 20 or more turnovers in a game.

LOOKING FOR RANKED ROAD WIN

- Purdue hasn't won a road game against a top-15 ranked team since Feb. 25, 2012, when the Boilermakers defeated No. 11-ranked Michigan 75-61.
- It hasn't won a non-conference road game against a top-15 team since Nov. 26, 1983, vs. No. 13-ranked Fresno State (W, 56-55).

JUNIORS LEAD THE WAY

- Head coach **Matt Painter** knew that the junior class would be key in its resurgence and through six games, the class has not disappointed.
- The group has scored a combined 294 points (49.0 points per game), accounting for 57.8 percent of the team's scoring.
- In the two games in Cancun, the group scored 120 of Purdue's 181 points, accounting for 66.3 percent of the Boilermakers' scoring.

THREE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

- Purdue has made a 3-pointer in 970-of-976 games since the 3-point line was introduced before the 1986-87 season, including 118 straight.
- Purdue has made at least two 3-pointers in 945-of-976 games, including 107 straight games.

THE NATION'S BEST FRONTLINE

- Purdue's front line of **Caleb Swanigan**, **Vincent Edwards** and **Isaac Haas** are punishing offenses both inside and out and are playing at a very high level.
- Purdue has a chance to lay claim to the nation's best frontline as it is one of three schools to have players named to the Erving (small forward), Malone (power forward) and Abdul-Jabbar (center) awards.

- Through five games this year, the group is averaging 47.7 points, 21.8 rebounds and 7.7 assists per game while shooting 82-of-140 (.586) from the field and 17-of-32 (.531) from 3-point range.

THE BIG THREE GAME-BY-GAME

THE LEGEND OF BIGGIE CONTINUES TO GROW

• **Caleb Swanigan** is off to a strong start to his sophomore season and may be the player of the month of November nationally. Consider:

⇒ His four straight double-doubles are the most for a Purdue player since **Glenn "Big Dog" Robinson** in 1993-94. A fifth against Louisville would be the first for a Purdue player since **John Garrett** (1974-75).

⇒ He is 1-of-3 players nationally to shoot at least 60.0 percent from the field and average at least 10.0 rebounds per game (Florida International's **Michael Kessens**; Clemson's **Sidy Djitte**).

⇒ He became the third major-college player in last 10 years with 20 points, 20 rebounds and five assists in a game. The other two? **Blake Griffin** and **Ben Simmons**.

⇒ Swanigan is seventh in the country in rebounding (12.0) and is 1-of-2 players nationally this year to average 18.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game. Of note since 1993-94, just six players in NCAA history have averaged 18.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game in a season (**Tim Duncan**, **David West** and **Ben Simmons** are notable players). Also of note, if he were to maintain his 60.0 percent field goal percentage, he would be the ONLY player since 1993-94 to do that.

⇒ Swanigan has also shown a much-improved 3-point stroke. Last year as a freshman, he shot 21-of-72 (.292) from long distance. We know it is early, but his shot selection has been much better and it has shown as he is now 5-of-8 (.625) from deep this year. Through the first six games last year, Swanigan was 6-of-19 (.316) from deep.

⇒ Swanigan has done a much-better job getting to the line, averaging 8.5 free throw attempts per game to rank 19th nationally and second in the Big Ten behind **Melo Trimble** (8.9). Last year, Swanigan averaged just 2.8 free throw attempts per game.

⇒ Lastly, Swanigan set a school record for most points scored in a perfect shooting game when he went 6-of-6 from the field and 10-of-10 from the free throw line to score 22 points against NJIT.

EDWARDS SHOWCASES HIS VERSATILITY

• **Vincent Edwards** has been an extremely-versatile player for head coach **Matt Painter** and he has shown that early this year.

• He grabbed a double-double (19 pts, 11 rebs) against McNeese State in the opener, then almost posted a double-double with 10 points and eight assists against Villanova.

• Edwards is 1-of-11 players nationally (and the only junior) to have scored 750 career points with 375 rebounds, 200 assists and 85 made 3-pointers.

HEAD COACH MATT PAINTER► **Record at Purdue:** 243-135 (.643) / 12th year | **Career Record:** 267-140 (.657) / 13th year

- With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, eight NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 12th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season. He then followed that up in August of 2016, signing a three-year extension good through the 2021-22 year.
- Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in eight seasons.
- Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.
- The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.
- Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.
- The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.
- Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.
- Painter has seen a total of 24 players earn a combined 44 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
