

## **PURDUE BASKETBALL POSTGAME NOTES**

**Purdue (13-2, 4-0) vs. Indiana (9-7, 1-3)**

**January 10, 2015 • Keady Court at Mackey Arena • Attendance: 8,519**

**Purdue Boilermakers 63, Indiana Hoosiers 53**

### **GAME NOTES**

- Head coach Sharon Versyp became the winningest head coach in school history and is now 207-110 at Purdue
- Purdue is now 25-10 at home against Indiana and 53-27 overall in the series, tying Illinois for the most wins against an opponent in school history
- The Boilermakers won their eighth straight, improving to 4-0 in the Big Ten and tied for first with Ohio State
- Purdue is 12-0 when leading at the half this season
- The Boilermakers tied their rebounding season-high figure, earning a 42-31 edge on the glass
- Purdue posted a 38-22 advantage on points in the paint, posting its second straight game with at least that many (44 at Northwestern)
- The Boilermakers tied a season-low one three-pointer (last vs. Boston College, 12/3/15), while holding the Hoosiers to 2-of-17 (.118) from behind the arc
- The nine blocked shots by Purdue set a new season-high (previous seven vs. Incarnate Word, 12/10/15)
- The Boilermakers defense kept the Hoosier's leading scorer, Tyra Buss, who averages 19.2 points per game to only 10 points, tying her lowest of the season

### **INDIVIDUAL NOTES**

- Andreona Keys finished with her first career double-double with 10 points, 11 rebounds with six of her points scored in the second half and six of her rebounds tying Purdue's offensive rebound season-high
- Key's three blocks and six offensive rebounds were career-highs (previous two and four respectively)
- Ashley Morrisette finished shy of a triple-double with 12 points, a career-high eight rebounds and eight assists
- Bridget Perry's 15 points made her the scoring leader for her fourth game this season and for the second straight game
- Nora Kiesler had seven boards, six of which came on the defensive end
