# - AROUND THE HORN -

- Purdue lost 3 of 4 in its series at ETSU after getting outscored 12-1 over the final three innings of the final two games, blowing an 8-3 lead in game three and 2-0 edge in game four.
- The Boilermakers enjoyed a 19-run outburst in game two of the ETSU series, scoring three more than they had over the first seven games (16) of the season. It was Purdue's most runs since putting up 23 in a March 2015 win vs. Northern Illinois.
- The Boilers overcame early deficits of 4-1 and 3-0 in both games of the Saturday doubleheader at ETSU, but dropped the nightcap on a walk-off threerun homer in the bottom of the ninth. It was Purdue's first walk-off loss since May 2014 at Minnesota.
- · After striking out 60 times over the first five games of the season, Purdue has done a much better job at putting the ball in play, striking out 28 times over the last five games. Situational hitting struggles continued through the series-opening loss at ETSU.
- The Boilers were batting .178 with RISP over their first six games, plating a runner from third with less than two outs in only 5 of 16 chances. But in the final three games at ETSU, Purdue hit .410 with RISP and plated that runner from third in 7 of 8 chances.

# PURDUE'S WEEKEND ROTATION -

- Gave Purdue a quality start in the opener at ETSU but a dropped fly ball in right field was changed to a triple, making all 4 runs earned instead of 2.
- Battled Georgia Tech as Purdue's season-opening starting pitcher, giving the team a chance to win by staying out of the big inning.
- Joined Nick Dalesandro as the first Purdue pitchers since 2013 to make their first career starts on the mound during a season-opening weekend. However, he became the first non-freshman since 2011 to make his first start on a weekend.
- As a freshman made five of his seven appearances in Big Ten play after not making his collegiate debut until April 11.; worked three innings of onerun ball at nationally ranked Illinois in his first outing as a Boilermaker.
- · Retired four of the five batters he faced over an inning and a third of hitless relief to close out the series-opening win against Penn State.

 Played four years of varsity baseball, basketball and football at Tippecanoe Valley High School in north central Indiana.

· Batted over .400 each year as a four-time all-conference performer; area player of the year and second team all-state performer in basketball averaged 20 points as a senior, first team all-state defensive back as a junior and Purdue Record When He Starts: 0-3 then earned similar honors as a wide receiver his senior year.

MIKE LUTZ SENIOR RHP NORTH BARRINGTON, ILL. LAKE ZURICH HS

- · Regularly used member of the bullpen over his first three seasons, ranking fourth in program history with 73 career appearances.
- Faced only 16 batters through the first five innings in his start at ETSU, which was his first weekend start since March 2014 and just second career.
- · Ranked second on the team last season by inducing six ground ball double plays in 28 2/3 innings, two more than he had induced in 99 innings over his underclassman seasons.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree ranks second among active Boilermakers with 135 1/3 career innings pitched.
- In 2014, became just the third pitcher in program history to appear in 30 games in a season (and first since 2008); set a new Purdue freshman record with 25 appearances in 2013.
- Pitched a career-high 6 1/3 innings and recorded a quality start in the 2015 midweek win at Valparaiso, his first start in over year.
- Induced and started a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded and Purdue clinging to a one-run leading in the 2014 series-opening win at Illinois, becoming the first Boiler pitcher to end a game in that fashion since February 2012.
- · Starred in relief in Purdue's first-ever sweep at Penn State (2013), working 6 1/3 innings of scoreless relief over his three appearances.
- · Also pitched in all three games of a 2013 series at Michigan State and 2014 series vs. Rice and Michigan.

NICK DALESANDRO FRESHMAN RHP PLAINFIELD, ILL. JOLIET CATHOLIC HS

- One bad inning (three-run fourth) marred what was an otherwise strong debut on the mound; had five strikeouts vs. no walks over five innings.
- Has helped Purdue as a two-way player, becoming the first Boilermaker since April 2014 to bat in the lineup as the starting pitcher.
- Selected in the 33rd round of the 2015 MLB First-Year Player Draft by the Detroit Tigers; became Purdue's first NLI signee since the 2009 draft to opt to attend college.
- Ranked No. 3 among impact freshmen in the Big Ten by D1Baseball.com.
- · Joined Tanner Andrews as the first Purdue pitchers since 2013 to make their first career starts on the mound during a season-opening weekend.

# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 18th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in nine of its 10 appearances under Schreiber.

The 2015 Boilermakers won their final five games and six of their last seven, posting their third longest season-ending win streak in program history. Kyle Wood won the team triple crown in 2015, becoming the first hitter to do so since 2007 and the 11th Boilermaker position player since 1970 to accomplish the feat.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ball State (1991-92) and spent 1993 as an assistant at Butler.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132) and games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eighth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

#### **BOILERMAKERS MAKE FIRST TRIP TO STATE OF KANSAS SINCE 2012**

- Purdue begins spring break with a trip to Lawrence for KU's Millard Management Classic. The Boilermakers played in two tournaments held at a single field a year ago, going 3-5 in those games. The Jayhawks represent the fifth and final first-time opponent on the schedule this season.
- · Purdue has not been to the state of Kansas since splitting a four-game series at Wichita State on the backend of the 2012 spring break trip. The Boilermakers did visit Big 12 country last year for a weekend series at Oklahoma. Kyle Wood (9-for-11, 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 2 BB, 4 R) enjoyed a monster series in Norman and claimed Big Ten Player of the Week honors after having 12 productive plate appearances in his 14 trips to the dish.

# JOHNSON & WOOD PRODUCE A NUMBER OF FIRST TIMES SINCE AT ETSU

- There were a combined 11 home runs hit in the four-game series at East Tennessee State, including six by Purdue's Kyle Johnson and Kyle Wood. Both seniors recorded their first collegiate multi-homer games, joining Alec Olund as active Boilermakers to accomplish the feat. Purdue's three home runs in the 19-6 win were the team's most in a game since hitting four in a May 2012 win at Iowa that clinched the outright Big Ten title. The 27 runs the Boilermakers scored in the March 5 doubleheader at ETSU were their most in a single day since putting up 35 in a doubleheader sweep at Morehead State in February 2011.
- Johnson had career-highs of four hits and six RBI in his multi-homer game, the 19-6 Purdue win. He hit the first grand slam by a Boilermaker since Jack Picchiotti in the 2015 Big Ten opener vs. Rutgers. His 10 total bases were the most by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh had 12 as part of a multi-homer game in May 2013. Johnson hit his grand slam in the seventh inning and a two-run shot the following frame, becoming the first Boilermaker since Cameron Perkins in May 2012 (at Iowa) to go deep in consecutive innings.
- · Wood homered three times in the Saturday doubleheader, doing deep twice in the nightcap. He became the first Boilermaker since Perkins in February 2011 to homer in both games of a doubleheader. His three home runs in one day were the most by a Boilermaker since Dan Black's three-homer game against Indiana at the 2008 Big Ten Tournament.

# DALESANDRO & McGOWAN RIDING STREAKS ALREADY

- Freshmen Nick Dalesandro and Jacson McGowan have been regulars in the starting lineup early this season. Dalesandro did not start the Feb. 21 win at Georgia State, which stands as the only game so far either of them wasn't in the starting lineup.
- Dalesandro enters the weekend riding an eight-game hitting streak, which began when he delivered a two-run double with the bases loaded to break a 3-3 tie in the win at Georgia State. He's 11-for-28 (.392) with three doubles and five RBI during the streak. After getting chased from the mound in the bottom of the second inning of his game two start at ETSU, he delivered another bases-loaded tworun double the following frame to ignite the Purdue comeback. This year Dalesandro has become the first Boilermaker since Kyle Wood in April 2014 to bat in the lineup in the same game he was the starting pitcher. But you have to go back to February 2014 (Wood again) for the last time it happened in a weekend game.
- · McGowan has hit safely in eight of the first 10 games and enters the weekend having reached base safely in six straight. He came through with a rare two-run sac fly with the bases loaded in the fourth inning of the 19-6 win at ETSU. The center fielder made a diving catch to take away a double, but Jack Picchiotti was able to score from second on the play.

# **EXCELLENT LONG RELIEF WORK**

- The Boilermakers had a chance to win both games of the March 5 doubleheader at ETSU thanks to strong relief work from Matt Frawley (7 2/3 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 0 BB, 6 K) and Shane Bryant (5 1/3 IP, 3 H, 3 R, 5 K). They combined for 13 innings of five-run ball, surrendering only eight hits and one walk while striking out 11. The effective long relief allowed Purdue to overcome its starting pitchers both failing to make it through the second inning.
- Frawley's 7 2/3 innings pitched and six strikeouts were both career highs. It was the longest relief outing by a Purdue pitcher since April 2013. He retired seven of the first eight batters he faced and later 14 of the final 16 that came to the plate against him. Bryant retired 14 of the first 17 batters he faced. He worked a pair of 1-2-3 innings and didn't give up a hit until the sixth inning during that
- In Purdue's comeback win at Georgia State on Feb. 21, Tanner Schumacher retired all 12 batters he faced over four perfect innings of relief.

# SITUATIONAL HITTING FRUSTRATIONS IN LOSSES

- · In the Boilermakers' eight losses this season they've struggled with timely hitting. Four of the eight losses have been by three runs or fewer. Purdue has actually had more chances for potential rallies than its opponents, seeing its leadoff man reach base safely 26 times (36 percent) to begin an inning. But the Boilers have left 62 runners on base (avearge of 7.75 per game) while hitting just .177 (14-for-79) with runners in scoring position.
- With a runner on third and less than two outs, Purdue has plated that runner in just 5 of 14 (36 percent) opportunities in its eight losses. Meanwhile, opponents have cashed in 15 of 18 (83 percent) chances with a runner on third and less than two outs. Purdue has struck out 73 times (average of 9 per game) in its eight losses, part of the reason it has not scored more runners from third with less than two outs. But when they have put the ball in play with runners on base, the Boilermakers have grounded into nine double plays.
