THE SCENE SETTER

- The Purdue men's basketball team begins its gauntlet Friday as one of the NEC favorites, Robert Morris, visits Mackey Arena for an afternoon matinee at 2 p.m. ET.
- The contest will be televised on BTN with **Rob Blackman** and **Shon Morris** calling the action courtside.
- On the radio waves, the contest will be available on the Purdue Radio Network and TuneIn.com, with **Larry Clisby**, **Nate Barrett** and **Ralph Taylor** on the call, beginning with the Purdue Basketball pregame show at 1 p.m.
- Live stats will be provided on PurdueSports.com, and as always, Twitter updates will be available on Purdue's official account (@BoilerBall).
- Purdue is looking to bounce back from a loss to No. 16 Virginia Tech in the finals of the Charleston Classic.
- Following this game, Purdue will face Florida State in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge, then open Big Ten play Dec. 1, at Michigan.

THE TWO TEAMS

- Purdue is 4-1 after falling in the title game of the Charleston Classic to No. 16-ranked Virginia Tech on Sunday 89-83.
- **Carsen Edwards** was named to the All-Tournament Team and leads Purdue in scoring at 26.6 points per game. **Ryan Cline** (13.8) and **Evan Boudreaux** (11.6) also average in double-figures for the Boilermakers.
- Purdue is averaging over 85 points per game, using a lethal outside attack. The Boilermakers rank seventh nationally in 3-pointers per game (12.2) and went 40 of 98 (.408) from 3-point range during the Charleston Classic.
- Purdue also excels on the glass, outrebounding foes by 10.4 per game.
- Robert Morris is 3-0 having won three straight games after an 0-2 start.
- **Josh Williams** leads RMU in scoring at 20.0 points per game and against Mount Aloysius, tied an NCAA record with 15 3-pointers to finish with 49 points.

THE TALKING POINTS

- The next Purdue win will be the 300th of **Matt Painter's** career with the Boilermakers.
- Purdue has won 16 straight non-conference home games. Its last loss came to defending champion Villanova (Nov. 14, 2016).
- **Carsen Edwards'** 133 points through the first five games are the seventh most in Purdue history.
- **Evan Boudreaux** surpassed 1,000 career points in the loss to Virginia Tech. He did so in just 59 career games.
- Purdue has been ranked in 18 consecutive AP Top 25 polls, the seventh-longest active streak in the country.
- Purdue ranks seventh nationally in offensive efficiency according to KenPom.com. The Boilermakers have averaged at least 1.17 points / possession in all five games.
- Purdue's next five opponents are ranked 8, 7, 37, 26, 66 according to KenPom.com.
- Purdue has attempted just 34 free throws in the last three games. Opponents have attempted 56 free throws in that span.

THE SERIES

- Purdue owns a 2-0 record against Robert Morris, but hasn't faced the Colonials since the 2001-02 season.
- The first meeting came in the 1983 NCAA Tournament, a 55-53 Purdue victory. The win was legendary coach **Gene Keady's** first NCAA Tournament victory at Purdue.
- The Boilermakers own a 6-0 record all-time against the Northeast Conference, winning by an average margin of 25.0 points per game. Two of the meetings have come in the NCAA Tournament.

LAST TIME OUT

- Purdue fell to 4-1 on the season after falling to No. 16-ranked Virginia Tech 89-83. Purdue finished runner-up during an eight-team in-season tournament for the first time since the 2011 Puerto Rico Tipoff (L to #16 Alabama, 65-56).
- Purdue is now 15-3 in its last 18 in-season tournament games. The Boilermakers were denied their third tournament title in the last four years.
- Purdue was outscored 28-15 in second-chance points and points off turnovers and was outscored 19-7 at the free throw line.
- **m** scored 26 points, his fifth straight game of 23 or more points to start the season.
- **Evan Boudreaux** scored a season-high 18 points with seven rebounds, three assists and two steals.

- Since the start of 2015-16, Purdue has been ranked in 59 of a possible 60 Associated Press top 25 polls, the third-best total in the country.

SCORING IN BUNCHES

- Purdue has opened the year by scoring at least 79 points in all five games, the first time since the 1973-74 season when it happened in eight straight games.

TRIPLES IN BUNCHES TOO

- Purdue has opened the season by making 61 3-pointers in the first five games, the most in the first five games in school history.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten and ranks seventh nationally in 3-pointers per game (12.2).
- Individually, **Carsen Edwards** is fifth in 3-pointers made (22), while **Ryan Cline** is 13th (16). The duo also ranks second (53) and 10th in 3-point attempts (45).

BIG MEN GETTING IT DONE

- **Matt Haarms** and **Evan Boudreaux** are showing they can be quite a 1-2 threat at the center position early on this year.

- Boudreaux has been especially productive as of late, averaging 15.0 points and 7.0 rebounds in just 21.5 minutes per game over the last two outings. He has 16 offensive rebounds in 58 minutes over the last three games.

NOVEMBER REIGN

- Purdue has dominated the opposition at home during the month of November, going 46-2 (.958) under head coach **Matt Painter**.
- Going back further, Purdue is 81-8 (.910) all-time at Mackey Arena during the month of November.
- Painter owns a 66-18 (.786) record during the month of November.

MAKING OUR STATEMENT

- Purdue has won nine straight games against in-state foes, last losing to a team from the state on Indiana on Feb. 20, 2016 (Indiana, 77-73).
- Just four of the nine wins have come in Mackey Arena.

GIVE US SOME EXTRA SHOTS

• Purdue has worked hard this year dominating the extra-possession battle, outrebounding opponents 10.4 rebounds per game and having a better turnover margin by 1.8 turnovers per game.

• As a result, Purdue has had 47 more shots (322-275) already this year, averaging 9.4 field goal attempts more per game.

• Purdue has turned 69 offensive rebounds (13.8 per game) into 83 (16.6 points per game) second-chance points.

THE EXTRA POSSESSION GAME

• During the Painter era, Purdue is 104-8 when committing fewer turnovers and outrebounding its opponents in the same game, having won 22 straight games when accomplishing the feat.

• Purdue's last loss when outrebounding an opponent and having fewer turnovers was against Gardner-Webb on Dec. 22, 2014.

HOME COOKING

• Since the start of the 2015-16 season, Purdue has won 50 home games, posting a 50-4 record. The 50 victories are the sixth most in America during that span.

► **Record at Purdue:** 299-150 (.666) / 14th year | **Career Record:** 324-155 (.676) / 15th year

- With four Sweet 16 appearances, 10 NCAA Tournament berths, two Big Ten regular-season championships, a Big Ten Tournament title and an international gold medal on his résumé, 14th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter owns a 324-155 (.676) record in 14 years as a head coach, while attaining a 299-150 (.666) mark at Purdue.
- Painter enters the 2018-19 season third on the school's all-time wins list (295) behind legendary mentors, Gene Keady and Ward "Piggy" Lambert, both of whom have been inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged almost 23 wins a season in his 13 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year, the average balloons to 23.8 wins per year over the last 12 seasons.
- Has won at least 25 games in eight of his 14 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Painter's three Big Ten Coach of the Year honors are the fourth most in league history (Gene Keady - 7; Bobby Knight - 5; Bo Ryan - 4).
- Painter has averaged 10.9 wins per year in conference play, the fifth-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
- Is one of just three active coaches to have won a Big Ten championship.
- Painter's 10 NCAA Tournaments in the last 12 years are the ninth most in the country.
- Purdue's four Sweet 16 appearances in the last 10 years are the ninth most nationally.
- Painter's 324 wins are the third most nationally for a coach nationally in under 15 years of coaching.
- Coach Painter's 11 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of Nov. 1, 2018 -- Painter is 48 years old).
- Has produced draft picks in each of the last three years, one of only six programs nationally that can say that.
- Purdue is one of five teams to have a Naismith position award finalist in each of the last three years.
- Purdue has finished first or second in Big Ten play in six of Painter's last 11 years.
- Purdue has led the Big Ten in scoring in each of the last two years, only the second team this century to do so.
- Has had 54 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in his 13 previous years at Purdue.
- Lastly, the four winningest classes in school history have come during the Painter era (2018, 2012, 2011, 2010).
