HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extraining affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

- BOILERS SET FOR HOME & AWAY WEEKEND VERSUS BUTLER -

Purdue baseball closes out the month of March with a home and away weekend against Butler, hosting the Bulldogs for a Saturday doubleheader at Alexander Field and visiting the Circle City for Sunday's series finale.

After opening Big Ten Conference play last weekend with a home series against Rutgers, the Boilermakers now have their open weekend in the league slate. Beginning next weekend with a home series against lowa, they'll play a conference rival each of the final seven weekends of the season.

Butler opens Big East play next weekend with a home series against St. John's.

Purdue won all three meetings with the Bulldogs a year ago, winning games in Birmingham, Indianapolis and West Lafayette. It was believed to be the first time in program history the Boilers defeated the same team in three different locations in the same season. The season series ended in thrilling fashion at Alexander Field on **Brandon Krieg's** walk-off single in the 10th inning. The Indianapolis native reached base safely six times in the victory.

After arm soreness sidelined Butler's projected game two starter, righthander Chris Myjak, the Bulldogs are now expected to throw three lefties this weekend, extending a lefty-heavy stretch for Purdue. Rutgers started two southpaws last weekend and the midweek games against Kent State and Ball State this week both featured lefthanded starters for the opposition. The Boilermakers are 4-8 in games against southpaw starters in 2015 and also faced three lefties the opening weekend of the season at Western Carolina.

Among the series' pitching probables, Purdue's **Brett Haan** and Butler's Jeff Schank and Peter Nyznyk each took the mound in the three-game series last season. Haan made his first start as a Boilermaker in the neutral-site game on Samford's campus in Birmingham. It was **Gavin Downs** who got the win though after working 5 2/3 innings of shutout relief thanks in part to inducing three ground ball double plays. Schank worked three innings of one-hit relief in the same game and is now enjoying a strong sophomore campaign, compiling a 2.65 ERA and .226 batting average against in 34 innings. Nyznyk started the game at Alexander Field last season, working the first two innings.

Adam Dressler and **Joe Eichmann** each had two strong outings against Butler a year ago. Dressler did not issue a walk over 10 2/3 innings of two-run ball. He earned the victory in the March 19 game in Indianapolis in his first collegiate start. However, Dressler has pitched in just one game this season.

Eichmann has struck out 11 in 12 2/3 career innings of one-run ball against Butler. He retired 15 of the 18 batters he faced in last year's series. In 2013, he pitched a career-high 7 2/3 innings of relief in the Bulldogs' win at Alexander Field. It remains the longest outing by a Purdue reliever since at least the beginning of the 2008 campaign.

Matt Gibbs and Eichmann have remained the top performers in the Boilers' bullpen this season. Gibbs has given up a hit to only two of the 29 batters he has faced and allowed only two of 14 inherited runners to score. Since having a couple rough outings in Phoenix the weekend of Feb. 26-28, Eichmann has struck out nine in 8 2/3 scoreless innings over his last six appearances. Batters are just 2-for-18 against him with runners on base during that stretch.

The Bulldogs started the season 0-8 after getting swept at Lipscomb and Pepperdine their first two weekends. But they enter the weekend having won six in a row, a streak that began with a 10-inning victory against Illinois State March 15 in Florida. However, four of the six wins have come against non-Division I opponents. Butler scored 12 runs in a midweek win at Dayton Wednesday and took two-of-three vs. IPFW the weekend of March 7-8. Purdue hosts IPFW next week and again April 15 as well Illinois State April 28.

The Bulldogs' Ryan Wojciechowski leads the team with 21 RBI thanks in part to a .349 batting average and 11 extra-base hits. Drew Small has 12 doubles and 15 RBI to go along with a .333 average, seven stolen bases and 25 runs scored, leading the way in doubles, steals and runs scored.

With an all-time series that features 139 meetings dating back to 1888, Purdue has played Butler more than any other non-conference opponent. Indiana (130) and Northwestern (110) are the only opponents the Boilers have more all-time wins against than Butler (103). Purdue has won 12 of the last 13 meetings dating back to 1996.

PURDUE TAKES ON BUTLER FOR FINAL WEEKEND OF NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- A unique home and away series against Butler is on tap for the Boilermakers as they are idle from Big Ten Conference play this weekend. Weather has once again impacted a weekend schedule. Saturday's doubleheader at Alexander Field will be Purdue's fifth twinbill of the season. Sunday's series finale is set for Bulldog Park in Indianapolis.
- The Boilermakers won all three meetings with Butler a year ago, winning games in Birmingham, Indianapolis and West Lafayette. It was believed to be the first time in program history Purdue defeated the same opponent three times in three different locations. Brandon Krieg delivered a walk-off single in the 10-inning victory at Alexander Field, punctuating a game in which he reached base safely six times.
- · Jack Picchiotti's grand slam broke a 5-5 tie in the seventh inning and lifted the Boilers to a Big Tenopening win against Rutgers, but Purdue ended up losing the series after scoring only three runs the rest of the weekend. The Boilermakers remained winless in Big Ten rubber games since April 2012.
- · Purdue has scored only eight runs during its four-game losing streak. Meanwhile, since giving up 13 runs in the March 8 rubber game loss at Oklahoma, Purdue pitching has surrendered 42 over the last 10 games (3.58 team ERA). But offensively the Boilers have been feast for famine during that stretch. They've scored 44 runs in their four wins, but only 12 in their six losses.
- Purdue shut out Valparaiso, 2-0, in the home opener March 18. It was the sixth-earliest home opener in program history and the earliest ever during head coach Doug Schreiber's 17-year tenure. Purdue's pitchers struck out 12 while leading the team to its first shutout win since April 2014 vs. Penn State. The Boilers won the contest on a game-ending line drive double play for the second time this season. Purdue improved to 13-4 in home openers under Schreiber.

PICCHIOTTI'S POWER SURGE

- · Jack Picchiotti has reached base safely in each of the last nine games, hitting safely in eight of the nine. He's 12-for-33 with five free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits have gone for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti is the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.
- Meanwhile, Picchiotti has struck out just once in his first 18 at-bats (20 plate appearances) at Alexander Field this season. Last year, he fanned just three times in 47 at-bats (52 plate appearances) at the Boilers' home field. For his career, he strikes out once every 8.5 at-bats. But at home as a Boilermaker, the rate drops to once every once K per 13 at-bats.
- PICCHIOTTI'S 9-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK (MARCH 14-PR): .364, 7 XBH, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 11 R, 3 BB

HIT BY PITCH TOTALS PILING UP FOR SHIPLEY & WOOD

- · Purdue batters were hit by a pitch 10 times in the Big Ten-opening series against Rutgers. Harry Shipley bore the brunt of the beanings and was plunked five times for the weekend. The freshman has now been hit by a pitch seven times over the last eight games. The Purdue freshman record for HBPs is 14, set by Kyle Wood in 2013.
- · Meanwhile, Wood has been hit by a pitch five times this season and on 33 occasions for his career. The program's all-time record is 40, established by Kevin Plawecki (2010-12). Wood enters the weekend tied for sixth place in Purdue record book. As a team, the Boilers have been hit by a pitch 29 times this season, ranking second in the Big Ten.

BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

- Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win was in April 2012 at Nebraska.
- · However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Dating back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.

SHIPLEY IMPRESSING DEFENSIVELY BUT 14-GAME ERRORLESS STREAK ENDS

 Shortstop Harry Shipley and center fielder Kyle Johnson are the only Boilers that have started every game at the same position this season. Shipley has done it as a freshman thanks in part to his steady play at the most important defensive position. He has committed only four errors in 124 defensive chances. His 14-game errorless streak ended March 21 in the middle game of the Rutgers series. It was his first error since game two of the Sam Houston State doubleheader on Feb. 21. During his 14-game streak without an error he handled 74 defensive chances cleanly. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 83 defensive assists.

· Shipley has been involved in all four game-ending double plays this season. Cody Strong and Shipley teamed up on both game-ending line drive double plays, with the tying run aboard both times. Those closed out victories against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and Valparaiso (March 18). Shipley also made a nice diving stop behind second base to start a game-ending 6-4-3 double play in the March 20 victory vs. Rutgers. Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Purdue has closed out nine wins on notable gameending double plays. That total includes games in which the potential tying run was at least in the ondeck circle at the time of the twin killing.

GIBBS STILL STINGY ON HITS ALLOWED

- Matt Gibbs has faced 29 batters and only allowed two hits this season, the second of which was a line drive comebacker off his elbow that forced him to leave the game in the March 8 rubber game at Oklahoma. That runner came around to score and stands as the only run the senior has been charged with in 2015.
- Dating back to the 2014 home opener, Gibbs has given up only 22 hits in 41 2/3 innings (4.75 hits per nine). By surrendering only 5.77 hits per nine innings last year, he posted the sixth best single-season clip in Purdue history. His 4.91 hits per nine in Big Ten play was a new program record. He posted a streak of 17 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances from April 5-25, 2014. This year, he has allowed only two of 14 inherited runners to score (14 percent).

SNIDANKO'S GRAND SLAM, SEVEN RBI HIGHLIGHT BLOWOUT WIN VERSUS NIU

- Purdue scored multiple runs in seven consecutive innings to slug its way to a 23-5 rubber game win vs. Northern Illinois March 15. Despite not entering the game until the sixth inning, **Ted Snidanko** finished the day with a careerhigh seven RBI and just a single shy of the cycle. He connected for a grand slam in the sixth inning as Purdue posted its second five-run frame of the game. It was the first slam by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh at Michigan in May 2013 and he became the first Purdue player with seven RBI in a game since Josh Estill in April 2013.
- Snidanko nearly hit two grand slams. He tripled off the fence in left center with the bases loaded in his third at-bat. The sophomore entered the day with one extra-base hit and no RBI in 27 games as a Boilermaker.
- Purdue recorded 20 runs and 20 hits for the first time since wins against Illinois-Chicago in March (hits) and April (runs) of 2013. But the 23 runs Sunday were the most since beating Indiana, 25-8, in April 2006 in Bloomington and the 24 hits were Purdue's most since racking up a program-record 30 in a March 2012 victory at Murray State.

WOOD WINS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR MONSTER SERIES AT OKLAHOMA

- **Kyle Wood** did something productive in 12 of his 14 plate appearances in Purdue's series at Oklahoma (March 6-8), earning the junior first baseman Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was 9-for-11 with a three-run double, two solo home runs, seven RBI, two walks and four runs scored. He had multiple hits in all three games, highlighted by his first collegiate four-hit effort in the rubber game.
- Wood put up his big numbers predominantly against a tough Oklahoma rotation. The Sooners' starting pitchers combined for 24 strikeouts over 17 1/3 innings in the series. But Wood also delivered an RBI single in his final at-bat of the weekend to win a lefty-lefty matchup vs. OU's closer in the eighth inning of Sunday's rubber game.
- Wood's 13-game reached base safely streak ended in the March 17 loss at No. 11 Louisville. He recorded multiple hits in eight of those contests. He was Purdue's first Big Ten Player of the Week honoree since **Kyle Johnson** was named Player and Freshman of the Week on April 1, 2013, following the Boilers' first-ever sweep at Penn State.
- Despite making just two appearances on the mound this season, Wood has struck out 12 over 5 1/3 innings and 12 of the 26 batters he has faced. As a pitcher, he has helped lead Purdue to wins against Western Carolina and Valparaiso.

Vilardo has opened the game with a hit seven times while batting leadoff in 22 of the first 14 games. The transfer from the University of Pennsylvania produced multiple hits six times during his reached safely streak while going hitless only twice.

10 EXTRA-INNING GAMES SINCE ST. PATRICK'S DAY 2014; LOTS OF DOUBLEHEADERS

- After blowing a four-run lead in the ninth inning en route to losing to CSU Bakersfield in 11 innings on Feb. 28, 10 of Purdue's last 60 games (17 percent) dating back to St. Patrick's Day 2014 have gone to extra innings. As of Feb. 28, it was 10 of 47 games (21 percent) had gone extras.
- The Boilers' eight extra-innings games last year were the most during **Doug Schreiber's** 17-year tenure as head coach and are believed to be the most in program history overall. Purdue is 4-6 in the 10 extra-innings game, including 1-1 this year.
- The March 28 doubleheader vs. Butler is Purdue's fifth of the season already. The Boilers played three doubleheaders over a span of 13 days from Feb. 14-26 and four in 29 days from Feb. 13-March 14. Purdue had not played a doubleheader in three consecutive weekends since 2008, the final year of the Big Ten schedule featuring a doubleheader of two seven-inning games every Saturday.

FRAWLEY STELLAR IN START VERSUS BAKERSFIELD

- Matt Frawley surrendered only three singles and one walk over seven shutout innings, striking out five and putting together the finest outing of the young season by a Purdue pitcher in the Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield in Phoenix. He worked three 1-2-3 innings and retired 15 of 16 batters from the second through seventh innings. His strikeout and innings pitched totals were career highs as a Boilermaker. It marked the first time a Purdue pitcher worked at least seven shutout innings in an outing since Lance Breedlove led the way in a 3-0 win against Indiana at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament with 7 1/3 shutout innings.
- Bakersfield opened the ninth inning with five consecutive hits to rally for four runs and tie the game. Purdue was fortunate to get the game to extra innings after CSUB had the go-ahead run on third with no outs. Alex Lyons got out of the jam thanks in part to an inexplicable suicide squeeze attempt with an 0-2 count on the batter with one out in the inning. However, the game marked the first time the Boilers suffered a loss after taking the lead into the ninth since the finale of last season's series at Minnesota when they gave up a three-run lead.

FIVE DOUBLE PLAYS IN GAME ONE WIN, NINE FOR THE DAY VERSUS GONZAGA

- Purdue tied a program record with five double plays in the game one win en route to finishing the Feb. 26 doubleheader vs. Gonzaga with nine twin killings. The five double plays were the most since the Boilers' turned four in a March 2012 win at Murray State. Gonzaga helped give Purdue a pair DPs in the game one win after an illegal slide into second base as the Boilers went for a 3-6-1 twin killing. An inning later, a runner tried to score from second base on a sac fly to right center after **Kyle Johnson** slipped while making the catch. But he quickly flipped the ball to **Jeff Evak**, who hit cutoff man **Cody Strong** and Purdue completed the F8-942 put out at the plate.
- Undoubtedly the most exciting double play of the nine was the game-ending line drive to **Harry Shipley** at shortstop. Gonzaga had the bases loaded with one out and Purdue was clinging to a 5-3 lead, but the Boilers successfully doubled off the runner at second base for the final out.
- The Boilermakers turned 15 double plays in their first nine games season, but only eight in the 15 games since. Purdue still ranks second in the Big Ten in double plays turned behind Penn State (24 in 19 games). The Boilers turned 54 double plays in 2014 to lead the Big Ten. Purdue also ranks first in the league this year by throwing out 17 base stealers (26-of-43). **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out 12-of-26 base stealers to rank among the top 20 nationally in caught stealing percentage (.462) entering the week.

KRIEG'S REACHED BASE SAFELY STREAK SNAPPED AT 26

- Brandon Krieg hit safely in each of the first seven games this season, extending his reached base safely streak to 26 consecutive games dating back to 2014. It ranked as the 13th longest active streak in the country when it was snapped Feb. 26 in game one of the doubleheader with Gonzaga. He had hit safely in 20 of the 26 games and overtook Kyle Wood's 24-game run last year for the longest reached base streak by an active Boiler. Cameron Perkins reached base safely in 50 consecutive games in 2011.
- Even with the streak snapped, Krieg is still off to a much better start at the plate than a year ago. Through 11 games last season he was 3-for-38. But he batted .325 from April 15 through the end of the season in 2014.

VILARDO, PICCHIOTTI & GIBBS STAR IN WILD DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP OF SHSU

- Purdue scored twice in the bottom of the 12th inning to rally for a 4-3 victory against Sam Houston State in the first game of a neutral-site doubleheader in Corpus Christi Feb. 21. Alec Olund scored the game-winning run as pinch runner on Michael Vilardo's sacrifice fly to right center field. Vilardo joined Kyle Wood and Brandon Krieg as active Boilers with a game-winning RBI in a walk-off victory.
- In the nightcap of the doubleheader, Purdue overcame deficits of 3-0 and 7-2 to win 9-7 after scoring three times in the top of the ninth inning. Vilardo again delivered the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly. **Cody Strong** led off the final inning of both games with a base hit against SHSU closer Ryan Brinley, who suffered both losses after giving up a combined five runs. Brinley entered the day having not allowed a run in his 27 innings of relief for SHSU dating back to 2014.

Matt Gibbs earned the victory in both games of the twinbill after retiring seven of the nine batters he faced over three scoreless innings of relief. He induced and started a game-ending double play in the nightcap and became the first Purdue pitcher since Chris Toneguzzi in April 2006 to earn the victory in consecutive games. Krieg, Vilardo and Wood joined Gibbs on the All-Tournament Team.
- The five-run deficit (7-2) the Boilers overcame in game two marked their largest comeback since scoring 10 times in the ninth inning at UCLA in May 2012 to rally back from a 10-5 hole entering the frame. However, Purdue's last win after trailing in the ninth inning was a May 2012 victory against Indiana State, 2-1 in 10 innings, in the final game at Lambert Field. A May 2005 doubleheader sweep of lowa at Lambert is believed to be the last time Purdue won two games on the same day in its final at-bat.
