### THE SCENE SETTER

• The No. 23-ranked Purdue men's basketball team wraps up its brief season-opening homestand Saturday as Texas visits Mackey Arena for the first time. Tip will be at 7:05 p.m. ET, and will be televised by FS1 and available on the FOX Sports App. **Brian Anderson** and the legendary **Bill Raftery** will handle the call courtside. On the radio dial, the game will be broadcast on the Purdue Radio Network and online at Tuneln.com, with **Larry Clisby**, **Rob Blackman** and **Ralph Taylor** handling the duties, beginning with the Purdue Basketball Pregame Show at 6 p.m. ET. Live stats will be provided on PurdueStats.com, and Twitter updates available at @BoilerBall.

### THE MAIN TALKING POINTS

- 1) Texas is the first Big 12 team to play at Mackey Arena since Dec. 2004. Coach Painter has never faced a Big 12 team at Mackey Arena.
- 2) The Boilermakers return two starters (**Matt Haarms** and **Nojel Eastern**) from last year's team that posted a 26-10 record and reached the Elite Eight for the first time since 2000.
- 3) Purdue has held 28 of its last 33 opponents at home to under 70 points. The teams to reach 70 are SIU Edwardsville (75; Nov. 10, 2017), Michigan (88; Jan. 25, 2018), Penn State (73; Feb. 18, 2018), Ball State (75; Nov. 10, 2018) and Iowa (70; Jan. 3, 2019).
- 4) **Jahaad Proctor's** 26 points were the most for a player making his Purdue debut since **Glenn Robinson** had 30 points on Nov. 28, 1992 (UConn).
- 5) **Matt Haarms'** seven blocked shots vs. Green Bay were the fifth most in a game in school history (more later in packet).
- 6) Purdue's 45 wins by 20 or more points since the start of the 2015-16 season are the third most nationally (Gonzaga - 70; Villanova - 47).
- 7) With its No. 23 preseason national ranking, Purdue has been ranked in five straight AP preseason Top 25 polls, the longest streak in school history.
- 8) Purdue is 56-2 (.966) over its last 58 games with the Paint Crew in attendance (79-76 vs. Villanova in 2016; 64-63 to Ohio State in 2018).
- 9) Purdue will enter Saturday's game with an 18-game homecourt winning streak, the fifth-longest streak in America. The Boilermakers own a nation's-best 64-4 (.941) home record over the last four years and since the start of 2017-18 are a combined 32-1 (.970) at Mackey Arena (loss to Ohio State).
- 10) Purdue's 20-game non-conference home court winning streak is the fourth longest in school history. Purdue's last loss to a non-conference foe came against defending National Champion and No. 3-ranked Villanova on Nov. 13, 2016 (79-76).

**THE SERIES**

- Purdue and Texas have met just four times, but all four games have been very competitive, decided by 10 points or less.
- Saturday's game is a return trip from last year's meeting in Austin, won by Texas 72-68, despite 40 points by Texas native **Carsen Edwards**.
- The Boilermakers have a history with **Shaka Smart**, as his VCU team defeated Purdue in the second round of the NCAA Tournament 94-76 en route to its Final Four appearance in 2011.

- Aaron Wheeler** and Texas freshman **Kai Jones** both attended Brewster Academy in New Hampshire. Wheeler is two years older than Jones.
- Purdue video producer **Taylor Smith** attended Texas, graduating in 2015. Smith is a native of Flower Mound, right outside Dallas.

**BIG 12 WOES**

- Purdue has had a lot of success against teams from other leagues, but the Big 12 has been tough to play against during the Painter era.
- Purdue's season has ended three times in its last six NCAA appearances by a Big 12 team (Kansas - 2012; Kansas - 2017; Texas Tech - 2018).

**THE POWER OF 3**

- The No. 3 has been good to Purdue basketball in season openers lately. **Carsen Edwards** wore No. 3 during his career at Purdue, scoring 30 points in last year's season opener against Fairfield.
- Over the last four season openers (Edwards - 3, Proctor - 1), the players wearing the number have averaged 22.5 points per game and shot 34 of 59 (.576) from the field.

**HAARMS HAS PERSONAL BLOCK PARTY**

- Purdue center **Matt Haarms** had a monster game in the season opener. Some noteworthy facts about it.
- With 16 points, 7 rebounds, 7 blocks, 3 assists and 2 made 3-pointers, he became the second player nationally since the 2010-11 season to reach those marks in the same game.

- Purdue has started 3-0 or better in 20 of the last 40 seasons dating to the 1979-80 campaign. Nineteen of those 20, 3-0 starts have resulted in a postseason tournament, 16 of which were NCAA Tournament trips.
- The Boilermakers have started 4-0 or better 10 times (in 14 seasons) under head coach **Matt Painter**.

## POLL POSITION

- Ranked 23rd in the AP preseason poll, Purdue has now been ranked in the preseason poll in five straight seasons. It marks the first time in school history that it has been ranked in the preseason in five straight polls. In fact, Purdue had never been ranked in four straight preseason polls before last year.

## HEAD COACH MATT PAINTER

▶ **Record at Purdue:** 322-159 (.669) / 15th year | **Career Record:** 347-164 (.679) / 16th year

- With five Sweet 16 appearances, 11 NCAA Tournament berths, three Big Ten regular-season championships, a Big Ten Tournament title, an Elite Eight and an international gold medal on his resumé, 15th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
- Painter was named the 2019 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to three straight Sweet 16 appearances.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter enters the 2019-20 season third on the school's all-time wins list (321) behind legendary mentors, Gene Keady and Ward "Piggy" Lambert, both of whom have been inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged almost 23 wins a season in his 14 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.0 wins per year over the last 13 seasons.
- Has won at least 25 games in nine of his 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Painter's four Big Ten Coach of the Year honors are the third most in league history (Gene Keady - 7; Bobby Knight - 5; Bo Ryan - 4).
- Painter has averaged 11.3 wins per year in conference play, the fifth-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
- Is one of just two active coaches to have won a Big Ten championship.
- Painter's 11 NCAA Tournaments in the last 13 years are the eighth most in the country.
- Purdue's five Sweet 16 appearances in the last 11 years are the ninth most nationally.
- Through last year, Painter's 346 wins were the second most nationally for a coach nationally in under 15 years of coaching.
- Coach Painter's 12 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2020 -- Painter is 49 years old).
- Has produced draft picks in each of the last four years, one of only four programs nationally that can say that.
- Purdue is one of five teams to have a Naismith position award finalist in each of the last four years.
- Purdue has finished first or second in Big Ten play in seven of Painter's last 12 years.
- Has had 58 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in his 14 previous years at Purdue.
- Lastly, the five winningest classes in school history have come during the Painter era (2019, 2018, 2012, 2011, 2010).
