The Scene Setter

- The No. 20-ranked Purdue men's basketball team opens its 120th season of competition, hosting SIU-Edwardsville at 8 p.m. ET, at Mackey Arena on Friday night.
- Tickets are available by calling 800.495SPORT, online at PurdueSports.com or at the Mackey Arena ticket office.
- The game will be streamed online on BTN2Go.com, via BTN Plus. On the radio waves, Larry Clisby, Rob Blackman and Ralph Taylor will handle the call on the Purdue Radio Network.
- Live stats will be provided on PurdueSports.com and fans can receive in-game updates via Twitter at @BoilerBall.
- Purdue will welcome back to the sidelines 2008 grad Tarrance Crump, who is an assistant coach with SIUE. He scored 338 points with 99 assists and 92 rebounds in 67 career games, playing in two NCAA Tournaments.

LOOKING BACK

- Purdue went 2-0 against exhibition competition, defeating Indiana State (94-72) and Carroll College (Mont.) (98-71) to prepare for the 2017-18 season.
- Purdue averaged 96.0 points per game and shot 53.7 percent from the field in the two games. The 98 points against Carroll College were the second most scored under Painter in exhibition games.
- Carsen Edwards led five players in double figures during the exhibition season, averaging 17.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game. Vincent Edwards (13.5), Isaac Haas (13.5), Dakota Mathias (10.5) and Matt Haarms (10.0) all averaged double figures as well.
- Purdue is now 24-0 under Matt Painter in exhibition games, winning by an average of 25.9 points.
- In years that Purdue won its exhibition game opener by at least 22 points under Painter (22-point win vs. Indiana State), the Boilermakers advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

- 140: Starts returning from last year's 27-8 record, the third-most returning starts in Painter era.
- 3,392: Points scored by Purdue's seniors, the fourth most by a senior class at one school.
- 20-1: Record under Matt Painter against winless teams entering the contest.
- 32-1: Purdue's record at home over last 33 games when the Paint Crew has been in attendance.
- 40-2: Home record during the month of November under head coach Matt Painter.

► November Reign

- Purdue has dominated the opposition at home during the month of November, going 40-2 (.952) under head coach **Matt Painter**. The lone setbacks were on Nov. 9, 2012, to Bucknell (70-65), and Nov. 14, 2017, to defending national champion Villanova (79-76). Ironically, Villanova's head coach **Jay Wright** graduated from Bucknell.
- Going back further, Purdue is 75-8 (.904) all-time at Mackey Arena during the month of November.
- Painter owns a 56-15 (.789) record during the month of November.

► Big Margins at Home

- Purdue has won seven straight home games, all coming vs. Big Ten foes, by an average of 18.1 points per game with all of them coming by double-digits. Its closest games during the streak was 11 points twice (Wisconsin, Indiana).

► Boilers Hot at Home

- Purdue will enter the 2017-18 season having won seven straight games at Mackey Arena, the eighth-longest streak during the Painter era.
- With eight non-conference home games on the slate, an undefeated non-conference schedule will give Purdue 15 straight home wins, which would be the fifth-longest home winning streak in Mackey Arena history.

- With a trio of Sweet 16 appearances, nine NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 13th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season. He then followed that up in August of 2016, signing a three-year extension good through the 2021-22 year.
- Painter has averaged over 22 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 25 victories in six seasons.
- Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last 10 years have seen six 25-win seasons and eight NCAA Tournament berths, three Sweet 16 appearances, two regular-season Big Ten titles and a Big Ten Tournament crown.
- The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.
- Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.
- The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.
- Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.
- Painter has seen a total of 26 players earn a combined 49 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored a pair of Academic All-Americans in E'Twaun Moore (2010) and Caleb Swanigan (2017)
