















# Photo Guide

- 1.) The center offers permanent seating for 700 fans, expandable to 1,400 with use of temporary bleachers.
- 2.) The center added a press row prior to hosting the 2005 NCAA Women's Swimming & Diving Championships.
- 3.) The eight-lane, 50-meter competition pool, with the use of two moveable bulkheads, allows reconfiguration as a 20-lane lane, 25-yard short course.
- 4.) An exclusive weight room is provided on site for swimmers and divers.
- 5.) In just five years, the center has welcomed some of the top national events, including the U.S. Open, two Big Ten Championships and the NCAAs. Purdue will play host to women's Big Tens, Region C Zones and NCAAs in 2010.
- 6.) A 12-person spa is a great asset to the divers who wait their turn during competition.
- 7.) The diving area boasts towers of 1, 3, 5, 7.5 and 10-meters in addition to two 1-meter and 3-meter springboards.

- 8.) A Daktronics scoreboard provides state-of-the-art scoring and allows live video coverage of events.
- 9.) The diving team has its own drydock practice area, which is located on the upper concourse of the center. Several new TiVO monitors were installed in 2005 allowing divers to take note of their form.
- 10.) A second harness system with rope and pulley was built over the diving well near the 3-meter springboards.
- 11.) An on-deck TiVO system allows athletes to watch their dives seconds after exiting the water. Above, diving coach Adam Soldati and Amanda Miller review proper technique.
- 12.) Another luxury for the divers is a trampoline/rope and pulley system, which allows them to practice their airborne movements.
- 13 & 14.) Record boards for swimming and diving were installed on the north and south ends of the pool shortly before the start of the 2005-06 campaign. The boards, which list varsity and pool records, are updated after the conclusion of the home season.

# Head Swimming Coach 1st Season at Purdue

Purdue Athletics Director Morgan Burke announced the hiring of John Klinge as the Boilermakers' women's swimming and diving head coach in early June following an extensive national search. Klinge assumed his new responsibilities July 1.

"This is a great opportunity for my family and me," Klinge said. "It's awesome to be able to come back and coach at my alma mater."

"With (former head coach) Cathy (Wright-Eger) finishing her relay leg, John, as a former Boilermaker swimmer, is eager to hit the water and lead our women's program," Burke said. "His plans are solid, and we are confident, given his background, that he will be a tremendous leader and coach for the young women on his team."

Klinge's background includes time spent serving his country with the United States Marine Corp in addition to coaching stops at the collegiate, club and high school coaching levels. This unique resume builder helped boost his appeal among the athletics department administrators.

"John's successful leadership experience with the U.S. Marines, combined with the coaching success he has enjoyed to date and the respect he has been shown by his peers, helped him rise to the top of the candidate list," Burke said.

"John brings tremendous leadership, integrity, character and high standards to our Purdue family," added sport administrator Terry Kix, who oversees swimming and diving. "His experiences coupled with his high intensity training methods will enhance our student-athletes' abilities to grow. We would also like to welcome John and his family back to Purdue as he is clearly a great fit."

Klinge is only the seventh head coach in the 38-year history of the program and the first male since Fred Kahms was at the helm from 1981 through 1985. Klinge replaces Wright-Eger, who stepped down earlier this spring to accept an academic advisor position within the university's Department of Intercollegiate Athletics.

"I can't say enough good things about Cathy," Klinge said. "She truly cares about the women in our program and I know she will continue to be Purdue swimming's greatest supporter."

Wright-Eger, Purdue's head coach for 21 seasons, is thrilled to see what Klinge can accomplish with her former team.

"I'm so excited and honored to have John as our next Purdue coach," she said. "He represents everything we were looking for in a coach."

In an email directed to her former studentathletes, Wright-Eger added, "John is a very personable coach, communicates extremely well, and will care about you as a person, a student and an athlete."

She also shared his vision for success at Purdue, which is, "To establish and ensure an environment where motivated and talented student-athletes strive for excellence in swimming and diving and in the classroom, and work together to consistently challenge for Big Ten and NCAA championships."

One student-athlete who immediately accepted Klinge's messages and goals is Leah Henninger. Only a junior, Henninger has quickly become a team leader and will serve as cocaptain of this year's roster along with classmate Christine Inman. "John's a motivated, positive and goal-oriented individual, and he was my No. 1 pick after the completion of the athlete interview process," said Henninger. "I know Coach Klinge will take our program to new heights, and we're very fortunate to have him as a member of the Boilermaker family."

There are 24 more swimmers and divers in addition to Henninger that Klinge will have to acquaint himself with as the season draws closer. He says he's looking forward to getting to know every single one of them.

"One of my first priorities is to get to know the team and then start to establish some very high goals for the upcoming season," he said. "I think it's going to be fun to work with the team and start to create a new and ambitious vision for the program together."

Klinge, a native of Richmond, Ind., graduated from Purdue in 1994 with a bachelor of science degree in civil engineering. He returns to his home state after spending the last five years as an assistant to men's head coach Bill Wadley at Ohio State.

Klinge was promoted to associate head coach in May, shortly after the Buckeyes posted their second straight top-20 showing at the NCAA Championships. The Scarlet and Gray were 12th in 2007 and 16th in 2008.

Last year's Buckeye squad finished 13th overall in the national dual meet rankings and broke a total of 10 school records before sending 11 student-athletes to the NCAA Championships. Senior sprinter Matt Voelker

placed 15th in the 50 freestyle to capture honorable mention All-America honors and was part of three Ohio State relay teams (800 free, 200 and 400 medley relay) that finished in the top 16 to earn honorable mention All-America accolades.

Last summer, 18 of Klinge's former Buckeye swimmers prepared for the Olympic Trials, which took place in Omaha, Neb. Sophomore George Markovic and freshman Itai Chammah secured spots on the Serbian and Israeli national teams, respectively.

While at Purdue, Klinge qualified for the 1992 United States Olympic Trials and went on to place 15th in the 200 backstroke. The former team captain also earned United States Swimming All-America honors in 1991 for placing fifth in the 100 back and was awarded All-Big Ten honors in both 1990 and 1994.

Klinge left Purdue as its second-fastest swimmer in four events: 100 and 200 backstroke, 200 and 400 individual medley, and as the Lambert Pool record holder in the 200 back (1:49.68) and 200 IM (1:51.47).

More than 14 years later, Klinge's lifetime bests in the 200 back (1:46.36) and 400 IM (3:54.82) still hold up among the five-fastest times in Boilermaker history even though Purdue moved into a much faster and improved facility at the start of this decade.

Klinge made an immediate transition into coaching following his senior year, serving as an undergraduate assistant coach to Purdue men's head coach Dan Ross for the 1994-95 season.

"I'm proud and very excited to have John re-join the Purdue swimming and diving program," Ross said. "His life experiences, knowledge and love for Purdue, along with an incredible work ethic, will equate to great success for our women's swimming and diving team for years to come."

Klinge joined the Buckeyes after serving as the head coach at both Bozeman High School and Bozeman Barracuda Swim Club in Bozeman, Mont. During his tenure at Bozeman, Klinge coached multiple National Age Group Top 16, Junior National, United States Open and high school All-America swimmers. He is well-trained in teaching proper employment of drills and stroke technique.

Klinge is also a commissioned officer for the United States Marine Corp. He is married to the former Chris Anderson, who also swam for Purdue University and is currently a coach of Dublin Swim Club. They have two sons, Jack and Matthew.

"We've loved our time at Ohio State as part of the Buckeye Swimming Program," Klinge said. "I can't thank Coach Wadley enough for his guidance over the last four years, and I couldn't ask to have worked with a nicer group of young men.

"It's hard not to get involved in all of the Buckeye traditions, but our family ties to Purdue are very strong. My wife's father went to Purdue as did her two brothers, so we can't be more excited to return to West Lafayette."

# SEASON PREVIEW Q&A



What are you most looking forward to now that you are back at Purdue?

I think I am most looking forward to establishing a culture of excellence on the team that we can build from, not only this year, but for years to come. My whole family is excited to be back. My wife was a swimmer on the Purdue Team - we were freshmen here together back in 1989 - so it's been a great move for the whole family.

Have you set your sights on any goals you hope to accomplish here?

Looking forward to the next couple of years, the biggest goals we have are to get ourselves in contention to fight for a Big Ten championship, get in the top ten nationally and then fight for a national championship. This season, we came up with our goals together as a team. This included academic and athletic goals as well as defining a lot of intangible qualities we expect from this point forward out of a Purdue swimmer. I think the women on the team enjoyed this process and feel a part of formulating what we think we need to do to achieve our longer-term goals.

What do you think is attainable for the team this year?

The goal for our team this year is to get in the top half of the Big Ten. The women on the team actually established that goal. I started out the year and talked about where we want to go and what we want to do in terms of the next few years, and then we all stated our goals for this year in a collaborative effort. Our goal is to be in the top half of the Big Ten, which is actually a big jump for us. I think it's a pretty high goal, but one that is attainable if we all do everything that we can.

Who do you look towards as your major contributors from last year's squad?

There are quite a few that I think will contribute a lot, especially those that are returning back. All of our returning divers are a huge asset to our team. They have established an excellent "culture" and they should continue to shine this season. Our two team captains, Christine Inman and Leah Henninger, will contribute a lot, not just in terms of points but in the whole attitude, demeanor and culture of the team. They are going to be a pretty integral part of establishing that. We also have one senior, Elyse Dudar, who is definitely a leader in our system. Also, Allie Smith comes back and is a huge leader in terms of being our biggest returning points scorer from last year. Ariel Martin and Lisa Butler will contribute as sprinters we will rely on the whole season, and Jessica Davis should help us a great deal in the breaststroke events where we lost a few senior scorers. Katie Beck should continue to improve and help us in a wide range of events from backstroke to butterfly, and Morgan Lebsack should add to our butterfly events.

What freshmen do you think can make an immediate impact on the program?

Our freshman class has really come in and set a pretty high standard for the rest of the team. In training, they have really been aggressive and have done a very good job. Quite a few of them stand out, but Kristen Gilson in the backstroke, IM and freestyle has really made an impact already in terms of our training. Lauren Roth has really set high standards, as well. Also, Sarah Dunleavy has certainly come in and done very well. We expect big things from her, as well as the rest of the freshman class. Christina Jacobs has helped our team already because of her unbelievable attitude and team spirit.

Who do you think will stand out on this year's relays?

# Head Diving Coach 4th Season at Purdue

Adam Soldati has solidified his reputation as one of the best collegiate diving coaches in the nation in just three short years at Purdue.

Last season alone, four of his student-athletes advanced to the 2008 NCAA Championships with a pair of freshmen walking away with All-America honors. David Colturi scored a 363.85 on 1-meter and a 453.65 on platform and Kara Cook tallied 311.00 points on platform to give the duo the national accolades.

Colturi won the Region C Zone title on platform and placed third on 1-meter to advance to the NCAA Championships. He placed second on 3-meter at the Big Ten Championships with a score of 423.15 and finished third on 1-meter after racking up 357.55 points. Colturi finished his season as the freshman record holder in all three diving events and the program record holder in the 3-meter and on platform.

Cook clinched her spot at the NCAA Championships by placing second on the platform at the NCAA Region C Zones. She also won the platform title at the Big Ten Championships with a score of 289.00 points. Her score of 311.00 on the platform at the NCAA Championships placed her third all-time in program history.

Ashley Karnes and Katie Berg were the other two divers to advance to the NCAA Championships. Karnes won both the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard titles at the Region C Zones. She finished as the runner-up on 1-meter at the Big Ten Championships and was third on 3-meter. Karnes won 15 events last season, including nine consecutive springboard competitions. She was named Big Ten Diver of the Week on three occasions

Berg placed third on the platform at Region C Zones to clinch her spot at the NCAA Championships. She was also a finalist on both the 1-meter and platform at the Big Ten Championships.

The Purdue varsity record books have almost been completely rewritten under Soldati. For the men, 25 of the top 30 scores (top 10 scores across all three events) have been accumulated with Soldati at the helm, including the entire top 10 on platform. On the women's side, 16 of the top 30 scores have come under Soldati.

Last year alone, 14 male and female divers entered the record books. Colturi broke program records on the 3-meter (423.15) and platform (453.65) and is also third all-time on 1-meter (363.85). Kyle Mitrione moved up to seventh on the 3-meter list (351.35) and eighth on 1-meter (323.00). Zach Schultz, the record holder on 1-meter (377.45), jumped up to fifth all-time on the platform (358.95).

Karnes moved up the women's all-time lists last season. She now sits third in both 1-meter (317.45) and 3-meter (364.55). Cook entered the record books in third on the platform (311.00) and 10th on 3-meter (292.73). Emily Wetzel also made noise, jumping up to seventh on both the 1-meter (278.50) and platform (266.30) lists. Berg (283.30) and Emily Griesemer (235.50) moved up to fifth and 10th, respectively, in platform.

Soldati believes that success in the collegiate ranks is only the first step for his student-athletes. Not only does Soldati want his divers aspiring to become conference champions and All-Americans, he wants them to see the bigger picture - the Olympics. And Soldati has the experience to get them there.

Soldati spent last summer working with Colturi and former Boilermaker Amanda Miller with the goal of advancing to the Olympics in 2008 and beyond. Miller finished ninth on the 3-meter at the Olympic Team Trials with a score of 910.30. She went on to finish third at the USA Diving Olympic Team Selection Camp with partner Christina Loukas in 3-meter synchro. Colturi finished 10th on 10-meter at the Trials after tallying a 1229.30.

Prior to his arrival at Purdue, Soldati worked with Olympic gold-medal coach Kenny Armstrong at the USA Diving National Training Center outside Houston. During his tenure, Soldati worked side-by-side with several Olympians, including Laura Wilkinson, Troy and Justin Dumais, Justin Wilcox, and Kimiko Soldati.

As head coach for the Woodlands Diving national team, Soldati guided three divers (J.J. Kinzbach, Harrison Jones and Jessica Livingston) to the finals of the 2004 Olympic Trials and five divers (Kinzbach, Jones, Drew Livingston, Jessica Livingston and Whitney Wielgus) to Senior Nationals. Kinzbach also qualified for the U.S. National Team. Soldati finished the summer taking Kinzbach and Jones to the Junior World Championships.

Following his graduation from Indiana University in 1997, Soldati founded Indiana Diving and Youth Development while serving as the Hoosiers' assistant coach and diving events director. Both programs succeeded at the highest levels with his involvement.

From June 1997 to January 2000, Soldati's club program advanced six athletes to the U.S. Senior National Diving Championships, plus four finalists and eight athletes to the U.S. Junior National Championships and earned one national championship. At the same time, he was helping his Hoosiers win three consecutive national diving titles from 1998 to 2000.

Soldati, 32, is married to Kimiko Hirai Soldati, who was a member of the 2004 U.S. Olympic Diving Team. The couple's first child, Blake, was born in November of 2005.

# Asst. Swimming Coach 12th Season at Purdue



Darlene Renie is in her 12th year as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Purdue program.

As the main recruiter for the Purdue women's program, Renie has been and continues to be responsible for all aspects of both on- and off-campus recruiting.

Since joining the Purdue staff, Renie has used her expertise, personal example and excellent recruiting skills to help take Purdue from the lower half of the Big Ten Conference to a respectable fifth-place showing in 2006 and three consecutive top-25 finishes at NCAAs.

Many of Renie's recruits continued

to excel for the Boilermakers in 2007-08, including Allie Smith, who broke the 200 back program record last season with a time of 1:58.66. Renie also received top efforts from seven student-athletes who set NCAA B qualifying marks in 14 different events. Plus, the 200 and 400 free relay and the 400 medley relay teams made the NCAA B cut.

Since her arrival to the coaching staff in 1997, Renie has coached two Big Ten champions and guided 12 different student-athletes to either All-America or honorable mention All-America honors at the NCAA Championships. Renie's most consistent performers at the national meet were Lisa Dolansky, Patricia Finnerty and Lindsay Lange, each of whom qualified for three straight meets from 2001 to 2003. Together on both medley relays and the 200 freestyle relay, these three competitors combined for 15 honorable mention All-America citations. Kim Paradeise shared in their relay success in 2002 and 2003, earning four honorable mention All-America certificates on her own. Gyongyver Lakos was part of the 2001 400 medley relay that also placed among the top 16 at nationals.

Renie, formerly Darlene Warta, was an outstanding swimmer and student-athlete at Purdue from 1987 to 1990. A two-time team captain, Renie became Purdue's first female swimmer to be selected as an All-American after she placed fifth in the 200-yard butterfly at the 1989 NCAA Championships. In 1990, Renie earned All-America honors again in the 200 fly and honorable mention recognition as a member of the 400 medley relay team. Renie also captured two Big Ten titles by winning the conference's 200 butterfly in 1988 and 1990.

A four-year letterwinner, she was a Senior Nationals consolation champion, a Junior Nationals qualifier, a four-time NCAA qualifier and the first woman in Purdue history to score individually at the NCAAs. She was named Purdue's Outstanding Senior Athlete by Mortar Board and the John Purdue Club's Chicago Athlete of the Year her senior year. By the time she finished her illustrious career, she held school records in the 100 and 200 fly, 800 free and 400 medley relays.

A native of Chicago, Renie and her husband, Jeff, live in Lafayette. Jeff, also a Purdue swimming alumnus, was a member of the 1986-87 Boilermaker squad under current head coach Dan Ross.

The Renies have three children: Jessica, Jake and Joshua.



# Vol. Diving Coach 4th Season at Purdue



Kimiko Hirai Soldati is in her fourth year as the volunteer assistant diving coach at Purdue, joining her husband, Adam, on the deck of the Boilermaker Aquatic Center.

A 2004 member of the U.S. Olympic diving team, Soldati's list of accomplishments in athletics and academics is nearly endless. Her most recent accolades include 3-meter championships at the 2004 U.S. National and Olympic Trial meets and a 10-meter synchro title with Laura Wilkinson at the 2004 American Cup.

Soldati began her collegiate career at Colorado State but transferred

to Indiana for the start of the 1994-95 season. After one year of redshirting, Soldati qualified for her first NCAA Championship and was victorious in 1-meter competition. For her efforts, she was selected as IU's 1996 Female Athlete of the Year.

Not only was Soldati rewarded by IU for her athletic accomplishments, but her academic endeavors as well. Soldati earned a degree in kinesiology from IU in 1997, sporting a perfect 4.0 grade-point average, and was chosen as her school's valedictorian. In December of 2001, Soldati received her masters degree in athletic administration/sports management again maintaining a solid 4.0. A former GTE Academic All-American, Soldati twice received the Jack D. Tichenor Award (in 1996 and 1997), which is presented to those students who achieve the highest degree of academic excellence.

Soldati earned her spot on the USA national team right out of college in 1998, and became the first female in U.S. Diving history to qualify for finals in all five events at the national championships. In the fall of 2000, Soldati made the move to The Woodlands, Texas, with her husband, to train with Olympic coach Kenny Armstrong.

Soldati and Armstrong proved to be a winning combination. At the 2001 Spring National Diving Championships, Soldati won the 1-meter title and earned silver medals off the 3-meter and 10-meter tower. These performances qualified her for her first major international competitions, the World Championships and Goodwill Games.


In September of 2001, Soldati shocked the world by winning a bronze medal for the United States on 3-meter springboard at the Goodwill Games after the media had speculated that women's springboard was the least likely event to earn a medal for the United States. Ironically, it ended up being the sole medal the U.S. was able to garner.

In 2002, Soldati went to the World Cup and won a silver medal in the 10 meter platform. She also made the finals in three other events, finishing among the top five of all three. Later that summer at the national championships, Soldati won her first national title on 3-meter springboard.

A two time U.S. Diver of the Year in 2001 and 2002, Soldati again qualified for the World Cup with partner Laura Wilkinson on 10-meter synchronized and brought home a spot for the Olympic Games. She also made the World Cup in 3-meter and 3-meter synchronized with Erin Quinn.

In addition to helping the Boilermaker divers, Soldati serves as a motivational speaker for different groups and causes. In the fall of 2005, Soldati gave the keynote address at the Academy for Eating Disorders national convention in Indianapolis. Soldati also plays an active part on the Revolve Tour, which is a Christian faith-based concert series and program designed specifically for teenage girls.

Soldati has also made the jump into the broadcast booth, providing coverage of the FINA/USA Grand Prix and the Kaiser Permanente National Diving Championships for the AT&T blue room web site.

Kara Cook and Emily Wetzel were second and third to Karnes on 1-meter. Emily Grisemer collected a NCAA zone-qualifying score of 281.70 points in finishing as the runner-up on 3-meter, while Cook and Katie Berg placed third and fourth.

Allie Smith provided excitement from the swimming pool, knocking off a pair of freshman records.

Smith's third-place and NCAA provisional cut of 2:00.07 in the 200 back erased Katie

Lallande's previous record of 2:01.17, which had been standing since 1994.

The Green Bay, Wis., native also eclipsed Jenae Gill's three-year old mark of 55.85 in the 100 back, posting another provisional cut of 55.84 leading off the 400 medley relay.

Smith began her night recording a personal and season best 2:04.87 in the 200 individual medley and senior Nicole Weatherman finished second in the 500 free with an NCAA consideration time of 4:53.93.

"This was a very tough competition, but they kept fighting and scraping for every point, which sets us up well for Big Ten's," Wright-Eger said. "We're rising up to meet the shave times we produced back in November, so I expect the best is still yet to come from this group of athletes. They're very exciting to watch."

Saturday's top performances were turned in by Smith who placed second in the 100 back (56.18) and led the fourth-place 200 medley relay with a leadoff split of 27.01.

Senior Nicole Weatherman also had a strong afternoon with third-place showings in the 200 (1:52.87) and 1000 free (10:04.11).





# End Of The Line

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - Purdue earned a seventh-place finish at the Big Ten Championships with a total of 284 points.

The Boilermakers totaled 17 NCAA provisional cuts this weekend, including ones on the 200 and 400 free relays and the 400 medley relay.

Most of the praise was given to the diving unit that totaled 113 points.

Sophomore Ashley Karnes succeeded in the springboard challenges as expected. She recorded lifetime best totals on 1-meter (317.45) and 3-meter (335.00) to finish second and third, respectively, which earned her Purdue's highpoint award with 33 points. For her runner-up showing on 1-meter, Karnes was named to the All-Big Ten second team.

But what wasn't expected was freshman Kara Cook moving up from an eighth-place preliminary score of 248.60 to win the conference platform title with 289.00 points. Cook was named to the All-Big Ten first team as a result of her victory and is Purdue's third conference champion on platform over the last five years.

Freshman Allie Smith succeeded in breaking the varsity record in the 200 backstroke. Smith swam a 1:58.73 in prelims to surpass Lisa Dolansky's 2003 record of 1:59.43, then lowered her mark to a 1:58.66 to finish 11th in finals.

Smith lowered her freshman records in the 100 backstroke and 200 individual medley to 55.11 and 2:02.41 earlier this weekend. Both those marks rank second on Purdue's all-time top performance lists.

Senior Nicole Weatherman began the finals session with an eighth-place and personal best time of 16:34.64 in the 1650 freestyle, which ranks as the third-fastest time in Boilermaker history. Weatherman's previous best in the mile was about nine seconds slower at 16:43.33.

Senior Jennifer Lavers posted a 2:16.15 in prelims and a 2:17.20 in finals of the 200 breaststroke.

Senior Shannon Grace also fared well in the 200 breaststroke, lowering her personal best from a 2:17.02 to an 11th place finals time of 2:16.20.

Lavers and Grace scored in both breaststroke races, and senior Lauren Hyman accomplished the same through the butterfly events. Hyman, who placed 11th last night in the 100 fly, earned the 16th-place point in the 200 fly with a personal record of 2:02.29.

Sophomore Leah Henninger just missed scoring in the 100 free despite posting a 50.97 to finish 17th in prelims. She did go on, however, to help Purdue place eighth in the 400 freestyle relay with a time of 3:24.04.

Henninger led off the relay with a lifetime best 100-yard split of 50.94 and was followed by Lisa Butler (50.62), Ariel Martin (51.48) and Grace (51.00).

Minnesota won the Big Ten title with 660.5 points, which gave the conference its third different champion in as many years. The Golden Gophers last won a conference crown in 2000.

Michigan finished a distant second with 609 points and last year's champion Indiana placed third with 513 points. Penn State and Northwestern rounded out the top five - a place where Wright-Eger wants to see Purdue get back to.

"Seventh place is never the goal ... but I'm really proud of this team," she said. "They've fought hard all year, had to battle through a lot of situations they couldn't control, and faced a demanding schedule that forced them to focus on themselves and always do their best," said Wright-Eger.

# LAFAYETTE WEST LAFAYETTE

West Lafayette, the location of Purdue University's main campus, is the twin city of Lafayette, the county seat of Tippecanoe County. On the banks of the Wabash River, surrounded by rich, green farmlands, the cities are located 60 miles northwest of Indianapolis and 120 miles southeast of Chicago.

With a population of more than 150,000, Tippecanoe County is one of the largest communities in northwestern Indiana, accessible from Interstate 65; U.S. Highways 52 and 231; and State Roads 25, 26, 38 and 43. Major bus lines and Amtrak trains stop daily. The Purdue Airport opened in 1930 as the first university-owned airport in the nation.

Lafayette-West Lafayette is a regional hub for restaurants, shops, museums and entertainment. The community offers three movie theaters with 25 screens, daily and weekly newspapers, 12 radio stations, a television station and cable system, 150 churches of all major denominations, an art museum, a historical museum, 2,100 acres of public parks and more than 30 miles of trails.

Nearby points of historic and scenic interest include Fort Ouiatenon, on the National Register of Historic Places; Battle Ground, where William Henry Harrison fought the Battle of Tippecanoe; and the Museum at Prophetstown and Prophetstown State Park, dedicated to the preservation of Woodland Native American agricultural and environmental heritage.

Lafayette also is home to the Long Center for the Performing Arts, Clegg Botanical Garden and Columbian Park Zoo. Located on the eastern side of the Wabash River, Lafayette shares the 13-mile long Wabash Heritage Trail with West Lafayette. Nearby Battle Ground, located northwest of West Lafayette, boasts Wolf Park, where people can see live wolves, coyotes and foxes in their natural habitat.

Not only are there places to go in Lafayette-West Lafayette, but there also are plenty of things to do. The area serves as host to numerous community events throughout the year, including the Taste of Tippecanoe, 'Round the Fountain Art Fair, Dancing in the Streets, Global Fest, Feast of the Hunters' Moon, Christmas Parade, Gus Macker 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament, Colt World Series and Trails of Tippecanoe Bike Tour.

West Lafayette has experienced a recent renaissance of sorts in an area called "the levee," located just across the John T. Myers Pedestrian Bridge from Riehle Plaza and downtown Lafayette. More than \$100 million worth of construction has gone into developing Wabash Landing. The result is numerous restaurants, shops and apartments that have made the location a new focal point for locals and students alike.

A diverse mixture of night spots, shopping centers, art museums and restaurants give Lafayette-West Lafayette a distinct and unique flavor. Boasting the convenience of a modern city and friendly "down-home" residents, Lafayette-West Lafayette is one of America's most-livable communities.


Beneath much of Indiana's rich soil is limestone. A large amount of the building limestone used in the U.S. is quarried in Indiana.

Those looking for a little adventure in Indiana can access more than 1.1 million acres of land available for outdoor recreation. Some of that land can be found in southern Indiana, where Wyandotte Cave, one of the largest caverns in the U.S., is located.

One can work and play in Indiana. But when it comes to sports spectating, Indiana is second to none. Everything starts in Indianapolis, home of the NFL Super Bowl Champion Colts, NBA Pacers and WNBA Fever. The Indians, a Triple-A baseball team, play at Victory Field, while Indianapolis also is home to the Indiana Ice hockey team. During the summer, the city plays host to the Indianapolis Tennis Championships, a precursor to the U.S. Open. The summer starts with the Indianapolis 500, followed by the Allstate 400 at the Brickyard and draws to a close with the Red Bull Indianapolis GP, car and motorcycle races run at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

Indianapolis has hosted one women's basketball and five men's basketball NCAA Final Fours. The men's finals return in 2010 and the women in 2011. Additionally the city has conducted at least one Olympic Trials each year since 1984, including those for swimming and diving, synchronized swimming, track and field and wrestling.

Long known as the "mother of astronauts" and a world leader in engineering, science and agricultural education and research, Purdue University also sends its sons and daughters to make a difference around the world and at home in business, government and even entertainment.


Of the more than 392,100 living Purdue alumni, 44 percent reside in Indiana. More than 19,000 call California home, and nearly 12,000 reside in Texas; the Hawaiian Islands are home to 714, and 350 live in Alaska.

Purdue graduates are pioneers and achievers in occupations as diverse as being elected to the Australian Parliament, serving as director of the National Science Foundation and head of Disney Studios. Others have become underwater explorers, traveled the country and world as relief workers with American Red Cross, founded support groups for cancer survivors and operated the largest duckling farm in the United States.

Nearly two-dozen members of the astronaut corps studied at Purdue. Notable among them are Neil Armstrong, Class of 1955, and Eugene Cernan, Class of 1956. Armstrong made history in 1969 as the first man to land a craft and step on the moon; Cernan was the last to leave it in 1972.

#### Academics

At Purdue University, we place value in the intercollegiate athletics experience of our student-athletes. #### Academic Learning Center

The facilities in the Jane P. Beering Academic Learning Center and the staff in academic support services are available to help all of our student-athletes reach their academic goals. The Jane P. Beering Academic Learning Center is located on the second floor of the Intercollegiate Athletic Facility and offers a range of academic support services for our student-athletes. Services available include: monitored study tables; individual and group tutoring; 74-station computer lab; walk-in tutoring for math, chemistry and physics; supplemental instruction; laptop computers for traveling; and note-takers.

#### **Tutorial Program**

Tutorial Services are offered to all student-athletes free of charge. Our tutorial staff consists of undergraduate and graduate students, instructors from campus, professionals from the community, and retired Purdue faculty. Commitment to Personal Development: To support the development of a well-balanced lifestyle for student-athletes, encouraging emotional well-being, personal growth and decision-making skills.


Commitment to Career Development: To encourage the student-athlete to develop and pursue career and life goals.

# BIG TEN CONFERENCE

A meeting of seven Midwest university presidents on January 11, 1895 at the Palmer House in Chicago to discuss the regulation and control of intercollegiate athletics, was the first development of what would become one of organized sports' most successful undertakings. Those seven men, behind the leadership of James H. Smart, president of Purdue University, established the principles for which the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives, more popularly known as the Big Ten Conference, would be founded.

At that meeting, a blueprint for the control and administration of college athletics under the direction of appointed faculty representatives was outlined. The presidents' first-known action "restricted eligibility for athletics to bonafide, full-time students who were not delinquent in their studies."

This helped limit some problems of the times, especially the participation of professional athletes and "non-students" in the university's regular sporting events. That important legislation, along with others that would follow in the coming years, served as the primary building block for amateur intercollegiate athletics.

Eleven months after the presidents met, one faculty member from each of those seven universities met at the same Palmer House, and officially established the mechanics of the "Intercollegiate conference of Faculty Representatives", or "Big Ten Conference" of "Western Conference."

Those seven universities were: University of Chicago, University of Illinois, University of Michigan, University of Minnesota, Northwestern University, Purdue University and the University of Wisconsin. Indiana University and the State University of Iowa were admitted in 1899. Ohio State joined in 1912. Chicago withdrew in 1946 and Michigan State College (now Michigan State University) was added three years later in 1949.

After a 40-year period of constancy in membership, the Conference expanded to 11 members for the first time. On June 4, 1990, the Council of Presidents voted to confirm its earlier decision to integrate Pennsylvania State University into the Conference.

At the turn of the century, faculty representatives established rules for intercollegiate athletics that were novel for the time. As early as 1906, the faculty approved legislation that required eligible athletes to meet entrance

requirements and to have completed a full year's work, along with having one year of residence. Freshmen and graduate students were not permitted to compete, training tables (or quarters) were forbidden, and coaches were to be appointed by university bodies "at modest salaries."

Football and baseball were the popular sports prior to 1900. Wisconsin won the first two football championships and Chicago claimed the first three baseball titles. The first "official" sponsored championship was in out-door track. It was held at the University of Chicago in 1906 with Michigan earning the title.

Today, the Big Ten sponsors 25 championships, 12 for men and 13 for women. There have been many different athletic events popularized on Big Ten campuses. Some became extremely popular - football and basketball, for example. Others, like boxing, fell by the wayside.

The office of the commissioner of athletics was created in 1922 "to study athletic problems of the various Western Conference universities and assist in enforcing the eligibility rules which govern Big Ten athletics." Major John L. Griffith was appointed as the first commissioner and served in that position until his death in 1944. Kenneth L. "Tug" Wilson, former director of athletics at Northwestern, served from 1944 until he retired in 1961. Bill Reed, an assistant commissioner since 1951, succeeded Wilson until his death in 1971. Wayne Duke became the fourth Big Ten

commissioner in 1971 and retired June 30, 1989. Duke was succeeded by James E. Delany on July 1, 1989. Delany came to the Big Ten following 10 years as Ohio Valley Conference Commissioner.

#### BIG TEN FACTS

- Big Ten Universities are members of the nation's only conference whose constituency is entirely composed of institutions that are members of the AAU, a prestigious association of major academic and research institutions in the United States and Canada.
- Big Ten Universities have more than four million living alumni and over 300,000 undergraduate students attending Big Ten universities.
- Big Ten Universities house on their campuses 10 of the nation's 35 largest academic libraries. Collectively, conference libraries hold nearly 70 million bound volumes and the institutions work collaboratively to build and share their resources with other league members.
- Since 1992, the Big Ten has created in excess of 2,000 new opportunities for women student-athletes and established 28 new women's teams.

- Big Ten universities provide approximately \$94 million in direct financial aid to more than 8,400 men and women student-athletes who compete for 25 championships, 12 for men and 13 for women. Conference institutions sponsor broad-based athletic programs with more than 270 teams.
- See their student-athletes graduate at a rate nine percent higher than all Division I student-athletes.
- The Big Ten recognized 2,018 Academic All-Big Ten honorees during the 2006-07 academic year, the highest total in the last decade. Over the past five years, the Conference has annually acknowledged more than 1,800 student-athletes as Academic All-Conference honorees.
- "Big Ten Conference schools are among the national attendance leaders in football, men's and women's basketball and women's volleyball. During 2006-07, more than 8.7 million fans attended Big Ten home contests in those sports.

# BIG TEN NETWORK

In June of 2006, the Big Ten announced the creation of the Big Ten Network, a national network devoted to Big Ten athletic and academic programs. Available to all cable and satellite providers nationwide, with most programs offered in stunning high-definition television (HDTV), the network will allow fans to see their home teams, regardless of where they live.

The network is led by President Mark Silverman, a former Disney executive who came to the network after serving as the general manager and senior vice president of ABC Cable Networks Group since April of 2004, managing the company's equity in such channels as Lifetime Television, A&E Network and the History Channel, each of which recorded their best financial performance in 2005. Silverman was also responsible for developing and launching new cable channels, shows and other key initiatives.

The Big Ten Network launches its inaugural season in August 2007 with football, men's and women's basketball, a nightly studio show, classics and coaches shows, along with more Olympic sporting events and exposure for women's sports than has ever been aired on any other network. In June

of 2007, the Big Ten announced that the Big Ten Network will become the first national network to commit to "event equality" for men's and women's sports on all network-controlled media within the first three years of launch. This dedication to "event equality" highlights the Big Ten's ongoing dedication to gender equity, which is aligned with the commitment of conference institutions to provide fairness for all female student-athletes.

The programming on the Big Ten Network and alternative network-controlled platforms will include, but is not limited to:

- More than 35 football games each season
- More than 105 regular season men's basketball games
- A nightly studio show including segments from each campus
- Women's sports, including basketball, volleyball, soccer and softball
- More than 170 Olympic sporting events including baseball, soccer, tennis, volleyball, swimming, diving and more
- Classic games and historical footage from ESPN and ABC libraries
- Original campus programming produced by Big Ten member universities showcasing their academic excellence, talented students and award-winning programs
- Weekly coaches shows

Located in the historic Montgomery Ward building in Chicago, the Big Ten Network is the first national television network to call the largest city in the Midwest its home. The original section of the building was designated as a historic landmark in 2000 for its significant role in American retail history. The space includes two studios and three control rooms as well as a 20,000 square-foot office space.

In May of 2007, the Big Ten Network announced its first on-air hire, signing ESPN college sports expert Dave Revsine to be its lead studio host. Revsine joined ESPN in October of 1996 as an anchor for ESPNews and filled a variety of roles for the network over the past 10 years. The Northwestern graduate has anchored SportsCenter, hosted ESPN Radio's College GameDay for the last six years and hosted ESPN Radio's coverage of several BCS Championship games. He also hosted studio halftimes for basketball and co-hosted ESPN's coverage of the last two men's Final Fours.

In addition to airing more coverage of Big Ten sports than ever before, the Big Ten Network will also provide numerous benefits to communities around the Big Ten. Those include increased exposure for women's sports, providing positive role models for girls; a greater economic impact to the communities from added sporting event production, with the potential to generate higher attendance; and greater national exposure for the excellence that surrounds the academic endeavors of Big Ten universities, some of the most highly regarded in the nation. Also, an internship program at each of the 11 universities will offer students training for careers in sports, television and entertainment.
