GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 778-414 all-time, including a 248-220 mark on the road.
- Purdue is 192-95 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 309-160.
- Purdue is 363-184 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 154-120 record on the road.
- Versyp is 90-49 at Purdue in conference play and 99-56 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 211-126 in January, including an 89-81 mark away from home. The Boilermakers are 7-3 all-time on Jan. 11, including a 5-3 record on the road.
- Purdue is 26-14 all-time in the 16th game of the season.
- Purdue is now 36-30 all-time against Iowa and 10-18 in Iowa City.
- The Boilermakers are 36-31 all-time against teams from Iowa, and are 12-19 all-time when playing in the Hawkeye State.
- The Boilermakers are 102-147 all-time against ranked opponents, and 16-57 when Purdue is unranked against a ranked opponent.
- Purdue shot just 34.5 percent from the floor (20-58), including 25.8 percent in the second half (8-31).
- Purdue outrebounded Iowa, 44-34, but turned 19 offensive rebounds into just 18 second-chance points.
- The Boilermakers held Iowa to just four three-point field goals, as the Hawkeyes came in averaging 8.9 per game (ranked eighth in the NCAA).
- The Hawkeyes made 17-of-19 at the free throw line (.895), against Purdue's 15-for-19 (.789). They're just the third team to make more free throws than the Boilermakers this season.
- Iowa came into Sunday shooting 66.6 percent from the free throw line.
- Purdue had just 10 assists on 20 made field goals.
- The Boilermakers committed 18 turnovers, which turned into 20 points for Iowa. Purdue scored just nine points off of nine Hawkeye turnovers.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Whitney Bays had her seventh straight double-double, finishing with 13 points and 11 rebounds. She now has 10 this season and 18 for her career.
- Ashley Morrissette scored a team-high 15 points.
- Liza Clemons was just shy of a double-double with 10 points and nine rebounds.
- Andreona Keys had nine points and a career-high seven rebounds in her first career start.
