GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 779-417 all-time, including a 409-129 record at home.
- Purdue is 193-98 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 310-163.
- Purdue is 364-187 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 209-66 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Versyp is 91-52 at Purdue in conference play and 100-59 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 212-129 in January, including a 118-43 record at home. The Boilermakers are 6-6 all-time on Jan. 25, including a 3-3 record in Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is 23-16 all-time in the 20th game of the season.
- Ohio State has the most wins against Purdue in the Big Ten Conference, holding a 42-28 edge in the all-time series
- Purdue is 499-189 when playing in its home state of Indiana.
- In their second overtime game this week, the Boilers fall to 1-3 this season when playing extra time and 30-23 all-time. Purdue is 0-3 at home in overtime this year.
- The lead changed hands 16 times on Sunday and was tied 11 times.
- The Boilermakers scored just 22 first-half points on Sunday, their second-lowest total this season (19 vs. George Washington). However, Purdue's 42 points in the second half were its second-highest of the year (46 vs. Indiana).
- Purdue shot 27.3 percent (9-33) in the first half, 50 percent in the second half (16-32) and 28.6 percent in overtime (2-7).
- The Boilermakers made just six-of-19 from behind the arc (.319), but knocked down four-of-eight in the second half. Purdue is 2-8 this season when attempting 14 three-point field goals or more.
- After going to the half down 25-22, Purdue is 0-9 this season when trailing at halftime.
- Ohio State connected on 16-of-18 free throws, while Purdue made 11-of-17. The Boilermakers are 0-7 on the year when opponents make equal or more free throws. All 18 Ohio State free throws came in the second half and overtime.
- Purdue outscored Ohio State in the paint, 36-30. Boilers led category by as many as 32-16 in the second half.
- Despite Boilermakers earning 47-45 rebounding edge, 14-12 on offense, Ohio State had 15-10 second-chance point advantage.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Senior Whitney Bays had 22 points, a career-high 19 rebounds and four steals, marking her second straight 20-point outing and 13th double-double of the year.
- Bays' 19 rebounds tie the 10th-best single-game total in Purdue history (Sue Bartz and Sam Ostarello).
- Bays ties the Boilermakers' single-season double-double record, matching Stacey Lovelace (1995-96) and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton (2008-09). Her 21 career double-doubles are third all-time at Purdue.
- Senior Liza Clemons was just shy of her third double-double of the season, finishing with 10 points and nine rebounds.
- Junior April Wilson turned in 12 points and six assists, but matched a season-high seven turnovers.
- Freshman Andreona Keys was just short of her career high with 11 points, and grabbed a career-high three steals.
- Ohio State freshman Kelsey Mitchell set a Mackey Arena scoring record with 37 points, netting 10-of-25 from the floor, four-of-12 from three and 13-of-14 from the free throw line. The previous record was shared by Camille Cooper of Purdue (3/20/00) and LSU's Marie Ferdinand (3/18/01).
