

KATE FOWEE FORWARD WHEATON, ILLINOIS

- Four-year letterwinner has seen action in 16 Big Ten games for the Boilermakers.
- Scored a goal in the 2012 home game against Wisconsin.
- Was the lone member of the freshman class to score a goal in 2012.
- Logged double-figure minutes seven times while playing in a career-high 11 games in 2013.
- Was among the six students from the school of aeronautics and astronautics selected to travel to the Kennedy Space Center in December 2014 for the first space test flight of NASA's Orion Capsule.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree has compiled a 3.43 GPA as an aeronautical & astronautical engineering major.





KIM LOVE DEFENDER WEST CHESTER. OHIO

- Four-year starting center back has started all 66 games in which she has played, missing only the first three games of 2013 due to injury.
- Enters the week having started 47 consecutive games overall and 39 straight in Big Ten action, both being the longest active streaks on the team.
- Leads the team in minutes played this season (1092) as the only Boilermaker to not come off the field yet; enters the week having logged 1838 consecutive minutes.
- Played every minute of 2012 as a freshman and also did not come off the field in all 16 games she played as a sophomore.
- Assisted on goals by Nicole Robertson in 2015 and Kate Fowee in 2012.
- Two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree has compiled a 3.43 GPA while majoring in human & health sciences.

- Settled in as an outside back as a senior and has started every game.
- Scored each of her three goals as a Boilermaker in Big Ten, scoring against Ohio State, Maryland and Minnesota.
- Scored the goal that gave Alex Hairston her Purdue record 23rd career assist
- Became the first Boilermaker since 2011 to score each of her first two goals in Big Ten play.
- Has made 22 of her 31 career starts in Big Ten play.
- Assisted on Melissa Casella's goal against Missouri this season.

TV GAME AT OHIO STATE HIGHLIGHTS PURDUE'S BIG WEEK

• In what could prove to be a make-or-break week, the Boilermakers' games this week at Ohio State (1-2-2, 5 points) and vs. No. 23 Rutgers (2-2-1, 7 points) set up as matchups with teams right along side Purdue (2-3, 6 points) in the thick of the Big Ten Tournament chase. Thursday's game at Ohio State is being televised live by the Big Ten Network. Behind a pair of goals from **Maddy Williams**, the Boilers were a 3-1 winner vs. OSU last year on BTN. Williams scored the game winner in the 81st minute off a flip throw-in by **Christa Szalach**. A video of the goal was viewed over 330,000 times across social media and the Internet. Purdue was a 1-0 winner at Ohio State in its last visit to Columbus (September 2013). • Seniors **Kate Fowee**, **Kim Love** and **Makaela Nellams** along with senior members of the support staff will be recognized prior to Sunday's senior day game against Rutgers. It will be the first time Purdue has ever hosted the Scarlet Knights. However, they did play lowa at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex in the quarterfinals of the 2014 Big Ten Tournament.

LEINERT BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Hannah Leinert was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after recording the gamewinning goal as well as an assist in the Oct. 2 win vs. Nebraska. She scored the game winner in the 85th minute after earlier making a great field-reversing pass to set up **Erika Arkans**' first-half goal that gave the Boilers a halftime lead.
- Leinert is the first Boilermaker to claim Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since **Maddy Williams** in October 2013. Coincidentally, Leinert has accomplished the rare feat of being named Player of the Week in two different conferences. While playing for Illinois State, she was selected as the Missouri Valley Conference Offensive Player of the Week after the opening weekend of both the 2013 and 2014 seasons.
- Leinert recorded a goal and an assist in the same game for the second time this season. Purdue improved to 5-0 when she has scored this year. The junior has recorded a point in seven of the eight

games in which the Boilers have scored a goal in the traditional run of play. She accounted for the latest game winner in a Big Ten game (excluding overtime wins) since Felicia Schroeder scored in the 89th minute of the 2008 Big Ten opener against Northwestern. The win against Nebraska was Purdue's first against the Huskers at home since September 2005.

EARLY & LATE GOALS BEGINNING TO ADD UP

- The Boilermakers have scored in the first 10 minutes of a game five times and the final 10 minutes of a game six times. Not surprisingly, Purdue is 4-0 when scoring in the first 10 minutes this season, with two of those five early goals coming in the win vs. Montana.
- Meanwhile, the six goals in the final 10 minutes of regulation are already tied for the second most in program history. Nicole Robertson (89th minute), Dagny Olson (85th) and Hannah Leinert (85th) accounted for the dramatic game winners in victories vs. Xavier, Baylor and Nebraska, respectively.

YOHN BUSY PROTECTING THE NET

• Goalkeeper **Erika Yohn** made a season-high seven saves in the Nebraska victory, helping Purdue win a game in which it came up on the short end of the shot (17-9) and corner kick (10-3) counts. She has made at least five saves in each of the last four games, accumulating 24 total over that stretch. Yohn enters the week sixth in the Big Ten in saves per game (4.0) and third in conference play (5.2).

BOILERS LOOKING TO END POST-SEPTEMBER STRUGGLES

• From 2000 to 2009, Purdue won 10-plus games for 10 consecutive seasons. Part of the reason the Boilers have not won more than eight games since 2009 is their struggles after the calendar flips to October. Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Purdue has won only three games in October or November (two coming in 2013). Furthermore, the Boilers have not won a game after October 7 since 2011. In fact, the 2011 team was responsible for three of Purdue's seven October wins since the start of 2010.

• While it is true that the schedule gets tougher as Big Ten play heats up in October, the Boilers have actually held their own in conference play in September. Since 2010, Purdue is 8-13-3 (.396) in September Big Ten games, accounting for more than half of its point-producing results in conference action the last six years (15-42-4 B1G overall, .279). Ultimately, to have a successful season, the Boilers will have to find a way to win games consistently after Sept. 30 at some point.

NELLAMS SCORES ON PURDUE'S FIRST PK BUT WINLESS DROUGHTS PERSIST

- The Boilermakers were unable to come away with any standings points while making their first trips to Minnesota and Wisconsin since 2011. The Sept. 25 loss to league-leading and 18th-ranked Minnesota kept Purdue winless against nationally ranked opponents since a September 2009 win at Texas A&M. Meanwhile, after dropping their second 1-0 game of the Big Ten season Sunday in Madison, the Boilers remained winless against Wisconsin since 2008.
- Oddly, the majority of the active Boilermakers played games at Big Ten newcomers Maryland and Rutgers (in 2014) before they did at Minnesota or Wisconsin. Purdue had played 23 regular-season true road games (including 18 Big Ten matches) in 16 different locations since it last made the Minnesota-Wisconsin road trip in October 2011.
- Makaela Nellams converted on Purdue's first penalty-kick opportunity of the season Friday at Minnesota to account for the only goal of the road trip. It was her third career goal, all coming in Big Ten play.

LOVE RIDING CONSECUTIVE MINUTES STREAK

- Center back **Kim Love** is the only Boilermaker that has played all 1092 minutes of the season so far and has logged 1,838 consecutive minutes dating back to the final six minutes of the Sept. 26, 2014, game against Minnesota. Love (47) also continues to sport the longest active consecutive games started streak on the team. She has started all 66 games in which she has played for Purdue. Previously, Love played every minute of the 2012 season (1,797) and also logged 1,472 consecutive minutes as a sophomore in 2013.
- Mikayla Lasky played every minute (1,764) last year and logged 3,225 consecutive minutes from September 2013 through the first half of the 2015 season opener. She missed three games due to injury during the season-opening homestand, ending her consecutive games started streak at 36. Megan Kaser was pressed into duty at center back for the first time as a Boilermaker and went the distance in all three games Lasky missed. Lasky returned to the starting lineup in time for the Montana Cup (Sept. 11-13) and also started the Big Ten opener against Northwestern, but has again been sidelined since. Dannah Williams has taken over at center back during Big Ten play in Lasky's absence.
- Fellow defender **Vanessa Korolas** ranks second on the team with four assists and is third among the field players in minutes played (858). She has started all 30 games since the start of the 2014 season.

PURDUE DEFEATS ILLINOIS TO SPLIT BIG TEN-OPENING WEEKEND

- One streak was extended and another came to an end as the Boilers split home games with Illinois and Northwestern during the conference-opening weekend. A 3-1 win Sept. 20 kept Purdue unbeaten (6-0-3) all-time at home against Illinois. But the Boilers' 11-game win streak vs. Northwestern, the longest in program history against any opponent, was snapped in a 1-0 loss Sept. 18. Purdue had not lost to Northwestern since 2004.
- Freshman Hannah Mussallem recorded her first collegiate goal to open the scoring in the Illinois win, joining Melissa Casella as Boilermakers to score their first goals this season. Seniors Kate Fowee (2011 vs. Wisconsin) and Makaela Nellams (2014 vs. Ohio State) also scored their first goals in Big Ten games. Andrea Petrina and Hannah Leinert accounted for their first goals in Big Ten play in the victory vs. Illinois as well.
- Freshman **Dannah Williams** made her first start at center back vs. Illinois after seeing action primarily as a defensive midfielder. **Christa Szalach** moved into the starting lineup in the midfield, making her first start of the season. Goalkeeper **Erika Yohn** matched her season high with six saves in the Illinois victory.

NEW BOILERMAKER SOCCER COMPLEX ATTENDANCE RECORD ESTABLISHED

• Purdue closed out its Big Ten-opening weekend with a 3-1 victory vs. Illinois in front of a Boilermaker Soccer Complex record crowd of 1,488 on youth soccer day in which the Greater Lafayette Regional Soccer Alliance/Boilers FC club team brought hundreds of fans to the field. The previous Soccer Complex attendance record of 1,318 was established two years ago on GLRSA day vs. Wisconsin. Last season's GLRSA day crowd of 1,305 vs. Ohio State came up just short of the previous record.

BOILERS SHUT OUT FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 2015

- Thanks to a win vs. the host Grizzlies, Purdue participated in the championship game of the Montana Cup the weekend of Sept. 11-13. But the Boilers were shut out for the first time this season in a 2-0 loss to Seattle, a side that qualified for the NCAA Tournament the last two years. The loss also marked the first time this year that Purdue didn't score the first goal or enjoy a halftime lead. The Boilermakers had scored in eight consecutive regular-season games dating back to the finale of the 2014 campaign. It was the program's longest streak since scoring in the first 13 games of the 2013 season.
- The Montana Cup was played in Missoula at an elevation of 3,200 feet. It marked the fourth-highest altitude for road matches in program history.

LEINERT'S EIGHTH CAREER MULTI-GOAL GAME THE DIFFERENCE VS. MONTANA

- Hannah Leinert scored twice in the first half of Purdue's 3-1 win at Montana Sept. 11. It was her first multi-goal game as a Boilermaker but the eighth of her college career after she posted seven in her two years at Illinois State. Leinert also scored the game winner in the Sept. 4 win vs. Evansville. In the process, she became the first Purdue player to account for a game-winning goal in consecutive games since Maddy Williams in October 2013.
- Leinert scored her sixth career goal against Evansville only two and half minutes after the opening kickoff. At ISU, she scored five of her 27 goals against the Purple Aces after the two teams met twice both years. Purdue closed its season-opening homestand with a 4-1 record and five victories overall including the Aug. 14 exhibition win vs. Miami (Ohio) that marked the beginning of the extended home stretch. The Boilermakers have still not conceded a goal in four all-time meetings with Evansville. Purdue also did not surrender a corner kick for the second time this season.

BOILERS SWEEP SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND AFTER COMEBACK WIN

- · Before losing in overtime to Missouri, Purdue started its season 3-0 for only the third time in program history. After winning their opener in shutout fashion (3-0 vs. Ohio) for the eighth time in team history, the Boilers had to rally to beat Xavier 4-3 Aug. 23. It marked the fourth time Purdue won a game in which it conceded three goals. Coincidentally, three of those four wins have been in the last three seasons.
- Despite a big edge in the shot count, the Boilers trailed Xavier 3-2 with just over five minutes to go. But goals by Maddy Williams and Nicole Robertson lifted Purdue to the thrilling victory. It marked the first time since the 2013 victory at Miami (Ohio), another 4-3 final, that the Boilers rallied to win after trailing with less than 10 minutes to go.

Williams posted a hat trick in the first 22 minutes of the Aug. 11 win at Milwaukee (4-0) and scored twice in the second half of the Aug. 14 victory vs. Miami University (2-0). Newcomer Dagny Olson also scored on a penalty kick at Milwaukee.
