## **GAME NOTES**

- With this win, Sharon Versyp's all-time record at Purdue improves to 139-70 and 256-135 overall in 13 years as a collegiate head coach.
- This was the eighth all-time meeting between the Boilermakers and the Falcons. Purdue now leads the series 5-3, winning the last three matchups.
- Purdue is now 2-0 with the starting lineup of KK Houser, Courtney Moses, Chantel Poston, Sam Ostarello, and Drey Mingo.
- The Boilermakers did not trail in the game tonight. Drey Mingo's scored 10 seconds into the game to give Purdue a 2-0 lead.
- Purdue started with a 12-4 run over the first 3:34 of the game. The Boilermakers scored the first six points of the contest before a minute of game play had gone by. Purdue held a 25-18 lead at the half.
- Bowling Green made just 3 of its first 15 shots. The Falcons had a span of 7:10 without a field goal before a Danielle Havel jumper ended the drought with 6:17 to go in the first half.
- After a Chrissy Steffen layup to start the second half for Bowling Green, Purdue went on a 17-1 run over the next 6:22 to give themselves a 21-point lead. The Falcons had another long drought after Steffen's opening basket, going 9:07 before an Allison Papenfuss jumper ended the spell.
- After the 17-1 run by the Boilermakers, Bowling Green would never get closer than 12 points the rest of the way.
- Purdue outscored Bowling Green 30-16 on points in the paint.
- By giving up only 45 points, Purdue held Bowling Green well below their season average of 73.5 points per game.
- Purdue is now 155-3 all-time when holding their opponent under 50 points.
- The Boilermakers are now 52-17 all-time against teams from the Mid-American Conference.

## **TEAM HIGHS AND LOWS**

- Leading the Boilermakers in scoring was Drey Mingo with 13 points. She and Sam Ostarello also led the team with 12 rebounds.
- Purdue did not allow a Falcon to reach double-figure scoring. Danielle Havel led the Falcons in scoring with nine points.

## **CAREER ACCOLADES**

- Drey Mingo posted her first double-double of the season and the fifth in her career. Her last double-double was 12 points and 15 rebounds at Penn State on Feb. 24, 2011.
- Sam Ostarello also had recorded a double-double, the first of the season and sixth of her career. Ostarello's last double-double was 12 points and 10 rebounds at Ohio State on Feb. 12, 2012.
- This was the 49th game in Purdue history that two players have posted double-doubles in the same game. Danielle Campbell and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton were the last to do so, at Indiana on January 19, 2009.
- Ostarello tied her career high with four blocks. It was the third time in her career she's reached that number, the last coming at home against IUPUI on Nov. 13, 2011.
