### THE NOTES TO KNOW

- No. 14-ranked Purdue "unofficially" tips off the 2024-25 season on Saturday night, when it travels to No. 15-ranked Creighton for a charity exhibition game benefitting the United Way of the Midlands Disaster Relief Fund. Funds from Saturday's contest will go to victims of devastating tornadoes that hit Omaha and the surrounding areas in late April.
- It marks the second straight year that Purdue will play a charity exhibition game for victims of violent tornadoes after Arkansas edged the Boilermakers in Fayetteville last October, 81-77, in overtime.
- Saturday's contest marks a return to Omaha for assistant coach **Paul Lusk**, who served on **Greg McDermott's** staff with the Bluejays for three seasons from 2018-19 to 2020-21. His son, Jack, is a 2023 graduate of Elkhorn North High School.
- Matt Painter** and **Greg McDermott** coached against each other in 2003-04, when Painter was the head coach at Southern Illinois and McDermott was at Northern Iowa. The two teams split the regular season meeting with McDermott's Panthers topping Southern Illinois 68-52 in the regular-season finale, denying Painter a perfect season in Missouri Valley Conference play. Both teams reached the NCAA Tournament that season, falling in their opening-round games. McDermott (Iowa State) also defeated the Boilermakers during the 2007-08 season.
- McDermott (474) and Painter (472) have combined for 946 career wins in 43 combined seasons - an average of 22.0 wins per season. The two were in the same bracket last season in the Midwest Region in Detroit.
- The Boilermakers open the 2024-25 campaign ranked No. 14 in the AP Top 25 preseason poll released Oct. 14.
- The Boilermakers have now been ranked in the preseason AP Top 25 poll in eight of the last 10 preseason polls dating to the 2015-16 season. The two seasons they weren't ranked came in 2022-23 (29-6 record; No. 1 seed) and 2020-21 (18-10 record; No. 4 seed).
- The preseason poll marks the first time since the Nov. 21, 2022 (ranked 24th) that Purdue hasn't been ranked in the AP top 5, ending a streak of 37 straight polls ranked in the top 5. Purdue was ranked in the top 3 in 32-of-37 of those polls. The 37 straight weeks in the top 5 was the third-longest streak in Big Ten history (41 by Ohio State, 1960-63; 38 by Indiana, 1975-77).
- Purdue has been ranked in 39 straight AP Top 25 polls, the sixth-longest active streak in the country and the third longest in school history.
- Purdue is looking to become the first team to win three straight outright Big Ten titles since the Boilermakers did it in 1994-96. Ohio State also accomplished the feat in 1960-62 as the only programs to record an outright "threepeat".
- Purdue's 58 wins over the last two seasons are the most in school history and the sixth most in the country (Houston, Kansas, Arizona, Gonzaga, Duke). Purdue needs just 25 wins this season to tie the school record for the most wins in a three-year span (83; 2016-17-18).
- The Boilermakers have won 35 straight regular-season, non-conference games, dating to a Dec. 8, 2020, setback at Miami, Fla. The streak is the longest in the country by 19 games (Houston - 16). The 35-game streak is the ninth-longest streak in NCAA history and just three programs have streaks of 40 or more. During the streak, Purdue has defeated seven teams ranked in the AP top 10.
- Purdue, Duke, Gonzaga and Houston are the only programs in America to have made at least a Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four in the last five NCAA Tournaments. Purdue reached the Sweet 16 in 2022, the Elite 8 in 2019 and the Final Four in 2024.
- Matt Painter** ranks fifth on the Big Ten's list for career wins with 447, trailing only **Tom Izzo** (707), **Bob Knight** (662) and **Gene Keady** (512) in Big Ten history. On the Big Ten games-only chart, Painter is fifth (226 wins), needing two wins to tie Hall of Famer, **Ward "Piggy" Lambert** of Purdue with 228 victories.

- The Boilermakers own a 69-8 (.896) all-time record in exhibition games. The Boilermakers saw a 33-game exhibition winning streak end last year in an 81-77 overtime loss to Arkansas in a charity game.
- Under **Matt Painter**, Purdue is 29-1 in exhibition games, winning by an average of 26.0 points per game (780 points in 30 games). Purdue's last 12 exhibition wins have come by at least 19 points.

**►►► RETURNING STARTS EQUALS SUCCESS**

- In 2024-25, Purdue will return 117 of a possible 195 starts from the 2022-24 season, marking the 11th time in 20 seasons that Painter returns at least 60 percent of starts from the previous season.
- In eight previous years that Purdue returns at least 110 starts from the previous season, the Boilermakers have posted a 228-61 (.789) combined record, reaching the Sweet 16 (and beyond) six times.

## ▶▶▶ AN ELITE POINT GUARD

- **Braden Smith** is one of six players in NCAA history to have at least 800 points, 425 assists and 350 rebounds through the completion of their sophomore seasons (**Magic Johnson**, **Kenny Anderson**, **Nick Calathes**, **D.J. Cooper**, **Ja Morant**).
- With 192 points, 55 assists and 127 rebounds, Smith can become the fourth player in NCAA history with 1,000 points, 500 assists and 500 rebounds by the end of his junior season (**Michael Anderson** - Drexel (1985-87), **D.J. Cooper**, **McKinley Wright IV**).
- Should Smith repeat his numbers from last season (based on 37 games), he would end his junior year with 1,252 points, 722 assists and 587 rebounds. He would be the first player in NCAA history to reach those marks by the end of his junior year.
- One thousand career assists is not out of reach for Smith. Just four players in NCAA history have had 1,000 assists (**Bobby Hurley**, **Chris Corchiani**, **Ed Cota**, **Jason Brickman**).
- At his current career pace, Smith will become the first player in NCAA history with 1,500 career points, 900 assists and 750 rebounds.

▶▶▶ THE BIG TEN ROAD SWEEP IS A BIG DEAL

- With the win at Rutgers on January 28, the Purdue senior class (and junior class) has won in every Big Ten road arena, joining the Classes of 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 as Purdue teams to join the Big Ten list.
- Other classes that have done it in four years include Iowa (2017), Michigan (2020, 2021). Wisconsin's **Brad Davison** accomplished the feat with an NCAA Tournament win in Mackey in 2021.
- With the addition of USC, UCLA, Oregon and Washington, it may be the last time in a while that a group wins in every Big Ten arena.

▶ **Record at Purdue:** 447-203 (.688) / 19th year | **Career Record:** 472-208 (.694) / 20th year

- With 16 NCAA Tournament berths, seven Sweet 16 appearances, five Big Ten regular-season championships, two Big Ten Tournament titles, two Elite Eight appearances, a trip to the Final Four, an appearance in a National Championship game and an international gold medal on his résumé, 20th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter was named the 2019 and 2024 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to nine straight NCAA Tournaments – the fourth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in five of the last seven tournaments.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter will enter the 2024-25 season second on the school's all-time wins list (447) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward "Piggy" Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged over 23 wins a season in his 19 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.3 wins per year over the last 18 seasons.
- Has won at least 25 games in 12 of his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Painter has averaged 11.9 wins per year in conference play, the third-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
- He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
- Coach Painter's 16 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2024 – Painter is 53 years old).
