HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 16th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the inaugural season at the new ballpark turned out to be a rebuilding year for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, Purdue won three times in walkoff fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last nine years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

- BOILERMAKERS BLOOMINGTON BOUND FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2010 -

As Purdue baseball prepares for its first regular-season series with rival Indiana since 2011, this weekend marks the first of back-to-back road trips in which the Boilermakers will get their first look at second-year stadiums around the Big Ten.

First pitch at Bart Kaufman Field in Bloomington is set for 7 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and noon Sunday. The Big Ten Network is scheduled to televise games two and three live.

Both IU's Kaufman Field and Minnesota's Siebert Field, which Purdue will visit next weekend, feature all artificial turf surfaces. But the Hoosiers' home park is unique in that even its pitching mound is covered by artificial turf.

Indiana is ranked as high as No. 11 in the national polls and No. 2 in the RPI. The Hoosiers have a three-game lead on Nebraska and Illinois in the conference standings, and are looking to become the first team to win consecutive Big Ten regular-season titles since Michigan won three in a row from 2006-08.

Purdue has not played Indiana since winning both meetings in the final two rounds of the 2012 Big Ten Tournament in Columbus, Ohio. The Boilermakers swept a three-game series in West Lafayette in the last regular-season series in 2011. **Sean McHugh** delivered a walk-off single as a pinch hitter in the 12th inning in the opening game of the series. Indiana's projected game three starter this weekend, Brian Korte, also started the finale of the 2011 series. But among Purdue's active roster, only **Brandon Krieg** and McHugh have played in games against the Hoosiers.

The Boilermakers have not visited Bloomington since winning two-of-three in a tight backand-forth series in 2010. That wild weekend featured a combined 62 runs scored over the three games, with games two and three both decided in extra innings. Purdue head coach **Doug Schreiber** said this week it was one of the most draining series of his coaching career because of how competitive the three games were.

The Boilermakers have won seven straight games (dating back to the finale of the 2010 series) and 11 of the last 14 (dating back to the 2008 Big Ten Tournament) against Indiana. Schreiber's Purdue teams are 17-9 vs. Tracy Smith's IU teams since Smith took over in Bloomington in 2006. But the Hoosiers have taken their level of play to the next level over the last two seasons, highlighted by their run to the College World Series last year (the first Big Ten team to make it since 1984).

Third baseman Dustin DeMuth, pitcher Joey DeNato, catcher/outfielder Kyle Schwarber and first baseman Sam Travis have been among IU's top performers the last few seasons during the program's rise to the top of the Big Ten. But Purdue has only seen the underclassman versions of those four standouts.

DeNato, who attended Torrey Pines High School in San Diego with **Kyle Johnson** and **Michael Mullen**, has established new Indiana records for wins (33) and strikeouts (267). He was still primarily an outfielder when he last pitched (as a reliever) against the Boilers in 2011, giving up the walk-off single to McHugh. Schwarber and Travis, whom graced the cover of Baseball America's college baseball preview issue this year, were just making names for themselves as freshman standouts when Purdue last saw them at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament. As a former high school teammate of **Connor Podkul** and **Kyle Upp** at La Porte High, DeMuth has been a four-year starter for the Hoosiers at third base. He opted not to sign after being selected by the Minnesota Twins in the eighth round of the MLB First-Year Player Draft last season and is now the NCAA Division I active career leader with 288 hits.

Meanwhile, Podkul returns to the weekend rotation having worked 10 2/3 scoreless innings of five-hit ball over his last three appearances. After **Jordan Minch**, who threw 130 pitches, and **Gavin**

Downs each pitched nine innings last weekend in their starts against Ohio State, the Purdue coaching staff has opted to give both an extra day of rest before taking the mound again. So Podkul will start Friday against Indiana's ace DeNato. The change also gives the Boilers a right-left-right order to its rotation, as opposed to left-right-right if Podkul were to start Sunday.

Indiana has already swept Iowa, Ohio State and Michigan State while racing out to first place in the standings. Despite being in 10th place in the standings with a 5-10 record, Purdue has not been swept in a Big Ten series this season. Besides IU, only Illinois (10-5), Nebraska (10-5) and Michigan (9-9) can also claim that. Wins this weekend for the Boilers would go a long way in making the final two Big Ten series against Minnesota (9-9) and Iowa (7-8) very significant in the Big Ten Tournament chase.

Indiana (17th) and Purdue (27th) have the highest strength of schedule rankings in the Big Ten entering the weekend. Nebraska (66th) and Michigan (69th) are the only other league schools that rank among the top 80 in strength of schedule. The Boilermakers have already played at two teams – Rice and LSU – that like the Hoosiers are being projected as NCAA Regional hosts when the NCAA Tournament gets underway in about a month.

LOTS OF CLOSE GAMES IN APRIL

• Twelve of Purdue's 18 games in April were decided by two runs or fewer, including five extra-innings affairs. The Boiler-makers posted a 5-7 mark in those close games en route to a 7-11 April record. For the season, Purdue is 8-13 in games decided by two or fewer runs.

• An 11-inning win at Michigan State April 11, the first walk-off victory in Alexander Field history April 15 vs. Butler (in 10 innings) and a 13-inning walk-off win April 25 vs. Ohio State highlighted the recent stretch of tight games. The win at MSU snapped a five-game losing streak in extra-inning games dating back to the final weekend of 2013. The Butler win was the Boilers' first in walk-off fashion since the final game at Lambert Field, May 2012 vs. Indiana State. Each of Purdue's last three Big Ten openers has gone extra innings. The 13-inning thriller with Ohio State was the longest game in the short history of Alexander Field but already the sixth extra-innings affair in 32 games at the second-year ballpark.

• The seven extra-innings games, including five over a stretch of 11 games from April 8-25, are the most in one season during head coach Doug Schreiber's 16-year tenure.

RUBBER GAME STRUGGLES

Four of the last six weekends (at SIU, at Illinois, at MSU and vs. OSU), the Boilers won the opener but lost the series. Purdue has not won a weekend series this season due in part to an 0-5 record in rubber games. Purdue has lost eight straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boiler-

makers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on 11 occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Nine of those 11 series have been in Big Ten play.

• During the Boilers' first home weekend of the season (April 5-6), Purdue outscored PSU 10-8 in the series but still lost two-of-three. The weekend of April 11-12 at Michigan State, the scoring was even at 12 runs apiece but the Boilers again lost two-of-three. Purdue had not lost a series in which it had outscored the opposition since March 2010 at Southern Illinois (32-21 scoring edge, lost 2-of-3). It had not happened in Big Ten play since April 2007 vs. Ohio State (23-15 scoring edge, lost 3-of-4). Each of the last three seasons, Purdue had managed to win at least one series in which it was outscored for the weekend (2011 at Northwestern, 2012 vs. Penn State and 2013 at Evansville).

• The Boilermakers dropped a pair of one-run games in doubleheader sweeps at the hands of Penn State and Michigan State, falling to 1-7 in twinbills this year and 0-6 in doubleheaders against the same team. Purdue's streak of six consecutive series wins vs. PSU ended this year. The Boilers won the series finale, 4-0, to post their first shutout since April 20, 2013 vs. Illinois-Chicago and first against a Big Ten opponent since beating Indiana 3-0 in the winner's bracket final of the 2012 Big Ten Tournament. Brett Haan earned his first win as a Boilermaker with five shutout innings. Joe Eichmann retired all 12 batters he faced while appearing in all three games of the Penn State series.

BOILERMAKERS HOLD ON FOR QUALITY MIDWEEK WIN AT ILLINOIS STATE

- Consecutive big innings allowed Purdue to open up an 8-0 lead and **Patrick Kenney** shut the door after Illinois State rallied to make it a two-run game, closing out an 8-6 win for the Boilermakers April 29 in Normal, Ill. Purdue became only the second visiting team to win at ISU's Duffy Bass Field this season. The road team has won seven consecutive games in the annual midweek series.
- The game ended on a line drive 5-3 double play to third base. It marked the second time this season Purdue has won a close game on a double play. **Mike Lutz** induced and started a game-ending 1-6-3 twin killing with the bases loaded in the 4-3 series-opening win at Illinois March 28.
- The Boilermakers' 8-0 lead entering the bottom of the eighth inning represented their biggest lead of the season. It came after scoring four in the fifth and three in the sixth. Purdue has only scored four-plus runs in a frame twice this year. The 8-6 final marked the most runs the Boilers had allowed in a win this season. Previously, Purdue had only won one game (April 15 vs. Butler, 5-4) in which an opponent had scored four-plus runs.
- Purdue completed a three-game season series sweep of Butler April 15. With the Boilers having won
 games against the Bulldogs in Birmingham, Ala., Indianapolis and West Lafayette, it's believed to be the
 first time in program history Purdue has defeated an opponent in three different locations in the same
 season.

EVAK'S INSIDE-THE-PARK HOMER, WOOD'S WALK-OFF SINGLE HIGHLIGHT 13-INNING WIN

- **Jeff Evak** connected for a game-tying, inside-the-park home run and **Kyle Wood** delivered the gamewinning hit eight innings later as Purdue defeated Ohio State in 13 innings, 4-3, April 25. Runs were only scored in the three of the 26 half innings played in the extended thriller.
- After being thrown out at the plate to end the 10th inning, **Cody Strong** led off the 13th with a double and scored this time on Wood's base hit through the left side.
- Evak enjoyed a fantastic five-minute stretch in which he connected for the inside-the-park homer in the bottom of the fifth and made a diving catch in right field to take away a leadoff double in the top of the sixth. The freshman connected for a deep fly ball to center field that kept carrying and eventually hit off the wall to the right of the 408-feet marker, caroming back towards left center. It was the freshman's first collegiate home run.
- Jordan Minch, Matt Gibbs and Mike Lutz teamed up for 11 consecutive scoreless innings after Minch gave up three runs in the top of the second. A wild swing in momentum featured Lutz warming up in the bullpen in the third inning to Minch still being on the mound in the ninth. Minch retired 13 of the final 16 batters he faced, highlighted by striking out the side in the ninth inning. It was the sophomore's longest outing as a Boiler as well as the longest by a Purdue pitcher this season. He threw over 130 pitches.

STRONG OUTINGS FROM DOWNS & PODKUL; GIBBS' SCORELESS INNINGS STREAK

- Gavin Downs and Connor Podkul both put together quality starts at Alexander Field during the recent home-heavy stretch (April 15-27).
- Downs earned his first career Big Ten win April 19 with seven innings of three-hit ball against Michigan, surrendering just two unearned runs. He followed that up with his first collegiate complete game, needing only 93 pitches in a tough-luck 2-0 loss to Ohio State. Those were his best outings since keeping No. 4 LSU off the scoreboard for six innings March 8 in Baton Rouge. Downs pitched Purdue's first true complete game since February 2013 (Robert Ramer vs. UConn). Jordan Minch and Ramer had each worked nine-plus innings in a start since then, but both outings came in extra-innings games. Downs did not issue a walk in his complete game, joining Adam Dressler (twice) as the only starting pitchers to not walk a batter in an outing this year.
- Podkul's first home start since May 2012 was also his best outing of the year. He struck out a career-high seven over six scoreless innings April 23 vs. Illinois-Chicago. He came up just one out shy of his longest collegiate outing. Podkul did not pitch from March 17 through April 19 as he continues to work his way back to full strength from Tommy John Surgery in the fall of 2012 and a knee ailment. However, over his last three outings (vs. Michigan, UIC & Ohio State) the righthander has worked a combined 10 2/3 shutout innings, surrendering just five hits and three walks while striking out 11.
- Matt Gibbs' streak of 16 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances ended April 27 vs. Ohio State. The junior allowed five inherited runners to score during that stretch, but none of the runners he allowed to reach base scored. He excelled in the extra-innings affairs in the series openers with Michigan State (3 IP, 2 H, 2 BB, 2 K) and Michigan (5 IP, 2 H, 2 BB, 6 K). He earned his first collegiate victory in the MSU win and posted career-high totals for innings pitched and strikeouts vs. Michigan, helping extend the game into the 12th inning.

BOILERMAKERS AMONG THE BIG TEN LEADERS IN FIELDING & DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

- Purdue's solid play defensively has been one of the bright spots of the season. Entering the weekend, the Boilermakers lead the Big Ten having turned 42 double plays in 41 games. They're also third in the conference in fielding percentage (.971). Purdue did not commit an error in the Penn State series but made a season-high five in the 12-inning series-opening loss to Michigan. The Boilers have posted 14 games without an error this year. For the season, Purdue has committed 46 errors in 41 games. Nebraska (.975, 40 DPs) has made 45 errors in 46 games and leads the league in fielding percentage while raking second to the Boilers in double plays turned.
- Sean McHugh has also impressed individually with his play behind the plate. The senior has thrown out 22 base stealers (who are 20-of-42 with McHugh behind the plate) to share the Big Ten lead. Base stealers are 26-of-52 against Purdue overall, the 26 steals allowed representing the third fewest against in the Big Ten. Only Michigan State (30, 24-of-54) has thrown out more runners than McHugh and the Boilers. MSU's Joel Fisher shares the league lead with McHugh, throwing out 22 base stealers.

KRIEG. MULLEN & WOOD DELIVER BIG HITS: MANIAGO HAS A DAY TO REMEMBER

- · Brandon Krieg, Michael Mullen and Kyle Wood have delivered the game-winning hits in the Boilers' last three extra-innings victories. Krieg's walk-off single April 15 vs. Butler gave head coach Doug Schreiber his 450th win as the leader of the program. Krieg was 4-for-4 and reached base safely six times in the win. It was his second career four-hit game and he became the first Boiler to reach safely six times in a game since Eric Charles in March 2012 at Murray State. Krieg went on to enjoy a 10-for-16 week at the plate in which he reached base in 15 of his 22 plate appearances. He had a pair of three-hit games against Michigan.
- · Mullen didn't enter the extra-innings win at Michigan State until the bottom of the 10th inning, but had a big impact on the final few frames. He turned an inning-ending 5-4-3 double play at second base with runners on first and second in the 10th. Not long after, he came through with a two-out single to drive home the go-ahead run in the top of the 11th. The hit plated Steve Maniago, who had connected for his first career home run earlier in the game to give Purdue a 3-2 lead. Maniago contributed to two of three inning-ending double plays turned by the Boilers.
- · Wood's walk-off hit in the 13-inning against Ohio State ended the longest game in the short history of Alexander Field. He slapped a pitch over the third baseman's head for the game-winning single after he had initially showed bunt with runners on first and second and no outs. The sophomore first baseman had not been in the starting lineup for the previous five games due to a suspension for a violation of team rules.
- Krieg's Big Month (March 16-April 20): .345 (30-for-87), 4 XBH, 10 RBI, 14 R, 5 BB, 8 SB

OVERLAPPING HIT & REACHED-SAFELY STREAKS

- · Sean McHugh, Brandon Krieg and Kyle Wood have all posted notable streaks over the last six weeks. McHugh and Krieg had 12-game hit streaks, the longest for Purdue since 2011.
- · Wood has reached base safely in 22 straight games. The sophomore has also reached base safely in 21 consecutive Big Ten games dating back to last season. He's second in the Big Ten with 12 hit by pitch, nine coming during his reached-safely streak. He connected for the first home run by a Boilermaker at Alexander Field this season April 8 vs. Louisville and had the walk-off single in game one vs. Ohio State. However, Wood did not play in the Michigan series due to a violation of team rules.
- Wood's 18-Game Reached Safely Streak (3/17-Pr): .337, 3 XBH, 10 RBI, 10 R, 7 BB, 9 HBP, .440 OBP
- · McHugh reached base safely in 18 consecutive games, highlighted by a career-best 12-game hitting streak. The senior also reached base safely in 14 consecutive Big Ten games dating back to last season.
- McHugh's 18-Game Reached Safely Streak (3/9-4/8): .338, 8 XBH, 12 R, 8 BB, 2 HBP .412 OBP
- McHugh's 12-Game Hit Streak (March 9-29): .365 (19-for-52), 4 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 8 R, 4 BB
- · Krieg matched McHugh with a career-best 12-game hitting streak before it was snapped April 8 vs. Louisville. The junior saw has average jump .194 points from .079 on March 13 to .273 after a three-hit game in the finale of the Michigan series. Krieg has now reached safely in the last 10 games.
- Krieg's Current 10-Game Reached Safely Streak (4/15-Pr): .350, 6 RBI, 5 R, 7 BB, HBP, .449 OBP
- Krieg's 12-Game Hitting Streak (March 16-April 6): .314 (16-for-51), 3 XBH, 4 RBI, 8 R, 7 SB

STRUGGLES DRIVING IN RUNS

- For much of the season, Purdue has struggled with timely hitting. The Boilermakers have been outscored this year, 268-136. Opponents have left 362 runners on base, Purdue has stranded 330 runners. The Boilers only score one run per every 2.43 runners LOB while opponents are at a run per every 1.35 runners LOB.
- For the season, Purdue is batting just .229 with runners in scoring position vs. the opposition's .337 clip. During a 12-game stretch from March 21-April 8, during which the Boilers actually posted a 4-8 record, they batted only .191 with RISP.

PITCHING MAKES BIG STRIDES IN BIG TEN PLAY

- · Led by strong outings from staff ace Jordan Minch (38 IP, 31 H, 28 K, 3.32 ERA), the Purdue pitching staff has been much better in Big Ten play after a rough start to the season. Minch was still on the mound in the eighth inning in four of his first five Big Ten starts. Matt Gibbs, (16 1/3 IP, 6 H, 12 K, 1.10 ERA), Gavin Downs (27 IP, 24 H, 3.67 ERA) and Joe Eichmann (7 2/3 IP, 5 H, 5 K, 2.35 ERA) have also been strong on the conference weekends. Eichmann pitched in each of the first nine Big Ten games and 10 of 15 total.
- The Boilermakers have posted a 4.11 ERA in Big Ten play vs. the 6.66 mark it has compiled in nonconference (6.97 pre-Big Ten). More importantly, Purdue has posted 77 strikeouts vs. 59 walks in Big Ten action after racking up 120 Ks vs. 129 walks in nonconference play. The Boilers' overall team ERA has dropped from 9.16 on March 16 to 5.69 entering the Indiana series. Purdue may rank last in the Big Ten in overall team ERA, but its 4.11 ERA in league play is eighth.

IRONMEN IN THE BULLPEN

- Relief pitchers Mike Lutz (25 appearances), Joe Eichmann (23) and Tim McElroy (21) have been busy this season. All three have appeared in more than half of the first 41 games. They've all pitched in the same game six times this season. Lutz and Eichmann lead the Big Ten in appearances, with McElroy ranking fifth. Eichmann took the mound in each of the first nine Big Ten games of the season. Lutz and McElroy have both pitched in six consecutive games this season, the longest streaks for a Purdue pitcher since at least the beginning of the 2008 season. All three have pitched in all three games of a series at least once this year.
- · Eichmann has excelled at stranding inherited base runners this year, allowing only seven of 35 to score. He has entered the game with at least one runner aboard in 19 of his 23 outings. He has stranded multiple runners on nine occasions. Lutz has allowed only nine of 26 inherited runners to score and McElroy three of 12. As a trio they've allowed only 19 of 73 (26 percent) inherited runners to score.
- Eichmann retired all 12 batters that he faced in the Penn State series and 17 straight over six appearances from March 30 through April 12.

STACKED SCHEDULE

- Purdue has challenged itself with a 2014 schedule that features numerous quality opponents. Indiana, LSU and Louisville all qualified for the 2013 College World Series and were preseason favorites in their conferences this year. Rice, San Diego State and Illinois were also NCAA Regional teams a year ago.
- The Boilers' strength of schedule ranks 27th nationally in the Boyd's World ISR as of May 1. It ranked as high as No. 2 in the country throughout much of March. Only Indiana (17th) has played a better strength of schedule in the Big Ten. Nebraska (66th) and Michigan (69th) are the only others in the top 80.
- Purdue's opponents have compiled a combined 499-351-2 (.587) record this year after posting a combined mark of 618-460 (.573) last season. The 17 teams that the Boilers have already played have compiled a 423-308-2 (.578) record this year.
