GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 778-413 all-time, including a 248-219 mark on the road.
- Purdue is 192-94 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 309-159.
- Purdue is 363-183 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 154-119 record on the road.
- Versyp is 90-48 at Purdue in conference play and 99-55 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 211-125 in January, including an 89-80 mark away from home. The Boilermakers are 7-5 all-time on Jan. 8, including a 3-4 record on the road.
- Purdue is 28-12 all-time in the 15th game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 2-5 all-time against teams from Maryland, including a 1-5 mark against the Terrapins.
- Thursday was Purdue's first-ever game in the state of Maryland, and its first-ever Big Ten Conference game against the Terrapins.
- Maryland was the Boilermakers' first ranked opponent of the season, entering Thursday's game ranked 12th in the AP poll and 10th in the Coaches' poll. Purdue is 102-146 all-time against ranked opponents, including a 16-56 mark when the Boilermakers are unranked.
- Purdue is now just 9-103 all-time when allowing 80 or more points to an opponent. Maryland's 88 points are the most by a Boilermaker opponent this season.
- The Boilermakers were outrebounded 49-28, including 23 offensive rebounds for Maryland, which led to 21 second-chance points.
- The Terrapins also had a 17-4 advantage in points off turnovers as Purdue had 15 turnovers, while Maryland committed just nine.
- Purdue shot a season-low 14 free throws, netting 11 of them, and hit a season-low mark with just nine assists on 25 field goals.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Whitney Bays posted her sixth straight double-double, extending her Purdue-record streak, with 19 points and 12 rebounds.
- Ashley Morrisette finished with 18 points, hitting three triples.

- Liza Clemons turned in 12 points, eight rebounds and a pair of blocks, shooting five-of-eight from the floor.
- Bridget Perry suffered an injury just five minutes into the game and did not return. She made her first two shots of the game and had a steal.
