GAME NOTES

- Purdue's Pink Zone donation efforts raised over \$4,200 for the Central Indiana Affiliate of the Susan G. Komen for the Cure.
- This is the 19th year for the Barn Burner Trophy, with Purdue winning 16 of the 19 contests, including three-straight. Brittany Rayburn earned her second Barn Burner Trophy Most Valuable Player honor, finishing with a game-high 24 points, two rebounds and two assists while hitting 7-of-10 (.700) from the field, including 4-of-6 (.667) from three-point range.
- This was the 74th meeting between Purdue and Indiana in women's basketball. With the win, Purdue improves to 49-25 all-time vs. the Hoosiers.
- With the win, head coach Sharon Versyp improves her career record to 249-134. Her record at Purdue moves to 132-69 and her Big Ten school record to 67-35.
- Purdue had over 10,000 fans at a home game for the first time this season with 10,249 in attendance for Pink Zone, Senior Day, Barn Burner Trophy game and Project Perfect.
- All five Purdue seniors scored in Sunday's contest, led by Brittany Rayburn's 24 points.
- With the starting lineup of KK Houser, Courtney Moses, Brittany Rayburn, Sam Ostarello, and Chelsea Jones, Purdue improves to 18-5.
- Brittany Rayburn's four three-pointers in today's game moved her past Jodi Howell into second on Purdue's all-time list with 191.
- Brittany Rayburn's 24 points moved her past the 1,700 career point mark with 1,718, seventh all-time at Purdue and needs 30 points to eclipse Joy Holmes for sixth.
- Alex Guyton scored 10 points in the first half and finished with 11 points for her sixth double-figure scoring game of the year and 16th in her career.
- Houser scored 15 points for her 15th double-figure game of the season, 23rd of her career.
- Moses set a school record with her first free throw of the game. She made both of her free throw attempts in the contest to extend her free throw streak to 40-consecutive makes, breaking Brittany Rayburn's previous school mark of 38 consecutive. Moses' last missed a free throw at Illinois on Jan. 2, 2012.
- For the 10th time this season, the Boilermakers had three players in double-figures in the same game: Rayburn (24), Houser (15) and Guyton (11).
- Houser's seven assists are the most by the redshirt sophomore since dishing out a career-high 10 at Minnesota on Jan. 12. She has eight games this season with five or more assists.
- Purdue had 25 assists on 31 field goals against the Hoosiers, just one short of the season high of 26 assists against Chicago State.
- Purdue's nine turnovers were the fewest against a Big Ten opponent this year and the second-fewest turnovers of the season behind the season-low seven vs. UT Martin.
- Purdue recorded eight blocks against the Hoosiers, the most since recording nine blocks at Illinois on Jan. 2.

TEAM HIGHS AND LOWS

- Purdue scored a season-high 90 points. The previous high was 89 against Nebraska in triple overtime on Feb. 2, 2012.
- Purdue scored 45 points in the first half, the most points in a first half this season. The previous high was 43 points against Northwestern on Jan. 26, 2012.
- Howard dished out a season-high four assists. Her career-high is six set at Michigan State on Feb. 6, 2011.
- Woods had a season-high three assists.
- Sasha Chaplin led Indiana with 15 points.
- Rayburn scored 24 points, her 24th double-figure scoring game of the season and 89th of her career which puts her alone in seventh place for career double-figure scoring games.
 It was her fifth game of the season with 20 or more points and the 25th of her career.
- The Boilermakers held IU to just one three-pointer. It is the third time this season that Purdue has limited an opponent to just one three and the first time they have done so and won the game. Purdue also limited Duke and Notre Dame to a single three-pointer.
