BOILERMAKERS HOST DEMONS & FLYERS FOR LABOR DAY WEEKEND

 Purdue closes out its six-game homestand against a pair of regional rivals, welcoming DePaul and Dayton to Folk Field for Labor Day Weekend. The Boilermakers are 6-0 all-time against DePaul, a mark that doubles as the program's longest active winning streak against any opponent. However, the two teams have not played since 2005. Purdue hosted Dayton for spring exhibition games inside the Mollenkopf Athletic Center in 2012 and 2014 and the Flyers also won the 2011 Boilermaker Challenge Cup without having to play Purdue. However, the Boilermakers have not hosted the UD for a regular-season game since the inaugural 1998 campaign.

PURDUE BLOWS OUT INDIANA STATE WITH MOST GOALS SINCE 2011

• The Boilermakers scored five times in a span of
25 minutes in the second half to turn a one-goal
lead into a 6-0 victory vs. Indiana State. The six
goals were the team's most since 2011. Sarah
Griffith scored in the sixth minute to give Purdue
an early lead. With a first-half goal in each of their
first three games, the Boilermakers have now held
the lead for 177 of the 270 minutes.

• With Hannah Mussallem, Andrea Petrina and
Kylie Hase also scoring in the ISU win, it marked
the first time since a 2013 win vs. Dartmouth that
four Boilermakers scored in the same game. The

2013 season also marked the last time six different players scored over Purdue's first three games, a feat accomplished this year after Hannah Melchiorre and Maddy Williams scored goals during the season-opening weekend.

· Goalkeepers Katie Luce and Erika Yohn teamed up for Purdue's first combined shutout since September 2015 vs. Evansville.

FRESHMEN SCORE FIRST OFFICIAL GOALS IN SAME GAME

· Although Sarah Griffith scored in both preseason wins, her goal vs. Indiana State became her first official tally. With she and Kylie Hase both recording their first goals in the victory, it marked the first time two freshmen scored their first goals in the same game since an August 2014 win vs. Ohio (Erika Arkans, Nicole Robertson). Including the two preseason wins, a freshman has scored Purdue's first goal in each of the first five games this year.

HIGH-SCORING SECOND HALF

 In the Indiana State win, the Boilermakers scored five goals in a half for the first time since a November 2007 win vs. Indiana. The six total goals represent the team's most since tying the program record with eight in an October 2011 victory vs. Indiana.

each scoring twice in the second half. The 8-2 win vs. IU in 2011 marked the last time Purdue had a pair of players record multi-goal efforts in the same game. But it had been a decade, the 2007 win vs. IU. since two Boilermakers each scored twice in the same half.

MADDY WILLIAMS RECORDS 20TH CAREER ASSIST

- · Maddy Williams recorded her 20th career assist on Sarah Griffith's goal early in the Indiana State win, becoming just the fourth Boilermaker to reach the benchmark. She also set up Hannah Mussallem's first goal of the second half to register her third career multiassist effort.
- · Williams has had a direct impact on 46 goals during her Purdue career, good for fourth most in program history. She's just two assists away from former teammate Alex Hairston's program record (23).

· Hannah Melchiorre set up goals by Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase in the Indiana State win, becoming the first Boilermaker to assist on a pair of goals in a half since a September 2015 win at Montana. An August 2014 win vs. SIU Edwardsville marked the last time two Purdue players had multiple assists in the same game, a feat accomplished by Melchiorre and Williams vs. ISU.

MELCHIORRE THE FIRST FRESHMAN TO SCORE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

 Hannah Melchiorre accounted for Purdue's first goal of both games during the season-opening weekend. In the process, she became the first freshman in program history to score in each of the first two games of a season. Classmate Sarah Griffith did likewise in both of Purdue's preseason wins, but as exhibition games those goals don't count toward Griffith's career total.

- · Maddy Williams (2015) remains the only Boilermaker to ever score in each of the first three games of a season.
- · Melchiorre is Purdue's first freshman to account for the Boilermakers' first goal of a season since Erika Arkans in 2014. However, Alex Hairston (in 2011) was the last Purdue freshman to score the team's first goal of a new campaign in a season opener.

LUCE ONLY THE THIRD FRESHMAN KEEPER TO START A SEASON OPENER

- · Katie Luce started in goal and played all 180 minutes of the season-opening weekend. She is only Purdue's third freshman to start a season opener at goalkeeper. Jocelyn Cavalier in the inaugural 1998 campaign and Lauren Mason in 2003 are the only other Boilermakers to earn the honor
- Luce finished the season-opening weekend with 10 saves, making six in the win vs. Kent State. Both total were the most by a Purdue keeper since Clara Kridler made eight and 14 in a 2011 season-opening road trip to Toledo and West Virginia.

THREE WINS VERSUS 10-WIN TEAMS FROM 2016

• The Boilermakers have posted three of their August wins against teams that won at least 10 games in 2016. Notre Dame (13-3-5), Iowa State (10-8-1) and Kent State (15-3-2) were a combined 38-14-8 (.700) a year ago. Purdue nearly had another victory against a 10-win team from 2016, but Loyola Marymount (11-5-3) rallied to steal the game 2-1. It marked the first time this season the Boilermakers conceded multiple goals in a game.

FRUSTRATING SECOND-GAME SIMILARITIES

- Hannah Melchiorre's first-half goal allowed Games Lost After Long Stretch with Lead Purdue to hold the lead for 48 minutes, but Loyola Marymount scored twice in the final six minutes to rally for the win. The Lions scored a pair of quality goals only four minutes and 20 seconds apart, equalizing in the 84th minute and taking the lead in the 88th minute.
- · The Boilermakers also dropped their second game of the 2016 campaign 2-1 after holding the lead for more than half the game. Purdue lost to Montana in overtime after holding the lead for 77 minutes. By leading for 48 minutes, the LMU defeat ranks tied for third in program

history among games Purdue ended up losing despite holding the lead for a long stretch.

SIX FRESHMEN STARTING SO FAR

- The Boilermakers have 12 true freshmen plus two more redshirt freshmen on the roster this fall. With more than half of the 27-player roster comprised of freshmen, Purdue will need newcomers to contribute to have a successful season. Six freshmen have started the first five games, both exhibition wins as well as the first three games of the regular season. They have been split evenly among the defensive and attacking positions. Sarah Clark and Maya Lambert earned the starts at center back in front of freshman goalkeeper Katie Luce. Sarah Griffith and Hannah Melchiorre and Kylie Hase are primarily offensive players as midfielders/forwards.
- Clark, Hase, Lambert and Luce all played the entire 180 minutes of the season-opening weekend. Freshmen Katie Stephens (78 minutes) and Alyssa Lum (41) have also seen action in each of the first three reglar-season games.

TEN WINS UNDER ROFF WHEN GIVING UP A GOAL

• Including the preseason victory vs. Iowa State this month, Purdue has now found a way to win 10 times when conceding a goal under third-year head coach Drew Roff. Seven of those victories have come in 2-1 fashion. Overall, the Boilermakers are 10-20-1 (.339) when conceding at least one goal under Roff (including preseason). From 2012 to 2014, Purdue was 9-32-5 (.250) when surrendering a goal.

CAPTAINS TRIO ON BIG TEN PRESEASON HONORS LIST

- Team captains Vanessa Korolas, Andrea Petrina and Maddy Williams were highlighted among the Big Ten's preseason honors list announced by the conference office the week of the season-opening Friday.
- · Purdue and Penn State were the only schools in the league to have three seniors among their preseason honorees this year. Korolas, Petrina and Williams have started a combined 143 games during their college careers as the Boilermakers' most experienced players at defender, midfielder and forward. They will share the captaincy this fall with goalkeeper Erika Yohn, who has led Purdue to 13 wins in her 25 career starts.

BOILERMAKERS REMAIN PERFECT IN PRESEASON ACTION UNDER ROFF

- · With wins vs. No. 18 Notre Dame (13-3-5 in 2016) and Iowa State (10-8-1) this month, Purdue defeated a pair of teams that won at least 10 games in 2016. Under third-year head coach Drew Roff, the Boilermakers are now 6-0 in preseason games and 17-4 in all exhibition games (spring and fall). Three of those four losses had come at the hands of the Fighting Irish in spring exhibitions before this preseason. Sarah Griffith and Maddy Williams both scored in each victory.
- Even though they don't count towards her career total (25), Williams scored eight goals in six career preseason games. She had five goals in Purdue's two preseason wins in 2015, highlighted by a hat trick at Milwaukee.
- Purdue managed to rally for a 2-1 win vs. the Cyclones despite conceding the game's first goal. Iowa State's first-half goal ended the Boilermakers' preseason shutout streak at 553 consecutive minutes dating back to a 2014 exhibition win at Illinois State, which was coached by Roff at the time. Rallying to win was an encouraging sign after Purdue was 1-8-1 last season when the opposition scored first.

FIRST WIN VERSUS TOP-25 OPPONENT SINCE 2009

 While the Aug. 9 preseason win at Notre Dame will ultimately not count toward Purdue's record this season or in the all-time series with the Fighting Irish, it was still a win against a team ranked among the top 25 in the United Soccer Coaches' (formerly NSCAA) preseason poll. The Boilermakers have not beaten a top-25 team in the regular season since August 2009 at No. 6 Texas A&M.

LONG HOMESTAND TO BEGIN THE REGULAR SEASON

- For the second time in three years, Purdue begins the regular Purdue's Longest Homestands with five straight games at home. Including the Aug. 12 preseason exhibition win vs. lowa State, it's a six-game homestand 2011 at Folk Field for the Boilermakers. In 2015, Drew Roff's first 2007 year as head coach, the Boilermakers also played six straight 2017 games at home. They went 5-1 during that stretch en route to 2015* posting their first winning season (9-8-1) since 2009.
- During the homestand this year, Purdue will host four teams 2009 that won at least 10 games in 2016 – Iowa State (10-8-1), Kent State (15-3-2), Loyola Marymount (11-3-5) and DePaul (10-6-1
- 3). Kent State and Dayton both qualified for the 2016 NCAA

Tournament. DePaul (Alexa Ben) and Dayton (Alexis Kiehl) also feature players on the Hermann Trophy's preseason watch list.

UPS & DOWNS DURING FIRST TWO YEARS UNDER DREW ROFF

- Including preseason exhibition games, Purdue is 12-9-2 (.565) at Folk Field since Drew Roff became head coach in December 2014. Roff led the Boilermakers to a 9-8-1 record in 2015, their first winning season since 2009.
- · But the 2016 campaign proved to be a snakebitten one for Purdue. Injuries to veteran forwards Hannah Leinert and Maddy Williams made goals tough to come by at times. The Boilermakers' 15 goals in the 17 games that counted ranked as a program low. Purdue was 1-8-1 when the opposition scored first and went 1-7 away from Folk Field. Their five overtime affairs, four being games in which they held a second-half lead, were the program's most since 2012.
- Technically, the three overtime losses last year was a program high. In 2005, the Boilermakers lost twice in overtime during the regular season and then dropped a shootout against UW-Milwaukee after a scoreless draw in the NCAA Tournament.
