## The Mortar Board Premier

The Mortar Board Premier tournament began in 1990 under the name Mortar Board Volleyball Invitational tournament. It has been played every year since with the exception of 2001, when it was cancelled due to the 9/11 tragedy. Thirteen different teams have captured the event title. Purdue has won the tournament 11 times, including 2011, 2012, 2014 and 2015, while Dayton and Miami (Ohio) each have taken two titles over the years.

The tournament is sponsored by Mortar Board, which is a national honor society that recognizes college seniors for excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership and service. Mortar Board members represent the top scholars and leaders on their campuses. Since its founding in 1926, Purdue's chapter of Mortar Board has awarded over 1.1 million dollars in fellowships and awards to Purdue students, staff and student organizations. The money for these awards comes largely from the annual sale of a calendar, appropriately called the Mortar Board.

Mortar Board will recognize student-athletes from all four teams for their scholarship and service accomplishments after each team's match on Friday evening.

## The Book on the Boilermakers

**At First Glance:** No. 20 Purdue (23-10, 13-7 B1G) is coming off its 10th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 12 seasons after finishing fifth in the Big Ten in 2015. The Boilermaker roster features seven returning players, two redshirts, a transfer and three newcomers. Head coach Dave Shondell is in his 14th season with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Boilermakers ended the 2015 season in the NCAA Second Round, falling to No. 3 Texas 3-1 in Austin. Purdue topped SMU in four sets in the first round.

**Statistically Speaking:** Honorable mention All-American middle blockers Faye Adelaja (2.38) and Danielle Cuttino (2.04) and outside hitter Azariah Stahl (1.80) return after contributing nearly two kills per set in 2015. Adelaja hit at a team-best .397 clip and added 0.89 blocks per set, while Cuttino put up a team-leading 1.21 stuffs per stanza. The team must fill the gap left by All-American outside hitter Annie Drews, who tallied 4.25 kills and 1.72 digs per set and 17 aces.

Defensively, the Boilermakers must replace libero Amanda Neill, who pulled up 4.02 digs per set and served up 29 aces. Setter Ashley Evans is back after posting 2.39 digs and 11.06 assists per set and 22 aces as is defensive specialist Brooke Peters, who chipped in 1.17 digs per set and served up a team-leading 30 aces. As a team, Purdue hit at a .262 clip and served up 145 aces.

## Series Information

**Wyoming (Purdue leads the series 3-2):** The Boilermakers won the first three meetings in the series, which began Sept. 19, 1981, at the Illinois State Invitational. The Cowgirls have taken the last two contests, a Sept. 14, 1990, match in Lincoln, Neb., and a Sept. 12, 1998, match in Laramie, Wyo.

**Washington State:** This is the first meeting between the Boilermakers and the Cougars.

**Kentucky (Purdue leads the series 10-8):** The Boilermakers won the first two matches in the series, which began Sept. 22, 1978, at the Illinois State Tournament. Purdue won five of the first eight matches. The Wildcats took three in a row, but the Boilermakers answered with three straight wins of their own. The teams have split the last four meetings, with the Boilermakers earning a pair of NCAA Tournament wins in West Lafayette in 2006 and 2010.

## What a Difference a Win Makes...

If the Boilermakers top Wyoming on Friday:

- They will have won their season opener for the 14th time in the last 15 years.
- They will move to 33-9 all-time in home openers, including a 12-2 mark in the Shondell era.

## The Dave Shondell File

•Shondell, who became the fourth coach in Purdue volleyball history in February 2003, is in his 14th year at the helm of the Boilermaker volleyball program.

•Shondell joined the Purdue staff after 22 years as a successful club and high school coach in central Indiana.

•In 13 years as head coach at Muncie Central High School, he led the Bearcats to four state titles and a 428-52 record. That winning percentage (.891) is the second-best winning percentage in Indiana high school volleyball history.

• In his 13 years at Purdue, Shondell has posted a 282-151 overall record, including a 145-115 mark in the Big Ten Conference.

### Words About Wyoming

**At First Glance:** The Wyoming Cowgirls (23-7, 13-5 Mountain West) return 11 letterwinners, including five starters, from the 2015 team which finished third in Mountain West play. The Cowgirls are coached by Chad Callihan, who is in his fourth season with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Cowgirls wrapped their 2015 season with a five-set loss to No. 12 Colorado State in the final match of Mountain West play.

**Statistically Speaking:** All-Mountain West selections outside hitter Kayla Slofkiss and middle blocker Laura Beach return to pace the Wyoming offense. Slofkiss posted a team-best 2.78 kills and 2.52 digs per set last season, while Beach managed 2.35 kills and 1.10 blocks per set, while hitting at a team-best .337 clip and adding 20 aces. Middle blocker Reed Copeland led the team at the net with 1.68 blocks per set to go with 1.22 kills per stanza.

Defensively, the Cowgirls must replace libero Allison Waldvogel's 4.48 digs per set and 21 aces, but return three players that averaged nearly two digs per set. Slofkiss (2.52), setter Courtney Chacon (2.14) and defensive specialist Lily Austin (1.76) make up the group. Austin also served up a team-leading 25 aces in 2015. Chacon dished out 5.40 assists per set, while Cori Aafedt added 4.53 assists per stanza. As a team, Wyoming hit at a .209 clip and served up 128 aces.

### Chatting About the Cougars

**At First Glance:** The Washington State Cougars (16-16, 5-15 Pac-12) return 12 letterwinners, including six starters, from the 2015 team which finished ninth in Pac-12 play. The Cougars are coached by Jen Greeny, who is in her sixth season with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Cougars ended their 2015 season with a three-set loss to No. 2 Washington in Seattle on Nov. 28.

**Statistically Speaking:** Preseason All-Pac-12 selection Kyra Holt returns to lead the Cougar offense, after posting a team-best 3.91 kills and 2.71 digs per set and a team-leading 35 aces in 2015. Outside hitter McKenna Woodford also is back after tallying 3.16 kills and 1.82 digs per set and 26 aces. Five other players averaged at least one kill per set, including outside hitter Hailey Bethune

(1.71), middle blocker Taylor Mims (1.50) and middle blocker Ella Lajos (1.45). Middle blocker Claire Martin put up a team-best 1.31 blocks per set, while Mims added 1.02 stuffs per set.

Defensively, Wyoming must replace libero Kate Sommers' 4.20 digs per set, but four players return after posting nearly two digs per set: Holt (2.71), setter Haley MacDonald (2.16), defensive specialist Tani Stephens (1.99) and Woodford (1.82). MacDonald also added 28 aces, while Stephens chipped in 21. As a team, Wyoming hit at a .186 clip and served up 155 aces.

## Keeping Up With Kentucky

**At First Glance:** The No. 24 Kentucky Wildcats return 11 letterwinners, including six starters, from the 2015 team which posted a 21-10 record, finished second in the Southeastern Conference and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats are coached by Craig Skinner, who is in his 12th season with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Wildcats wrapped the 2015 season with a three-set loss to American in the NCAA First Round in Columbus, Ohio, on Dec. 4.

**Statistically Speaking:** Kentucky returns its top seven hitters, including five which averaged more than two kills per set. Outside hitter Darian Mack (3.24), All-SEC middle blocker Kaz Brown (2.73), outside hitter Anni Thomasson (2.53), outside hitter/middle blocker Sharay Barnes (2.27) and middle blocker Brooke Morgan (2.12) make up the group. Mack added 2.04 digs per set, while Thomasson chipped in 2.92 digs per set and a team-best 30 aces. Brown led the team with 1.61 blocks per set and hit at a team-best .312 clip. Middle blocker Emily Franklin served up 27 aces and added 1.01 blocks per set.

Defensively, SEC Libero of the Year Ashley Dusek is back after registering 5.05 digs per set and 23 aces. Thomasson (2.92), Mack (2.04) and defensive specialist McKenzie Watson (2.03) followed. The team must replace All-SEC setter Morgan Bergren. The Wildcats hit at a .228 clip and served up 147 aces in 2015.

## Poll Position

Purdue kicks off the 2016 season ranked 20th in the AVCA Preseason Top 25 poll. The Boilermakers entered the top 25 at No. 24 in the August 31, 2015, poll and were ranked throughout the rest of the season, peaking at No. 14 and ending the year at No. 17.

The Boilermakers fell out of the AVCA Top 25 for the first time since Nov. 29, 2010, dropping from No. 24 in the Dec. 1 poll to

receiving votes in the final 2014 rankings. The team also received votes in the preseason 2015 poll, before beginning its current stretch of 16 listings.

Purdue has been ranked 175 times since the AVCA polls began in 1982, including preseason and postseason listings.

## The Ties That Bind

Kentucky head coach Craig Skinner and Purdue associate head coach John Shondell were college teammates on the men's volleyball team at Ball State from 1991-93. The pair played under Shondell's father, Hall of Famer Dr. Don Shondell. Shondell played 1989, 1991-93, while Skinner was a letterwinner from 1990-93. Their history, however, dates well before their time together at Ball State as the pair met in kindergarten at Westview Elementary in Muncie and played little league and club volleyball together through the years.

## The Slate

The Boilermakers are slated to play 11 matches against teams ranked in the AVCA Preseason Top 25 Poll, and three more against teams that are receiving votes outside of the Top 25. Purdue will face No. 1 Nebraska, No. 3 Minnesota, No. 4 Wisconsin twice, No. 5 Kansas, No. 9 Penn State, No. 11 Stanford, No. 14 Illinois twice, No. 15 Ohio State and No. 24 Kentucky. The Boilermakers also will face off with vote getters Michigan State twice and Michigan once.

## Preseason Predictions

The Boilermakers were picked as FloVolleyball's No. 16 team in the website's preseason NCAA countdown. The site said "If it avoids injuries, look for Purdue to scramble with Ohio State and Penn State for a spot just behind Nebraska, Minnesota, and Wisconsin."

Purdue was picked to finish ninth in the Big Ten in both the league's preseason coaches' poll and PrepVolleyball.com's preseason conference rankings. Prepvolleyball also listed the Boilermakers at No. 29 on its Preseason Top 50 Countdown.

## New Faces

The 2016 roster features four newcomers as well as two new staff members. Redshirt sophomore outside hitter Sherridan Atkinson joined the team in January after transferring from Long Beach State. Freshman libero Natalie Haben and setter Lexi Dorn have been on campus since July, while defensive specialist Olivia Van Zelst came to West Lafayette for preseason camp in August.

One member of the Boilermaker volleyball family is back with the team in a different role as three-time All-American middle blocker Stephanie (Lynch) Harpeneau returns after eight seasons to be the program's supervisor of operations. Harpeneau graduated from Purdue in 2009 as one of Purdue's most highly decorated players. Also new to the staff is volunteer assistant Levi Gibson, who comes to West Lafayette after four years as a manager at Ball State. Gibson graduated in May 2016.

## Top 10 Wins

The Boilermakers have posted 11 wins over Top 10 foes in the Dave Shondell era, including nine since 2010. Purdue added a five-set win over No. 3 Minnesota on Nov. 21, 2015.

## Among the Nation

In the final 2015 NCAA statistical rankings, the Boilermakers ranked among the Top 50 nationally in three categories. Purdue was 27th in hitting percentage (.262), 37th in assists per set (13.07) and 48th in kills per set (13.90). Individually, Faye Adelaja ranked 26th in hitting percentage (.397), while Ashley Evans ranked 29th in assists per set (11.06). Annie Drews was 32nd in points per set (4.75) and 34th in points per set (4.25).

## Shondell's Successes

Under Dave Shondell's watch, the program has become part of an elite group nationally. Including the 2015 season, Purdue is one of 11 schools nationally to make 10 NCAA second round appearances in the last 12 seasons. In addition, the Boilermakers have made seven Sweet 16 berths in the last 12 seasons, making the program one of just 12 in the nation that can boast the accomplishment. Purdue also claims elite status as one of only 12 Division I teams to reach the NCAA Sweet 16 four of the last six years. The Boilermakers also have excelled in the classroom, garnering the NCAA Public Recognition Award for 11 straight seasons, making them one of just three volleyball squads and one of 110 teams across NCAA sports to be honored each year of the program's existence.

Under Shondell, Purdue has posted eight 20-win seasons, including 23 victories in 2015, the program's sixth-straight 20-win campaign, and defeated 48 ranked foes. In 2011, the Boilermakers finished second in the Big Ten, its best conference placing since 1987, and posted 29 wins, the most since 1985. Shondell has coached players to 15 All-American honors and four Academic All-America accolades. His charges also have earned 22 All-Big Ten and 84 Academic All-Big Ten accolades.

Aiding Shondell are associate head coach John Shondell and assistant coach Kathy Jewell. The trio are the longest tenured complete staff in the Big Ten Conference.

## 2015: A Look Back

The Boilermakers finished their season 23-10 and 13-7 in the Big Ten. The fifth-place finish marked the sixth straight and 11th spot among the conference top five in the last 12 seasons. Purdue was ranked in all 14 regular season polls, and received votes in the preseason poll, peaking at No. 14 on Nov. 23. The team advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the 10th straight time under Shondell in 10 NCAA appearances since 2004. Purdue reached the 20-win milestone for the sixth-straight season and ninth time in the last 11 years, while the 23 wins were tied for the most since 2011. The Boilermakers defeated three ranked foes and were ranked 27th nationally in hitting percentage, 37th in assists per set and 48th in kills per set.

Right side hitter Annie Drews was named among the top 28 players in the country as she earned AVCA Second Team All-America honors. Middle blockers Faye Adelaja and Danielle Cuttino garnered Honorable Mention All-America acclaim. The trio also garnered first team All-Northeast Region honors.

The All-America nod was the second for Drews, following honorable mention acclaim in 2014. She became the eighth player in Purdue history to earn more than one All-America accolade and first since Val Nichol (third team in 2013 and honorable mention in 2014). The trio of All-America honorees marked the first for the Boilermakers in program history. Purdue has previously had two honorees in a season five times (1983, 1984, 2011, 2013, 2014).

The Boilermakers carried on a tradition of 12 straight years with an All-Big Ten selection and six straight years with a first team selection as senior outside hitter Annie Drews and redshirt junior Faye Adelaja garnered all-conference honors. Drews was named as a unanimous All-Big Ten selection, while Adelaja received honorable mention honors. Purdue has had a first team selection each year since 2010 and has earned two All-Big Ten honors each year since 2011, including honorable mention selections. This was Drews' second consecutive All-Big Ten honor, following first team accolades in 2014, and marked Adelaja's first ever Big Ten postseason accolade.

## Statistically Speaking

Outside hitter Annie Drews paced the Boilermaker offense with 4.25 kills per set. Middle blocker Faye Adelaja (2.38), outside hitter Sam Epenesa (2.09), middle blocker Danielle Cuttino (2.04) and outside hitter Azariah Stahl (1.80) also contributed nearly two kills per set. Adelaja hit at a team-best .397 clip and added 0.89 blocks per set, while Cuttino put up a team-leading 1.21 stuffs per stanza.

Defensively, libero Amanda Neill pulled up 4.02 digs per set and served up 29 aces. Setter Ashley Evans posted 2.39 digs per set to go with her 11.06 assists per set tally and 22 aces. Outside hitter Alexa Smith added 2.05 digs per set and 21 aces, while Drews managed 1.72 digs per set and 17 aces. Defensive specialist Brooke Peters chipped in 1.17 digs per set and served up a team-leading 30 aces.

As a team, Purdue hit at a .262 clip and served up 145 aces.

The Boilermakers ranked among the nation's top 50 in three statistical categories. Purdue was 27th in hitting percentage (.262), 37th in assists per set (13.07) and 48th in kills per set (13.90).

Individually, Faye Adelaja ranked 26th in hitting percentage (.397), while Ashley Evans ranked 29th in assists per set (11.06). Annie Drews was 32nd in points per set (4.75) and 34th in points per set (4.25).

## Records and Milestones

Senior libero Amanda Neill joined the 1,000-dig club on Sept. 26 at Michigan State and moved into the career top 10 for digs with 23 against Nebraska on Nov. 4. She ended her career with 1,315 digs, good for fifth all-time on the Purdue career list.

Senior outside hitter Annie Drews tallied her 1,000th career kill vs. Notre Dame on Sept. 19 and recorded her 1,300th career kill against No. 3 Minnesota on Nov. 21. Drews ended her career with 1,373, good for 11th on the Purdue career list.

Sophomore Danielle Cuttino recorded 10 block assists at Maryland, Nov. 11, making her the first player to post double-digit stuffs since Faye Adelaja had 11 against Pittsburgh on Sept. 14, 2013. The tally ranks second all-time on Purdue's four-set match records list behind an 11 block assist effort by Jill Whiteman on Sept. 23, 1990 vs. Georgia.

## In A Nutshell

The Boilermakers played 11 matches against ranked foes in 2015, and battled 11 teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Purdue started the year with a 9-2 record in non-conference play, including 3-0 marks and tournament titles at the Mortar Board Premier and Boiler Box Challenge. The team started Big Ten play 6-0, including a season-sweep of Indiana, and a sweep of No. 12 Michigan in Ann Arbor. The Boilermakers faced six ranked teams in the next seven matches, managing only a sweep of unranked Northwestern and a five-set win over No. 18 Illinois. Purdue bounced back with five straight wins including a five-set victory over No. 3 Minnesota. A four-set win over SMU put the team in the NCAA Second Round, where No. 3 Texas edged the Boilermakers in four sets to wrap the season.

## Drews Honored By Big Ten Three Times

Senior outside hitter Annie Drews became the first Purdue player to garner three Big Ten weekly honors in a season since Ariel Turner did so in 2012 (Player of the Week twice, Defensive Player of the Week once). Turner was honored as Big Ten Player of the Week four times in 2011.

Drews was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week, Oct. 5, for her efforts in wins against Rutgers and Maryland. The senior paced the Boilermakers with 4.29 kills per set on a .411 hitting percentage to go with 1.86 digs per set and three blocks.

The Elkhart, Indiana, native was named Big Ten Player of the Week for the second straight week on Oct. 12 after leading Purdue in two wins against Indiana. She paced the Boilermakers in a pair of sweeps of the Hoosiers, posting 5.00 kills, 1.67 digs and 1.17 blocks per set, while hitting at a .482 clip.

Drews picked up her third weekly honor of 2015 as she was named Big Ten Co-Player of the Week Nov. 16 for her efforts in road wins over Maryland and Northwestern. She paced the Boilermakers with 4.88 kills per set, while hitting .289 and adding 1.62 digs and 1.00 blocks per set as Purdue reached the 20-win milestone for the sixth-straight season.

## Academic Honors

Redshirt sophomore Ashley Evans successfully balanced her academics and guiding the Boilermaker volleyball team and was honored by the College Sports Information Directors of America with Academic All-America third team honors and Academic All-District 5 accolades in 2015.

Evans, a mechanical engineering major, was one of just 18 volleyball players selected nationally to three six-person teams. She was one of eight student-athletes selected to represent District V, which covers Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Ohio, on the All-America ballot. To be eligible for Academic All-District and Academic All-America honors, student-athletes must be in their second academic year at an institution and carry at least a 3.3 cumulative GPA.

Evans and seven other Boilermakers garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors: Faye Adelaja, Carissa Damler, Lydia Dimke, Annie Drews, Kaisley Fisher, Amanda Neill and Linnea Rohrsen.

## Coming Back From the Dead

The Boilermakers fought off eight match-point attempts by Miami (Fla.), overcoming a 24-22 deficit in Set 3 and a 24-18 margin in Set 4 to win both stanzas by 26-24 scores to extend the match to a decisive fifth set. Purdue trailed 11-9 in Set 5 and scored four in a row to go up 13-11, but could not hold off a late Hurricane rally in a 15-13 loss.

On Sept. 26 at Michigan State, the Boilermakers trailed 24-21 in Set 3, before scoring five straight to steal away the set at 26-24 en route to a four-set win.

In their Oct. 25 match against No. 18 Illinois, Purdue came back from trailing 2-0 to win the match in five sets. The victory marked the Boilermakers first such five-set comeback since Oct. 24, 2014, against Northwestern. In the Shondell era, Purdue has won five matches after trailing 0-2.

While they didn't complete the set win, Purdue rallied from down 20-9 in Set 3 against Rutgers on Nov. 18 to tie the score at 24 and 25 before falling 27-25 in the stanza. The Boilermakers trailed 24-17 and thwarted seven Scarlet Knight set-point chances with four kills, two blocks and a hitting error to tie the score at 24.

## Boilers Hold Arkansas-Pine Bluff to Single-Digit Total

Purdue allowed Arkansas-Pine Bluff just nine points in Set 1 on Sept. 4. The single-digit point total marked the eighth time a Boilermaker side held its foe under 10 points in a set in the rally scoring era and the first time since a 25-8 score in Set 3 of the Oct. 11, 2014 match against Indiana.

## Bypassing the Block

The Boilermakers hit at a season-high .462 clip against Northwestern on Oct. 23, thanks, in part, to the fact that they bypassed the Wildcat block. The match marked the first time since Aug. 25, 2012, against George Washington, that a Boilermaker foe had not recorded at least one block in a match. Dating to 1999, the two occurrences stand alone. Purdue foes have put up just one block nine times in the span.

In program history, Boilermakers foes have gone without a block 10 times. Blocking stats began in earnest in 1982. Purdue allowed opponents zero blocks twice in 1982, twice in 1983, once in 1984, once in 1987, once in 1989 and once in 1997 in addition to the 2012 and 2015 occurrences.

## Neill Joins 1,000 Dig Club

Senior libero Amanda Neill registered 16 digs against Michigan State on Sept. 26, moving her career total to 1,005. The feat made her the 17th Boilermaker to reach the milestone and first since Ariel Turner (2009-12) posted 1,030. The Lafayette, Ind., native recorded 825 digs in her first three seasons at Purdue. All told, Neill managed 1,315 digs.

### Drews Joins 1,000 Kill Club

Senior outside hitter Annie Drews put down 29 kills in the Sept. 19 win over Notre Dame, recording her 1,000th career putdown to tie the score at 24-24 in Set 2. The Elkhart, Ind., native became the 25th Boilermaker and first since Ariel Turner, who put down 1,906 from 2009-2012, to achieve the milestone. In total, Drews tallied 1,373 kills, (Note: Kim Cappa tallied 625 kills from 2002-04 at Purdue after transferring from Murray State to give her more than 1,000 in her career. She is not included in the 25 player list.)

### Pack Mackey

Purdue topped Notre Dame in four sets in Mackey Arena on Sept. 19 in front a crowd of 6,220, the fifth largest in program history. The match marked Purdue's 18th match in Mackey in program history, including two exhibition contests. The Boilermakers are now 12-4 in countable matches in the facility and at one time held the NCAA Attendance record, packing in 10,645 fans for the original Pack Mack event on Oct. 29, 1985. The nine largest crowds ever to watch Purdue volleyball at home have seen the Boilermakers play in Mackey Arena.

The Mackey crowd pushed Purdue's season attendance tally to 40,379. The per-match average of 2,524 ranked Purdue eighth nationally. The program has been among the national top 20 in attendance average every year since 2003.

### Home Sweet Home

The Boilermakers went 13-3 at home in 2015, including a 7-3 mark in Big Ten play. Purdue boasts a 336-176 record all-time in Holloway Gymnasium, a .656 winning percentage. The program is 147-55 (a .727 percentage) on Belin Court in the Dave Shondell era. Purdue's best home record under Shondell is a 17-1 mark from 2011. The Boilermakers also recorded just one loss on the home boards in 1990 (13-1), 1985 (16-1) and 1982 (18-1).
