### Notables

- Purdue is 9-1 in the last 10 games against Illinois and 18-2 in the last 20 matchups.
- Purdue has a four-game win streak against the Fighting Illini.
- The last Illinois win over Purdue was a 65-55 victory Feb. 3, 2005 in West Lafayette, Ind.
- A win by the Boilermakers would give them a 41-14 series advantage over Illinois.
- The Boilermakers victory over Northwestern on Sunday was coach Versyp's 40th win as the Purdue head coach and the first back-to-back wins since the first two games of the season.
- A win would move Purdue to 10-10 on the season, 6-3 in the Big Ten.
- A win would improve Purdue's Big Ten regular season record to 293-140 and give the Boilermakers a school record of 627-335.
- A Boilermaker victory would move Coach Versyp's record to 41-16 at Purdue and 158-81 overall, including a three-year Big Ten record of 29-12 (9-7 at Indiana in 2005-06 and 20-5 while at Purdue).
- Sunday's game is "Think Pink" game, an initiative sponsored by the WBCA in an effort to raise money and awareness for breast cancer research. Purdue is hosting a health fair, the team will wear pink uniforms, donations will be solicited and cancer survivors will be honored at halftime.

## Scouting The Boilermakers

Purdue (9-10, 5-3) is tied with four other teams for second place in the Big Ten after losing 69-53 at Iowa on Jan. 24. The non-conference schedule was tough, with five of the Boilers losses coming against nationally-ranked teams, including No. 1 Connecticut, No. 3 North Carolina, No. 10 Duke, No. 13 Old Dominion and No. 16 Notre Dame. Purdue junior Danielle Campbell leads the team in scoring with a 12.6 point per game average. Campbell is the team's leading rebounder, averaging 7.9 boards while averaging a team-high 2.3 blocks per game. Starting point guard FahKara Malone leads the team in both assists (3.4 apg) and steals (2.3 spg). Injuries to key players has been the story this season. The Boilermakers lost two returning starters, Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton (knee) and Jodi Howell (shoulder) to injuries before the season began and Malone has been hampered by concussion symptoms.

## Scouting The Fighting Illini

Illinois has lost five of its last six contests, including a 65-62 decision against Michigan State on Thursday and four of those five losses have been by three points or less. The Fighting Illini are led by sophomore forward Jenna Smith who is averaging a double-double, 18.4 points and 10.1 rebounds per game. Danyel Crutcher also averages double-digits at 10.2 points and junior Lori Bjork has a 9.1 per game average. Bjork has hit a total of 10 threes in the last three games. Illinois is led by first-year head coach Jolette Law.

## The Series Vs. Illinois

This marks the 55th meeting between Purdue and Illinois, with the Boilermakers leading the series 40-14. Purdue won both matchups last season, including a 69-57 victory on Feb. 8, 2007, in Mackey Arena. Katie Gearlds led the team with 24 points and recorded a career-high with 12 rebounds. Less than three weeks later, the 15th-ranked Boilermakers won in Champaign, 58-48, on Feb. 25, 2007. The last Illinois win against Purdue was on Feb. 3, 2005, when the Fighting Illini prevailed over the Boilermakers 66-56. The Illinois win in Mackey Arena snapped a record 12-game losing streak to Purdue. Since then Purdue has been on a four-game win streak against Illinois. The Boilermakers are 22-4 at home and 16-9 in Champaign against the Fighting Illini.

## Purdue Vs. The Big Ten

The Boilermakers own a 339-184 record in all Big Ten games, a .648 win percentage. Purdue has a winning record against every Big Ten opponent, except Ohio State. The Buckeyes have a 32-22 series advantage against the Boilermakers. Purdue's winning percentage against the Fighting Illini is 74.1 percent.

## Campbell Having Impressive Season

Danielle Campbell is Purdue's leading scorer and rebounder, averaging 12.6 points and 7.9 rebounds per game. Campbell picked up her fifth double-double of the season, for her career and for the second time against the Hoosiers with 15 points and 11 rebounds on Jan. 14. The junior center made history with a triple-double against Butler, compiling 12 points, 11 rebounds and 11 blocked shots. It is only the second triple-double in Purdue history and the first since All-American Stephanie White accomplished the feat with 20 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists on Jan. 22, 1999, against Indiana. Campbell's 11 blocked shots set a school single-game mark for blocks and is the most in a single game in NCAA Div. I this season. The Chicago native followed up her triple-double with a double-double against Duke, scoring 14 points and grabbing 13 rebounds against the Blue Devils and recorded her third double-double with 10 points and 12 rebounds against Southeast Missouri State. Campbell is currently second in the Big Ten in blocked shots and 28th in the nation, with an average of 2.3 per game.

## France's Contributions

Kalika France scored 14 points on Thursday at Iowa, sharing team-high scoring honors with Danielle Campbell. France was the leading scorer and leading rebounder for the Boilermakers in the loss at Minnesota, with 15 points and nine boards, both career highs at Purdue. The senior guard is averaging 8.1 points and is third on the team in rebounding with a 5.7 average.

### Malone By The Numbers

Purdue's sophomore point guard, FahKara Malone, scored a career-high 19 points on 6 of 11 shooting, including 2 of 3 from three-point range against Indiana on Jan. 14. She recorded a career-best 10 assists against North Carolina on Nov. 29. The 5-foot-3 guard was named as a 2006 Big Ten All-Defensive Team member and Big Ten-All Freshman. Malone finished the 2006-07 season with a conference-best average of 2.8 steals per game, ranking her 25th in the nation in that category. This season she is averaging a team-high 2.3 steals and 3.4 assists per game, while averaging 7.5 points.

### Freeman Provides Offense

After leading the team in scoring for the majority of the season, Lakisha Freeman is now the Boilermakers second-leading scorer with an average of 12.3 points per game. She has reached double-digits in 14 of 19 games this season. The 6-foot-1 forward had her first 20-point game with a team- and career-high 23 points at North Carolina. Freeman is fourth on the team in rebounding with a 5.4 board average and is third on the team in field goal percentage, averaging .435 percent. Freeman is 41 of 51 from the free throw line, an 80.4 percent average. She is averaging a team-high 35.9 minutes per game.

### Strong Comeback

Redshirt junior Natasha Bogdanova has returned to the court after sitting out the 2006-07 season with an ACL injury. Bogdanova has started 16 of 19 games this season, averaging 8.1 points and 5.8 rebounds. She tied her career-high for rebounds with 13 against Northwestern on Nov. 20, while also scoring a team-high 13 points, marking the second double-double of her career. Bogdanova scored a season-high 17 points at North Carolina, hitting three three-pointers for the second time this season. The 6-foot-4 forward has hit a team-high 20 threes in 2007-08, and has a team-best three-point field goal percentage of 37.7 percent.

### Mioton Under Control

Lauren Mioton can be counted on to take care of the ball for the Boilermakers this season. The 5-foot-9 junior has committed only 14 turnovers in Purdue's 19 games, despite averaging 12.2 minutes an outing. The New Orleans native has started four games this season.

### Versyp Records 40th Win At Purdue

Sunday's 52-38 victory over Northwestern was Sharon Versyp's 40th win as the head coach of the Boilermakers.

### Campbell Hits One Hundred

Junior Danielle Campbell recorded her 100th career block at Penn State on Jan. 17. The 6-foot-4 junior is 10th on the Purdue career charts with those 100 blocks and is eight swats from tying Rhonda Mateen for ninth place.

### Boilermakers Score Season High

The 79 points scored by Purdue in its 79-70 win at Penn State marked a season high for the Boilermakers. Purdue scored in the 70s only one other time this season, when they lost 90-72 at North Carolina. This season, the Boilermakers have scored in the 60s six times (4-2), in the 50s eight times (4-4) and in the 40s three times (0-3).

### RPI

Despite a 9-10 record, the Boilermakers are ranked as high as 39th in the various RPI indexes. This is due in large part to the challenging schedule that Purdue has played, which has been rated as high as the second most difficult in the country. Collegiate Basketball News has the Boilermakers rated No. 39 with a No. 6 strength of schedule, the Jeff Sagarin/CBN poll has the Boilers No. 62 with the second-toughest schedule and College RPI has Purdue at No. 49 with the fifth-toughest schedule this season. The NCAA RPI lists Purdue at No. 40 as of games played through Jan 22.

### Mosley Has Career Game

Freshman Keshia Mosley got her first career start against Minnesota and made the most of the opportunity by posting career highs for points (12), rebounds (6), free throw percentage (100%), assists (2), blocked shots (2) and minutes (17). The 6-foot-1 forward is averaging 5.2 points by shooting a team-high 47.5 percent (23 of 64) field goal percentage, while averaging 2.6 rebounds.

### Mosley Surprises Gonzaga

Freshman Keshia Mosley provided a boost for the Boilermakers at Gonzaga. The 6-foot-1 forward checked into the game at the 17:25 mark of the second half with Purdue trailing by five points and proceeded to score 10 of the Boilermakers next 12 points, giving Purdue a 41-40 lead with a basket at 12:48. The Boilermakers did not trail after that, winning by a final score of 64-61. Mosley finished with 10 points in 10 minutes of play, on 5 of 6 shooting while grabbing a rebound and a steal.

### Woods Gets Off To A Fast Start

Freshman Samantha Woods had an impressive debut for the Boilermakers, leading the team in scoring and rebounding with 17 points and seven boards in the 65-62 win over Valparaiso. The 6-foot-3 native of Bolingbrook, Ill., was 5 of 11 from the field and 7 of 12 from the free throw line in 25 minutes of play. Woods moved into the starting lineup at Penn State and started two games for the Boilermakers. She is averaging 3.4 points and 2.2 rebounds per game.

### Not Your Typical Senior Class

Purdue's two active seniors, Brittany Dildine and Kalika France, each had only half a season experience with the Boilermakers coming into the 2007-08 campaign. Dildine joined the team in Dec. 2006, after completing her career with Purdue's nationally-ranked volleyball team. France earned a bachelors degree in accounting from Maryland and transferred to Purdue in Jan. 2007. The 5-foot-9 native of Bladensburg, Md., averaged 11.3 points and 5.4 rebounds in two seasons at Maryland and was named to the 2004 ACC All-Freshman Team and honorable mention All-ACC the same year. Knee problems caused France to redshirt the 2005-06 national championship season with the Terrapins. Because she earned her undergraduate degree in three and a half years and only played two seasons, France was eligible for the Boilermakers immediately due to an NCAA rule that has since been rescinded. France is in the health and kinesiology graduate program at Purdue.

### Versyp Gets 150

Purdue head coach Sharon Versyp recorded her 150th career win with a 69-53 victory over Butler on Nov. 17 in Mackey Arena. At the conclusion of the 2006-07 season, Versyp moved into the top-50 of active Division I coaches by winning percentage, ranking 44th with a career percentage of .676.

### Purdue Gives Up Records Against Connecticut

Several records were set in top-ranked Connecticut's 100-50 victory over Purdue in Mackey Arena on Jan. 6, including 50 points being the worst loss in Purdue's history, the most points by an opponent in a home game and tying the record-low in a first half by holding the Boilermakers to 14. Purdue gave up 100 points for the first time in 25 years.

### The Wrong Kind Of Record

Purdue's four-game losing streak was the longest since the 1992-93 season when the Boilermakers lost five consecutive Big Ten games. Purdue finished 16-11 that year, including 8-10 in the Big Ten. One has to go back to the 1984-85 campaign, Sharon Versyp's freshman year, to find a string greater than five losses. That season the Boilermakers lost seven consecutive contests, finishing 12-16 overall, 6-12 in the Big Ten and was the last time Purdue had a losing record.

### The Wrong Kind Of Record: Part Two

The Boilermakers began conference play at 4-6, the first sub-.500 record since the 1983-84 season. That year, Purdue was 4-6 heading into its Big Ten opener at Wisconsin on Jan. 6, 1984.

### Three-Point String Broken

For the second time this season, Purdue failed to hit a three pointer in a game. The Boilermakers were 0 for 9 from beyond the arc in the 55-49 win at Indiana on Jan. 3, 2008. It was the 43rd time since the three-point rule was instituted that Purdue has failed to make a three-point shot in a game. Earlier in the season, Temple held the Boilermakers scoreless from the three-point line on Nov. 24, 2007, in the second game of the Paradise Jam. Purdue was 0 for 4 from beyond the arc, marking the first time since a 51-43 win at Michigan on Jan. 8, 2006, that the Boilers failed to make a three. Purdue's streak of consecutive games with a made-three pointer ended at 59.

### Leading The Way

The players voted for team captains for the 2007-08 season and elected sophomore FahKara Malone, junior Lauren Mioton and senior Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton.

### Injury Updates

The Boilermakers are without the services of senior Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton and junior Jodi Howell this season. Wisdom-Hylton, the 2007 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year and an All-America candidate, would have been the top returning scorer and rebounder, averaging 14.8 points and 8.2 rebounds last season. She injured her knee July 7, while playing for the USA Basketball U21 World Championship Team in the FIBA U21 World Championship in Moscow. Her rehab has progressed to the point that she is currently practicing with the team, but plans to apply for a medical redshirt for the season. Howell is sitting out due to an injured shoulder that required two surgeries this fall. Howell first hurt her left shoulder in Purdue's 78-65 win against Georgia in the 2007 NCAA Tournament Dallas Regional. Howell started every game last year, except the final contest against North Carolina. She averaged 6.8 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.3 assists while shooting 46.6 percent from the field. Howell led the team in three-point field goal percentage at 40.6 percent, ranking her third in the Big Ten. Howell was second on the team in made three-pointers, connecting on 56 of 138 threes. She is allowed to practice in non-contact drills.

### Back In Old Gold And Black

Purdue returns eight letterwinners, including one starter from 2006-07. The Boilermakers lost two starters to graduation (Katie Gearlds and Erin Lawless) and two to injuries (Jodi Howell and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton). # Sharon Versyp

Head Coach

2nd season at Purdue • 8th season as a head coach



In her first season as the head coach at her alma mater, Sharon Versyp led Purdue to a 31-6 record that included a Big Ten Tournament title and an appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight.

The Boilermakers finished the 2006-07 season ranked No. 7 in the final USA Today/ESPN poll. Versyp was named the 2007 WBCA Region 6 Coach of the Year for her achievements on the season.

The 31 wins equals the second-most in school history and marks only the third time the Boilermakers have achieved a 30-plus win season.

Versyp's career record stands at 157-81 in her eighth year as a collegiate head coach. With her 24th win on Feb. 22, 2007, against Iowa, Versyp became Purdue's winningest first-year head coach. The 24 wins passed Carolyn Peck (23-10) and Kristy Curry (23-8) for the most victories by a first year coach. Versyp's 2006-07 win percentage of 83.8 percent (31-6) is fifth best in a season at Purdue and tops for a first-year coach.

Versyp was hired April 10, 2006, as the eighth head coach of the Purdue women's basketball team. Versyp, who played point

guard for the Boilermakers from 1984 to 1988, directed Indiana to a 19-14 record in 2005-06, the second-best turn-around in school history. Prior to Indiana, Versyp was the head coach at Maine for five seasons where she was named 2003 and 2005 America East Coach of the Year. At Maine, Versyp put together back-to-back 25-win seasons for the first time in school history.

As a player, Versyp was one of only seven four-year starters in school history. A native of Mishawaka, Ind., she was the first Indiana Miss Basketball to play for Purdue. Versyp still has top 10 standings in nine statistical categories; career points (10th - 1,565), career points per game (8th - 13.8), career field goals made (8th - 653), career field goals attempted (6th - 1,404), free throws made in a game (3rd - 14), career free throw percentage (5th - 79.6), assists in a game (4th - 12), career assists (7th - 418) and career double-figure scoring games (7th - 87).

In addition to her on-court success, Versyp excelled in the classroom. She earned Academic All-Big Ten honors as a sophomore, junior and senior. Also as a senior, she was named a second team Academic All-American. She majored in speech communications education.

Versyp signed a new contract that will secure her presence on the Boilermaker sidelines through June of 2013.

In an historic evening at Mackey Arena, junior forward Danielle Campbell recorded only the second triple-double in the history of Purdue women's basketball, with a 12-point, 11-rebound and 11-block performance to help pace Purdue to a 69-53 victory over Butler on Saturday night. The 11 blocks in a game is a new school record and her 12 points tied her personal best. Junior forward Natasha Bogdanova also aided in the Boilermaker victory by scoring 16 points, all in the second half, and converting on 6 of 7 from the field and a perfect 3 of 3 from long range. After starting the second half on a 16-2 run and leading 46-22 with about 15 minutes left in the game, Purdue was held scoreless by the Bulldogs for the next five minutes, who went on a 14-0 run and cut the lead to 46-36. That's when Bogdanova connected from the right wing with 10 minutes to play and allowed Purdue to regain control of the contest. Along with Campbell and Bogdanova, two other Boilermakers (2-0) finished in double figures with FahKara Malone tying Bogdanova with 16 points and tying a career-high, and Lakisha Freeman adding 15. Campbell, like her teammate Bogdanova, started the game slowly with six points and only three rebounds as Purdue held a 30-20 lead heading into the break. The Boilermakers shot only 38 percent from the floor in the first half, but the Boilermakers capitalized on nine blocked shots, three steals and nine assists in the second half and shot 55 percent from the floor after halftime. Susan Lester led the way for the Bulldogs (2-1) with 14 points and six rebounds. The Boilermakers now hold a 6-0 record all-time against Butler.

With three players scoring in double figures, Purdue held on to defeat the Michigan Wolverines 56-51 Thursday night. Lakisha Freeman scored 14 points, Danielle Campbell added 12 and Kalika France chipped in 11. A back and forth battle for the entire game, the Boilermakers (7-8, 3-1 Big Ten) fell behind 51-50 with about two minutes remaining, but Purdue ended the game on a 6-0 run, thanks to timely free throw shooting and solid defense. In the game, Purdue forced 20 Michigan (9-5, 5-5) miscues. After going 1 of 6 from the foul line in the first half, the Boilermakers converted on 9 of 13 in the second half, including a perfect 4 of 4 with less than 30 seconds left to preserve the victory. Following the worst loss in program history Sunday against No. 1 Connecticut, the Boilermakers struggled early against the Wolverines. Falling behind 10-4 in the early going, Purdue used an 11-0 run to take the lead and get back into the contest. Coming out of intermission with the score tied at 24, Purdue started the second half without the services of sophomore guard FahKara Malone. Malone was shaken up at the end of the first half and didn't re-enter the game until the 7:34 mark of the second half. Later in the second, Malone left the game briefly after running into a hard screen. Upon returning, she converted on two of Purdue's final four free throws to ice the game. Michigan forward Carly Benson led the way for the Wolverines with 17 points and eight rebounds.

Purdue was trailing by just one point at the half, 31-30, but the Hoosiers used an 8-0 run at the start the second to defeat the Boilermakers 66-54 Monday night. Purdue and Indiana split the season series after Purdue defeated Indiana in Bloomington earlier this season. Indiana forward Whitney Thomas capped the evening with a double-double, finishing with 17 points and 18 rebounds, the most rebounds by any Purdue opponent this season. Purdue forward Danielle Campbell countered with a 15-point and 11-rebound performance of her own, but it wasn't enough to keep Purdue in the game. With nine lead changes in the first half Indiana (10-7, 3-2 Big Ten) scored the first eight points of the second half to gain control of the game. The Hoosiers finished the half shooting 42 percent while the Boilermakers converted on only 25 percent of their shots. Despite its poor shooting, Purdue (7-9, 3-2) mounted a charge late in the second half when Thomas went to the bench after picking up her fourth foul. A FahKara Malone free throw moved the Boilermakers to within three at 50-47, but they wouldn't get any closer. Indiana converted on 13 of 16 free throws in the second half, while Purdue struggled at the stripe, going 5 of 10. Malone, one of only two Boilermakers in double-figures, led Purdue with 19 points to go along with four assists and three steals. Indiana's Jamie Braun and Kim Roberson scored 14 and 11 points for the Hoosiers.

The Boilermakers ended Penn State's perfect home record this season with a 79-70 victory on Thursday. The Boilermakers had four players in double figures and were led by Danielle Campbell's 17 points. Head coach Sharon Versyp challenged her team to play more aggressively and they responded by outscoring the fast-breaking Lady Lions 6-0 in that category. Purdue (8-9, 4-2) also made six more free throws than Penn State attempted, hitting 23 of 27 (85.2 percent) from the charity stripe compared to 14 of 17 (82.4 percent) free throws by Penn State (12-6, 3-3). Purdue shot 48.1 percent (26 of 54) from the field in the game and the 79 points scored by the Boilermakers are a season high for the Boilermakers. Purdue outrebounded the Lady Lions 36 to 29 and held a 32 to 22 advantage in points scored in the paint. Junior Lakisha Freeman came off the bench to score 15 points while Kalika France had 14 points and a team-high eight rebounds. FahKara Malone rounded out the double-figure scoring for Purdue with 11 points while dishing out four assists. Penn State was led by Tyra Grant's 18 points. Kamela Gissendanner added 14 points, Meggan Quinn had 11 and Brianne O'Rourke contributed 10 points and nine assists for the Lady Lions.

Purdue had three players score in double-figures and held Northwestern scoreless in the final 4:12 as the Boilermakers defeated the Wildcats 52-38 on Sunday afternoon. Natasha Bogdanova recorded a double-double leading the Boilermakers with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Lakisha Freeman and Danielle Campbell scored 10 and 12 points each and Purdue improved to 9-9 overall and 5-2 in the Big Ten while the Wildcats dropped to 4-15 overall and 0-7 in the Big Ten. After allowing the Wildcats to shoot 52 percent in the first half, Purdue came out with increased defensive intensity in the second half. In the second stanza the Boilermakers forced 14 turnovers, recorded eight steals and held Northwestern to 27 percent shooting from the field. For the game, the Boilermakers scored 20 points off turnovers and had nine second-chance points. Purdue controlled the rebounding as well as it out-rebounded Northwestern 37-30 overall and 16-3 on the offensive glass. After leading 24-23 at the half, the Boilermakers fell behind 28-24 at the beginning of the second half but went on a 22-8 run in the final 12 minutes to overtake the Wildcats. With the score tied at 32-32 and 11:40 remaining, the Boilermakers got a 16 foot jumper from Freeman to go down and then forced a Northwestern shot clock violation. Following the Wildcat turnover Freeman came up with another score as she drove to the basket and put in a layup from the left side to give Purdue a 36-32 advantage. Purdue never looked back as it hit 7-of-10 free throws in the last 10 minutes and only allowed three field goals in the final nine to ice the victory.

The Boilermakers could not overcome a slow start on the road, dropping a 69-53 decision at Iowa. Purdue never led in the game and the Boilermakers only tie was 3-3 at the 18:32 mark of the first half. Danielle Campbell and Kalika France were the only Boilermakers in double-figures, scoring 14 points each. Campbell also contributed eight rebounds despite limited playing time in the first half due to foul trouble. FahKara Malone scored nine points to go along with seven assists and two steals. Iowa's Kristi Smith led all scorers with 19 points while 6-foot-6 reserve center Megan Skouby chipped in 17 and Wendy Ausdemore had 11 points. The Hawkeyes outshot Purdue in both halves, finishing 22 of 52 from the field for 42.3 percent while the Boilermakers were 18 of 51 for 35.3 percent.
