GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 779-420 all-time, including a 409-131 record at home.
- Purdue is 193-101 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 310-166.
- Purdue is 364-190 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 209-68 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Versyp is 91-55 at Purdue in conference play and 100-62 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 167-117 in February, including a 99-45 record in Mackey Arena. The Boilermakers are 5-8 all-time on Feb. 8, including a 5-3 record at home.
- The Boilermakers are 499-192 in the state of Indiana.
- Purdue is 19-18 all-time in the 23rd game of the season.
- Sunday's game between Purdue and Penn State was the first meeting with neither team ranked since 2011, and just the 10th time in series history with no ranked team.
- The Boilermakers are now 5-3 in their home Pink Zone games, which started in 2008.
- Sunday was just Purdue's second loss of the season when leading at halftime, falling to 10-2 for the situation.
- The Boilermakers shot a season-worst 29 percent from the field (18-62), including 16.7 percent from behind the arc (3-18).
- Purdue had is second-worst free throw shooting game of the season, making just 55 percent at the line (11-20).
- The Boilermakers outrebounded Penn State, 43-42, but turned 15 offensive rebounds into just seven second-chance points.
- Penn State was six-of-11 from behind the arc (.545), despite coming into Sunday's game averaging 24.3 percent from three.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Senior Liza Clemons had 12 points and nine rebounds, and was the only Boilermaker in doublefigures, marking only the second time this season that has happened.
- Senior Whitney Bays finished with seven points, 12 rebounds, three assists and three steals.
- Freshman Andreona Keys had nine points and a pair of steals.

•	Sophomore Bridget Perry returned to the starting lineup for the first time since Jan. 8 at Maryland and posted six points, eight rebounds and three assists in 28 minutes.
