

PURDUE BASKETBALL POSTGAME NOTES

Purdue (14-4, 5-2 Big Ten) vs. Nebraska (13-5, 4-3 Big Ten)

GAME NOTES

- Purdue now leads the series 5-3, including a 1-2 record at home over Nebraska
- Purdue is now 1-4 when trailing at the half and 3-3 when trailing after the third quarter
- April Wilson joins Purdue history as the 29th player to score 1,000 career-points
- Purdue tied their largest halftime deficit of 9 points with a score of 21-30 (previous was at Ohio State, 1/17/16)
- The Boilermakers defense allowed 12 assists by Nebraska's Rachel Theriot, an individual opponent-high (previous 7, last by Martina Mosetti of Boston College, 12/3/15)
- The 27 turnovers committed by the Cornhuskers are the most this season by any Purdue opponent (previous 25 vs. Incarnate Word, 12/10/15), who were averaging 14.4 per game
- Dominique McBryde was forced to switch jersey numbers in the first half, moving from 20 to 44 after having too much blood to remove from the uniform.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHS AND LOWS

- April Wilson tied her career-high 24 points (last vs. Illinois 1/3/16) and five steals in addition to setting a career-high 10 field goals
- This was April Wilson's fourth game this season and fifth game in her career with 20-plus points and third career-game with at least five steals
- McBryde's five blocks was good for her fourth career-game as blocked shots leader, including her first time leading a Big Ten game
- The last time a Purdue freshman had five blocked shots in game was Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton's five vs. Michigan on Jan. 9, 2005
- This was the first time this season, and the second time of Wilson's career playing the full 40 minutes of regulation
- Bridget Perry made two three-pointers this evening, which was the second time this season and seventh time in her career with 2+ three pointers
