PURDUE BEGINS ROAD STRETCH WITH SERIES AT MOREHEAD STATE

Fresh off a success season-opening weekend at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge, Purdue baseball begins a stretch of 16 consecutive true road dates with a four-game series at Morehead State.

The weather forecast is scheduled to gradually improve as the weekend progresses but could still impact the series. First pitch is slated for 3 p.m. Friday and 1 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. A doubleheader featuring a nine-inning first game and seven-inning nightcap is scheduled for Saturday. That is the standard format for doubleheaders in the Ohio Valley Conference, the league Morehead State (0-4, 24-25-1 in 2010) calls home.

The Boilermakers (2-1, 33-24 in 2010) are slated to take on three OVC opponents during their upcoming 16-game road stretch. Purdue's spring break trip through the Volunteer State is bookended by series at Tennessee-Martin (March 11-13) and Tennessee Tech (March 18-20).

Because weather could impact the series schedule, which pitchers start which games for both teams remains in flux. Senior right-handers **Matt Morgan** and Trey Smith are projected to start the series opener. Should all four games be played, **Joe Haase** is expected to get an opportunity to make his first career start for Purdue.

Morgan may have won Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for his 5 2/3 shutout innings of BIG EAST preseason favorite Connecticut in the season-opening win, but in many ways **Brad Schreiber's** quality start in Sunday's win against Pittsburgh was equally impressive. Consider it was only Schreiber's second collegiate start and he faced a team that ranked second nationally in 2010 with a .363 batting average. The sophomore held the Panthers to only three runs (two earned) on five hits over six innings.

"I think I started off by being able to locate my fastball on the inner half of the plate," Schreiber said. "I struggled a little bit in the second and third [innings] but I feel like I regained some of my strength through that. I got the ball up a little bit but I was able to pitch backwards, starting them off with offspeed, which kind of threw them off at first. And it also made my fastball a little better, which I was able to move in and out."

Morehead State is regularly among the OVC leaders in home runs, thanks in part to a short right field porch at their home ballpark, Allen Field. Compensation comes in the form of a 40-foot high net in right field and dimensions in left center much larger than other parks. And just as the unique dimensions of Allen Field can inflate the power numbers of the Eagles hitters, especially the lefties, it can have a similar affect on the Morehead pitching staff's ERA.

Haase said that pitchers learn to concentrate on executing their pitches and sticking with

the game plan, rather than focusing on the size of the field.

"Our job is to throw down in the zone anyway," he said. "We try to avoid the other team being able to get the ball in the air. If we keep the ball down in the zone, odds are we won't have a problem with that."

There were only eight home runs hit in the 24 games played at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge last weekend, including none in the Boilermakers' three games. The new restrictions on the aluminum bats being used at the college level were predicted to have a negative impact on power numbers this season. This weekend's series at a field that has a reputation as being home run friendly could make for an interesting test case.

Purdue and Morehead State squared off last year at Evansville Tournament's during the opening weekend of the Boilers' spring break trip. The Eagles won the first meeting between the two teams since 1995, 9-8. Purdue trailed 7-1 entering the top of the sixth but scored eight unanswered runs and eventually took the lead in the bottom of the eighth. A two-out, two-run double in the bottom of the frame proved to be the game-deciding hit for Morehead.

The Boilermakers were just 2-7 after losing that game to MSU on March 13 of last season. One weekend into the current campaign, Purdue has already matched that win total. But one good season-opening weekend does not a successful season make.

"They were definitely big wins [vs. UConn and Pitt]," Schreiber said. "It was tough last year starting 0-4. 2-1 is great but obviously we've got to get back in [Mollenkopf] and practice and keep getting better and better every day. Hopefully by the end of the year we can be the best team we possibly can. And the only way that's going to happen is if we practice hard every day."

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series, All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU. Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE OPENS WITH SUCCESSFUL WEEKEND AT BIG EAST-BIG TEN CHALLENGE

- Purdue opened its new season by winning two-of-three at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge, posting wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut (10-2) and Pittsburgh (5-3). The Boilermakers also lost to Notre Dame after the Fighting Irish blew the game open with an 11-run fourth inning. Purdue scored first in all three games and never trailed against UConn, a team that was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the BIG EAST by the league coaches.
- The Boilermakers snapped a seven-game losing streak at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge dating back to 2009 and exceeded their combined win total in the first two years of the event.
- The BIG EAST won the Challenge, 14-10. Michigan State (3-0), Purdue (2-1) and Penn State (2-1) were the only Big Ten teams to post a winning record. Sunday, the Boilers defeated at Pitt team that had beaten Illinois and Iowa in the first two days of the Challenge.

WINS OVERS NATIONALLY-RANKED COMPETITION

- · Connecticut was ranked ninth by Baseball America in the publication's preseason poll. Pittsburgh was tabbed 30th by Collegiate Baseball in its preseason poll. Purdue managed to defeat both teams during its season-opening weekend.
- · The victory against UConn was Purdue's first against a nationally-ranked opponent since 2007 (Michigan) and first against a Top 10-ranked opponent since winning the opener of a 2006 series at North Carolina. The Boilermakers defeated No. 2 UNC and No. 16 Missouri early in the 2006 campaign, the last time Purdue had multiple wins against nationally-ranked teams in the same season.

MORGAN, PLAWECKI & SERRATO RECOGNIZED

- · Barrett Serrato and Matt Morgan were selected as the first Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Week of 2011 for their standout performances at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. CollegeBaseball360.com selected Kevin Plawecki and Morgan to its Challenge All-Tournament Team and included Serrato on the Honorable Mention list. Morgan, meanwhile, was also named a Primetime Performer for the seasonopening weekend by CollegeBaseball360.com.
- · Morgan was recognized by the conference office for the second time in his career, while the honor for Serrato was his first. Purdue's last Big Ten Player of the Week was Ben Wolgamot in April 2008 and the Boilers had not swept the league's weekly awards since March 2006 (Eric Wolfe and Dan Sattler).
- · Serrato hit safely and drove in a run in all three games at the Challenge, finishing the weekend 6-for-9 with a double, triple, walk, four RBIs and three runs scored. He was 3-for-4 with runners in scoring position. The junior came through with three hits in the Pitt win, driving in the game-tying run in the sixth and a key insurance tally with a two-out single in the eighth. He had two hits, including a double, drove in a run and scored twice against UConn.
- Morgan worked 5 2/3 shutout innings to earn the victory against nationally-ranked Connecticut Friday, setting the tone for the upset win and weekend in general. He struck out five and surrendered only three hits while pitching into the sixth inning. He did not allow the leadoff man to reach in any of the six innings he started, opening the inning with a K in the third, fourth and fifth frames. It was his second consecutive shutout performance at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge.
- · Plawecki hit safely in all three games, finishing the weekend 6-for-12 with a walk, stolen base, four RBIs and a run scored. He had three hits and three RBIs in the win against UConn and helped Purdue defeat Pittsburgh Sunday with two hits and an RBI. He also scored the go-ahead run in the sixth inning and a key insurance tally in the eighth of the Pitt victory.

SCHREIBER & WITTGREN IMPRESS ON THE MOUND IN PITT WIN

- · Brad Schreiber and Nick Wittgren were Purdue's standout performers in the Feb. 27 win against Pittsburgh. Their work on the mound was a big reason why the Boilers limited a Pitt team that ranked second in the nation last season with a .363 batting average to three runs on nine hits.
- · Schreiber won his first start of the season with six solid innings, surrendering only three runs (two earned) on five hits. He struck out a career-high seven, including the final two batters he faced while closing out his sixth inning of work.
- · Wittgren earned his first Purdue save with a stellar relief outing, slamming the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.

SEASON-OPENING NOTEWORTHY

- Eric Charles posted his third career four-hit game in the season-opening win against UConn. He led off the fifth and seventh innings with singles and eventually scored in both frames. He drove in a run with another single in the eighth inning
- Tyler Spillner collected three RBIs without the luxury of a hit in the UConn win, drawing a pair of basesloaded walks and registering a sacrifice fly to left field. He also led off the Notre Dame and Pittsburgh games with doubles.
- · Cameron Perkins hit safely in all three games of the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge to extend his current hitting streak to seven games dating back to last season. He tripled home a run against UConn and collected another RBI with a first-inning double against Pittsburgh.
- Purdue batters were hit by a pitch seven times at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Stephen Talbott was hit three times, including twice in the season opener. Despite collecting only one hit, Talbott had a productive weekend. Against UConn, he scored twice and tagged up and took third on fly ball to left field. He executed a successful squeeze bunt to record an RBI vs. Notre Dame. Sunday against Pitt, he singled and stole a base.

BOILERS OPEN WITH 19 STRAIGHT AWAY FROM HOME

- · Purdue opened its new season at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge for the third year in a row. The program's 123rd season features the Boilermakers playing their first 19 games away from West Lafayette. Purdue plays 16 consecutive road games from the final weekend of February through the end of the spring break trip (March 19).
- This season also marks the 46th and final year for the Boilermakers at Lambert Field, their home since 1965. Construction of the new Northwest Baseball Facility is slated to begin this spring and the new stadium is scheduled to open in 2012.

RECORDING-SETTING SEASON

- The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and strikeouts (435), strikeouts per nine innings (7.76) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.35) on the mound.
- Individually, Tyler Spillner led the Big Ten with seven triples, a new Purdue single-season benchmark. Matt Bischoff established new single-season (95) and career strikeout records (291) while closing out his college career as a four-time All-Big Ten honoree.
- As a team, Purdue led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) while ranking second in ERA (4.78) and saves (14). Remarkably, seven different pitchers earned a save in 2010, none having more than three.

PERKINS, PLAWECKI & SCHREIBER AMONG BIG TEN'S PLAYERS TO WATCH

- Projected to play prominent roles this spring after earning assorted freshman honors in 2010, Cameron Perkins, Kevin Plawecki and Brad Schreiber have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch this season. In conjunction with the unveiling of the projected Big Ten Tournament field, each league coach highlighted three players expected to be key to his team's success this season.
- Plawecki was honored after the 2010 season for his impressive numbers at the plate and his work with the Purdue pitching staff. He was recognized as a Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association after batting a team-best .343 with 21 extra-base hits and a Purdue freshman-record 53 RBIs. He was also the unanimous selection as the catcher on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team thanks in part to a .435 batting average with runners in scoring position.
- PERFECT GAME USA RANKS THE **BIG TEN'S TOP PROSPECTS FOR 2012** 1. 3B Torsten Boss, MSU 2. C/OF Kevin Plawecki, PUR 3. RHP Brad Schreiber, PUR 4. RHP Kevin Johnson, ILL 5. 3B/SS Micah Johnson, IND 6. 3B/C Cameron Perkins, PUR List compiled by Allan Simpson
- Perkins started at first and third base, but settled in at the hot corner and finished the year with a .961 fielding percentage. He joined Plawecki on the Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American team after batting .338 with 27 extra-base hits, 34 RBIs and 10 stolen bases. He established new Purdue freshman records for hits (74), doubles (17), total bases (119) and at-bats (219). Perkins hit safely in 13 consecutive Big Ten games during the heart of conference play and in all four games at the Big Ten Tournament.
- Schreiber slugged .506 in only 79 at-bats last season nine of his 22 hits going for extra bases showing glimpses of the power potential that helped him twice win Wisconsin State Player of the Year honors as high school standout. He was recognized as the relief pitcher on the 2010 Big Ten All-Freshman Team after surrendering only three earned runs in 10 1/3 innings pitched over six appearances on conference weekends. The right-hander is expected to get a chance to start on the mound this year and should get more at-bats at designated hitter.

MORGAN HEADLINES RETURNING PITCHERS

- Matt Morgan is one of only three seniors on the roster and Purdue's only returning pitcher that started more than four games in 2010. The right-hander looks to close out his career as a three-year member of the Purdue weekend rotation. Morgan's experience should prove important after the Boilermakers lost three seniors - Matt Bischoff, Drew Wurdack and Matt Jansen - who made a combined 32 starts in 2010. Purdue went 21-11 in games started by those pitchers last year.
- Morgan enters his senior season with a 10-7 career record. He has maximized his opportunities to earn victories, as the Boilermakers are only 10-13 in his 23 career starts. He's likely to join the program's all-time strikeouts list this year and currently ranks among the Purdue leaders in strikeouts per nine innings (7.975), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.782) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.867). He has struck out 153 versus 55 walks in his first three seasons.
- Morgan struck out a career-high 14 batters over 7 2/3 innings of two-run ball in a March 20 win at Ohio at last season. Along with issuing only one walk, the right-hander struck out the side in the second inning and fanned at least two batters in five of the seven full innings he worked. The 14 Ks were only one shy of the school record, set by Chadd Blasko in March 2002 against Miami (Ohio). Blake Mascarello closed out the victory, striking out two of the seven batters he faced. The 16 Ks by Purdue pitchers in the win were also just one shy of the program record, set against Miami (Ohio) in 2002 as well.

BURNING BRIDGES

• Ryan Bridges put together a team-best 13-game hitting streak in 2010. He hit safely in every game in which he batted from April 6 through May 14. During that stretch he became the starting first baseman and batted .458 (22-for-48) with eight multi-hit efforts and only two strikeouts. Seven of his 22 hits went for extra bases, including a home run in the middle game of the Indiana series.

PLAWECKI GARNERS PRESEASON RECOGNITION

- One of the leaders of Purdue's talented sophomore class, **Kevin Plawecki** was recognized by a pair of college baseball websites in the preseason. In a poll of the Big Ten Coaches by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, he was selected as the best defensive and throwing catcher in the conference. Perfect Game USA also selected him as the catcher on its preseason All-Big Ten team.
- Plawecki made 47 of his 52 starts behind the plate in 2010 and was charged with only six passed balls. He threw out 16 would-be base stealers and worked with a Purdue pitching staff that led the Big Ten in strikeouts and batting average against while ranking second in ERA.

SPILLNER & CHARLES HIGHLIGHT JUNIOR CLASS

- Tyler Spillner (18) and Eric Charles (15) teamed up to account for 33 of Purdue's 90 stolen bases in 2010. Entering the new season, the two juniors are projected to be constants at the top of the Purdue lineup. In 2010, Spillner batted leadoff in 49 of the 54 games he started, while Charles was the Boilers' No. 2 hitter in 37 of his 49 starts. Both players walked more than they struck out as sophomores.
- Spillner was one of two Purdue players to see action in every game of 2010. He was one of three Boilers to record 70-plus hits, 21 going for extra bases thanks to 13 doubles and a program-record seven triples. He also led the team with 32 walks and ranked second in hits, doubles, runs and steals. Spillner was a Big Ten All-Freshman Team selection in 2009.
- Charles saw his batting average drop last season after hitting .371, a Purdue freshman record, in 2009 as a *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-American and Third Team All-Big Ten selection at second base. But he was still productive with his plate appearances, collecting 14 more RBIs thanks in part to a Big Ten-leading eight sacrifice flies. He also executed six sacrifice bunts in the two-hole and reduced his strikeout rate from 6.91 in 2009 to 8.62 last year.

CIANFROCCO & SERRATO CLOSED 2010 AS STARTERS

- Angelo Cianfrocco and Barret Serrato are both left-handed hitters that are projected to be regulars in the lineup this season. Both players closed the 2010 season as starters, Cianfrocco in right field and Serrato at shortstop. After initially seeing action at first base and designated hitter, Cianfrocco moved out to right field where he started 12 of the 16 games in the season's final month. Serrato started seven of the final nine games of the year.
- Cianfrocco reached base safely a team-best 55 percent of the time when leading off an inning. He is the son of Purdue alumnus and former Big Leaguer Archi Cianfrocco.
- Entering 2010, Serrato has registered an on-base percentage (.379) 100 points better than his collegiate batting average (.278) thanks to 24 walks. He was selected by the Florida Marlins in the 48th round of the 2008 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

NEW PROGRAM FRESHMAN RECORDS

- On their way to earning Freshman All-American honors, **Cameron Perkins** and **Kevin Plawecki** both established new program freshman records in 2010.
- Perkins broke or tied benchmarks for hits (74), doubles (17), at-bats (219) and total bases (119). He led the team in hits, doubles, runs scored and total bases. Plawecki led the team and ranked among the Big Ten leaders with 53 RBIs, eclipsing the previous Purdue freshman record (46) that had stood since 1982.
- Perkins and Plawecki both hit eight home runs to rank second on the team. In the process, they became only the third and fourth freshmen in program history to hit at least eight homers in their first seasons at Boilers

LEADOFF HOMERS & BACK-TO-BACK JACKS

- Stephen Talbott and Tyler Spillner both connected for home runs as the game-opening leadoff man in a road game and the Boilers also hit back-to-back homers three times in 2010.
- Talbott led off the March 30 loss at Missouri with his first collegiate long ball. Spillner went deep to open the April 20 win at Chicago State. One was a case of foreshadowing, the other not as much. Talbott's game-opening blast was the first of 10 long balls in the game. Meanwhile, there was only one other homer hit in the game on Chicago's South Side.
- Sets of back-to-back home runs were hit by **Cameron Perkins** and Drew Madia, March 17 at Eastern Kentucky; **David Blount** and Jon Moore, April 6 versus Valparaiso; and Madia and **Kevin Plawecki** April 14 at Illinois State. Purdue won all three games.

PERKINS STREAKY VERSUS BIG TEN COMPETITION

- Cameron Perkins posted a 13-game hitting streak in Big Ten play from April 16 through May 14. He also hit safely in all four Big Ten Tournament games.
- Perkins batted .382 (21-for-55) with seven extra-base hits, 10 RBIs and a team-high 15 runs scored during his 13-game Big Ten hitting streak. He went 8-for-18 at the Big Ten Tournament and did not strikeout or commit an error at third base.
- Perkins also had a 10-game hitting streak (in all games) from April 13-25. Only **Ryan Bridges** (13), Barret Arthur (11) and Jon Moore (11) had longer overall hitting streaks in 2010.



Opening in 2012 The New Northwest Baseball Facility Construction to Begin Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out Lambert Field this year with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa.
