Boilermakers head to Nebraska for first ranked foe of 2016

Gerad Parker faces first test as Purdue's interim head coach.

»GAME THEMES

- Saturday is Purdue's first game under interim head coach Gerad Parker.
- Parker was named interim head coach Oct. 16 after Darrell Hazell was relieved of his duties.
- Purdue and Nebraska meet for the fifth time in series history.
- The Boilermakers beat Nebraska last season at Ross-Ade Stadium 55-45 behind four touchdown passes from David Blough and five takeaways by the defense.
- Purdue is 2-2 all-time against Nebraska and 0-1 in Lincoln.
- The Boilermakers are coming off a 49-35 loss to Iowa last week.
- Purdue is 1-1 against Big Ten West foes this season.
- Purdue is 1-1 on the road this season.
- Purdue is looking for back-to-back conference road wins for the first time since 2012.

GERAD PARKER FILE



Gerad Parker was elevated to interim head coach Oct. 16, 2016, taking over for Darrell Hazell, who was relieved of his duties.

Parker is in his fourth season at Purdue. He was hired Feb. 11, 2013, and spent his first two seasons as tight ends coach before becoming wide receivers coach in 2015. He also has served as recruiting coordinator.

In Parker's first season as wide receivers coach, junior DeAngelo Yancey regained the form he displayed as a true freshman. After totaling merely 12 catches as a sophomore, Yancey bounced back with 48 receptions for a team-high 700 yards and five touchdowns. Senior Danny Anthrop led all Boilermakers with 57 receptions in 2015, the most by a Purdue player since Antavian Edison had 58 catches in 2012.

Parker previously worked at Marshall, joining the Thundering Herd coaching staff in the spring of 2011 and spending two years as wide receivers coach. In 2012, Marshall led all Football Bowl Subdivision teams in passing offense with an average of 365.1 yards per game. Wide receiver Tommy Shuler led all FBS players with 9.2 receptions per game and ranked 18th nationally with 94.8 yards per game average. In a Sept. 29 game against Purdue in West Lafayette, Shuler set an opponent record vs. the Boilermakers with 19 receptions for 200 yards.

Prior to Marshall, Parker spent three seasons at UT-Martin as the Skyhawks' passing game coordinator, recruiting coordinator, wide receivers and running backs coach. He began his collegiate

coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kentucky, his alma mater.

A four-year letterwinner for the Wildcats, Parker twice was named to the Southeastern Conference Scholar Athlete Honor Roll (2002 and 2003), was selected the Most Inspirational Player by his teammates (2004) and was the UK Football Scholar Athlete of the Year (2004).

Parker (born Jan. 4, 1981) earned his bachelor's degree in business management in 2003 and his master's in education in 2005, both from Kentucky. He and his wife, Kandi, have three daughters: Kolbi, Gwyneth and Rosalyn. Rosalyn was born Sept. 7, 2016, three days before the Boilermakers hosted Cincinnati.

»GAME SIX REWIND

- Purdue lost at home to Iowa 49-35.
- David Blough had a career day, completing 30 of 59 passes for 458 yards and five touchdowns, with one interception.
- Cole Herdman had a big day, becoming the first tight end at Purdue to go over 100-yards receiving since Dustin Keller in 2007. Herdman had seven catches for 104 yards.
- Brycen Hopkins also had a big day, marking one of the best receiving days by the tight end group in a single game. He had three catches for 80 yards and two touchdowns
- Purdue tied its second-best offensive performance of the season, putting up 504 total yards.
- Evan Panfil had a big day with 2.0 sacks to lead the Boilermakers.
- Markus Bailey had his second straight 11-tackle game. He leads the team this season with 43 tackles.
- The Boilermakers were without Jake Replogle and Ja'Whaun Bentley on defense, both among the top players for Purdue on that side of the ball.
- Bilal Marshall had four catches for 65 yards and a touchdown.
- C.J. Parker had a career-high nine tackles, including 1.0 for loss.
- The Boilermakers were perfect in the red zone for the second game in a row.

MISCELLANEOUS

- Blough became the seventh different quarterback in school history to throw five touchdown passes in a game against Iowa.
- It marked the 12th time in program history a quarterback has thrown at least five touchdown passes in a game and is tied for fifth-most in a single game.
- Blough is the first Purdue quarterback with five touchdown passes in a game since Curtis Painter in 2008 against Indiana.
- Blough's 458-yard passing game against Iowa was the second game in his career he threw for at least 400 yards. He is the fifth quarterback in school history with multiple 400-yard passing games and the first since Curtis Painter.
- Blough's 458 passing yards against Iowa were the most by a Boilermaker since Danny Etling threw for 485 yards at Indiana in 2013.
- Blough's 458 passing yards are the 10th most in a single game in school history.
- Blough is one of 20 quarterbacks in school history with a 300-yard passing game.
- Blough's first start came last season against Bowling Green. He went 29 for 39 for 340 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing for 11 yards and a score.
- David Blough was named the starting quarterback Aug. 22 after starting eight games last season.
- Blough, a third-year sophomore, has appeared in 16 games and has completed 317 of 558 passes (.568) for 3,330 yards with 22 touchdowns and 18 interceptions.
- His 56.8 percent completion percentage ranks 12th in school history (min. 300 attempts).
- Blough rushed for two touchdowns in the season opener against Eastern Kentucky, a career high. He added one at Illinois and now has seven career rushing touchdowns.
- Blough threw for at least 300 yards against Cincinnati and Nevada, making him the first Purdue quarterback with back-to-back 300-yard passing games since Joey Elliott in 2009 (367 at Michigan; 373 at Michigan State).
- Blough picked up his first road win as a starting quarterback at Illinois.
- In home starts, Blough averages 300 passing yards and 2.3 passing touchdowns, while in road starts (not including Iowa last season where he was injured) he averages 182 yards and 0.8 touchdown passes per game.

- 7** David Blough became the seventh quarterback in school history to throw at least five touchdown passes in a game after throwing five against Iowa.
- 6** Through the first six games, Evan Panfil is tied for fourth in the Big Ten with four solo sacks.
- 5** Purdue's five touchdowns last week were the most in a conference game since last year against Indiana.
- 4** Joe Schopper has put 52.0 percent of his punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line this season. That ranks fourth in the country for punters with at least 25 attempts.
- 3** Anthony Brown, now with the Dallas Cowboys, had three interceptions last year against Nebraska.
- 2** Purdue is second in the Big Ten in first downs, averaging 24.0 per game.
- 1** Purdue's passing offense ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten, averaging 305.5 yards per game.
- 0** Purdue has given up zero sacks in three games this season and against Iowa, the lone sack was on an intentional grounding penalty.

JA'WHAUN BENTLEY

»CAREER NUMBERS

- Ja'Whaun Bentley has 143 tackles, 13.0 for loss, three fumble recoveries and an interception in his 21-game career.
- Bentley led the team with 49 tackles, including 7.5 for loss, through the first five games last season before a season-ending injury.
- Bentley still finished seventh on the team in tackles.
- He had a career-high 14 tackles, including nine solo and a half tackle for loss, and two PBUs last year against Bowling Green.

»HEALTH

- Bentley tore his ACL last season before Purdue's game against Minnesota. He missed the final seven games of the year.
- He returned to fall camp healthy and ready to anchor the middle of the defense.
- When Bentley was healthy last year, the Boilermaker defense gave up 193 rush yards and 33 points per game, including games against four bowl teams and No. 2 Michigan State.
- After his injury, the Boilermakers gave up an average of 231 rush yards and 40 points per game.
- Bentley missed the Illinois and Iowa games with an injury.

»MORE

- Bentley was voted a captain by his teammates for the second straight year.
- As a sophomore captain a year ago, he was the youngest-ever captain for Darrell Hazell.
- Bentley has started every game that he has been healthy for since coming to Purdue in 2014. Saturday will be his 22nd start.
- Bentley averaged 9.8 tackles per game last year before his injury. That number would have ranked 17th-best in the country last season, had he played enough games for his total to qualify.
- Bentley's 9.8 tackles per game would be tied for eighth among players who returned this season, third among returning players from Power 5 Conferences and second among returning Big Ten players (Rutgers' linebacker Steve Longa averaged 10.6 tackles per game).
- Bentley opened the 2016 season with eight tackles apiece against Eastern Kentucky, which tied for the team high, and Cincinnati.
- Bentley had his first two tackles for loss of the season against Nevada. That was the second-best on the team.
- Bentley had three tackles at Maryland and was limited with an injury.

»INTERIM, ACTING HEAD COACHES

- Here is a snapshot of previous interim and acting head coaches with Purdue football:
- On **Oct. 30, 1912, M.H. "Bill" Horr** was dismissed as coach for "improper conduct." **John "Keckie" Moll** assumed control of the team, and the Boilermakers did not lose the rest of the season, winning three and tying one. Among their victories was a 91-0 demolition of Rose Poly on Nov. 17. In that game, halfback Elmer Oliphant set school records with five touchdowns (in the first year they were worth the modern-day six points), 13 extra points and 43 total points. Moll, who was expected to have his contract renewed, had an offer to become head coach at Ohio State, as well. But he died on Christmas morning of 1912 after a short illness stemming from typhoid fever.
- In **July of 1937, Noble Kizer** was stricken with a kidney disorder. He was granted a leave of absence Aug. 28 and tabbed longtime assistant **Mal**

Elward as interim coach. Kizer staged a remarkable recovery but did not coach again and ultimately succumbed to the illness June 13, 1940, at just 40 years of age. Elward continued as head coach through the 1941 season and also served as athletics director for two years.

- When **Danny Hope** was relieved of his duties **Nov. 25, 1912**, wide receivers coach **Patrick Higgins** was named interim head coach. Higgins coached the Boilermakers in the Heart of Dallas Bowl, a 58-14 loss to Oklahoma State.
- Twice, **Bob DeMoss** served as acting head coach under Jack Mollenkopf.
- Prior to Purdue's game at Michigan on Oct. 21, 1961, Mollenkopf was sidelined with an intestinal ailment that proved to be a benign growth in his lower abdomen. DeMoss, who was the offensive backfield coach, filled in for two games, including a 9-0 victory over fifth-ranked Iowa on Oct. 28. DeMoss was honored as Coach of the Week by United Press International. The following week, the Boilermakers won 23-9 at Illinois.
- DeMoss again served as acting head coach for the final four games of the

»CAREER NUMBERS

- Jake Replogle has amassed 141 career tackles, 28.5 tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, three PBUs, a blocked field goal and a fumble recovery.
- Replogle's 28.5 tackles for loss rank 17th in Purdue history.

1968 season when Mollenkopf was hospitalized with acute infectious hepatitis. Purdue posted a 3-1 record, defeating Illinois at home 35-17, losing at Minnesota 27-13, winning at Michigan State 9-0 and beating Indiana 38-35 at home.

»REVAMPED RUNNING BACK ROOM

- Purdue's running back room was a bit of a question entering the season with little experience and production.
- D.J. Knox, a junior, was competing for the starting spot when he went down with an injury in the spring. He will miss the season.
- Sophomore Markell Jones is the most experienced back in the room and is slated to carry most of the load during the season. He has two 100-yard rushing games this season, but missed the Illinois game with an injury and was limited against Iowa.
- Freshman Brian Lankford-Johnson was forced to step in for Jones. He made his first career start against the Illini and rushed 18 times for 127 yards and a touchdown. He is the 70th player in school history to rush for 100-yards in a game.

»ACCOLADES

- Replogle is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- This season, he was named to three watch lists: The Bednarik, Lombardi and Outland.
- Replogle was voted a captain by his teammates Aug. 19.

»MORE

- Replogle anchors a defensive line that returns three of the four starters from last year (also DE Evan Panfil and RE Gelen Robinson).
- Replogle's year-by-year stats have seen consistent improvement from 1.9 tackles per game as a freshman to 3.3 per game as a sophomore (+1.4) and 5.0 as a junior (+1.7) in 2015. This year, he has 5.6 tackles per game.
- Replogle's brothers, Tyler, Mike and Adam, all played football at Indiana.
- Replogle's biggest game statistically last year was at No. 6 Iowa when he came up with five tackles, 3.0 for loss, 2.0 sacks and blocked a kick.
- Replogle is Purdue's first on the Lombardi Watch List since Kawann Short, now of the Carolina Panthers.
- Replogle led the team in tackles at Maryland with seven.
- Replogle missed the Iowa game as a precaution for headaches.

- Lankford-Johnson got banged up towards the end of the Illinois game, which meant redshirt freshman Richie Worship had to step in.
- Worship rushed 13 times for 60 yards and a touchdown, including three carries for 15 yards in overtime to set up the game-winning field goal.
- Redshirt freshman Tario Fuller has also been in the mix. He has 14 touches for 83 yards this season.
- Lankford-Johnson is the third running back on the roster to rush for 100 yards in his first career start, joining Markell Jones (157 last year at Michigan State) and D.J. Knox (102 at Marshall in the 2015 season-opener).

»FLIPPING THE FIELD: JOE SCHOPPER

- Sophomore Joe Schopper ranks 86th in punting this season with an average of 39.6 yards per punt.
- While that number may not be very impressive, it is very deceiving.
- Schopper has placed 13 of his 25 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line, 52.0 percent.
- Twelve of those 13 punts were also at the 15-yard line or better.
- Six of his punts have ended up at the 10-yard line or better, with five inside

»FRESHMAN NUMBERS

- Markell Jones led the team in rushing last season with 168 carries for 875 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 875 yards are the most ever by a Purdue freshman.
- Jones ran for 157 yards and two touchdowns at No. 2 Michigan State last year. That is the most single-game yardage by a true freshman in program history. That was his first career start.
- Jones' 10 rushing touchdowns were the most by a Boilermaker since 2008, when Kory Sheets had 16, and rank tied for 15th-most in a season in program history.

»RANKINGS

- Jones is one of just two B1G running backs back this year who rushed for 10+ touchdowns in 2015. Jones had 10, MSU's LJ Scott had 11.
- Jones ranks fourth in rushing yards for returning Big Ten running backs from last year. His 875 yards are only fewer than Northwestern's Justin Jackson 1,418, Penn State's Saquon Barkley's 1,076 and Indiana's Devine Redding's 1,012.
- Jones' 5.21 yards-per-carry average ranks third in the conference among returning running backs behind only Barkley (5.91 ypc) and Rutgers' Robert Martin (5.41 ypc).
- Jones is one of just 12 returning Power 5 running backs to rush for at least 875 yards and 10 touchdowns last season.

- Jones was named to the Doak Walker Watch List for the nation's premier running back for achievements on the field, in the classroom and in the community.
- In Jones' 168 carries last year, just seven went for loss - all 1-yard losses.
- Against Cincinnati, he had 15 carries for 47 yards, before a shoulder injury sidelined him for the rest of the game.
- Jones has two 100-yard rushing games this season, after putting up 124 on Nevada.
- Jones is just two rushing touchdowns shy of cracking Purdue's top-20 career list.
- He needs 341 yards to jump into Purdue's top-20 career rushing yards list.

»2016 NUMBERS

- Jones led the Big Ten in week one with 145 rushing yards.
- Jones' rushing total is the fourth best for a Boilermaker in a season-opening game.
- Jones went over 1,000 career rushing yards against ECU and now has 1,247 after the Iowa game.
- Jones has 82 carries for 372 yards (4.5 avg.) and two touchdowns this season.
- Jones was limited to 33 yards on nines carries against Iowa.
- Jones missed the Illinois game with a shoulder injury.

- Bobinski's first official day as the athletics director was Sept. 1.

- He came to Purdue from Georgia Tech, where he had been since 2013. He had previously served as AD at Xavier (1998-2004, 2006-13) and Akron (1994-1998).
- Bobinski is just the fourth full-time athletics director at Purdue in the last 74 years.
- Morgan J. Burke steps aside after serving as Purdue's athletics director since 1993. He will officially retire June 30, 2017, after serving a transitional role.
- Darrell Hazell gave Bobinski the game ball after the Boilermakers defeated Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 3.

»INSTANT IMPACT

- Purdue has played 19 freshmen, including eight true freshmen, and four first-year junior college transfers this season.
- Freshmen have accounted for 75

points, 346 rushing yards, 69 passing yards, 322 receiving yards, two interceptions, 95 tackles and two PBU's this season.

- First-year players scored 28 of Purdue's 34 points at Illinois, including 22 by freshmen, and racked up 34 tackles.
- First-year junior college players have added six points.

»MALONE IN THE COMMUNITY

- Offensive coordinator Terry Malone, in his second year at Purdue and first calling plays, never shies away from extending a helping hand.
- On Aug. 24, nine tornadoes touched down across Indiana, the worst an EF-3 with a peak wind at 152 miles per hour in Kokomo, located about 45 miles east of West Lafayette.
- While fortunately no lives were lost, more than 1,000 structures were damaged, including 200 deemed a total loss. More than 15,000 people were without power and more than 200 needed at least temporary shelter.
- Though just one week before the season-opener, Malone and his wife, Ann, cleared their Saturday, Aug. 27 schedule and drove over to help clean up.
- Malone said afterwards, "It was very satisfying. I'm not sure how much we did to help, because there's so much work to be done, but we cleared three or four yards of debris and cut a couple trees down. But we had a really good day."
- That was not the first time the Malones have stepped in after a disaster.
- Malone, who came to Purdue from the New Orleans Saints, opened his speech at the Purdue Football Preseason Banquet on Aug. 19, expected to be a quick overview of the offense, by asking the Boilermaker community for any help for his friends and neighbors back in Louisiana who are dealing with the tragic flooding.





- Malone was also helping in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, as he took the job in February 2006.
- Malone said Tuesday, "There was never a year in New Orleans without having something. So, it becomes a part of the way you think. The fact is that you really don't need to do a whole lot to help people who are in need. They really appreciate it and you get a lot more satisfaction of doing it than they probably do out of you helping them."

»BOILERMAKERS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Purdue football program is incredibly involved with community service initiatives, as players and coaches regularly volunteer their time.
- The Boilermakers amassed more than 500 hours of community service from January to August of 2016 and have made more than 500 appearances at events and outings over the past five years.
- They have been involved with mission trips to Haiti and South Africa, pioneered community projects like Dream Season and IMPACT, and are regular visitors to local elementary schools.
- In addition to campus programs like the Purdue Dance Marathon for Riley Children's Hospital and the Purdue University Center for Cancer Research 5K run/walk, the football program has participated in the Indiana Blood Center blood drive each of the last 18 years.

»THE LINEBACKERS

- Purdue returns four linebackers who have each started at least nine games in their careers prior to this season.
- Those four linebackers, Danny Ezechukwu, Andy James Garcia, Ja'Whaun Bentley and Jimmy Herman, came up with a combined 232 tackles, 19.5 for loss, 2.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, an interception and a touchdown last year.

»Ja'Whaun Bentley (Jr.)

- Bentley was voted a team captain Aug. 19.
- The rest of his accolades are on page 5.

»Danny Ezechukwu (Jr.)

- Ezechukwu started all 12 games last year.
- The Academic All-Big Ten selection finished second on the team with 79 total tackles, 40 solo, with two tackles for loss, a sack, an interception, a fumble forced, a fumble recovered for a touchdown and two PBUs.

- Ezechukwu scooped a fumble against Virginia Tech at Purdue's 10-yard line and raced 90 yards down the left sideline for a score.
- Ezechukwu has 21 career starts.
- In the opener, Ezechukwu tied for the team lead with eight tackles.
- He has 32 tackles this season, fourth on the team.

»Jimmy Herman (Sr.)

- Herman appeared in eight games last year, including seven starts, while battling injury.
- He finished the season with 41 tackles, 6.0 for loss, half a sack and a forced fumble.
- Herman is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Herman has 16 starts in his career.

- He recorded a season-high seven tackles at Illinois, and has 15 total tackles this season.

»Andy James Garcia (Sr.)

- Garcia appeared in all 12 games last year, including nine starts.
- He finished the year third on the team with 63 tackles, four for loss, a sack, a fumble recovered and three PBUs.
- Garcia has nine career starts.

»Garrett Hudson (Jr.)

- Hudson was another player who started among the linebackers.
- He appeared in nine games last season, including three starts.
- Hudson finished the year with 32 tackles, three for loss, half a sack and a fumble recovery.
- Hudson's fumble recovery came against Nebraska when he returned it 27 yards inside the Nebraska 20-yard line.

»Markus Bailey (R-Fr.)

- Bailey is one of a few redshirt freshmen with game experience prior to this season.
- Bailey appeared in the first three games last season before a knee injury sidelined him for the season.
- Bailey totaled 12 tackles, including nine solo, before the injury.
- He made his first career start vs. ECU and finished with four tackles in the 2016 season opener.
- Bailey started against Cincinnati and led the team with nine tackles, including a career-high seven solo stops.
- He had his first career interception at Maryland on the defense's third play

of the game.

- He had a career-high 11 tackles at Illinois and followed that performance with 11 more last week against Iowa.
- He has 43 tackles this season to lead the team.

»BREAKING DOWN THE PRODUCTION

- Purdue scored 301 points last season, including 248 by position players (non-kickers). Of those 248, 186 points return (75 percent). The breakdown of last year's scoring by current class:

»BURGESS' BASEBALL BACKGROUND

- Purdue sophomore receiver Jarrett Burgess turned 26 on Aug. 25.
- Burgess played five seasons of minor league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.
- Burgess played outfield and pitched, throwing 97 miles per hour off the mound, during his career in rookie and Class A ball.
- Burgess came to Purdue last summer after not playing organized football for more than 10 years, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a football-heavy family, as his dad, Fernanza, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess, played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers. Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., wrapped up his senior season as a linebacker at Louisville last fall.
- Last season, Burgess had 60 rushing yards and a touchdown on three carries, as well as 20 receiving yards.
- He made his first career catch against Eastern Kentucky in this year's opener.
- Burgess suffered a hand injury in practice before the Nevada game and missed that game, as well as at Maryland. He returned for the Illinois game on special teams.

»CURIOUS CASE OF THIRD DOWNS

- Third-down success on offense and defense can often predict the outcomes of games.
- Purdue's offense ranks 15th in the country in third-down conversions with a success rate of 49.0 percent.





- The defense, however, is on the other end of the spectrum, yielding first downs on 51.6 percent of occasions. That ranks 128th.
- Purdue has seen much better defensive third-down success in second halves this season, limiting Eastern Kentucky to 0 for 7 in the final 30 minutes. Cincinnati was just 4 for 10 on third down in the second half against Purdue and Nevada picked up 3 of 7 in the second half. Maryland converted just 1 of 5 third downs in the second half, while Illinois was just 2 of 6. Iowa was just 2 of 8 on third downs in the second half.
- Purdue's defense has given up first downs on 37 of 52 occasions in first halves this season (.712), while allowing just 12 of 43 in the second halves (.279).
- Third downs were a huge factor in Purdue's win at Illinois, as the offense picked up 9 of 16 third down tries, while the defense gave up first downs on just 3 of 11 occasions.

»WATCH LISTS

- Purdue has two players on a total of four watch lists to start the season.

»Markell Jones

- Jones was named to the Doak Walker Award watch list.
- The award goes to the nation's premier running back for his accomplishments on the field, achievement in the classroom and citizenship in the community.

»Jake Replogle

- Replogle has racked up the watch lists, as the senior defensive tackle is on three.
- Replogle most recently was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award watch list.
- That award goes recognizes the most outstanding college football lineman.
- Replogle is also on the Outland Trophy watch list.
- The Outland Trophy is presented to the nation's top interior offensive or defensive lineman.
- Replogle is also on the Chuck Bednarik Award watch list.
- The award goes to the nation's defensive player of the year.

»50-YEAR SALUTE

- The Boilermakers remember the 1966 season's Rose Bowl champions 50 years later.
- This season's game dates line up with those of the 1966 season.
- This week 50 years ago, the 4-1 and ninth-ranked Boilermakers travelled to

- East Lansing, Michigan, to face the No. 2 Spartans. Michigan State won 41-20.
- The Boilermakers put themselves in a big first-half hole thanks to a pair of fumbles inside their own 17-yard line.
- Both led to touchdowns and a Spartan 28-0 lead.
- Bob Griese tried to rally the team, completing 14 of 18 passes in the second half and added two rushing touchdowns on a windy day.
- Jim Beirne tied the then-Purdue single game receiving record with 11 catches.

»BOILER BRIDGE WALK

- The popular Boiler Bridge Walk takes place every Friday before a home game.
- Join the Boilermakers as they cross the John T. Myers Pedestrian Bridge connecting West Lafayette and Lafayette.
- The free event also features live music, giveaways and appearances by the cheerleaders and Purdue Pete beginning at 5:45 p.m.
- The team arrives at approximately 6 o'clock near the Sonya L. Margerum Fountain on the West Lafayette side of the bridge and walks to Riehle Plaza, interacting with fans along the way.

»FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE COMPLEX

- The Boilermakers are building a new football performance complex, a \$65 million project, on the north end of the Mollenkopf Athletic Center.
- The complex is part of the Football Master Plan, which consists of six points: coaching and support staff, player development, academic support, recruiting, fan engagement, and contemporary facilities.
- The project is expected to be completed in August 2017.
- The three-level structure – totaling 110,000 square feet – will include a locker room, team meeting room, position group meeting rooms, player development room, sports performance training area (weight room), sports medicine facility, nutrition station and coaches' offices, as well as a grand entrance lobby, which will highlight the Boilermakers' history and tradition.

»The Latest

- The foundation has been laid at the Football Performance Complex from the northwest to the east and south.
- Specifically, some 4,240 cubic yards of cast-in-place concrete were poured for the 110,000-square foot facility.
- Since work began, 23,375 cubic yards of mass excavation has occurred, and

- 401 aggregate piers and 92 augercast piles have been installed to support the foundation.
- All underground piping has been laid, including 2,697 feet of storm piping and 1,569 feet of water lines.
- Visibly, the building's two elevator shafts are in place, as are the hydrotherapy pool pits.
- Steel assembly is underway and about 15 percent completed. When all is said and done, some 881 tons of structural steel and fabrication will be in place.
- Floors and walkways are beginning to become visible.

»NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

- The Boilermakers have five new assistant coaches, which is tied for the fifth-most of any team with the same head coach in FBS this year.
- John Nussman was elevated to assistant coach when Gerad Parker was named interim head coach Oct. 16.

»Ross Els - Defensive Coordinator/Safeties

- Els was hired Jan. 1, 2016.
- Els returned to collegiate coaching after spending the 2015 season as an assistant coach at Lincoln Southwest, his son's high school in Lincoln, Nebraska.
- A veteran of 26 seasons of coaching on the collegiate level, Els most recently spent four seasons (2011-14) as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska.
- Els has given the defense a spark, noticeably in second-half adjustments.
- After giving up nearly 300 yards of offense to Eastern Kentucky in the first half, Purdue limited the Colonels to just over 100 in the second half.
- Against Nevada, the Boilermakers shut out the Wolf Pack in the second half, something that hadn't been done by a Purdue team since 2012.
- The defense allowed just 3 of 11 first downs against Illinois and came up with an overtime takeaway to help lead the Boilermakers to the win.

»Darrell Funk - Offensive Line

- Funk was hired Feb. 4, 2016.
- Funk, who boasts 29 years of collegiate coaching experience, came to the Boilermakers from Akron, where he coached in 2015.
- Prior to Akron, Funk spent four seasons as the offensive line coach at Michigan (2011-14).
- Funk's offensive line has opened holes for 100-yard rushers in three of Purdue's six games this season.
- His group has also had three games without allowing a sack and allowed



just one on an intentional grounding against Iowa.

»Tim Lester - Quarterbacks

- Lester was hired Dec. 28, 2015.
- Lester came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he served as quarterbacks coach from 2013 to 2015 and as offensive coordinator the last two seasons, as well.
- Lester's work with David Blough has produced three 300-yard passing games, including two 400-yard performances already this season.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in passing.

»Randy Melvin - Defensive Line

- Melvin was hired Dec. 31, 2015.
- Melvin returned to the Boilermakers from Miami (Fla.).
- He previously coached at Purdue as defensive ends coach from 1997 to 1999.
- He was at Miami for one year.
- Prior to Miami, he was at Florida International for a year.
- He was the defensive line coach with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and 2013.
- In 2001, he was the defensive line coach with the New England Patriots when they won Super Bowl XXXVI.
- Melvin's defensive line has steadily improved this season. His group has 11.0 sacks and 16.0 tackles for loss in the last four games. His group also forced the overtime turnover against Illinois, which helped Purdue pull out the win.

»DeAndre Smith - Running Backs

- Smith was hired Jan. 26, 2016.
- Smith came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he spent the previous three seasons in a similar role.
- Smith previously coached running backs at New Mexico (2012, 2008), Illinois (2010-11), UNLV (2009), Miami (Ohio) (2005-07) and Northern Illinois (2001-04).
- Smith's group has three 100-yard rushing games, with two from Markell Jones and one by Brian Lankford-Johnson.
- Smith has had his work cut out for him with a group that doesn't have a senior and the majority of the work is by freshmen and sophomores.
- Junior D.J. Knox, who started half the games last season, went down with an injury in spring and will miss the season and return in 2017 as a redshirt junior.
- Sophomore Markell Jones, Purdue's leading back this season, has been limited with a shoulder injury and

missed the Illinois game entirely.

- Freshman Lankford-Johnson stepped in for Jones and rushed for 127 yards and a touchdown in his first career start, before he left the game with a shoulder injury.
- Redshirt freshman Richie Worship helped Lankford-Johnson fill in for Jones and rushed 13 times for 60 yards, including the game-tying fourth-quarter touchdown, at Illinois.
- Redshirt freshman Tario Fuller has also seen action in the backfield for the Boilermakers this fall.

»Terry Malone

- Malone is a second-year coach, but enters his first season as the team's offensive coordinator.
- He was promoted Dec. 22, 2015.
- In his first game as offensive coordinator, the Boilermakers scored touchdowns on their first two drives. It was the first time since 2009 that Purdue scored on its opening drive of the season.
- Malone has rejuvenated the Purdue offense and already has three 500-yard outings, as well as at least 450-yards in five of Purdue's six games.

»John Nussman

- John Nussman, who began the 2016 season as offensive analyst, assumed assistant coaching duties when Gerard Parker was elevated to interim head coach.
- Nussman is working with the wide receivers.
- Nussman served as a graduate assistant with the Boilermakers from 2013 to 2015 after spending the 2012 season at Otterbein University.
- Nussman earned his bachelor's degree in strategic communications from Ohio State in 2012.
- As an undergraduate, he served three seasons as an offensive assistant/intern with the Buckeyes, taking part in the 2009 Rose Bowl (11-2) and 2010 Sugar Bowl (12-1) championship teams.
- Nussman played quarterback, wide receiver and punter at Northmont High School in Ohio.
