GAME NOTES

- With this win, Sharon Versyp's all-time record at Purdue improves to 142-71 and 259-136 in 13 years as a collegiate head coach.
- This was the second meeting between the Boilermakers and the Yellow Jackets. Purdue leads the series 2-0.
- This is Purdue's first win in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and now has a 1-5 record in the current installment of the event.
- Purdue started KK Houser, Courtney Moses, Dee Dee Williams, Drey Mingo and Sam Ostarello, a lineup not used previously this season.
- Georgia Tech jumped out to an 11-4 lead at 3:01 in the first half behind four quick points by Tyaunna Marshall.
- Purdue was able to regain the lead in the first half with a 16-2 run of their own. Courtney Moses led the way with five points during the run.
- After committing seven turnovers early in the first half Purdue only had one the final 10 minutes of the half. Purdue outscored Georgia Tech by 10 points during that period of time.
- The Boilermakers were outrebounded 40-28, but committed just 15 turnovers to Georgia Tech's
 24.
- Purdue turned the 24 Yellow Jacket turnovers into 34 points, giving the Boilermakers a 34-20 advantage on points off turnovers.
- In the second half Purdue shot 70.0 percent (21-of-30) from the field after only shooting 36.4 percent (12-of-33) in the first half.
- After falling behind Purdue was able to regain the lead in the second half during a 15-3 run. Moses led the way again with four points during the run.
- Purdue scored 48 points in the second half, the most second-half points by the Boilermakers this season. The previous best was 44 in the second half against USC Upstate.
- The Boilermakers outscored Georgia Tech 56-32 in the paint.
- Four Boilermakers scored in double figures: Houser (19), Mingo (16), Moses (15) and Wilson (12). Taylor Manuel and Sam Ostarello contributed nine points each.

TEAM HIGHS AND LOWS

- KK Houser led Purdue with a season-high 19 points. Houser went 10-of-10 from the free throw line and added 10 assists for her first double-double of the season and second of her career.
- Sam Ostarello led the team in rebounding with eight.
- Drey Mingo added a season-high 16 points.
- Tyaunna Marshall led the Yellow Jackets in scoring with 26 points on 11-of-19 shooting. Jasmine Blair led Georgia Tech with eight rebounds.

CAREER ACCOLADES

- KK Houser recorded the second double-double of her career with 19 points and 10 assists. Houser first career double-double came at Minnesota last season.
- April Wilson had an impressive night with season highs of 12 points, six assists and six steals. She had zero turnovers in 31 minutes and also pulled down three rebounds.
