Opening Tips

- Illinois has two victories over the RPI top 10, defeating No. 9 Baylor and No. 10 Maryland. The Illini rank second nationally for RPI top-10 wins, tied with Duke, Kansas and Kansas State. Oklahoma State leads with three.
- Illinois' nine Big Ten wins are its most in four years, since going 9-9 in conference play in 2011.
- A win on Saturday would give Illinois its best Big Ten record in five years, since finishing 10-8 in 2010.
- A victory on Saturday also would give Illinois its third-straight 20-win season under Coach John Groce.
- Illinois is attempting a home-and-home sweep of Purdue for the first time since the 2008-09 season.
- In eight of its nine Big Ten wins this year, and each of the last seven, Illinois has allowed 60 points or less.
- Senior **Rayvonte Rice** appears to be back at full strength, averaging 20.7 points over the last three games (62).
- Looking ahead to next week's Big Ten Tournament, Illinois will open play on Thursday as either the 7 or 8 seed. With BOTH a win at Purdue AND a Michigan State win at Indiana, Illinois would earn the 7 seed. Otherwise, the Illini will be the 8 seed.

Illinois' defense has improved over the course of conference play, currently ranking third among Big Ten teams and 40th nationally in defensive efficiency (Ken Pom). Guarding better also has led to better results:

Getting it Done at The Line

Illinois leads the NCAA in free throw percentage, shooting 79.9 percent as a team (434-543). The Illini are on pace to shatter the current school single-season record of 74.4 percent at the line, set by the 1996-97 squad. Illinois' 79.9 percent accuracy also ranks as the highest by a team nationally over the last three seasons.

Illinois has shot better than its season average at the free throw line in 18 games, including 11 of the last 15. In conference-only games, Illinois' free throw shooting improves to 82.1 percent, ranking first in the Big Ten.

Seven players in the UI rotation are shooting at least 76 percent from the line, led by **Jaylon Tate** at 84.6 percent (56-66). **Rayvonte Rice** is the most accurate Illini with a high free throw rate, knocking down 83.3 percent on the year (85-102).

Notes from the Last Time Out: Illinois 69, Nebraska 57 (March 4 in Champaign)

- 1. With the Senior Night victory, Illinois finished the season 14-2 overall at State Farm Center, and 7-2 in Big Ten play. It marked the Illini's best home record in four years, since also going 14-2/7-2 during the 2010-11 season.
- 2. After getting off to a slow start and trailing 12-8, Illinois scored on four straight possessions over a 1:41 span to complete a 9-0 run that made it 17-12. The Illini took a 31-25 edge into halftime.
- 3. Following a 13-0 Nebraska run, which included 11 straight to open second half, the Illini answered with a 20-8 run to turn a 36-31 deficit into a 51-44 advantage with seven minutes remaining. The Huskers later got within five, but the Illini closed out the win by outscoring the visitors 14-7 over the final 3:15.
- 4. Illinois, which entered the game leading the NCAA in free throw percentage at 79.6 percent, continued its strong shooting at the line by knocking down 20-of-23 (87 percent).
- 5. In his final performance at State Farm Center, senior **Rayvonte Rice** poured in a game-high 23 points, his highest scoring game since Dec. 13 and his eighth 20-point game of the season. Rice hit a key 3-pointer with 1:35 remaining that pushed the Illini lead to 59-50.
- 6. Fellow senior **Nnanna Egwu** turned in another solid defensive effort with four blocked shots and six defensive rebounds (eight total) to go along with six points.
- 7. Freshman Leron Black came off the bench to tally 11 points with five rebounds, his best game since Feb. 3,
- 8. Sophomores **Kendrick Nunn** (11) and **Malcolm Hill** (10) also scored in double figures.

Illini Items

- Illinois has held its opponent to less than 70 points in 18 of 19 wins this season, and 43 of its last 45 victories dating back to Feb. 10, 2013 during Coach Groce's first season.
- The Illini defense also has held the opposition to 60 points or less in 13 of its most recent 14 wins.
- Illinois has either led (six times), been tied (once), or trailed by one possession (twice) during the second half in nine of its 11 losses this year.
- Illinois ranks fourth in the nation in turnover rate at 14.9 percent.
- Illinois ranks ninth nationally in fewest turnovers, averaging just 9.9 per game. The current Illini single-season record for fewest turnovers is 10.3 per game, set by last year's squad.
- The Illini have committed single-digit turnovers in 16 games this season.
- Illinois is 19-2 when outscoring the opponent in points off turnovers.
- The Illini are 14-1 when outrebounding the opponent, with the only loss coming at lowa (Feb. 25).
- Illinois is 12-1 when shooting better than the opposition, with the lone loss coming at Michigan (Dec. 30).

Player Trends

- Senior **Rayvonte Rice** is 13 points away from becoming the 13th active player in NCAA Div. I to score 1,900 career points (1,887).
- Rice has scored in double figures in each of the last five games, averaging 17.4 points (87).
- Rice has been the Illini's leading scorer in each of the last three games, tallying 20 points at lowa (Feb. 25) followed by a game-high 19 points vs. Northwestern (Feb. 28) and another game-high 23 points Wednesday night against Nebraska.
- After combining for 3-for-13 (.231) from 3-point range in his first three games back, **Rice** has knocked down 8-of-13 (.615) treys over the last two games.

- Rice's performance at lowa marked the first time since Jan. 3 that Illinois' leading scorer was someone other than Malcolm Hill or Kendrick Nunn.
- Hill has led the Illini in scoring in six of the last 11 games, averaging 15.2 points (167).
- Hill also has been the team's top scorer in eight of the last 15 games, nine of 17 in Big Ten play, and 12 times on the season.
- Hill had his streak of scoring in double figures in 12 straight games end at lowa. He responded with 15 points vs. Northwestern followed by 10 points vs. Nebraska. He has reached double digits 15 of 17 Big Ten games, and 26 of 30 times on the season.
- Hill entered his sophomore year with a career high of 11 points. He has surpassed or equaled that total in 23 games this season.
- Nunn has scored in double figures in 12 of the last 16 games, and 17 times on the season.
- Nunn is averaging 11.4 points on the year, but has increased his production to 13.2 points in Big Ten play.
- Senior **Nnanna Egwu** ranks second in the Big Ten in blocked shots, averaging 1.8 bpg. He has tallied three or more blocks in nine games on the year, including four Wednesday vs. Nebraska.
- Egwu is the all-time shot blocking leader in Fighting Illini history. He broke the record on Jan. 21 against Purdue, turning away a Vince Edwards dunk attempt with 3:20 left in the first half. Egwu has now recorded 197 blocks during his Illini career, ranking 21st on the NCAA active career list. The previous UI record of 177 was set by Deon Thomas from the 1991 through 1994 seasons. Egwu is three blocks away from reaching 200.
- Senior **Ahmad Starks** tied his season high with 19 points at lowa (Feb. 25) and had 17 points vs. Northwestern (Feb. 28). He is averaging 13.7 points (41) on 50 percent shooting (15-30) over the last three games.
- Starks is shooting 44.6 percent from 3-point range over the last 12 games (25-56).
- Freshman **Leron Black** is shooting 62.5 percent from the field over the last eight games (15-24).
- In league play, sophomore **Jaylon Tate** ranks fourth in the Big Ten in assist/turnover ratio (2.3).
- After logging one minute through the first eight games of league play, sophomore **Austin Colbert** has averaged 10.1 minutes over the last nine games (91), totaling 18 points on 8-of-10 shooting with 27 rebounds.

Notes from the Last Illinois-Purdue Game:

Illini 66. Boilermakers 57 (Jan. 21 at Champaign)

- 1. Trailing 49-48 with 6:46 remaining, Illinois rolled off eight straight to take a 56-49 advantage and never relinquished the lead. The Illini made their final nine free throws to close out the contest over the final 4:40.
- 2. Illinois grabbed a 32-30 halftime lead thanks to an 8-0 run over the final 1:16 of the first half. Steals by **Kendrick Nunn** and **Maverick Morgan** led to fastbreak run-outs by **Malcolm Hill** and **Leron Black**. Hill drained a three to end the half, giving the Orange and Blue their first lead since jumping ahead 4-2 to begin the game.
- 3. The Illini continued their impressive free throw shooting, drilling 21-of-24 (87.5 percent) from the line.
- 4. Illinois entered the game ranked last in the Big Ten in conference play in offensive rebound percentage, but grabbed a season-high 16 offensive rebounds against Purdue.
- 5. The Illini out-rebounded Purdue for the game by a 43-to-35 margin. It marked the first time in 2015 conference play that the Boilers had been beaten on the boards.
- 6. **Nnanna Egwu** broke Deon Thomas' career blocked shots school record and became Illinois' all-time leader, rejecting five shots to tie his career high for the fifth time. Egwu also added 11 points, seven rebounds and three steals, which tied his career high.
- 7. **Leron Black** recorded his first career double-double with 15 points and a career-high 13 rebounds, marking the most by an Illini since Egwu grabbed 14 boards against Ohio State last season (Feb. 15, 2014). Black also finished 6-of-9 from the field and had two steals in his first career start.
- 8. Malcolm Hill delivered a solid performance with a game-high 18 points, six rebounds and four assists.
- 9. **Kendrick Nunn** nabbed a career-high seven rebounds and equaled his career high with five free throws while finishing with 14 points.

Rayvonte Returns

Illinois welcomed back leading scorer and rebounder **Rayvonte Rice** to the lineup against Michigan on Feb. 12. Rice fractured a bone in his left hand in practice on Jan. 5 and had surgery Jan. 7. When combining the duration of his recovery with a team suspension, he missed a total of nine games.

Rice played 27 minutes in his return against the Wolverines. And while he didn't reach his normal level of offensive production during his first game action in nearly six weeks, Rice made an impact on defense and on the glass, totaling five rebounds and three steals. His four points, meanwhile, helped him reach another milestone as he became the 13th active player nationally to record 1,800 career points.

Rice has since scored in double figures in each of his last five outings. He netted 10 points at Wisconsin, 15 against Michigan State, poured in 20 points with a team-leading nine rebounds at lowa, had 19 against Northwestern and most recently went for 23 on Senior Night vs. Nebraska.

Rice looks to be regaining the all-conference form he showed before being sidelined. Consider the following:

- Rice has an offensive rating of 125.0 on the season, which ranks sixth nationally and second in the Big Ten behind Wisconsin's Frank Kaminsky among players with at least 24 percent of possessions used (KenPom).
- Rice is effective in all areas. Although his name does not appear in the conference statistics due to playing in less than 75 percent of Illinois' games (he has played in 70 percent of Illinois' season), Rice is the only Big Ten player ranked in the top seven in scoring (fifth, 16.6 ppg), rebounding (seventh, 6.5 rpg) and steals (second, 1.9 spg).
- Rice has improved his shooting accuracy at every level this season. He is currently shooting 47.9 percent from the field, 46.5 percent from 3-point range (third in Big Ten), and 83.3 percent on free throws (fifth in Big Ten). Rice entered his senior year as a 42.4 percent career shooter, including 28 percent from behind the arc and 71.2 percent at the line.
- Rice has scored in double figures in 19 of 21 games this year, with eight 20-point outings. He has registered double figures in 50 of 56 games during his two-year Illini career with 18, 20-point games.
- When combining his totals from Drake with Illinois, Rice ranks 13th nationally on the Div. I active scoring list (was fifth when sidelined on Jan. 5):

Super Sophs

Sophomores **Malcolm Hill** and **Kendrick Nunn** carried the scoring load for the Illini during most of conference play, teaming up to average 28.3 points with Hill at 15.1 ppg (ranked ninth in Big Ten) and Nunn at 13.2 ppg (20th in Big Ten). When looking at sophomores from throughout the six major conferences, the Illini duo currently owns the second-highest combined scoring average during league play:

Hill Improving Rapidly

Malcolm Hill came on strong at the end of his freshman season, starting Illinois' last 12 games and averaging 6.5 points as a starter. On the heels of that success and bolstered by an offseason of hard work in the gym and the weight room, Hill is having a breakout sophomore campaign.

He currently ranks second on the Illini in scoring with an average of 14.2 points. He has scored in double figures in 26 of 30 games, and has been the Illini's leading scorer 12 times on the year.

Hill has increased his scoring average by 9.8 points this year, the largest improvement in the Big Ten. Of the five conference players who have raised their point production the most this season, three are sophomores:

Nunn Better

Like his teammate Malcolm Hill, Illini sophomore **Kendrick Nunn** is another of the Big Ten's most improved players. Nunn started the final 12 games of his rookie campaign, averaging 10.3 points as a starter, and earned a spot on the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. After being slowed in the offseason by a knee procedure, Nunn is now fully healthy and helping lead the Illini attack this year.

He has increased his scoring average by 5.2 points, checking in at 11.4 points per game after netting 6.2 ppg as a freshman. He has scored in double figures 17 times, led by a career-high 25 points in the win at Northwestern (Jan. 14) followed by 24 points the following game vs. Indiana (Jan. 18).

Nunn is shooting nearly 38.3 percent from 3-point range and leads the Illini with 51 threes (1.7 avg.). He has knocked down at least three treys in nine games this season, highlighted by a career-best six triples against the Hoosiers.

Nunn has been at his best in Big Ten play, currently ranking 20th in the league in scoring during conference-game only at 13.2 ppg. He has scored in double figures in 11 of the last 14 games, with four 20-plus point performances during that span.

Top of the Class

Illinois has the highest-scoring sophomore class in the Big Ten, combining to average 34.4 points per game. Sophomores **Malcolm Hill** (14.2 ppg) and **Kendrick Nunn** (11.4 ppg) are both averaging double figures and rank second and third, respectively, on the team in scoring. **Jaylon Tate** (3.7 ppg), **Maverick Morgan** (2.7 ppg) and **Austin Colbert** (1.8 ppg) are also regular contributors in the UI lineup. SFC Transformation Underway

State Farm Center is undergoing a major renovation, which began following the conclusion of the 2014 basket-ball season, dubbed the Illinois Renaissance. The \$169.5-million project includes a renovated seating bowl and the addition of four levels of premium seating; improved rest rooms, concessions and a team store; remodeled locker rooms, video room and team lounge; air conditioning and many other amenities. The project is scheduled to be completed in the fall of 2016.

The most demanding phase of the renovation began immediately following the final home game of the season. The lower half of the seating bowl will be completely demolished and rebuilt with all new 100-level seating which includes new student seating, suites, club areas, and loge seating. This phase of construction will last until December 2015, so the Illini will play a total of five games next November at the Prairie Capital Convention Center in Springfield (four regular season games and one exhibition).

Coleman-Lands Selected to Jordan Brand Classic

Fighting Illini signee **Jalen Coleman-Lands** has been chosen to play in the Jordan Brand Classic, scheduled for April 17 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn. The game will be televised on ESPN2 at 7 p.m. CT.

Coleman-Lands is a consensus top-50 recruit who attends La Lumiere School in La Porte, Ind. He is considered one of the top shooters in the Class of 2015.

Game 29 Notes: Illinois 86, Northwestern 60 (Feb. 28 at Champaign)

- 1. The 26-point win over the Wildcats marked the largest victory margin in conference play of the John Groce era, and since Jan. 10, 2009, when the Illini defeated Indiana by 31 points (76-45).
- 2. Illinois' 86-point total, meanwhile, was the most the team has scored in Big Ten play in the Groce era and the most against a conference foe since racking up 88 points in a 25-point win over Northwestern on Jan. 6, 2011.
- 3. The Illini began the game by outscoring the Wildcats 12-to-2, on 3-pointers by four different players (Nunn, Hill, Starks and Rice) in the first 2:30 of the game. Illinois led wire-to-wire for the fourth time this season, and first in Big Ten play.
- 4. The Illini's stifling defense was on display midway through the first half, as Northwestern was held without a field goal for a 10:30 stretch. During that span the Illini went on an 18-3 run, turning a 12-9 lead into a 30-12 advantage.
- 5. The Illini made 14 threes in the game, with nine coming in the first half. Illinois fell just one trey short of tying their best at State Farm Center, most recently accomplished earlier this season vs. Coppin State (Nov. 14).
- 6. Illinois dominated the Wildcats on the boards (40-21). The +19 margin was the UI's largest of the season.

- 7. **Rayvonte Rice** posted a game-high 19 points, with an efficient shooting performance, going 5-of-9 from the field and 4-of-6 from behind the arc. Rice added seven rebounds and three assists.
- 8. Five Illini scored in doubles figures led by Rice's 19. **Ahmad Starks** followed with 17 while **Malcolm Hill** (15), **Kendrick Nunn** (14) and **Maverick Morgan** (10) rounded out the Illini in double digits.
- 9. Sophomores **Maverick Morgan** and **Austin Colbert** combined or 15 points and 12 rebounds, shooting 5-of-8 from the field. Morgan's totals of 10 points and eight rebounds six offensive were all career-highs.

Game 28 Review: Iowa 68, Illinois 60 (Feb. 25 at Iowa City)

Illinois was unable to get back on the winning track, falling on the road at lowa. The Illini hung with the Hawkeyes for much of the night and held a 43-42 lead with 14 minutes remaining. The momentum turned shortly after, however. After an Ahmad Starks 3-pointer brought the Illini within one at 47-46, the Hawkeyes went on a pivotal 11-2 run over the next six-and-a-half minutes. That made the deficit 10 points (58-48) and the Illini could get no closer than five the rest of the way.

Rayvonte Rice was dominant with 20 points and nine rebounds, and fellow senior **Ahmad Starks** tied his season high with 19 points in 39 minutes of action, draining five treys. They were the only Illini to reach double figures, accounting for 65 percent of the Illini offense on the night.

Game 27 Review: Michigan State 60, Illinois 53 (Feb. 22 at Champaign)

Illinois lost for just the second time this season at State Farm Center, falling to Michigan State in a rematch two weeks after the Illini won on the Spartans' home court. After MSU scored the game's first five points, the Illini quickly rattled off 12 unanswered to take control. The Spartans came right back as the lead continued to change hands throughout the physical first half.

MSU led by four at the halftime and answered each time the Illini seemed to be close to regaining control. With the Illini trailing 38-34 and just over nine minutes left, the Spartans outscored the Illini 14-7 over the next five minutes to grab their biggest lead of the night at 52-41. Illinois went to a fullcourt press which ignited a furious late-game rally. After the Orange and Blue had pulled within three points, **Kendrick Nunn** was left open near the top of the key. But his 3-pointer with 44 seconds remaining did not fall. And instead of tying the game, the Illini were forced to foul where the Spartans sealed the victory at the free throw line.

Illinois committed just five turnovers and held Michigan State to just six offensive rebounds. But the Illini could not overcome a cold shooting night, managing only 15-of-52 from the field, a season-low 28.8 percent.

Malcolm Hill led the Illini with 17 points while **Rayvonte Rice** scored 15.

Game 26 Review: #5 Wisconsin 68, Illinois 49 (Feb. 15 at Madison)

The Illini had its four-game winning streak snapped at the Kohl Center, falling to Big Ten leader Wisconsin. Illinois hung with the fifth-ranked Badgers early, leading 22-20 before the hosts finished the half on a 12-2 run to lead by eight at the break. Illinois hung around but could not gain ground in the second half, and the Badgers finished the game on another run, this one 11-2, to create the final margin.

Malcolm Hill led the Illini with 15 points on 5-of-9 shooting, **Rayvonte Rice** added 10, and **Nnanna Egwu** had a team-high nine rebounds.

Game 25 Review: Illinois 64, Michigan 52, OT (Feb. 12 at Champaign)

In front of the largest State Farm Center crowd in Illini basketball history (17,087), the Orange and Blue saved its best for last, rallying in the final minutes of regulation and erupting in overtime to defeat Michigan and extend its winning streak to four.

Illinois struggled from the field for much of the night before getting hot late. Senior **Ahmad Starks** kept the Illini in the game in the first half, scoring nine of the team's 20 points. The Wolverines led by as many as eight in the second half and held a 50-43 advantage with three minutes left. That's when the Illini made their move, scoring the final seven points of regulation on a layup by **Rayvonte Rice**, a runner by **Kendrick Nunn**, and capped by a **Nunn** 3-pointer with 1:22 left that would send the game to overtime.

Illinois had all the energy in the extra session, scoring on their first seven possessions and grabbing three steals on their first four defensive possessions. That opened the floodgates as the run extended to a staggering 21 unanswered points. Illinois scored the first 14 points of overtime and nearly pitched a shutout, the Wolverines managing just two free throws with 13 seconds left. Michigan went the final eight minutes without a field goal.

Nunn led all scorers with 21 points, his second straight 20-point outing at home. **Starks** finished with 12 points, four assists and a career-high four steals. **Hill** scored nine of his 11 points in the second half and added six rebounds. **Nnanna Egwu**, meanwhile, got stronger as the game wore on, scoring all six of his points in overtime while collecting a season-high 12 rebounds to go along with four blocks and three steals. And in his first game action since Jan. 3, **Rice** finished with four points, five rebounds and three steals in 27 minutes.

The 12-point win marked Illinois' largest margin of victory ever in an overtime game. The Illini also improved to 3-1 in overtime games under Coach John Groce.

Game 24 Review: Illinois 59, Michigan State 54 (Feb. 7 at East Lansing)

The Illini earned a road victory over Michigan State, winning at the Breslin Center for the second straight season. Illinois started slow, falling behind 10-2 while uncharacteristically racking up six fouls and five turnovers during the first eight minutes of play. But the Orange and Blue settled down after that, grabbing a 19-14 lead later in the half following a 17-4 run. The Spartans would tie it twice in the second half, but the Illini never relinquished its lead, coming up with stops and timely baskets in crunch time.

A driving floater by **Kendrick Nunn**, put the Illini ahead by three with less than a minute remaining. The Illini then overcame a bizarre sequence when, after MSU's Travis Trice made the front end of a 1-and-1 with 33 seconds to go, **Jaylon Tate** was assessed a dead ball technical following a monitor review for fouling Trice on a box out. That gave the Spartans two additional free throws and possession of the ball. But Trice missed his second attempt at the line, and Bryn Forbes missed one of the two technical shots, so the Illini still led by one. The Illini made a big defensive stop on the ensuing possession and **Malcolm Hill** knocked down four free throws in the closing seconds to secure the win.

Hill lead all scorers with 19 points while collecting six boards. **Nunn** scored 14 and **Nnanna Egwu** had one of his best games of the season with 12 points, a game-high nine rebounds and three blocked shots.

The win was Illinois' fifth in its last 12 visits to the Breslin Center, the most victories of any opponent on the Spartans' home court over the last 14 seasons.

Game 23 Notes: Illinois 66, Rutgers 54 (Feb. 3 at Champaign)

- 1. Trailing 20-19 with 7:06 remaining in the first half, the Illini closed the opening stanza on a 16-4 run, including an 8-0 spurt over the final 3:46 for a 35-24 halftime edge. UI continued the surge into the second half, making it a 28-10 run for a 47-30 lead, its largest of the game.
- 2. Illinois also made 10-of-12 field goals over the final 9:05 of the first half.
- 3. Illinois made 25-of-52 from the field (48.1 percent), its best shooting percentage in a Big Ten game this year.
- 4. UI was perfect from the free throw line for the first time this season, drilling 9-of-9 from the charity stripe. The Illini increased their second-best free throw percentage in the nation to 79.7 percent.

Game 22 Notes: Illinois 60, Penn State 58 (Jan. 31 at Champaign)

- 1. **Malcolm Hill** notched his first game-winning basket as an Illini, driving to the hoop and making a layup with 4.5 seconds remaining.
- 2. **Hill** finished just one shy of his career high, tallying a game-high 27 points. It was his third 20-point game of the season and 19th in double figures. The performance garnered Hill Big Ten Co-Player of the Week honors.
- 3. **Hill** matched the production of the rest of the Illini from the field. He made a career-high 10 field goals on 15 attempts while the remainder of the team shot 10-of-38. Hill also tied his career high with four 3-pointers on five attempts while his teammates shot 4-for-10 from beyond the arc.
- 4. Illinois nabbed 12 steals, its second-highest total this season (15 vs. Indiana State on Nov. 27), and forced 19 turnovers. That allowed the Illini to claim a 15-to-9 advantage in points off turnovers.
- 5. **Kendrick Nunn** racked up a career-high five steals while **Nnanna Egwu** snagged a career-high four steals.
- 6. The Illini shot better than 50 percent on 3-pointers for the first time since the Austin Peay game (Nov. 21) and the third time this season, finishing 8-of-15 (53.3 percent) from distance.

Game 21 Review: Minnesota 79, Illinois 71 (Jan. 24 at Minneapolis)

A big second-half run by the hosts proved to be the difference as the Illini fell to the Gophers in Minneapolis. Illinois led for much of the first 25 minutes, including a 41-38 advantage with 15 minutes remaining. But that's when the Gophers made their charge, outscoring the Illini 15-to-3 over the a seven-minute stretch to grab a 56-44 lead with eight to go. That deficit proved too much for the Orange and Blue to overcome.

Illinois was on fire from 3-point range, hitting 11-of-24 for 45.8 percent accuracy. But as hot as they were from beyond the arc, they couldn't get anything to fall inside it. The Illini made just six of their first 28 two-point attempts, and ended the day making just 12-for-37 on twos (32.4 percent).

The UI sophomore class led the way against the Gophers. **Malcolm Hill** and **Kendrick Nunn** scored 18 points apiece to lead the Illini, while **Jaylon Tate** set career highs with 11 points and nine assists. Tate did not have a turnover in 31 minutes, making his nine-assist day even more impressive. **Maverick Morgan** had his best game in Big Ten play, meanwhile, recording seven points and four rebounds.

Manager Ryan Schmidt Joins Roster

Illinois has seen an unusual number of injuries to its backcourt this year. Coach John Groce has repeated the "Next Man Up" mantra following each injury, and has now looked to a manager to share that philosophy. **Ryan Schmidt**, who had been in his fourth year serving the Illinois program as an on-court manager, officially joined the roster on Jan. 23. He is practicing with the team daily and dressing for both home and road games.

Schmidt is a senior guard from Bloomington, III. who played varsity basketball at Central Catholic High School, where he was named team MVP as a senior in 2011. Schmidt is majoring in accounting.

Game 19 Review: Indiana 80, Illinois 74 (Jan. 18 at Champaign)

Illini fans were treated to an entertaining game featuring a number of runs by both teams. But unfortunately the visiting Indiana Hoosiers made the final charge, earning its first win in Champaign in seven years.

The Illini came out firing, with Kendrick Nunn burying a trio of 3-pointers for the game's first nine points. The Illini grabbed an early double-digit lead at 14-3, but the Hoosiers quickly answered with a 14-2 run to take their first lead. Indiana later went on a 12-0 spurt to take an 11-point lead of its own. It was erased immediately, however, by an 11-0 Illini spurt.

The Hoosiers led by four at half and opened up a 50-40 lead with 16 minutes remaining. The Illini then went on an impressive 21-2 run over the next six minutes to bring the crowd to its feet and put the Illini ahead 61-52. Indiana then slowly chipped away at the deficit, and with the Illini leading 72-67, the Hoosiers outscored the Illini 13-2 over the final three minutes to earn the win.

Kendrick Nunn scored a game-high 24 points to lead the Illini. He nailed 9-of-13 shots and set a career-high with six 3-pointers in 10 attempts. **Ahmad Starks** poured in a season-high 19 points, draining 5-of-8 from 3-point range with four free throws to go along with a season-best six assists. **Malcolm Hill** tallied 12 points, freshman **Leron Black** had his best game as an Illini with eight points and career-high nine rebounds, and **Jaylon Tate** added nine points and five assists.

Mannie Jackson Earns NCAA's Theodore Roosevelt Award

Former Fighting Illini great **Mannie Jackson** has earned the highest honor bestowed by the NCAA, the 2015 Theodore Roosevelt Award. It is given annually to an individual who best exemplifies the ideals of college sports.

Jackson was a pioneer at Illinois, becoming one of the first two African American letterwinners and starters in program history. He starred from 1958-60, finishing his career ranked fifth on the UI career scoring list. His number 30 hangs from the rafters of State Farm Center as part of the Illini Basketball Honored Jerseys program.

After playing professionally with the Harlem Globetrotters, Jackson began a long and distinguished business career first at General Motors, then at Honeywell, Inc., where he quickly became one of the company's top executives. In 1993, Jackson purchased the Globetrotters and revived the legendary team's status as one of America's favorite teams. In addition to his decades of success in the business world, Jackson is a dedicated philanthropist who has made countless financial and time commitments to helping others, including the creation of the Academic Enrichment and Leadership Program on the UI campus.

Jackson officially received the Theodore Roosevelt Award on Jan. 16 at the NCAA Convention in Washington D.C.

Game 18 Review: Illinois 72, Northwestern 67 (Jan. 14 at Evanston)

Illinois earned its first road win of the season, defeating Northwestern in Evanston. After suffering a cold shooting night in their previous game at Nebraska, the Illini came out hot from the start at Welsh-Ryan Arena, draining seven of their first 12 three-point attempts in building an early 28-19 lead.

The Illini led by four at halftime and extended it to as many as 10 in the second half, leading 60-50 with six minutes remaining. The Wildcats continued to close the gap, but Illinois got the job done at the free throw line, making 10 of 11 in the final four minutes to claim the road win.

Turnovers were a major story line, as the Illini committed just three turnovers, tying a school record. Northwestern, meanwhile, had 11. The Illini capitalized by outscoring the Wildcats 14-to-0 in points off turnovers.

Kendrick Nunn led all scorers with a career-high 25 points. Nunn made 8-of-13 shots, and equaled his season high with four 3-pointers in eight attempts. He also made 5-of-5 free throws, including four in the final seconds to seal the win. **Aaron Cosby** poured in a season-high 19 points, hitting 7-of-15 shots and also draining four treys on seven attempts.

Game 17 Review: Nebraska 53 Illinois 43 (Jan. 11 at Lincoln)

A rough shooting night spoiled a solid defensive performance as the Illini fell to Nebraska by 10 points. Illinois trailed the majority of the night but had its chances. Down 42-36, the Orange and Blue had three straight chances narrow the deficit but missed jumpers on each possession. Nebraska finally ended the three-minute scoreless drought with a bucket late in the shot clock. That pushed the lead to eight points and the Huskers extended it to double figures in the game's closing minutes.

Illinois managed just 27.3 percent shooting from the field (15-55), its lowest field goal percentage under Groce. That negated the Illini holding Nebraska to 53 points, the Huskers' second-lowest point total of the year. Nebraska scored just 25 after intermission, the fewest second-half points by a UI opponent on the season.

Malcolm Hill and Kendrick Nunn led the Illini with 12 points apiece while Nnanna Egwu grabbed 10 boards.

Game 16 Review: Illinois 64, No. 11 Maryland 57 (Jan. 7 at Champaign)

The Illini remained undefeated at home on the season, improving to 8-0 at State Farm Center with a victory over 11th-ranked Maryland.

Playing their first game without leading scorer and rebounder **Rayvonte Rice**, the Illini focused on defense. After allowing a combined 48.6 percent shooting through its first two Big Ten games, Illinois' defense stepped up, holding the Terrapins to just 36.5 percent from the field. Maryland's 57 points were a season low, the first time this season the Terps were held below 60 points.

The Illini trailed by two at intermission, but opened the second half with a dominating 20-3 run to grab a 46-31 lead with 12 minutes remaining. **Malcolm Hill** came out of the locker room and hit his first four shots, accounting for 12 of Illinois' first 15 points after the break.

Illinois held Maryland scoreless for 5:47 during the run and allowed the Terps just two field goals over the first 12 minutes of the second half. The visitors came alive from 3-point land down the stretch to tighten the game, but the Illini made 8-of-8 at the foul line to in the final minute to seal the win.

Hill led all scorers with a career-high 28 points and made a career-best four treys. Hill shot 9-of-18 on the night, including 7-of-11 in the second half when he accounted for 18 of his 28 points. Nanna Egwu had an outstanding all-around game, reaching double figures for the first time in five games with 11 points, equaling his season high with nine rebounds, and blocking four shots. Jaylon Tate earned his first career start and responding by tying his career high with 10 points and dishing out four assists in a career-best 31 minutes.

Game 15 Review: No. 20 Ohio State 77, Illinois 61 (Jan. 3 at Columbus)

The Illini played a great first half of basketball but it was the host Buckeyes who took over in the second half as the Illini fell in Columbus.

Illinois started out hot, hitting eight of its first 14 three-point shots and building an 8-point lead at 34-26. The Buckeyes closed the half on a 10-3 run over the last four minutes, giving the Illini a one-point advantage at intermission. The Illini led by three early in the second half when the Buckeyes went on another 4-minute spree, this one the pivotal run of the game. Ohio State scored 15 unanswered to turn a 44-41 deficit into a 56-44 lead from which the Illini could not recover.

Illinois — which had been doing a fantastic job taking care of the ball so far on the season — had an uncharacteristic 20 turnovers, 13 coming in the second half. That allowed by the Buckeyes to get out in transition and they converted, scoring 26 points off UI miscues.

Rayvonte Rice had another standout game, scoring 20 points on 7-8 shooting, including 4-of-5 from 3-point range. Rice also had seven rebounds and four assists. **Kendrick Nunn** joined Rice in double figures, totaling 10 points.

Game 14 Review: Michigan 73, Illinois 65, OT (Dec. 30 at Ann Arbor)

The Illini looked to be on their way to a fourth-straight Big Ten road win, but hot 3-point shooting by Michigan allowed the hosts to come back and protect its homecourt with an overtime victory.

Illinois led for the majority of the game, building an advantage that reached as many as 13 points – 48-35 – with 11 minutes remaining. The Wolverines, who had made just two of their first 15 attempts from 3-point range, then caught fire, draining five straight treys and six of nine to pull back to even. Illinois had its chances at the end, taking a 1-point lead on a pair of free throws by **Malcolm Hill** with 48 seconds remaining. Ricky Doyle made one of two at the line with 30 seconds to go to tie it and set up the final play of regulation. **Rayvonte Rice** drew two defenders after a screen, missing an 18-footer at the buzzer to set up overtime.

Hill made a jumper on the Illini's first possession in OT, but Michigan then rattled off 13 unanswered points to pull away. The Wolverines ended up making 10 three-pointers on the afternoon. That proved to be too much to overcome, as Illinois lost for the first time this season when outshooting its opponent from the field.

Malcolm Hill led the Illini with 19 points, shooting 7-of-12 and scoring 15 of his points after intermission. He was the lone Illini in double figures, as **Rayvonte Rice** and **Nnanna Egwu** added eight points each.

Game 13 Notes: Illinois 93, Kennesaw State 45 (Dec. 27 at Champaign)

- 1. Illinois won its 36th straight non-conference game at State Farm Center and extended its homecourt winning streak in regular-season non-conference games to 47 in a row.
- 2. UI led wire-to-wire for the third time this season, following Indiana State (Nov. 27) and Hampton (Dec. 17).
- 3. The Illini blew the game open with a 25-0 scoring run over a span of 6:21 in the first half, turning a 24-15 lead into a 49-15 advantage. Illinois went on to lead 54-18 at the break, the 36-point margin surpassing the Ul's 35-point halftime lead against Coppin State as its largest of the season.
- 4. Illinois held Kennesaw State to just 24.6 percent shooting, the lowest field goal percentage by an Illini opponent in Coach Groce's tenure and lowest since Michigan State shot 24.1 percent vs. the UI on Jan. 31, 2012.
- 5. Kennesaw State's 45 points were the fewest permitted by the UI since allowing 41 at Northwestern on Feb. 17, 2013.
- 6. The Illini shot 55.4 percent, their highest percentage since shooting 59.7 percent against Austin Peay (Nov. 21).
- 7. Illinois turned 16 Kennesaw State turnovers into 23 points, its highest total since converting 19 turnovers by American into 26 points (Dec. 7). For the game, the Illini had a 23-6 edge in points off turnovers.

- 8. **Rayvonte Rice** hit all seven of his field goal attempts, including two three-pointers, and made 5-of-6 from the line to finish with a game-high 21 points. His offensive rating of 184 for the game was the highest of his Illini career.
- 9. Malcolm Hill went for 16 points and nine rebounds, narrowly missing his first career double-double. Hill's nine rebounds matched his career high set against Coppin State (Nov. 16).

Rice Dominant In Non-Conference Play

Rayvonte Rice averaged 17.7 points entering Big Ten play, continuing to excel against non-conference competition. Last season Rice averaged 18.7 points in 15 games against non-league opponents. He has scored double figures in every non-league game of his Illinois career, boasting an average of 18.1 points (510) on 51.3 percent shooting (180-351) over 28 non-conference games as an Illini.

Home Sweet Home

After finishing 7-0 during the non-conference portion of its home schedule, Illinois will carry a 36-game homecourt winning streak into the 2015-16 season. The Illini last lost at State Farm Center to a non-league foe on March 24, 2010, against Dayton in the NIT Quarterfinal. The UI active streak ranks third nationally:

Illinois' winning streak in *regular season* non-conference home games, meanwhile, now stands at 47 in a row heading into 2015-16. The Illini have gone undefeated at State Farm Center in regular season non-conference games each of the last six seasons, with the last loss to Clemson on Dec. 2, 2008.

Game 12 Review: Illinois 62. Missouri 59 (Dec. 20 at St. Louis)

Illinois won the coveted Braggin' Rights trophy for the second straight year, defeating Missouri thanks to **Rayvonte Rice's** step back, fade away 3-pointer as time expired, the first buzzer beater in the 34-year history of the annual rivalry game played in St. Louis.

This year's match-up was as tightly contested as any in the series, featuring 10 ties, eight lead changes and the margin never extending beyond two possessions. **Rice** came up big during crunch time, scoring 11 of Illinois' last 17 points over the final nine minutes while also assisting on another basket during that stretch.

The game was knotted at 55-all with less than four minutes remaining. Missouri went ahead on a layup by Jakeenan Gant, but **Malcolm Hill** hit a pair of free throws to tie it at 57. The Illini then took the lead on a **Nnanna Egwu** dunk off a feed from **Rice** with 1:53 left. Mizzou evened the score at 59 on Wes Clark's jumper with 18 seconds remaining. That set up the game's final possession, with **Rice** burying the dagger three from the top of the key at the buzzer as the Illini bench stormed onto the court, piling on top of him in wild celebration.

Rice led the Illini with a game-high 19 points and seven rebounds. Ahmad Starks added 13 points, reaching double figures for the first time in nine games and marking his second-highest point total of the season. Hill also finished in double digits with 10.

Buzzer Beaters Becoming the Norm Under Groce

Rayvonte Rice's 3-pointer to down Missouri marked the fourth buzzer beater of Groce's Illini tenure, joining the following clock-expiring game winners: D.J. Richardson's 3-pointer at Hawaii (Nov. 16, 2012), Tyler Griffey's layup against No. 1-ranked Indiana (Feb. 7, 2013) and Brandon Paul's jumper versus Minnesota in the Big Ten Tournament (March 14, 2013).

Illinois went the previous 12 seasons prior to Groce's arrival with just one buzzer beater, a runner by **Demetri McCamey** to beat Indiana on Jan. 30, 2010.

In addition to the four buzzer beaters, the Illini also made two game winners under Groce in the final seconds: **Griffey's** 3-pointer versus Gardner-Webb (Nov. 25, 2012) and **Jon Ekey's** 3-pointer at lowa (March 8, 2014).

Game 11 Notes: Illinois 73, Hampton 55 (Dec. 17 at Champaign)

- 1. The first half featured several runs, beginning with a 7-0 spurt by the Illini to start the game. Midway through the first frame, UI used a 15-3 run to jump ahead 27-11. After Hampton's 10-0 run made it a six-point game, the Orange and Blue finished the first half on a 10-4 run for a 37-25 edge at the break.
- 2. Illinois made nine 3-pointers and shot 42.9 percent from behind the arc, its best numbers from the land of three since the Indiana State game on Nov. 27.
- 3. Illinois had a plus-20 advantage at the free throw line, finishing 22-of-26 (84.6 percent) compared to 2-of-9 (22.2 percent) by Hampton.
- 4. Illinois held Hampton to 34.8 percent shooting (23-66), its best field goal percentage defense since the Baylor game on Nov. 28.
- 5. The Illini recorded a season-high eight blocks, its most since also rejecting eight shots last year vs. Valparaiso (Nov. 13, 2013).
- 6. Kendrick Nunn tallied 16 points to lead all scorers and equaled his season-high with four 3-pointers.
- 7. Nnanna Egwu equaled his career-high with five blocked shots. Egwu also tallied 10 points and five rebounds.
- 8. **Rayvonte Rice** added 12 points, with 10 coming in the second half.
- 9. Jaylon Tate connected on a career-high eight free throws, hitting every attempt to register eight points without attempting a field goal.

Game 10 Review: Oregon 77, Illinois 70 (Dec. 13 at Chicago)

Illinois was unable to get back on the winning track following the Villanova game, falling to Oregon at the United Center. The Illini got off to a solid start behind the scoring of **Rayvonte Rice**, leading by as many as 13 points in the first half and 10 late in the stanza. But the Ducks went on a 14-4 run over the last 1:17 of the first half and opening three minutes of the second to tie it at 41.

The lead traded hands before the Illini pulled ahead by four on a 3-pointer by **Ahmad Starks** with 5:51 remaining. Oregon then made the decisive charge, scoring 11 unanswered to take a 71-64 lead with 1:30 left. Rice drained a pair of threes to keep the Illini within striking distance, but Ahmaad Rorie made a runner just before the shot clock expired with 12 seconds remaining to put the Ducks ahead by five and end it.

Rayvonte Rice equaled his career high, erupting for 29 points. It marked the 14th 20-point game of his Illini career, and fourth of the season. Rice also set a career best with five 3-pointers. **Nnanna Egwu** also scored in double figures with 10 and grabbed a game-high seven rebounds along with **Malcolm Hill**.

Game 9 Review: No. 7 Villanova 73, Illinois 59 (Dec. 9 at New York)

The Illini were positioned well, tied with a top-10 team in Madison Square Garden entering the game's closing stretch. No. 7 Villanova then turned its offense up a notch, defeating the Illini in the Jimmy V Classic.

Illinois made a pair of runs early in the second half, beginning with a 7-0 spurt that tied it at 38. Later trailing by seven, the Illini went on a 9-2 run on a runner by **Kendrick Nunn**, a layup by **Ahmad Starks**, a jumper by **Malcolm Hill** and capped by an **Aaron Cosby** 3-pointer to tie the game at 50-all with 8:30 left.

Villanova, however, scored on 10 straight possessions to pull away, outscoring the Illini 23-9 over the final 8-plus minutes. The Wildcats showed why they have one of the nation's best offenses, scoring 73 points on 53.7 percent shooting, the highest field goal percentage allowed by the Illini defense this season.

Malcolm Hill led Illinois with a game-high 20 points, while Rayvonte Rice also scored in double figures with 10. Kendrick Nunn added nine points and Nnanna Egwu scored eight while collecting a game and season-high nine rebounds.

Game 8 Notes: No. 24 Illinois 70, American 55 (Dec. 6 at Champaign)

- 1. Coach John Groce collected his 50th career win at Illinois.
- 2. The Illini forced 19 turnovers and capitalized with a 26-15 advantage in points off turnovers.
- 3. UI made its first 18 free throws of the game and finished a season-best 19-of-21 (90.5 percent) from the line.
- 4. Illinois used a 17-2 run in the first half to break the game open, turning a 13-11 edge into a 30-13 margin over seven minutes.
- 5. The Illini finished with a 29-18 edge on the glass and held American without an offensive rebound for the entire game. That led to a 10-0 advantage in second-chance points.
- 6. Illinois' bench outscored American's bench 28-3 on the afternoon, the +25 margin its largest of the year.
- 7. **Nnanna Egwu** blocked three shots and moved into fourth place in Illinois school history, surpassing James Griffin (156 blocks from 1979-82). Egwu also grabbed a game-high seven rebounds.
- 8. Malcolm Hill led the Illini in scoring for the third time this season with 13 points.
- 9. Maverick Morgan registered a career-high eight points and equaled his career-best with four rebounds.
- 10. Jaylon Tate tallied a season-high eight points and game-high four assists.
- 11. Kendrick Nunn racked up a career-high four steals.

Game 7 Review: No. 15 Miami 70, No. 24 Illinois 61 (Dec. 2 at Miami)

Illinois suffered its first loss of the season at No. 15 Miami in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Illini shot season lows of 33.3 percent overall and 23.3 percent from 3-point range. Included in that total was just 25 percent accuracy in the first half, as the Illini fell behind by 13 points at intermission.

The Illini opened the second half with a 10-0 run to draw within three, but the Canes extended the lead back to double figures. Trailing 48-38, the Illini then brought the deficit to two after **Kendrick Nunn** went on a personal 8-0 run, hitting consecutive 3-pointers followed by a breakaway layup. Miami, however, answered with a 7-0 run of its own to make the margin nine points, and the Illini got no closer than six the rest of the way.

Rayvonte Rice led the Illini against Miami, registering his second double-double of the year with 22 points and career-high 12 rebounds. Malcolm Hill finished with 13 points, Nnanna Egwu added eight points and a season-high nine rebounds and Nunn also netted eight.

Back in the Top 25

Illinois entered the Top 25 on Dec. 1, debuting at No. 24 in the Associated Press poll and No. 25 in the USA Today Coaches poll.

The Illini basketball program has now appeared in the AP rankings during all three years of Coach Groce's tenure, as well as each of the last seven seasons, 19 of the last 22 seasons, and 48 seasons all-time.

Rice MVP of Las Vegas Invitational; Hill, Egwu All-Tourney

Illinois had three players earn accolades upon winning the Las Vegas Invitational. Senior **Rayvonte Rice** was named MVP of the tournament. He averaged 19 points, seven rebounds and four assists in the two wins, netting 21 points with seven rebounds and a career-high tying five steals vs. Indiana State followed by 17 points, seven rebounds and three steals vs. Baylor.

Sophomore **Malcolm Hill** and senior **Nnanna Egwu** earned All-Tournament Team honors. Hill averaged 17 points and 5.5 rebounds in Vegas, posting 17 points in the back-to-back games. He also grabbed eight boards vs. Indiana State. Egwu, meanwhile, averaged seven points 6.5 rebounds in Vegas. He reached double figures for the second time on the year with 10 points vs. Indiana State and added eight rebounds vs. Baylor.

November Reign

Illinois is a perfect 21-0 in the month of November under Coach Groce, and has gone undefeated in college basketball's opening month for four straight seasons. The Illini have won 32 straight games in November — the nation's longest active streak — which will carry into next season.

Illini Continue Regular-Season Tournament Success

Illinois has won multi-team event tournaments in each of Coach Groce's first three seasons, claiming the Las Vegas Invitational after winning the 2012 EA Sports Maui Invitational followed by the 2013 Global Sports Invitational. Overall, the Illini have now taken the crown in nine of their last 12 regular-season tournaments, including three titles in Las Vegas.

Game 6 Notes: Illinois 62, Baylor 54 (Nov. 28 at Las Vegas)

- 1. With the victory over the Bears, Illinois won the 2014 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational, the Illini's ninth in-season tournament title since 2001.
- 2. Illinois improved to 6-0 on the season, marking the fourth-straight year the Illini started the season with at least six straight wins. The Illini started 10-0 in 2011-12, 13-0 in 2012-13 and 7-0 last season.
- 3. Rayvonte Rice and Malcolm Hill led the way, each scoring a game-high 17 points.
- 4. Ahmad Starks tallied five assists and Nnanna Egwu grabbed a team-high eight rebounds.
- 5. While offensive production was the story for Illinois in its first five wins, the Illini won this game with defense. Illinois held Baylor a top 20 offense in Ken Pomeroy's efficiency rankings to a season-low 54 points on just 33.3 percent shooting while also forcing 15 turnovers.
- 6. Illinois posted its biggest come-from-behind win of the season after facing a 7-point deficit just three minutes into the contest. Illinois answered with an 8-0 run and the teams went back and forth the rest of the half before Baylor took a 4-point lead into the locker room. The Illini then opened the second half with another 8-0 run to regain the lead and maintain it the rest of the way.

Game 5 Notes: Illinois 88, Indiana State 62 (Nov. 27 at Las Vegas)

- 1. Illinois scored at least 80 points for the fifth straight game to start the season.
- 2. The Illini had 15 steals against the Sycamores, equaling the most for Illinois in a game since also tallying 15 steals against Gonzaga on Jan. 2, 2010. **Rayvonte Rice** tied his career high with five steals to lead the defensive attack, while **Kendrick Nunn** equaled his career best with three steals.
- 3. Five Illini scored in double figures, marking the fourth straight game with at least five Illini in double digits. **Rayvonte Rice** led the way with a game-high 21 points while also grabbing seven rebounds.
- 4. Malcolm Hill scored 17 points. He did most of his damage drawing fouls and getting to the foul line, recording career bests for free throws made (11) and attempted (12).
- 5. **Aaron Cosby** (10), **Nnanna Egwu** (10) and **Kendrick Nunn** (10) also reached double figures, scoring 10 points apiece. Cosby hit a trio of 3-pointers while Egwu tied his career high with two triples.
- 6. The Orange and Blue opened the game with a 30-8 run and never looked back. Illinois started the game on fire hitting its first five shots and eight of its first nine. The lead grew to as many as 30 points (60-30) and never fell to fewer than 17 in the second half.
- 7. The Illini forced a season-high 20 turnovers and converted that into a 21-7 edge in points off turnovers.
- 8. Illinois dominated the glass (46-33), especially on the offensive end (13-5) and turned that into a 12-4 advantage in second chance points. **Cosby** and **Hill** each pulled down a game-high eight boards, with Cosby setting a career high in that category.

Game 4 Notes: Illinois 89, Brown 68 (Nov. 24 at Champaign)

- 1. After a basket by Brown to start the second half, Illinois went on a 15-0 run over the next 3:36 to take control of the game, turning a 37-31 deficit into a 46-37 lead that the Illini would not relinquish.
- 2. The Illini were on fire in the second half once again, shooting 19-of-26 (73.1 percent) en route to 58 second-half points.
- 3. Illinois totaled 38 points in the paint, tying their season high. The Illini made 11 straight shots in the paint to end the game and finished 12-of-13 in the paint in the second half.
- 4. Five Illini scored in double figures, marking the third game in a row with at least five Illini reaching double digits.
- 5. Rayvonte Rice recorded his second double-double as an Illini with 15 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. Rice's first double-double came at UNLV on Nov. 26, 2013.
- 6. **Aaron Cosby** led the way with 18 points, shooting 5-of-10 from the field and 3-of-6 from behind the arc.

Triple Digits

Illinois topped 100 points in back-to-back games, registering 107 points against Austin Peay (Nov. 21) after tallying 114 versus Coppin State (Nov. 16). It marked the first time the Illini hit the century mark in consecutive games since the 1993-94 season when they did so in three straight games from Dec. 10-18, 1993. Illinois recorded two 100-point games in the span of six days after eclipsing the century mark just twice in the previous 14 seasons.

Game 3 Notes: Illinois 107, Austin Peay 68 (Nov. 21 at Champaign)

- 1. The 41-point victory over Austin Peay following the 58-point win over Coppin State gave Illinois consecutive wins by 40-plus points for the first time in the modern era. The last time it happened was in 1943 when the Whiz Kids closed out the season with a 42-point win at Northwestern followed by a 67-point win over Chicago.
- 2. Illinois topped 100 points for the second straight game, accomplishing the feat for the first time since 1993.
- 3. Illinois equaled the most three-pointers made in back-to-back games in school history with 29, as the UI drained double-digit threes (14) for the second straight game after previously tying the State Farm Center record with 15 three-pointers against Coppin State. The only other time it has been done was in 2004-05 with 14 vs. Northwestern (2/23/05) and 15 vs. Purdue (3/3/05). Illinois hit double-figure threes just twice in 35 games last season.

- 4. The Illini were on fire in the second half, shooting 24-of-32 (75 percent) from the field. For the game, Illinois was 40-of-67 (59.7 percent), including 14-of-25 (56 percent) on 3-pointers.
- 5. The Illini forced 18 turnovers and capitalized with a double-digit advantage in points off turnovers (22-6) for the third consecutive game.
- 6. **Rayvonte Rice** and **Malcolm Hill** each turned in a game-high 16 points and six rebounds. Rice hit all six of his field goals, including three 3-pointers, while Hill was 6-of-7 from the field.
- 7. Kendrick Nunn was 4-of-4 on 3-pointers, one shy of his career high, and was third on the team with 14 points. He also equaled his career high with three steals.
- 8. **Nnanna Egwu** reached double figures for the first time on the season with 13 points.
- 9. Mike LaTulip scored a career-high nine points in eight minutes.

Game 2 Notes: Illinois 114, Coppin State 56 (Nov. 16 at Champaign)

- 1. Illinois scored its most points (114) and posted its largest margin of victory (58) since dropping 121 points in a school-record 69-point win over Chicago State on Dec. 18, 1993.
- 2. Illinois broke the 100-point plateau for the first time in 10 years, since tallying 105 points vs. Longwood on Dec. 27, 2004.
- 3. The Illini drained 15 three-pointers to tie their State Farm Center record and come within one of the school-record 16 three-pointers made vs. Arizona in the 2005 NCAA Tournament Elite Eight. It marked the third time the Illini hit 15 three-pointers at State Farm Center, with the other two times both occurring in 2005: vs. Penn State (1/12/05) and vs. Purdue (3/3/05).
- 4. Illinois rattled off 59 points in the first half, marking the Ul's most points scored in an opening half since totaling 67 points vs. Georgia Tech on Nov. 23, 2001. It was the most points for the Illini in any half since notching 59 points in the second half vs. Western Illinois on Dec. 16, 2001.
- 5. Illinois dished out 24 assists, its most dimes since registering 25 against Chicago State on Nov. 27, 2011.
- 6. After missing their first three shots of the game, the Illini drained 15 of their next 16 field goals to start the contest 15-of-19 (78.9 percent) from the field. That hot start included stretches of eight consecutive made field goals and seven straight made field goals.
- 7. The Illini forced 18 turnovers and capitalized once again with a big advantage in points off turnovers (28-9).
- 8. Illinois finished with a 50-35 advantage on the glass, the +15 margin the UI's largest since outrebounding Chicago State by 19 boards last season (Nov. 22, 2013). The 50 rebounds, meanwhile, was Illinois' highest total since collecting 52 in last year's opener vs. Alabama State (Nov. 8, 2013).
- 9. Six Illini scored in double figures for the first time in the Groce era: **Ahmad Starks** (18), **Leron Black** (18), **Aaron Cosby** (17), **Rayvonte Rice** (14), **Malcolm Hill** (13) and **Kendrick Nunn** (13). It was Illinois' first game with six players scoring in double figures since a victory over Northwestern on Jan. 6, 2011.
- 10. Cosby made five 3-pointers, equaling his career high first set at Seton Hall on the road vs. Notre Dame (Feb. 10, 2013).
- 11. Hill grabbed a career-high nine rebounds.
- 12. **Jaylon Tate** had a team-high seven assists, one shy of his career high.

Game 1 Notes: Illinois 80, Georgia Southern 71 (Nov. 14 at Champaign)

- 1. Illinois opened its 110th season of basketball by defeating Georgia Southern to win its 16th straight season opener and improve to 97-13 all-time in season openers.
- 2. Rayvonte Rice poured in a game-high 24 points, his 11th game in an Illini uniform scoring 20+ plus points. Rice also made 3-of-4 three-pointers.
- 3. Aaron Cosby was second on the team in scoring with 16 points in his Illinois debut.
- 4. Ahmad Starks had 10 points in his Illini debut, eclipsing the 1,000-career point mark. Starks scored 991 points during his three years at Oregon State.
- 5. Nnanna Egwu tallied four blocked shots, one shy of his career high. It marked Egwu's 10th career game with more than three blocks.
- 6. Leron Black, who finished with six points and four rebounds, was one of three Illini along with Cosby and Starks to make his Illini debut.
- 7. The Illini forced 16 turnovers and capitalized with a 22-9 advantage in points off turnovers.
- 8. Illinois made its final 13 free throws down the stretch and finished 27-of-34 (79.4 percent) from the charity stripe. It marked Illinois' most free throws made and attempted in a game since knocking down 28-of-35 last season against Penn State (Jan. 4, 2014).

Williams** are new additions to the program while junior college sophomore **Darius Paul** officially rejoins the Fighting Illini. It is a consensus national top-15 class in 2015, checking in at No. 8 by 247Sports, No. 11 by Scout and No. 12 by Rivals.

Abrams Out for Season with Torn ACL

Illinois lost its most experienced player prior to the season. Point guard **Tracy Abrams** suffered a torn ACL in his right knee during a skill workout in September, forcing him to the sidelines. Abrams had been a starter for the Illini since midway through his freshman campaign. He ranked second on the team in scoring last year, averaging 10.7 points, and led the Illini in assists (3.2 apg).

Abrams had surgery Oct. 22 in Chicago. He will redshirt this season and return in 2015-16 for his final year of eligibility.

Tri-Captains

Following a vote of the players and coaches, seniors **Tracy Abrams**, **Nnanna Egwu** and **Ahmad Starks** are serving as Fighting Illini team captains for the 2014-15 season. This marks the third straight season that Abrams and Egwu are captains and first for Starks.

Nunn Wears 25 to Honor Ben Wilson

The Illinois program has benefited from a recruiting pipeline to Simeon High School that began in the 1980s. This year's UI roster features two players from the Chicago basketball powerhouse in guards Kendrick Nunn and Jaylon Tate. Illinois also has signed a Simeon player in its 2015 recruiting class in D.J. Williams. Nunn is carrying on the tradition of former Simeon stars wearing the number 25 jersey at Illinois in memory of Ben Wilson, a prep basketball phenom who was shot and killed in 1984 before the start of his senior season. Nick Anderson was the first Fighting Illini player from Simeon to wear Wilson's 25 and the tradition continued with Deon Thomas, Bryant Notree and Calvin Brock prior to Nunn.

Illini Continue SEAL Team Training

For the second straight offseason, the Fighting Illini trained with SEAL Team Physical Training, led by former U.S. Navy SEAL John McGuire. The players and entire coaching staff participated in four mornings of workouts, held from June 23-26 during summer classes. The grueling, two-hour long training sessions included a number of physical activities such as races, push-ups, sit-ups, relays, swimming and rafting. The course was designed to enhance communication and foster team unity, mental toughness and togetherness.

ILLINI SIGN TOP-15 RECRUITING CLASS

University of Illinois head coach John Groce announced the signing of four student-athletes to national letters of intent in the 2015 recruiting class. High school seniors Jalen Coleman-Lands, Aaron Jordan and D.J. Williams are new additions to the program while junior college sophomore Darius Paul officially rejoins the Fighting Illini.

Illinois has recruited a national top-15 class, checking in at No. 8 by 247Sports, No. 11 by Scout and No. 12 by Rivals. This is Groce's second top-25 class in his three seasons in charge of the Illini program.

"We are thrilled with this class and are excited to publicly welcome Jalen, Aaron and D.J. to the Fighting Illini family as well as to officially re-sign Darius, who has remained an extended part of our family," Groce said. "We look for a certain type of player who fits our culture, which I call an 'Illini guy.' These young men are definitely Illini guys, and that also is a testament to the parents, families, coaches and friends who surround them.

"When looking at what they bring to the court, I don't know if there's a class in the country with a better set of shooters than Jalen and Aaron," Groce continued. "They are lights-out from the perimeter. And D.J. is one of the most skilled and versatile players in the entire 2015 class. He can play practically anywhere on the floor. These three are a perfect fit for our system.

"Regarding Darius, we have remained in communication with him and his family since he left last spring," Groce added. "We are proud of the progress he has made both on and off the court. We look forward to his continued improvement and a successful return to our program."

HEAD COACH JOHN GROCE

3rd Year at Illinois // 7th Year Overall // 22nd Year as a College Coach

John Groce is in his third season in charge of the Fighting Illini program in 2014-15 after leading Illinois to consecutive 20-win seasons and postseason appearances during his first two years in Champaign.

Groce guided one the youngest and most inexperienced teams in the nation last season to 20 wins and a No. 2 seed in the NIT, as the Illini narrowly missed a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Entering the year with nine newcomers and returning just three rotation players, Groce emphasized defense to his young squad and it delivered, finishing the season ranked 11th nationally in defensive efficiency.

Illinois won 13 of its first 15 games, highlighted by thrilling wins at UNLV, in the Braggin' Rights game over No. 23 Missouri and against Indiana in overtime on New Year's Eve. The Illini then played some of their best basketball late in the season, a staple of Groce's teams throughout his coaching career. Illinois won four of its last five regular season games, with three of those victories coming on the road at Minnesota, at No. 18 Michigan State and at No. 24 lowa. The Illini added wins over Indiana in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament and at Boston U in the first round of the NIT to finish the season with six victories over its final nine contests, with both postseason losses coming by just one point apiece.

Groce directed the Illinois program to a number of achievements during his first year – including a 23-win campaign that marked a six-win improvement from the UI's previous season – culminating in an NCAA Tournament appearance and subsequent victory to advance to the Round of 32.

Illinois won its first 12 games in 2012-13, equaling the sixth-best start in school history and matching the best start ever for a first-year UI coach. Included in that stretch was a dominating performance in Hawaii as the Illini captured the school's first-ever EA SPORTS Maui Invitational championship. Illinois also recorded arguably the most impressive win of college basketball's pre-conference season, winning at No. 10 Gonzaga by double digits.

The Illini spent eight weeks ranked in the Top 25, reaching as high as No. 10 in the national polls. Illinois recorded two more top-10 wins during conference play in one of the most difficult seasons in Big Ten history. The Illini defeated No. 8 Ohio State on Jan. 5 by 19 points, the Ul's largest margin of victory over a top-10 opponing last-second home victory over No. 1 Indiana. The Illini won it at the buzzer on a layup by Tyler Griffey, leading to a court storming celebration as Illinois defeated a No. 1-ranked opponent for just the third time in school history.

The Fighting Illini earned a No. 7 seed in the NCAA Tournament and defeated No. 10 Colorado in the Round of 64 as Groce improved his record in the opening round of the Tournament to 9-0 during his coaching career, and 3-0 as a head coach.

In addition to the success on the court, Groce also made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail, signing a top-25 ranked class in less than eight months on the job in Champaign.

Groce was named the 17th Fighting Illini men's basketball coach on March 29, 2012. He arrived at Illinois after four seasons as head coach at Ohio University, where he led the Bobcats to an 85-56 overall record as well as Mid-American Conference Tournament titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2010 and 2012.

Ohio was the story of the 2012 Tournament, advancing to the Sweet 16 as a No. 13 seed with victories over No. 4 seed Michigan followed by No. 12 seed South Florida. The Bobcats finished just short of the Elite Eight, falling to top-seed North Carolina in overtime in the regional semifinal. It marked just the second time in Ohio's school history and first since 1964 that the Bobcats won multiple games in the NCAA Tournament. Ohio finished the 2012 season with a school-record 29 wins and was known for its pressure defense, ranking second nationally in turnover percentage and third in steals percentage.

Ohio also made noise in the 2010 postseason. Playing in the school's first NCAA Tournament game in five seasons, the Bobcats received a No. 14 seed and defeated No. 3 seed Georgetown. With the 2010 and 2012 NCAA performances, Ohio became just the sixth school ever to win Tournament games as both a 13 and 14 seed.

The 43-year-old Groce has a total of 21 years in the coaching profession and has been part of teams that have made 18 postseason appearances. His record in 15 years as an assistant was an impressive 349-156, giving him a combined record of 4.77-240

Groce earned his first head-coaching job at Ohio following four seasons on Thad Matta's staff at Ohio State from 2005-08, the first two as assistant coach and last two as associate head coach. During Groce's time in Columbus the Buckeyes amassed a record of 105-35, advanced to the NCAA Championship game in 2007 and second round in 2006, claimed back-to-back outright Big Ten Championships in 2006 and 2007 and won the NIT in 2008. Groce played a key role in recruiting many of the top players at Ohio State and was named Rivals.com's 2006 National Recruiter of the Year.

In all, Groce spent eight years as an assistant under Matta. Prior to his time at Ohio State, Groce served three years on Matta's staff at Xavier from 2002-04 and one season at Butler in 2001. The Musketeers went 78-23 and made three straight NCAA appearances, advancing to the second round in 2002 and 2003 and the Elite Eight in 2004. Xavier also won consecutive Atlantic 10 titles in 2002 and 2003. Butler, meanwhile, went 24-8 and won a conference crown in 2001 while also advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Groce entered the Division I coaching ranks as a member of Herb Sendek's staff at North Carolina State from 1997-2000. The Wolfpack went 73-58 overall and advanced to the NIT in each of the four seasons Groce was in Raleigh, including a trip to the semifinals in 2000.

Groce got his start in coaching as an assistant at his alma mater, Taylor University, an NAIA school in Upland, Indiana. Groce spent three years on Paul Patterson's staff from 1994-96, helping lead the Trojans to a 69-32 record and pair of trips to the NAIA national tournament. Groce played for Patterson for three years from 1991-93 before making the transition to a student assistant role as a senior. Taylor compiled a 90-16 record and made three trips to the NAIA Tournament during Groce's playing career, including a 1991 NAIA Final Four appearance during his freshman season.

Groce earned a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Taylor in 1994. John and his wife, Allison, have two sons, Conner and Camden.
