Purdue hosts Sycamores for second time in three years.

The home opener is Military Appreciation and Band Day

THE GAME

- Purdue kicks off the 2015 home schedule against Indiana State. It is the second time in three years the Boilermakers have hosted the Sycamores for their first home game.
- Purdue leads the series 4-0 with all four being played in West Lafayette.
- Indiana State head coach Mike Sanford returns to Purdue where he was an assistant coach from 1987 to 1989 under head coach Fred Akers.
- The game is Purdue's penultimate game against an FCS opponent, as the Big Ten Conference has mandated that there will be no more games against FCS opponents. Purdue's previously scheduled 2016 season opener against Eastern Kentucky has been grandfathered in, as have previously scheduled FCS games around the league for next season.
- Purdue is 3-2 all-time in games played on Sept. 12, including 3-0 at home.
- The Boilermakers have won 11 straight home openers and 17 of the last 18 heading into Saturday's game. That is the most in a row in program history.
- Purdue is 8-0 all-time against the Missouri Valley Football Conference, including a win over a league member each of the last two seasons.
- Indiana State head coach Mike Sanford and assistant Brian Cabral were both assistants at Purdue in the late 1980s.
- The game is Military Appreciation and Band Day. High school bands from around the state will be on hand and also play at half time.
- Purdue is 0-1 in games broadcast on ESPNews, with a loss last season to Central Michigan.
- Purdue has won the game immediately following its first loss four of the last five years.

- Indiana State head coach Mike Sanford was an assistant coach for the Boilermakers from 1987 to 1989.
- Purdue was 10-22-1 during Sanford's time at Purdue.
- Indiana State assistant coach Brian

- Cabral coached Purdue's inside line-backers in 1987 and 1988.
- Purdue starting wide receiver Domonique Young and Indiana State starting punter Osborn Umeh played one year together at Cerritos College.

FIRST(S) AND 10

- Leroy Clark picked up his first career interception in the third quarter Sunday at Marshall.
- Langston Newton made his collegiate debut and had his first career fumble recovery against Marshall.
- Ra'Zahn Howard had his first career fumble recovery at Marshall.
- Markell Jones is the first true freshman running back to rush for a touchdown in the season opener since 2007 when Dan Dierking had a 30-yard touchdown run at Toledo. He is also the first true freshman to score in a season opener since 2009 when Antavian Edison had a 15-yard touchdown reception.
- D.J. Knox is the first Purdue running back to rush for over 100 yards in an opening-day first career start at running back since Raheem Mostert last season and the second since Ralph Bolden in 2009. Knox is the first sophomore or younger to do so since Bolden, as Mostert was a senior.
- Purdue's defense forced a threeand-out in their first drive of the season. It's the first time they haven't allowed a first down on the opening series of the opening game since 2013, when the defense had an interception on their first play at Cincinnati. Purdue's defense has not allowed a first down on the opening possession of the opening game three times in the last four years.

THE DARRELL HAZELL FILE



Darrell Hazell was named the 35th head coach in Purdue football history on Dec. 5, 2012. He signed a sixyear contract with the Boilermakers. Hazell is in his third year at

Purdue, after spending two seasons as the head coach at Kent State.

Hazell (HAY-zull) was named the 2012 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year after leading Kent State to arguably its most sucessful season ever, with an 11-3 record and MAC East Division championship. The 11 wins set a school record.

Prior to his time at Kent State, Hazell spent seven seasons at Ohio State, where he served as an assistant head coach and wide receivers coach under Jim Tressel. Hazell has spent 28 years in the college coaching ranks, and has previous stints as Rutgers (2001-03), West Virginia (1999-2000), the U.S. Military Academy (1997-98), Western Michigan (1995-96), Pennsylvania (1992-94), Eastern Illinois (1988) and Oberlin (1986-87, 1989-91).

Hazell graduated in 1986 from Muskingum College with a B.A. in speech communications and business. He was a three-time all-conference selection as a wide receiver and an All-American as a senior.

A native of Cinnaminson, N.J., Hazell (born April 14, 1964) and Annmarie have a son, Kyle.

- Purdue had 95 offensive plays from scrimmage Sunday, the first time it's had at least 90 since facing Marshall in 2012. It is the most since also running 95 against Oregon in 2008, though that game had two overtimes. The 95 plays against Marshall is the most in a non-overtime game since 2005 against Northwestern (101 plays).
- Antoine Miles and Michael Rouse III both had their first career sack on Sunday.
- Miles (DE), Robert Gregory (S), Knox (RB), Domonique Young (WR) and Ben Makowski (LS) all made their first career start on Sunday at Marshall.
- Purdue ranks first in the Big Ten, prior to Ohio State's Monday night game against Virginia Tech, and 22nd nationally in time of possession with 34:47.

STARTING UP FRONT

- Purdue returns all five starters on the offensive line, and six guys who started at least seven games up front last season.
- Robert Kugler (Sr. Center) has 32 consecutive starts heading into Sunday's game.
- Jordan Roos (Jr. Right guard) started all 12 games last year and has 19 for his career.
- **Jason King** (Jr. Left guard) has started 18 straight games.
- J.J. Prince (Jr. Tackle) started nine games at left and right tackle last season and has 10 career starts.
- Cameron Cermin (Jr. Tackle) started eight games at tackle last season and started at right tackle against Marshall.
- David Hedelin (Sr. Left tackle) started the final seven games of the season last year and Sunday's season opener at Marshall at left tackle.
- The group helped Purdue increase its rushing total by 91 yards per game from 2013 to 2014.
- The group allowed 14 fewer sacks

- in 2014 than the offensive line did in 2013.
- The group paved the way for 11 more rushing touchdowns in 2014 than in 2013 - nearly triple the total number.
- Purdue is one of nine schools in the country that returns five starters on the offensive line (also Ball State, Boise State, Bowling Green, North Carolina, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Texas, Washington State).
- Thirty-four other schools return four offensive line starters, including Purdue opponents Indiana and Michigan State.
- The Boilermakers return five starters on the offensive line, and six guys who started at least seven games up front a year ago, for the first time since 1963, when Purdue had 11 different guys start on the line that season, after having 10 in 1962.
- The offensive line opened holes for Purdue's new running backs Sunday at Marshall, helping D.J. Knox and Markell Jones to gain 174 yards and two touchdowns on 34 carries (5.1 avg.). Purdue rushed for three touchdowns in the opener.

NUMBERS GAME

- Purdue's offense ranks first in the Big Ten among teams that faced FBS opponents in week one. The Boilermakers offense is fourth in the conference overall with 454 yards.
- Purdue scored 31 points vs. Marshall last week. It is the fourth straight time Purdue has lost when scoring exactly 31 points, and five of the last six.
- Purdue ran 95 offensive plays against Marshall. The next closest Big Ten team was Northwestern with 79.
- Purdue's 95 plays from scrimmage tied for second most in the country during the first week, just one behind Florida Atlantic's nation-leading 96 offensive snaps.
- Purdue's rushing offense ranks third in the Big Ten among teams that faced FBS competition in week one and seventh overall with 184 yards.
- Austin Appleby threw the most passes, had the most completions, third highest completion percentage and fourth highest yard total in week one.
- Purdue had 28 first downs against Marshall, the most by any Big Ten team in week one.
- Purdue committed four penalties in the season opener, the third fewest among Big Ten teams in week one.

- Purdue's defense had three takeaways, with two fumble recoveries and an interception, which is the second most in the Big Ten for week
- Purdue was four for four in red zone opportunities, one of 10 Big Ten teams to be perfect in the red zone week one.
- Purdue's two fumble recoveries are tied for the Big Ten lead after week
- Appleby's 31 completions were the fifth most in the country in week one
- While Purdue's record over the last eight games, Appleby's career starts, doesn't look good on paper, 1-7, Purdue has had a possession in the final minutes of four of those games, including this season at Marshall, to potentially tie or win the game (also 2014 vs. Michigan State. at Minnesota, at Indiana).

YOUNG, TALENTED RUNNING BACKS

- Purdue had two running backs carry the ball last Sunday at Marshall and both recorded their first career carries.
- D.J. Knox (So.) rushed 22 times for 102 yards and scored the first touchdown of the season for Purdue from four yards out in the first quarter.
- Knox also had six catches to lead the team for 36 vards.
- Knox is the first Boilermaker to rush for 100+ yards in his first career start in a season opener since Raheem Mostert did so last year, and the second since Ralph Bolden's first start during his sophomore season in 2009.
- Knox is the first Boilermaker to rush for over 100 yards in his first season-opening game carrying the ball for Purdue since Mel Gray rushed for 104 yards against Stanford in
- Knox is one of six Big Ten running backs to rush for 100 or more yards in week one.
- Markell Jones (Fr.) had 12 carries for 72 yards, including a 36-yard touchdown in the third quarter.
- Knox and Jones touched the ball a combined 40 times and did not have a single negative play.

THIS AND THAT

- Purdue was 0-2 in 2014 in games decided by one possession or less. Both games were on the road (Minnesota and Indiana), while both come to Ross-Ade Stadium this season.
- Purdue was within one possession in

- the fourth quarter in four of its losses last season (vs. Iowa, vs. Michigan State, at Minnesota, at Indiana).
- Purdue increased its scoring output by 8.91 points per game from 2013 to 2014. That is the biggest increase in points per game since 1996 to 1997 (+15.36 ppg). Purdue's offense returns eight starters this season.
- The Boilermakers return 53.3 percent of their total scoring from the last two seasons combined.
- The last time Purdue came off a three-win season, the Boilermakers went 9-3 with a first year starting quarterback (1997).
- Purdue has just six days to prepare for Saturday's game, since the season opener at Marshall was on a Sunday. It's the first time game preperation has been short a day since 2004. The Boilermakers beat Ball State 59-7 in the shortened week.

A WIN WOULD MEAN...

- Purdue improves to 9-0 all-time vs. teams currently in the MVFC.
- Purdue extends its record home-opener winning streak to 12.
- Purdue improves to 4-0 at home in games played on Sept. 12.
- Purdue improves to 4-2 all-time on Sept. 12.

THE 'BACKERS ARE BACK

- Purdue returns all three starting linebackers from last season with Ja'Whaun Bentley, Danny Ezechukwu and Jimmy Herman.
- Purdue's linebacking corps, which comprises 11 individuals, has three juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen.
- Purdue is one of just three schools in the country to return all three linebacker starters and have all three with remaining eligibility after this season (also New Mexico State and UCLA).
- Ja'Whaun Bentley (So. MLB) was voted as a captain by the team on Aug. 21. He is Purdue's first sophomore captain since Raheem Mostert in 2012. Bentley is Purdue's top returning tackler from 2014, after starting all 12 games and amassing 76 tackles, including 3.5 for loss, three fumble recoveries and an interception. Bentley was named to ESPN.com's True Freshman All-America team and USA Today Sports Freshman All-America team. Bentley led the team with 10 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, at Marshall.

COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

- Freshman Markell Jones had 12 carries for 72 yards and a touchdown in his first career game.
- Purdue has won 11 straight home openers heading into Saturday's game, a program record.
- Purdue had 95 offensive plays from scrimmage against Marshall, it's most in a non-overtime game in 10 years.
- Of Purdue's 12 regular season games, nine are against teams that played in bowl games last season, just one behind the national leaders.
- Purdue is 8-0 all-time vs. teams currently in the Missouri Valley Football Conference.
- Paul Griggs scored seven points in the opener against Marshall, giving him 154 for his career, just eight shy of Purdue's top 20 all-time.
- D.J. Knox not only led the team at Marshall in rushing attempts, he also had the team's most receptions with six.
- Purdue had five first time starters at Marshall: Robert Gregory, D.J. Knox, Ben Makowski, Antoine Miles and Domonique Young
- Purdue was a perfect four-forfour in red zone scoring last week at Marshall.
- Purdue is one of just three team in the country to return three starting linebackers who all have eligibility remaining after the season.
- This is the second time in three years Purdue opens the home schedule against Indiana State.
- After Saturday, Purdue has just one more game against an FCS opponent, next season vs. Eastern Kentucky.
- D.J. Knox and Markell Jones both had their first career carries Sunday at Marshall. They combined for 34 carries and had zero negative plays.

AUSTIN APPLEBY

- Austin Appleby was named the starting quarterback on Aug. 25, after starting the final seven games of the 2014 season.
- Appleby has appeared in 12 games, including 10 last season. He is 180-326-15 for 1,787 yards and 12 touchdowns.
- Appleby had career highs in completions (31), yards (270), interceptions (4), and tied his career high with 48 pass attempts at Marshall.
- Appleby is Purdue's fifth different opening day starting quarterback in the last five years. No Purdue quarterback has started the season opener in consecutive years since Curtis Painter in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

- Purdue football lost a special family member when senior associate director of sports performance Doug Davis passed away May 12 due to complications of pneumonia. He was 33.
- The Boilermakers are wearing helmet stickers with the initials DD for today's game.
- "Doug was a great man, who
 worked tirelessly to make people
 better," head coach Darrell Hazel
 said. "He didn't coach with his
 whistle, didn't coach with his voice
 and didn't coach with his looks. He
 coached with his heart, and everyone knew it. We miss him dearly.
 Our thoughts and prayers continue
 to go out to his family."
- Doug joined the Boilermaker staff in 2013 after spending the 2011 and 2012 seasons working with Hazell at Kent State. From 2007 to 2010, Doug was a strength assistant at Ohio State, where Hazell was the wide receivers coach.

CAPTAINS

- Darrell Hazell announced team captains at the team's Kickoff Luncheon on Aug. 21.
- Hazell named seniors Danny Anthrop, Robert Kugler and Frankie Williams captains, as well as sophomore Ja'Whaun Bentley.
- Kugler earned captain status for the second year in a row.
- Bentley is the youngest captain Hazell has ever had. He is Purdue's first sophomore captain since Raheem Mostert was the special teams cap-





tain as a sophomore in 2012.

 Captains were voted on by the team. The vote was for upperclassmen, though one slot was opened up for a possible write-in. Bentley was written in by the majority of the team.

THIRD LARGEST CROWD

- A few thousand Purdue fans and 50 members of the All-American Marching Band made the five and a half hour drive to Huntington, W. Va., for the Boilermakers game at Marshall.
- The official attendance for the Sunday game was 38,791, the third-largest crowd in the history of Joan C. Edwards Stadium.

FIRST GAME EXPERIENCE

- Robert Gregory, D.J. Knox, Domonique Young, Antoine Miles and Ben Makowski all made their first career start at Marshall.
- Freshmen Markell Jones and Markus Bailey, redshirt freshmen Brandon Roberts, Martesse Patterson, Kirk Barron, Cole Herdman and Alex Hilger, junior college transfers Anthony Mahoungou and Shayne Henley and junior Langston Newton all saw their first action as Boilermakers.
- Knox had 22 carries for 102 yards and a touchdown, and six catches for 36 yards.
- Jones had 12 carries for 72 yards and a touchdown.
- Young had two catches for 16 yards.
- Gregory had six tackles.
- Miles had three tackles, 1.0 sack and 1.0 tackle for loss.
- Makowski was perfect on two field goal snaps, four extra point snaps and six punt snaps.
- Bailey had three tackles and a pass breakup.
- Roberts had two tackles.
- Patterson and Barron both saw action on the offensive line.
- Herdman had one catch for 11 yards.
- Hilger had one tackle on special teams.
- Mahoungou had four catches for 59 yards.
- Henley had one tackle.
- Newton had one tackles, including 0.5 for loss, and a fumble recovery.

FACING THE NATION'S BEST RUSHERS

 Purdue seems to face one of the nation's top running backs week in and week out. Saturday's game will be no different.

- The Boilermakers faced last year's Nos. 1 and 2 backs in the country in Melvin Gordon (Wisconsin) and Tevin Coleman (Indiana), who averaged 184.8 and 169.7 yards per game, respectively. Against Purdue, Coleman was held nearly 40 yards below his season average.
- Purdue also faced Nebraska's Ameer Abdullah, who was top five in the NCAA prior to an injury. Abdullah finished 14th in the country with 123.9 rush yards per game, but against Purdue, he only gained one yard.
- Purdue also faced Minnesota's David Cobb, Western Michigan's Jarvion Franklin and Michigan State's Jeremy Langford, who ranked 13th, 17th and 20th in the country, respectively. Purdue held Langford 13 yards below his season average.
- Purdue also faced Northwestern's Justin Jackson, who finished the year 31st in the country in rush yards per game.
- Sunday, Purdue faced Marshall running back Devon Johnson, who ranked fifth in the country in rushing yards per game in 2014 with 135.9. The Boilermakers held him to 89 yards and forced, and recovered, a fumble on his longest run, 33 yards.
- Indiana State's LeMonte Booker currently ranks 11th in FCS after racking up 137 yards and three touchdowns on 11 carries last week against Butler.

IRON MEN

- Robert Kugler has started 32 straight games at center.
- Anthony Brown has started 23 straight games at cornerback.
- Jason King has started 18 straight games at left guard.
- Ja'Whaun Bentley started all 12 games at linebacker last season as a freshman. He started Sunday at Marshall.
- Jake Replogle has started 13 straight games at defensive tackle.
- Frankie Williams has started 28 games at cornerback and safety in his career, including 11 each in 2013 and 2014.
- Austin Appleby and David Hedelin have both started the last eight games at quarterback and left tackle, respectively.

league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.

- Burgess played outfield and pitched, throwing 97 miles per hour off the mound, during his career in rookie and 'A' ball.
- Burgess came to Purdue during the summer after not playing organized football for more than 10 years, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a foot-ball-heavy family, as his dad, Fernanza, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess, played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers. Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., is a senior linebacker at Louisville.
- Burgess is not the only football player in the country that began their professional career in another sport:
- -Hayden Hurst, a 22-year old freshman tight end for South Carolina played baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization prior to playing for the Gamecocks.
- -Morgan James, a 25-year old freshman offensive lineman for Cincinnati, played minor league hockey prior to joining the Bearcats football team.
- -Melvin Ray, a 26-year old senior wide receiver for Auburn, was a 33rd-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2008.
- -Tyler Stovall, a 26-year old sophomore wide receiver and holder for Auburn, was a second-round draft pick of the Atlanta Braves in the 2008 MLB draft. He also played in the Kansas City Royals system.
- -Andy Phillips, a 26-year old junior kicker at Utah, spent five years after high school competing on the U.S. National Ski Team as an alpine racer.
- -Wallace Gonzalez, a 22-year old redshirt freshman tight end at Utah, spent three seasons in the Houston Astros' organization after being selected in the 29th round of the 2011 MLB draft.

WATCHLISTS

- Purdue has three players on watch lists to start the season.
- Paul Griggs, a senior kicker, has been named to the Lou Groza Award Watch List a year after making 16 of 20 field goals, including 3-for-3 from 50+ yards.
- Robert Kugler, a junior center, has been named to the Rimington Award Watch List after starting the last 31 games.
- Cameron Cermin, a junior tackle,

has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List for the top offensive player from Texas who has overcome adversity, especially injury.

STARTERS FROM NEAR AND FAR

- Purdue's projected offensive starters are from seven different states and one foreign country, while no state is represented more than twice.
- The defensive starters are from six different states.
- The specialists, long snapper, kicker and punter, are from three different states.
- In all, Purdue's 25 starters are from 12 different states and one foreign country.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

- Purdue had five first time starters at Marshall:
 - -Domonique Young (Jr., WR)
 - -Ben Makowski (Fr., LS)
 - -D.J. Knox (So., RB)
 - -Antoine Miles (So., RE)
 - -Robert Gregory (Jr., FS)
- Last season, the Boilermakers had six first time starters for the season opener, with two on offense and four on defense.
- In 2013, the first year of the Darrell Hazell head coaching era, Boilermakers had five first time starters.
- Jordan Jurasevich (Sr., TE) is listed as the starting tight end, but did not start last Sunday because of the opening formation.

"211 SESSION"

- The football team brings back the 211 Session for the third straight year.
- The 211 session is a major pep rally hosted inside Mackey Arena before all home games.
- The event begins two hours and 11 minutes prior to kickoff and features the "All-American" Marching Band, head coach Darrell Hazell, the team, cheerleaders and Purdue Pete.
- The event is designed for fans to have a personal connection with the team and create tremendous excitement heading into the game.
- The session is named such because at 211° water is hot, but at 212° water boils and produces steam, which can power an engine. The excitement from the event will help the atmosphere "rise one degree" and make Ross-Ade Stadium, nicknamed "The Furnace," a difficult place for opponents to play.

FIFTEEN-YEAR SALUTE

- No. 14 Purdue improved to 2-0 with a workmanlike 45-10 win over Kent State on Sept. 9 at Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Drew Brees broke school records for career completions and total offense, while Travis Dorsch broke the career field goals mark.
- After the Golden Flashes took a 3-0 lead, the Boilermakers scored 24 unanswered points en route to racking up 605 yards of total offense.

BOILERMAKER DEPOT

- Purdue fans have a one-spot stop for all information regarding activities on campus during game week.
- Fans can access "Boilermaker Depot" by visiting BoilermakerDepot. com.

ANTHROP-OLOGY

- Purdue football's version of Anthropology focuses on senior wide receiver Danny Anthrop.
- Anthrop led Purdue in receiving seven straight games last season, including the Nebraska game, where he incurred a season-ending injury.
- Anthrop had two 100-yard receiving games, and a third with 99 reception yards: Southern Illinois (106), Michigan State (133) and Illinois (99).
- Anthrop also finished the 2013 season on a high with 151 receiving yards and a touchdown on five catches.
- Anthrop seemed to be the piece that kept Purdue's offense going, as in the eight games he was fully healthy, the Boilermakers averaged 28.3 points per game. In the other four, including at Nebraska where he was injured, Purdue averaged just 15.0 points per game.
- Anthrop needs just 28 receiving yards to eclipse 1,000 for his career.
- For his career, Anthrop, from West Lafayette, Ind., has 61 catches for 972 yards and seven touchdowns.

QUARTERBACKS ON THE FIELD

- The Boilermakers played three different players that were recruiting to Purdue as quarterbacks in 2012.
- Robert Gregory, listed as the starting free safety on the depth chart, came to Purdue in 2012 as a dual-threat quarterback. That fall, he volunteered to switch positions to running back. Gregory was a reserve running back in 2013, before switching to safety in spring before the 2014 season. Gregory won the

Hammer Award, given to the player who is the most outstanding hitter during spring practice, in 2014 and 2015. He made his first career start at safety at Marshall and had six tackles.

- Bilal Marshall came to Purdue in the same recruiting class as Gregory. He switched to wide receiver after one season as a reserve quarterback. Marshall has shown promise through fall and spring practices, including being named the offense's Most Improved Player during this year's spring ball. He played, though did not record any stats at Marshall.
- Austin Appleby was also a member of the 2012 quarterback recruiting class. He stuck with the position and made his eighth straight start for Purdue.
