THE GAME

- Purdue and Northwestern meet for the 79th time in series history. Purdue leads the series 50-27-1 and won the last meeting, which was in 2010.
- Purdue won the last meeting 20-17 at Northwestern, after scoring on a fourth-down run inside the 10-yard line in the final minutes.
- The Boilermakers are coming off a bye week. Prior to that, Purdue fell at home to Wisconsin 34-16 in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Northwestern is coming off a come-from-behind 43-40 overtime win at Notre Dame.
- Saturday is Senior Day at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers will honor 21 graduating student-athletes on the field prior to the game.
- Purdue is 12-4-1 all-time in games played on Nov. 22, and has won seven in a row on that date. The Boilermakers are unbeaten on that date in their last nine games played on Nov. 22. Purdue has not lost on Nov. 22 since 1947.
- Anish Shroff will handle play-by-play duties, while Kelly Stouffer will serve at his side as analyst.
- Tim Newton will handle the play-by-play on the Purdue Sports Properties radio broadcast with Pete Quinn at his side. Kelly Kitchel will join the crew from the sideline.

GAME THEMES

- Purdue is back at Ross-Ade Stadium for the final time in 2014, as the Boilermakers host Senior Day.
- The Boilermakers are coming off their second bye week of the season.
- Northwestern is playing its fifth and final road game of the season. The Wildcats are 2-2 away from home this season.
- Purdue and Northwestern are meeting on the gridiron for the first time since 2010 and the first time as divisional foes.
- Though Purdue won the last meeting against the Wildcats, Purdue hasn't knocked off Northwestern at Ross-Ade Stadium since 2007. Including the 2007, Purdue is 1-1 against Northwestern in that span.
- Despite the fact that Northwestern is the 11th game on Purdue's schedule, the Wildcats are the first team the Boilermakers will face whose record is not above .500 (other than 0-0 Western Michigan in the season opener).
- Purdue's last four opponents, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska and Wisconsin, are a combined 33-9. Two of those nine losses were against those same teams (Nebraska lost to

Wisconsin and Michigan State).

- Saturday is Darrell Hazell's first game against Northwestern as Purdue's head coach.

HEAD COACH DARRELL HAZELL

- Purdue head coach Darrell Hazell (Muskingum, 1986) is 4-18 as Purdue's head coach and 20-28 overall. He was 16-10 in two seasons at Kent State.
- Hazell was named the school's 35th head coach on Dec. 5, 2012, after two seasons as the head coach at Kent State.
- Hazell's first coaching win at Purdue came on Sept. 7, 2013, against Indiana State.
- Hazell's first Big Ten win came on Oct. 4, 2014, at Illinois.
- Hazell was named the 2012 MAC Coach of the Year after leading Kent State to 11 wins and its first bowl appearance in 40 years.
- Hazell also has served seven years on staff at Ohio State and been an assistant coach at Rutgers, West Virginia, U.S. Military Academy, Western Michigan, Pennsylvania, Oberlin College and Eastern Illinois.

UP AND GOOD GRIGGS

- Junior place kicker Paul Griggs has had a career year this season.
- Griggs has knocked down 13 of 15 field goals this year, after making just six of 12 a year ago.
- He has made a career-best seven-straight kicks heading into Saturday's game.
- He is 29-30 on extra points, and has made 25-straight.
- Griggs was named the Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week after the Wisconsin game. There, he was 3-for-3 in field goals, including 53- and 52-yard makes.
- He was also named the College Football Performance Awards Placekicker of the Week after that performance.
- Griggs became the first kicker in school history to make multiple 50+ yarders in the same game.
- Griggs is Purdue's first kicker to ever make three kicks of 50+ in a single season at Purdue.
- Griggs' 53 and 52-yarders against Wisconsin were the longest two of his career.
- Griggs is one of just two kickers in the country to be perfect from 50+ this season with at least three attempts. Griggs and Florida State's Roberto Aguayo, who won last year's Lou Groza Award, are both 3-3 from that distance.
- Griggs is one of five kickers who have made at least three kicks of 50+ this season. Josh Lambert of West Virginia leads the way with four (of five attempts).
- Griggs' .867 percent success rate this season is on pace to become the new school record for a single season.
- His season makes percentage is 10th in FBS this year.
- Only 35 kickers in FBS have made at least one kick of 50+ yards this season, and just 12 have made multiple from that distance.
- Griggs is one of 20 kickers to be perfect from 50+ this season, and one of just seven perfect from that distance with at least two attempts.
- Griggs is one of just two kickers in FBS to have multiple makes of 50+ in a single game this season, with Memphis' Jake Elliott.
- Griggs has made three of the Big Ten's nine field goals of 50+ yards this season. He is the only Big Ten kicker with more than one make from that distance.
- Griggs' 53-yarder against Wisconsin is the third-longest field goal in the Big Ten this season. His 52-yarder in the same game is tied for the fourth-longest in the conference for 2014.
- Griggs is 23-34 for his career, a success rate of .676. That percentage is currently fifth in school history, behind fourth place Tim Clark (.688), third place Ben Jones (.694), second place Travis Dorsch (.701) and school-record holder Carson Wiggs (.737).
- Griggs' 13 makes this season is tied for the 13th-best season effort in school history. He is one shy of 11th, two shy of eighth, three shy of sixth and five shy of fourth.
- Griggs' 23 career makes moves him into seventh in school history. He is four shy of Scott Sovereign, who is sixth.

MISCELLANEOUS STATS

- Austin Appleby has five rushing touchdowns, which is tied for 22nd-most among FBS quarterbacks this season.
- Appleby's last six touchdown passes have all been to different receivers, with Cameron Posey, Danny Anthrop, B.J. Knauf, DeAngelo Yancey Akeem Hunt and Gabe Holmes all hauling in one.
- Purdue has thrown 14 touchdown passes this season, but no receiver has caught more than one in a single game.
- The Boilermakers average 14.43 yards per punt return, which ranks eighth in the country. That total is the third-highest among teams that do not have at least one return touchdown, and best in the Big Ten.
- Purdue's punt return total, though both of its top two returns went down with injury at Nebraska, is the best in the Big Ten, despite the fact that Maryland and Nebraska each have two return touchdowns.
- Purdue has scored off of all but four takeaways this season, which all, oddly enough, have been Landon Feichter interceptions.

MOVING UP THE PURDUE RANKINGS

- Raheem Mostert is now the all-time Purdue leader in career kickoff return yards. Mostert now has 2,207, 82 yards better than previous record-holder Dorien Bryant.
- Akeem Hunt continues to climb the Purdue rankings for all-purpose yards. He now ranks fifth all time with 4,378 career yards.
- Hunt is 223 yards shy of Otis Armstrong who is fourth.
- Hunt now averages 5.53 yards per carry for his career, which ranks fifth in school history for players with at least 200 career attempts.
- Paul Griggs' 23 career made field goals ranks seventh in Purdue history.
- Griggs has made 23 of 34 field goals for a .676 percent success rate. That percentage ranks fifth in program history.
- Mostert has 3,050 all-purpose yards for his career, which ranks 15th in Purdue history.
- Mostert is 35 yards shy of 14th, 53 yards shy of 13th, 146 yards shy of 12th and 149 yards shy of 11th.

WHERE PURDUE RANKS IN THE BIG TEN

- Purdue is tied for first in the Big Ten with only four fumbles lost on the season. The Boilermakers are tied with Michigan State in that category.
- Purdue ranks third in the Big Ten in fewest penalty yards and fewest penalty yards per game this season.
- Purdue is second in the Big Ten in fourth down defense, giving up a first down on just 0.214 percent of fourth down attempts.
- Purdue is third in the Big Ten in red zone defense. The Boilermakers allow points on just 78 percent of opponents trips inside the 20-yard line.
- Purdue is second in the Big Ten in turnovers lost with 15.
- Paul Griggs is second in the Big Ten in field goal percentage this season. He has connected on 0.867 percent of his attempts this season (13-15).
- Landon Feichter leads the Big Ten, and is ninth in the country, in interceptions per game with 0.5 on the season.
- Feichter is also fourth in the conference in solo tackles with 5.7 per game.

THIS DATE IN BOILERMAKER HISTORY

- Purdue is 12-4-1 all-time in games played on Nov. 22.
- The Boilermakers' first game on Nov. 22 was in 1890, when Purdue beat Illinois 62-0.
- Purdue has won seven in a row in games played on Nov. 22, and is unbeaten in its last nine on that date.
- Purdue's most recent game on Nov. 8 was in 2008, when the Boilermakers fell to Indiana, 62-10 in West Lafayette. The game was Joe Tiller's final as a coach.
- This is the first time Purdue and Northwestern have played on this date.

SENIOR SALUTE

- Saturday is Senior Day, and 21 seniors will be honored during pregame festivities: Brandon Cottom, Josh Davis, Jack De Boef, Landon Feichter, Parker Flynn, Joe Gilliam, Gabe Holmes, Akeem Hunt, Mike Lee, Antoine Lewis, Collin Link, Dolapo Macarthy, Ian MacDougall, Raheem Mostert, Jalani Phillips, Taylor Richards, Sean Robinson, Ryan Russell, Jesse Schmitt, Justin Sinz and Charles Torwudzo.
- Also being recognized are student managers Justin Cook, Chris Hoffman, Sarah Lim, Ryan Lombard, Devin Morgan and James Stonestreet, as well as student athletic trainers Katy Clark and Cameron Ortyl.

PEACH BOWL ANNIVERSARY

- Purdue will celebrate the 30th anniversary of the 1984 Peach Bowl team during Saturday's game.
- Under head coach Leon Burtnett, the Boilermakers began the season with a come-from-behind 23-21 victory over eighth-ranked Notre Dame in the dedication game of the Hoosier Dome in Indianapolis, then later upset second-ranked Ohio State 28-23 and defeated Michigan 31-29, both at Ross-Ade Stadium.
- The team joined the 1951 and 1965 Michigan State teams as the only squads to defeat those three traditional powerhouses in the same season.
- Purdue finished with a 7-4 overall record and 6-3 Big Ten mark, good for a second-place tie with Illinois, and accepted an invitation to the Peach Bowl to play Virginia on New Year's Eve.
- Burtnett was named Big Ten Coach of the Year.

FRESHMAN IMPACT

- Purdue's linebacking corps is littered with freshmen.
- True freshman Ja'Whaun Bentley and redshirt freshman Danny Ezechukwu have made a huge impact to the group, especially over the last three games, filling in for Sean Robinson and Joe Gilliam who both went down to season-ending knee injuries.
- At Minnesota, Ezechukwu had a game- and career-high 12 tackles.
- Bentley was second on the team with 11 tackles, including 1.0 for loss at Minnesota.
- Ezechukwu has 24 tackles and a forced fumble over the last three games, while Bentley has 20 tackles and a fumble recovery in that span.
- Several other Boilermaker rookies have had huge impacts this season.
- Gregory Phillips had Purdue's longest reception in week one. Phillips caught one pass for 29 yards in the game's second quarter.
- Bentley had a career-high nine tackles against Notre Dame in week three. He also has an interception and two fumble recoveries.
- Gelen Robinson picked up his first career sack against Notre Dame. He now has two in his young career.
- Robinson had five tackles, including 0.5 for loss, against Wisconsin in Purdue's last game.
- Ezechukwu (redshirt freshman) had a half sack against Notre Dame.
- Ezechukwu finished tied for a game high with 12 tackles against Minnesota and had a game-high 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Redshirt freshman Keyante Green played half the fourth quarter against Southern Illinois and had a game-high 71 rushing yards on 13 carries. Green rushed eight times for 20 yards against Iowa. Against Minnesota, he had one rush for 36 yards, his second-straight week with a rush for at least that distance. Against Illinois, he had a 53-yard carry. Last week at Nebraska, Green rushed once for 18 yards.
- Green and Trae Hart made their first career starts at Illinois. Green rushed three times for 51 yards, while Hart had one catch for 12 yards.
- Freshmen Miles Norwood, D.J. Knox, Da'Wan Hunte, David Yancey, John Strauser, Jason Tretter and Jordan Jurasevich have all also played this season.

BENTLEY IN ELITE COMPANY

- Since 2000, just 18 freshmen, including Ja'Whaun Bentley, have made a start for Purdue's defense in the opening month of the season.
- Bentley's start at linebacker the first nine games makes him just the seventh true

freshman at Purdue to make a defensive start in the opening month.

- Bentley joins Bernard Pollard, Royce Adams, Gilbert Gardner, Brandon Erwin, Ricardo Allen and Bruce Gaston as the true freshmen to start defensively in the opening month.
- Bentley also joins the likes of Landon Johnson, Shaun Phillips and Kawann Short as Boilermaker freshmen (true or redshirt) to start a game in the opening month.
- Current Boilermakers Ryan Russell and Frankie Williams both had starts as redshirt freshmen in the opening month.
- Bentley is the first true freshman to start at linebacker in the opening month 2000 when Gardner started. Landon Johnson, Stanford Kegl and Joe Holland had linebacker starts as redshirt freshmen in the month of September.
- Bentley is the first true freshman to have an interception for Purdue since Austin Logan had one against Nebraska last season.
- Bentley also has two fumble recoveries this year.
- Bentley is second on the team in tackles with 62, and also has 2.5 tackles for loss.
- Due to injuries to Sean Robinson and Joe Gilliam, Bentley switched from weakside linebacker to middle linebacker, making his first start at the position against Michigan State. He has started there ever since.

YOUNG STARS SHINE ON DEFENSE

- Purdue's defense is experience a youth movement, especially at linebacker and across the line.
- The Boilermakers' main linebackers are freshmen Ja'Whaun Bentley and Danny Ezechukwu and sophomore Jimmy Herman.
- Ezechukwu has led the team in tackles two of the last three games, while Bentley was second on the team against Nebraska.
- Herman was tied for second on the team in tackles against Wisconsin with eight.
- In Purdue's last game, the Boilermakers had five tackles for loss and all of them were by players with freshman or sophomore eligibility.
- Sophomore defensive tackle Jake Replogle has played some of his best football over the last few weeks. Replogle was fourth on the team with seven tackles at Nebraska last week, and also had a solo sack.
- Replogle also had a 1.5 tackles for loss against Wisconsin, and has 2.0 sacks and 7.5 TFL this season.
- Sophomore Ra'Zahn Howard has had a huge impact on the defensive line - even bigger than what appears on his stat line. Howard has 17 tackles and a sack this season.
- Sophomore cornerback Leroy Clark started at Nebraska and had four tackles. Against Wisconsin, he tied for second on the team with eight tackles, including 1.0 for loss.
- Purdue started six freshmen and sophomores on defense at Nebraska.
- The Boilermakers started five against Wisconsin.

FACING THE BEST

- Purdue has faced a pretty difficult schedule so far this season.
- Teams that Purdue has already played this season are a combined 69-33, including three teams that have 8-2 records, four with 7-3 records and one with a 7-4 record.
- Only one team that Purdue has played is currently below .500.
- No FBS team that Purdue has played has yet been eliminated from bowl contention.
- Three of Purdue's losses are against current AP top-25 teams.
- Five of Purdue's losses are against teams ranked in the top 25 in the second College Football Playoff Rankings.
- Purdue's seven losses this season are against teams with a combined record of 52-19 (.732).
- Purdue had leads in three of those games, with a 14-10 advantage in the first half against Notre Dame, a 10-0 first quarter lead against Iowa and led Minnesota most of the game until the Gophers hit a 52-yard field goal late in the fourth quarter.
- Against Michigan State, Purdue had the ball with less than three minutes remaining in the game with a potential game-tying drive, before Michigan State sealed its victory with an interception.

- Appleby completed 15 of 20 passes for 202 yards and a touchdown, without an interception, in the team's win at Illinois.
- His 75% completion percentage was the highest for a first-time starter since before Curtis Painter in 2005.
- Appleby's 202 passing yards is the most for a first-time starter since Caleb TerBush in 2011, when he threw for 220 yards.
- Appleby is the first first-time starter to not commit a turnover since Brandon Kirsch against Michigan in 2002.

- Appleby helped the running game come alive as well, as the Boilermakers rushed for 776 yards and nine touchdowns in his first three games as a starter, while averaging 7.4 yards per carry.

- Purdue tight end Justin Sinz has been one of the Boilermakers' most consistent pass catchers over the last couple years.

- Purdue is one of 14 teams in FBS that played eight-straight games before having its first bye week of the season.

- This year's group is built by four sophomores, RG Jordan Roos, RT J.J. Prince, LG Jason King and T/C Cameron Cermin, and two juniors, C Robert Kugler and LT David Hedelin.
- The unit has showed improvement each week, allowing the Boilermakers to rush for 159.7 yards per game.
- The Boilermakers rushed for 349 yards at Illinois.
- Against Michigan State, the nation's No. 5 rushing defense, Purdue rushed for 129 yards and three touchdowns against a unit that is allowing just 81.5 yards per game on the ground.
- Purdue gave up two sacks against Michigan State, after not allowing one the previous week at Illinois.
- At Minnesota, the offensive line helped Purdue rush for 298 yards and two touchdowns against Minnesota, while averaging 8.5 yards per carry. Purdue did not allow a sack in the game.
- The offensive line has not allowed a sack in a game three times this season, the first time since 2010 when Purdue had four such games.

Last Time **vs. Northwestern**

Northwestern entered the game 5-0 and was looking for its best start in 48 years. Purdue had freshman Rob Henry making his first career start at quarterback for a Boilermaker team that was 2-2 entering the game.

The teams went into halftime tied at 10. Dan Persa led the Wildcats to a third-quarter score to give Northwestern a 17-10 lead early in the third quarter. The Boilermakers answered with a field goal, before heading to the fourth quarter.

The Purdue defense came alive, holding Northwestern scoreless for the rest of the game. Kawann Short had a huge field goal block in the fourth quarter to keep the Boilermakers down just four. On a fourth-down play with four minutes to play, Dan Di-erking took a handoff from Henry and marched into the end zone from seven yards out. The Wildcats had a 45-yard field goal try with 58 seconds left, but missed to secure Purdue's 20-17 win.

- The Boilermakers have scored 137 combined points the last five games, including 17 touchdowns.
- Purdue has put up 38, 31, 38, 14 and 16 points the last five weeks, respectively.
- Purdue had 31 in a game last season just once, which came in the final contest of the year at Indiana (L, 36-56).
- The last time the Boilermakers put up at least 31 points in three straight games was 2009 when Purdue scored 38 at Michigan (W, 38-36), 37 against Michigan State L, 37-40) and 38 at Indiana (W, 38-21).
- Purdue scored at least 31 points in three straight games this season, Illinois, Michigan State and Minnesota, a feat only accomplished 17 times in program history, including this season's streak.
- The Boilermakers scored at least 31 points in three straight Big Ten games eight times in program history, including this season's streak.
- Purdue's offense has scored 256 points this season, compared to 179 from all of last season.
- The offense is averaging more than 65 more yards per game this season than last season.
- Over the past five games, Purdue has rushed for 926 yards and 10 touchdowns, compared with 805 rushing yards and six touchdowns all of last season.
- Over the last five games, Keyante Green is averaging 18.0 yards per carry, Raheem Mostert is averaging 12.2 yards per carry, Akeem Hunt is averaging 5.0 yards per carry and Austin Appleby is averaging 3.4 yards per carry.
- Purdue is averaging 5.7 yards per carry as a team for the past five games.

ALL ANTHROP

- Danny Anthrop has had a breakout year, which has made him Purdue's best and most consistent wide receiver so far this season, prior to his season ending injury at Nebraska.
- The junior led the Boilermakers in receiving yards seven games in a row, from Notre Dame through Nebraska, including performances of 133 yards (vs. Michigan State), 106 yards (vs. Southern Illinois) and 99 yards (at Illinois).
- Anthrop had one receiving performance of 100+ yards a year ago, with 151 yards in the season finale at Indiana.
- Anthrop caught four touchdown passes this season, after having caught three total during his first two seasons as a Boilermaker.
- Anthrop had 38 catches for 616 yards this season, after catching 18 balls for 338 yards during his first two seasons combined.
- Anthrop ranked 48th in the country in total receiving yards this season, prior to his injury.
- He was sixth in the Big Ten in total receiving yards this season.
- Anthrop's three career 100+ receiving-yard games makes him the 30th receiver in Purdue history with at least three. Teammate DeAngelo Yancey also has three 100+ receiving-yard games, all from last season.
- Anthrop led the Big Ten in week seven with nine receptions. His 133 receiving yards were just five behind that week's Big Ten leader, Tony Lippett of Michigan State.
- Anthrop led the Big Ten in receiving yards on Sept. 20 with his 106 receiving yards.

BACK IN THE HUNT

- The Big Ten is proving to have the nation's best running backs this season, with the top two and three of the top seven, and four of the top nine in the nation in terms of rushing yards per game and total rushing yards.
- While Purdue's Akeem Hunt has started just the last six games at running back, after starting all 12 last season, he still ranks 68th in the nation in rushing yards per game.
- More impressively, Hunt is 47th in the nation with an average of 5.36 yards per carry.
- Hunt had rushed for five touchdowns in his career heading into his senior season.
- This year, Hunt has rushed for five touchdowns, including three against Michigan State's No. 5 rush defense in the country.
- Hunt has rushed for 718 yards this season, a career best. Last season, Hunt rushed for 464 yards while starting all 12 games at running back.
- Akeem Hunt has rushed 332 times in his career for 1,804 yards, an average of 5.43 yards per carry.

- Hunt's career yards per carry average ranks tied for fifth in school history.
- Hunt also continues to climb the Purdue rankings for all-purpose yards. He now ranks fifth all time with 4,378 career yards.
- Hunt is 223 yards shy of Otis Armstrong who is fourth.
- Hunt's career all-purpose yards rank 11th in the country among active players, and third in the Big Ten behind national leader Ameer Abdullah.
- Hunt's 96 rushing yards against Michigan State's No. 5 ranked defense were the most yards allowed by an individual since Ohio State quarterback Braxton Miller rushed for 142 yards against the Spartans in last year's Big Ten Championship game.
- Hunt had a career high with three rushing touchdowns against Michigan State.
- Hunt now averages 71.8 rushing yards per game this season.
- Hunt had a 79-yard touchdown reception against Wisconsin, the longest catch of his career.
- Hunt's 1,804 career rushing yards ranks 14th in Purdue history, two yards ahead of Duane Purvis. He is 107 yards shy of 13th and John Macon.

'CHUNK' PLAYS

- Purdue's coaching staff preaches 'chunk' plays – gaining several yards on a single play.
- Purdue had five plays of at least 44-yards against Illinois, including four rushes. The four rushes were the longest four of the season for Purdue. The five plays were made by different Boilermakers, with Anthrop hauling in an 80-yard touchdown reception, Appleby rushing 62 yards, Akeem Hunt scoring on a 54-yard run, Keyante Green having a 53-yard rush and Raheem Mostert scoring on a 44-yard run.
- The Boilermakers scored five touchdowns against Minnesota, matching a season best with the team's performances against Illinois and Western Michigan.
- Against the Illini, Purdue's touchdown drives averaged 76.6 yards on merely 4.4 plays and 1 minute and 58 seconds, most utilizing 'chunk' plays. Purdue's average field position was its own 19-yard line.
- Including the four rushes of 44 yards or more, Purdue had five rushes of at least 20 yards. Prior to the game against Illinois, the Boilermakers had just six 20+ yard rushes all season.
- Against Michigan State's nationally ranked defense, the Boilermakers had a 52-yard touchdown rush, a 36-yard rush and a 36-yard passing play.
- Against Minnesota, Purdue had rushes of 69, 31 and 25, as well as a 55-yard touchdown pass.
- Against Wisconsin, Akeem Hunt hauled in a 79-yard touchdown pass from Austin Appleby.

APPLEBY AMONG EIGHT FOR MANNING AWARD STAR OF THE WEEK

- Austin Appleby was among eight finalists for the Manning Award "Star of the Week" after his performance at Illinois in his first career start.
- Appleby's 15-20 performance for 202 yards and a touchdown, with no interceptions, as well as 76 rushing yards and two touchdowns on seven attempts earned him a spot on the list.
- Appleby was one of eight with Mike Bercovici, Arizona State, Shane Carden, East Carolina, Darell Garretson, Utah State, Connor Halliday, Washington State, Nick Marshall, Auburn, Dak Prescott, Mississippi State and Deshaun Watson, Clemson.
- Prescott was eventually named the Star of the Week.

HOW SWEDE IT IS

- Purdue's offensive line has been a solid unit through the first nine games, helping Purdue rush for 1,597 yards.
- The Boilermakers added a talented piece to that line for the Southern Illinois game with transfer David Hedelin, a native of Stockholm, Sweden.
- Hedelin's three-game NCAA imposed suspension, for competing in club football after high school, ended prior to the Southern Illinois game.
- Hedelin first appeared in the first quarter on Purdue's 44-yard touchdown pass from Danny Etling to Danny Anthrop.
- Hedelin made his first start at Illinois, and helped the Purdue offense rush for 349 yards, while not allowing a sack.
- Hedelin started against Michigan State and had a key block in Akeem Hunt's 52-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter, which got Purdue back in the game.
- Hedelin also started against Minnesota and helped the offense rush for nearly 300 yards while not giving up a sack.
- Against Nebraska, Hedelin was largely responsible for keeping all-Big Ten defensive end Randy Gregory out of the backfield, and limited him to just four total tackles, none for loss.

TURNOVERS = TOUCHDOWNS

- Purdue has forced 15 turnovers this season and has made the most of them.
- The Boilermakers scored a touchdown after each of the first seven takeaways they had this season, including a pick-six against Iowa, and had scored a touchdown after nine of the first 10 takeaways, and added one field goal.
- Prior to the Nebraska game, the only turnover that Purdue had not turn into points was an interception in the end zone against Illinois, which the Boilermakers subsequently knelt down twice to end the game.
- In week one, Frankie Williams returned an interception inside the five against Western Michigan, which led to a Danny Etling rushing touchdown.
- In week two against Central Michigan, Ja'Whaun Bentley's 44-yard interception return set up an Austin Appleby touchdown pass to Danny Anthrop one play later.
- In week three against Notre Dame, Antoine Lewis' forced fumble and Jalani Phillips' recovery led to a Danny Etling touchdown pass to DeAngelo Yancey three plays later.
- Against Southern Illinois, Purdue forced a first quarter fumble, which led to an Etling 10-yard touchdown pass to Yancey.
- Purdue then forced an interception in the same quarter against Southern Illinois, as Landon Feichter picked off a pass. One play later, Etling hit Danny Anthrop for a 44-yard touchdown strike.
- Against Iowa, Frankie Williams picked off a pass in the first quarter and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown for the game's first points.
- At Illinois, Williams recovered a fumble. Two plays later, Austin Appleby hit Danny Anthrop for an 80-yard touchdown.
- Feichter intercepted an Illinois pass in the end zone with less than two minutes left in the game. The Boilermakers knelt down from the 20-yard line twice to end the game.
- Against Michigan State, Williams intercepted Connor Cook and returned it 24 yards to the Purdue 40. Four plays later, Akeem Hunt sprinted 52-yards on fourth and two to score a touchdown.
- Against Minnesota, Purdue turned a Ja'Whaun Bentley fumble recovery into a chip-shot field goal by Paul Griggs.
- At Nebraska, Purdue had a takeaway on a strange play where Austin Appleby was picked off, before Danny Anthrop forced a fumble, which was recovered by Dan Monteroso. A few plays later, Austin Appleby rushed 25 yards for a touchdown.
- Landon Feichter had two interceptions against Nebraska, but Purdue was not able to score after either of them.
- Against Wisconsin, Feichter had a fumble recovery, which Purdue turned into a field goal, and an interception, which the Boilermakers were unable to score.
- All four times Purdue has not scored off a takeaway this season were after Feichter interceptions.
- Conversely, Purdue has turned the ball over 15 times this season and has held its opponents to 34 points off those miscues, with two field goals and four touchdowns.
- Purdue's defense has held tough after turnovers, holding the opponents to just two field goals and two touchdowns, as the other two touchdowns came on turnover returns for scores.

BABY BOILERS

- Purdue ranks seventh in the country in terms of most underclassmen (Fr., R-Fr., So., R-So.) in fall training camps. 70 of the 101 players in Purdue's camp were sophomores or younger.
- Sophomore DeAngelo Yancey led the team in receiving yards with 546 as a true freshman in 2013. His total ranked 13th among freshmen in FBS.
- Yancey was sixth among freshmen in FBS with 49.6 receiving yards per game.
- The Boilers return 35 players who have made at least one start in their career heading into the season.
- Of the 35, 20 have at least one more year of eligibility remaining.
- Purdue's three scholarship quarterbacks are all sophomores or younger.
- Four of Purdue's top seven receivers this season have at least one year of eligibility remaining (Danny Anthrop, B.J. Knauf DeAngelo Yancey and Cameron Posey).
- Four of Purdue's nine interceptions this season are by players with remaining eligibility, with junior Frankie Williams (3 picks) and freshman Ja'Whaun Bentley.

WILLIAMS DOES IT ALL

- Junior Frankie Williams switched to safety in the offseason, after playing his first two years at cornerback.
- In his first game at his new position in the first week, Williams recorded the games only turnover with an interception in the second quarter, setting up a Purdue touchdown three plays later.
- Williams also had two huge pass breakups in the final four plays, including on fourth down, securing the win for Purdue.
- Williams recovered a fumble against Illinois.
- Williams has also made a name for himself as a nationally ranked punt returner.
- Through the first 10 games, Williams has eight returns for 136 yards, a 17.0-yard average.
- Williams is second on the team with three interceptions this season and 119 return yards, including a touchdown against Iowa.

ROSS-ADE STADIUM UPDATES

- Ross-Ade Stadium has a new look this year, after taking out 5,264 seats in the south end zone.
- The bleachers, which had been modified from Lambert Fieldhouse, were in need of repair, but with future plans for a permanent structure, it was decided to remove them during the first and second week of July.
- The new South End Zone Patio is a temporary design, ahead of a final major renovation plan that is yet to be finalized for the coming years.
- The patio is available to football season-ticket holders and Purdue students who have purchased the VIP Card. It will open one and a half hours before kickoff and close at the end of the game.
- Anchored by a 3,200-square-foot high-peak tent, the space will also feature several pergolas and an array of patio-style furniture, including tables with umbrellas.
- Fans are able to purchase typical tailgate food and beverage, including beer and wine. Six 46-inch televisions will be mounted throughout.
- Week one against Western Michigan drew rave reviews from the fans about the patio setup.
- Space is limited to 1,500 fans at a time.

NATION'S BIGGEST, NATION'S FASTEST

- Purdue guard Corey Clements is the largest player in FBS football for the 2014 season.
- The junior, in his first year at Purdue, checks in at 6'8" and 400 pounds. No other player in FBS is as big as Clements.
- Raheem Mostert is widely considered the fastest man in college football.
- After winning the Big Ten Championship in the indoor 60-meter and 200-meter dashes, and outdoor 100-meter and 200-meter dashes on the track, Mostert was a Second Team All-American in 100m, 4x100m relay and both indoor events, while picking up Honorable Mention honors in the outdoor 200m.
- Mostert had a season-best 10.15-seconds time in the 100m dash, and was thus tabbed college football's fastest player by NFL.com. His time was the fastest track time by a football player in 2013-14.

TWO-SPORT STAR

- Raheem Mostert has showed his speed on the gridiron on kick returns and on the track as a four-time Big Ten Champion.
- The senior running back competed in track as a freshman in 2012 and finished fourth in the 60m dash at the Big Ten Championships, before returning to spring practice.
- After sitting out the 2013 track seasons with an injury, Mostert returned bigger, stronger and faster.
- Mostert won the 60-meter dash and 200-meter dash at the Indoor Big Ten Championships, the 60-meter in a school-record time of 6.63 seconds and the 200m in a Big Ten Championships-record time of 20.73 seconds.
- He also ran the anchor leg of the school's 4x400m relay team which finished sixth, which earned him 23 of the team's 61 points.
- Mostert advanced to the Indoor NCAA Championships and was Second Team All-America in the 60m and 200m.
- After this year's spring football, Mostert was back on the track for his first career outdoor track season. He won the Big Ten Championship in the 100-meter and 200-meter dash, and earned a silver medal in the 4x100m after bringing the relay team from fifth to second in his final leg. The relay team was 0.01 of a second off another gold medal.
- Mostert also ran the anchor leg of the 4x400m relay, on the same day as his other three events, and helped the team take fourth.
- Mostert earned 33 of the team's 79 points at the outdoor conference championships.
- Mostert advanced through the NCAA East Preliminary Round to the NCAA Championships in a team-best three events, the 100m, 200m and 4x100m.
- At the Outdoor NCAA Championships, Mostert was Second Team All-American in the 4x100m and 100m, and was Honorable Mention in the 200m.
- Mostert had personal bests of: 6.63 seconds in the 60m, 10.15 seconds in the 100m and 20.65 seconds in the 200m.
- Mostert was named the Big Ten Male Track Athlete of the Big Ten Championships during both indoor and outdoor seasons.
- Mostert was tabbed the Great Lakes Region Men's Track Athlete of the Year after the outdoor season.
- In football, Mostert was the NCAA Statistical Champion in kickoff return average as a freshman, with 33.5 yards per return.
- Mostert has returned two kickoffs for touchdowns in his career, including a 100-yarder at Penn State last year.
- Mostert has 500 rushing yards, 107 receiving yards and 649 kickoff return yards this season.
- Mostert had his second 100-yard rushing game of the season, and his career, at Minnesota with five carries for 115 yards and a touchdown.

- Mostert also had over 100 yards in kickoff returns, which made him the first Boilermaker with 100+ yards in two statistical categories, other than passing, since Dorian Bryant in 2009.
- Mostert was named to the Hornung Award Honor Roll for his efforts against Minnesota.
- Mostert is now the all-time Purdue career leading in kickoff return yards with 2,207 - a total that is 82 yards better than Dorian Bryant who previously held the record.

WATCH LISTED

- Four Boilermakers were named to preseason watch lists for the 2014 season and one was added to a midseason watch list.
- Senior Akeem Hunt was named to the Paul Hornung Award (most versatile player) list for the second year in a row.
- Junior Robert Kugler was named to the Rimington Award (nation's top center) list.
- Hunt and senior defensive end Ryan Russell were named to the Senior Bowl watch list.
- Justin Sinz was named to the Mackey Award midseason watchlist for the nation's top tight end.
- Sinz is one of 33 on the list.
- The senior has had at least one reception in all seven games this season.

CAPTAINS' CORNER

- The team voted for captains on Aug. 21 and named Robert Kugler, Sean Robinson, Ryan Russell and Justin Sinz the leaders of the 2014 squad.
- The captains could only be chosen from upperclassmen.

DANGEROUS DUO

- Akeem Hunt and Raheem Mostert are one of the most electric running back and kick return duos in the country.
- Mostert rushed for 146 yards on 22 carries, 6.6 avg., in his first career start against Western Michigan.
- Hunt complimented nicely with 78 yards on 15 carries, 5.2 avg., and had two catches for seven yards in that game. He also returned two kickoffs for 43 yards.
- Raheem Mostert's 146 rushing yards was the 19th-best total in week one and the fifth best in the Big Ten.
- Purdue has had six 100-yard kickoff returns for a touchdown in program history and Hunt and Mostert both have one.
- Each player has two kickoff returns for a touchdown in his career.
- Hunt currently ranks third in Purdue history in career kickoff return yards with 1,747, while Mostert is first with 2,207.
- Mostert was the NCAA FBS return leader as a freshman in 2011 with a 33.5 yards per return average (25-837). He had four returns of 71 yards or more, including a 99-yard touchdown against Western Michigan in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl.
- The two have combined for 1,218 of Purdue's 1,597 rushing yards and 386 receiving yards.

BOILERMAKER DEPOT

- For all information regarding the activities on campus during game week, fans have a one-stop spot for it all.
- The "Boilermaker Depot" lists all the happenings on and around campus for the excitement leading up to each big game.
- It can be accessed by going to BoilermakerDepot.com.

IRON MEN

- Senior defensive end Ryan Russell has started 45 career games during his career, including all 10 this season.
- Senior safety Taylor Richards has 30 career starts, including five this year.
- Junior safety Frankie Williams has started 25 games, including 11 last season.
- Junior cornerback Anthony Brown has started 20 consecutive games heading into Saturday.
- Junior center Robert Kugler has started 29 consecutive games.
- Senior tight end Justin Sinz has 19 career starts, including 10 last year.
- Senior Gabe Holmes has started at least two games each of the four years he has been at Purdue and has 18 for his career.
- Sophomore Jason King has made 15 consecutive starts at left guard.
- Purdue's offensive line has stayed nearly intact this season, with Kugler, King, Jordan Roos, Cameron Cermin and J.J. Prince all starting five of 10 games. David Hedelin started at left tackle the last five games.

AIR DEFENSE

- Despite losing the No. 2 all-time interception leader in program history in Ricardo Allen to the NFL, the Boilermaker secondary is one of the most experienced units on the team.
- Junior safety Frankie Williams has 24 starts under his belt and has appeared in all 33 games of his career. Williams has seven interceptions in his career, including one in week one against Western Michigan, one against Iowa which he returned for a touchdown, and one against Michigan State.
- Williams returned his second quarter interception 56 yards to the 4-yard line, which set up a Purdue touchdown against Western Michigan.
- Senior safety Landon Feichter has made 26 career starts, despite missing six games a year ago with an injury. Feichter has 10 career interceptions, including three in the last two games.
- Feichter now ranks tied for ninth all-time in Purdue history for career interceptions, and is one shy of a tie for third all-time.
- Feichter's five this season tie him for eighth in Purdue history for most in a season.

- Junior cornerback Anthony Brown has started 20-straight games and has appeared in 31 games during his career. Brown led the team in tackles last year with 69 stops.
- Senior cornerback Antoine Lewis has started 10 career games and has appeared in 38 games. Lewis has two career interceptions and forced fumbles against Notre Dame and Central Michigan.
- Sophomore safety Austin Logan appeared in 11 games last year and had an interception.
- Sophomore cornerback Leroy Clark appeared in 11 games last year, including two starts. He has started the last two games.

YOUNG QBs

- The Boilermakers have three scholarship quarterbacks and four total, and all are freshmen or sophomores.
- Purdue's quarterbacks had combined for nine career appearances and seven starts, the 15th-most inexperienced group in FBS, heading into the season.
- Danny Etling has started 12 games, and has 13 career appearances.
- Austin Appleby has seven career appearances, including his first career start in Purdue's win at Illinois on Oct. 4.

VERY YOUNG O-LINE

- The Boilermakers have the ninth-least experienced offensive line returning from last season.
- The hog mollies return to the 2014 season with a combined 30 career starts among them, including 19 from junior center Robert Kugler, from last season.
- J.J. Prince and Cameron Cermin made their first career starts in the season-opener against Western Michigan.
- All of the starting linemen have eligibility left after this season, including King, Roos, Prince and Cermin who are all sophomores.
- Junior transfer David Hedelin made his Purdue debut against Southern Illinois, and made his first start at Illinois.

RECEIVING EXPERIENCE

- The Boilermakers return the vast majority of their receptions from last season.
- Purdue ranks ninth in the country for the highest percentage of receptions returning from last season.
- The group returns 86.4 percent of its receptions last year (203 of 235).
- New Big Ten member Maryland leads FBS, returning 93.5 percent of its receptions from 2013 (215 of 230).

"211 SESSION"

- The football team brings back the 211 Session for the second-straight year.
- The 211 session is a major pep rally hosted inside Mackey Arena before all home games.
- The event begins two hours and 11 minutes prior to kickoff and features the "All-American" Marching Band, head coach Darrell Hazell, the team, cheerleaders and Purdue Pete.
- The event is designed for fans to have a personal connection with the team and create tremendous excitement heading into the game.
- The session is named such because at 211° water is hot, but at 212° water boils and produces steam, which can power an engine. The excitement from the event will help the atmosphere "rise one degree" and make Ross-Ade Stadium, nicknamed "The Furnace," a very difficult place for opponents to play.

WILLIAMS AND MOSTERT NAMED TO HORNUNG HONOR ROLL

- Purdue safety Frankie Williams was one of four players - two offensive and two defensive - named to the Honor Roll after the first week.
- The Hornung Honor Roll is for players who make a game-changing play.
- It recognizes versatile, single-game performances in FBS.
- Williams had an interception and returned it 56 yards to the Western Michigan 4-yard line, which set up a Purdue touchdown three plays later in the first week.
- Williams also had two pass breakups in Western Michigan's final offensive series of the game.
- Williams returned two punts for 27 and 36 yards.
- Williams finished with seven tackles.
- UCLA's defensive back Ishmael Adams, Georgia running back Todd Gurley and Stanford wide receiver Ty Montgomery were the other honorees.
- Raheem Mostert was named to the list after Purdue's game against Minnesota where he had over 100 yards rushing and in kickoff return yards.

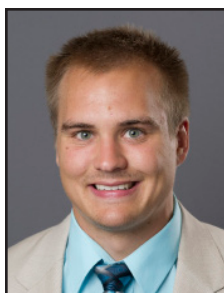

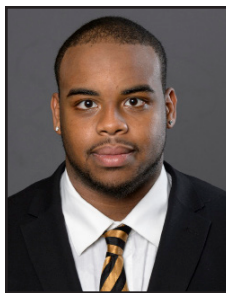
