JONES LEADS DORES

Sophomore post player Damian Jones is off to a great start to his sophomore campaign, averaging 17.7 points and 7.9 rebounds per game in six early contests. Jones, a preseason All-SEC First Team selection by the league's coaches, has scored 20+ points in four games this year and leads the SEC in field goal percentage (.611). Jones is 3rd in the SEC in scoring 4th in rebounding, 5th in blocks (1.7), 4th in defensive rebounding (5.1/game), and 7th in offensive rebounding (2.7).

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 903 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

COACH **STALLINGS IN 16TH** YEAR

Head Coach Kevin Stallings, the school's all-time winningest coach, is in his 16th season with the Commodores and 21st overall as a head coach. Stallings has 297 career wins at Vanderbilt and 420 overall as a head coach. He has seven 20-win seasons in the last 10 seasons, with six NCAA tournament appearances and two Sweet 16's (2004 and 2007). Against Tennessee State earlier this year, he won his 200th career game at Memorial Gym.

STALLINGS **FACING** ALMA MATER

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings played three seasons at Purdue under Coach Keady (1980-82) and helped lead the Boilermakers to the NCAA Final Four in 1980. He was also an assistant at Purdue under Keady from 1983-1988. His only time facing Purdue came when he was the head coach at Illinois State in a 69-55 loss at Purdue on December 8, 1998.



STRONG EARLY PERIMETER PLAY	The freshman trio of Wade Baldwin IV, Riley LaChance, and Shelton Mitchell have combined for 87 assists and only 33 turnovers in their first seven games.
BALDWIN WINS FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK	Guard Wade Baldwin IV won his first SEC Freshman of the Week honor for his performance in wins over Lipscomb and Tenn. State. The 6'3 guard from Belle Mead, N.J., averaged 9.5 points, 7.5 assists, 6.0 rebounds, and 1.5 steals in the two Vanderbilt wins. He also posted 10 assists in the win over TSU. Baldwin is 3rd in the SEC in assists (5.6) and 2nd in A/TO ratio (3.0).
DORES AMONG SEC LEADERS	The Commodores lead the SEC in FG% with 49.3%. VU is 2nd in assists (17.3), and 3rd in scoring defense (58.0), and 3-Pt FG% (37.4%)
SEC'S YOUNGEST BACK COURT	The Commodores' freshman backcourt is the youngest in the SEC. In fact, Vanderbilt is the only school in the league to start three freshmen at the three guard spots.

RECAP

NASHVILLE (AP) - Baylor's 3-point shooters were too much for Vanderbilt on Thursday night.

The Bears made 10 of 18 shots from beyond the 3-point arc, leading Baylor to a 66-63 win over Vanderbilt in the Big 12/SEC Challenge at Memorial Gym.

Baylor forward Royce O'Neale scored 22 points and Taurean Prince added 19. O'Neale made four 3-pointers and Prince added three.

"I think our guys really did a great job of sharing the ball and making the extra pass," Bears coach Scott Drew said. "And at the end of the day, shooting open shots is better than contested ones."

O'Neale, a 6-foot-6 forward, made 9 of 11 from the floor, including 4 of 5 from beyond the 3-point stripe.

"We just did a good job of focusing on the rim and knocking down shots, especially Royce O'Neale," said Prince, a 6-7 senior.

Baylor (7-1) recorded its second road win over an SEC opponent, including a victory at South Carolina two weeks ago.

Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings had a simple explanation for Baylor's success beyond the 3-point stripe.

"Mostly dribble penetration, breaking us down off the dribble and kicking it so we've got some lessons to learn about what it takes to be a good college perimeter defender," Stallings said. "It's hard to guard guys in college when they're skilled and fast, let alone if they're big and fast. We were at a size disadvantage and a quickness disadvantage at a few positions tonight." Baylor has the Big 12's best record in conference challenge games at 5-1. Vanderbilt's Damian Jones made two free throws to narrow the deficit to 65-63 with 15 seconds left.

Baylor's Lester Medford hit 1 of 2 free throws to increase the Bears' lead to 66-63 with 14.4 seconds left.

Vanderbilt's Riley LaChance missed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 1 second left as the ball bounced off the glass.

James Siakam's layup narrowed Baylor's lead to 61-59 with 1:41 left, but he couldn't convert the three-point play after missing a foul shot.

"Every time I go in I try to feed off (the crowd's) energy and try to encourage my teammates," said Siakam, who scored 12 points. "I think the bench was incredible."

Jones, who entered the game as the Southeastern Conference's fourth-leading scorer, led Vanderbilt with 21 points. Luke Kornet, a 7-foot sophomore forward, added 13.

Vanderbilt made a 15-8 run in the second half to narrow Baylor's lead to 51-50.

A put-back by Siakam gave Vanderbilt its first lead, 54-53, since early in the game, prompting Baylor coach Scott Drew to call a timeout with 6:10 left.

Prince hit two free throws to put Baylor back on top, 55-54. with 5:22 left.

Vanderbilt cut the deficit to 48-46 with 9:33 left, but Al Freeman hit a 3-pointer to put Baylor up by five.

Baylor broke a 12-all tie with an 8-0 run to take control in the first half, and the Bears stretched their advantage to 34-25 by halftime.

Prince led the way in the early going with 13 points in the first half and O'Neale added 12.

Baylor hit 6 of its first 12 shots from beyond the 3-point arc.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 63RD SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 63rd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.



VANDERBILT BASKETBALL QUICK HITTERS

- This is the 112th year of Vanderbilt basketball, with the first season taking place in 1900-01. There were no teams in 1904-05 and 1905-06.
- The Commodores have been to 13 NCAA Tournaments and 11 NIT's. Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite 8 in 1965 (field of 23), and the Sweet 16 in 1988, 1993, 2004, and 2007. The Commodores captured the NIT Championship in 1990 and finished runner-up in 1994.
- The Commodores are a charter member of the SEC, with the 2013-14 season being the 80th year in the conference.
- Vanderbilt is the only private institution in the SEC with the lowest enrollment of any of the 14 schools (6,738).
- Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace became the first African-American scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court in 1967.
- The Commodores have 43 career 1,000-point scorers, with Shan Foster (2004-08) the all-time leading scorer with 2.011 career points.
- Vanderbilt has had 12 All-Americans since 1950. They are: Billy Joe Adcock (1950), Clyde Lee (1965), Tom Hagan (1969), Jan van Breda Kolff (1974), Will Perdue (1988), Billy McCaffrey (1993), Dan Langhi (2000), Matt Freije (2004), Derrick Byars (2007), Shan Foster (2008), and John Jenkins (2011).
- The Commodores had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft John Jenkins, Atlanta, 23rd pick, Festus Ezeli, Golden State, 30th pick, Jeffery Taylor, Charlotte, 31st pick the most by the Commodores in one draft. In all, 35 Vanderbilt players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1950.
- The Commodores ended a 61-year SEC Tournament drought in 2012 by claiming the tournament championship in New Orleans, the team's first SEC championship since 1951.
- Coach Stallings is the winningest coach in Vanderbilt history after surpassing legendary mentor Roy Skinner on November 15, 2013, against Lipscomb.
- Stallings has led his Commodore teams to 10 postseason tournaments since his arrival in 1999 and has had seven 20+-win seasons. His 2004 and 2007 teams advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament expanded to 64+ teams.
- Stallings has appeared in the NCAA Tournament six times, including a stretch of three consecutive appearances from 2010-2012. It was the first time in school history that Vanderbilt has advanced to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.
- All three of the university's top all-time scorers played for Coach Stallings (Foster, Jeffery Taylor, Matt Freije). John Jenkins, who is 10th on the list, also played for him.
- Vanderbilt's intercollegiate athletics teams are nicknamed the Commodores, in honor of the nickname given to founder Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his fortune in shipping. Vanderbilt donated \$1 million to begin "Central University" in 1875 - the campus was later renamed for Cornelius because of his generosity. Cornelius never stepped foot on the campus that bears his namesake.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt dominated the second half en route to an 83-56 season-opening win over Trevecca

Damian Jones scored a career-high 24 points, while freshman Riley LaChance added 13 and Luke Kornet scored 10 to lead Vanderbilt.

Jones, a preseason All-SEC first-team selection, was 10 of 13 from the field and grabbed 12 rebounds as Vanderbilt (1-0) overwhelmed Trevecca (1-1), which is transitioning to NCAA Division II.

Trevecca managed to keep it close trailing 33-30 at the half, but Vanderbilt opened the second half on a 13-0 run, which included a couple spectacular dunks by Jones.

Three freshmen, including LaChance, started for Vanderbilt, which is in a major rebuilding mode. The team had only seven scholarship players a year ago and must now rely heavily on a rotation of five freshmen.

"There's going to be some inconsistencies with us,' said Stallings. "I would like to think, in my more rational moments, that I would know that part of that is having a team as young as our team is."

Jones, a sophomore from Baton Rouge, La., will be asked to lead the Commodores and that's what he did against overmatched Trevecca, which is about a 15 minute drive from Vanderbilt.

Stallings knows that Jones will have be the one that guides his young squad.

"We need him to be a guy that can lead us and his play inspires confidence throughout the rest of our team," Stallings said. "His play today did that. Let's see it happen against guys that look more like him, play more like him, and are more his level of ability."

Jalen Palm led the Trojans with 11 points.

Vanderbilt was able to dominate inside as Trevecca didn't have an answer for Jones or Kornet, who finished with 10 rebounds. The sophomores blocked four shots apiece and altered several others.

NASHVILLE - Damian Jones started strong and finished strong - just what Vanderbilt needed.

The 6-foot-10 center scored 21 points and had six rebounds, leading the Commodores to a 72-62 win over Lipscomb.

"We better have that card to play or we're going to have some trouble on nights," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "We were able to get him the ball and he made some nice moves. He made a nice jump shot out there on the perimeter, which he's worked hard on and been excited to break out."

Stallings has high hopes for Jones, a preseason All-Southeastern Conference selection.

"He's really tough and he's proven that at the highest level," Lipscomb coach Casey Alexander said. "You just can't let him inch his way closer to the rim. He's going to catch it and they do a lot of good stuff to get him the ball at the optimal spot."

Jones hit 8 of 15 from the floor and 5 of 7 from the foul line.

"We have a lot of plays set up to get the ball to me in the post," Jones said. "It keeps me going, it keeps my energy high always getting me the ball."

Luke Kornet and Wade Baldwin IV added 11 points each for the Commodores.

Lipscomb (1-2) narrowed the deficit to 52-49 on Martin Smith's foul shot with 10:08 left, but Vanderbilt's Jeff Roberson and Baldwin answered with back-to-back 3-pointers to ignite a 13-2 run as the Commodores pulled away

Lipscomb's Josh Williams was held to 12 points, 10.5 below his average.

J.C. Hampton led Lipscomb with 13 points.

The Commodores (2-0) started three freshmen and two sophomores against the Bisons, members of the Atlantic Sun Conference.

Vanderbilt dominated inside, outscoring Lipscomb 30-18 in the paint.

Vanderbilt took charge quickly with a 16-1 run that gave the Commodores a 19-6 lead as Lipscomb went over 7 minutes without a field goal.

Vanderbilt's James Siakam had six rebounds and two points after missing the season-opening win over Trevecca to attend his father's funeral in Cameroon.

Lipscomb shot just 33.3 percent from the floor.

NASHVILLE - Damian Jones was Vanderbilt's most dangerous offensive weapon in the Commodores' first two games, but a new force appeared vs. Tennessee State.

Luke Kornet made his first nine shots from the floor en route to a career-high 24-point night, leading Vanderbilt to a 78-46 win over Tennessee State in the first round of the Barclays Center Classic.

The 7-foot forward didn't miss a shot until he bounced a 3-pointer off the front of the rim with 12:45 left.

He tied a Memorial Gym record for highest field goal percentage, 90.9, by hitting shot 10 of 11, including three 3-pointers. Jeff Taylor also hit 10 of 11 against TSU on Dec. 19, 2009.

"Once you just see the ball go in a couple of times, you'll start feeling a little bit of a rhythm to it and that's what happened tonight," Kornet said. "Once I stepped out and shot the first 3, I had a really good feeling that it was going to go in."

With Kornet playing so well, the Commodores (3-0) didn't need much from Damian Jones, who entered the game as the Southeastern Conference's leading scorer at 22.5 points per game. The 6-10 sophomore scored 13 points after scoring 20-plus in his first two games.

"They were in zone a lot in the first half and we put our two big guys down low," Commodores coach Kevin Stallings said. "Damian probably got Luke some shots just by his mere presence because I'm sure the defense kind of shades over to him."

Kornet was perfect in the first half, making all six of his shots from the floor and his only foul shot for 14 points

Many fans in the crowd of 7,446 yelled "Luuuke" when he drained a 3-pointer from the corner to give the Commodores a 38-20 lead with 3 seconds left in the first half.

Kornet's first three baskets were dunks. His father, Frank, played at Vanderbilt from 1986-89.

Kornet powered Vanderbilt to a 15-6 lead in the early

Kornet also had seven rebounds and two blocked shots. He has made 14 of his last 17 shots, including Thursday's win over Lipscomb. Jones had eight rebounds and two blocks.

Riley LaChance also scored 13 for the Commodores.

No one from the Tigers (2-2) scored in double figures as they shot 32.7 percent from the floor. Vanderbilt hit 60.9 percent from the floor.

TSU narrowed the deficit to 26-20 before the Commodores closed the first half with a 12-0 run. They extended it to 15-0 when Jones converted a three-point play early in the second half.

Wade Baldwin IV led the Commodores with 10 assists and Shelton Mitchell added seven.

Vanderbilt made nine 3-pointers in a 63-53 win over Norfolk State in the preliminary round of the Barclays Center Classic.

The Commodores have made at least one 3-pointer in 900 consecutive games, dating back to the inception of the shot in 1986.

UNLV and Princeton are the only other college teams to make a 3-pointer in every game since the shot was implemented.

Freshmen guards Riley LaChance and Wade Baldwin IV led Vanderbilt with three 3-pointers apiece. Baldwin led four Commodores in double figures with 13 points.

LaChance added 12 and Matthew Fisher-Davis and James Siakam 11 each.

Vanderbilt is off to a 4-0 start for the first time since 2007 when it opened with 16 straight wins.

The Commodores, one of the top shooting teams in the Southeastern Conference, hit 44 percent. They cooled off in the second half after hitting 63.2 percent in the first 20 minutes.

Norfolk State (2-3), a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference member, struggled offensively, hitting 32.1 from the floor. Jeff Short was held to five points, 12.3 below his average, as he hit 2 of 11 from the floor.

D'Shon Taylor led the Spartans with 19 points and Malik Thomas added 13.

Vanderbilt's Damian Jones, who entered the game as the Southeastern Conference's second-leading scorer at 19.3 points per game, scored six points. Teammate Luke Kornet, who scored a career-high 24 points in Sunday's win over Tennessee State, had a quiet night with five points.

Norfolk State jumped out to an 11-8 lead before Vanderbilt answered with a 12-0 run to take a 20-11 advantage.

It was the Commodores' first game against a team outside of Nashville after opening up at home against Trevecca, Lipscomb and Tennessee State.

The prescription, according to Rutgers Eddie Jordan, was a win.

Mack scored 10 of his 21 points in the second half, and Jack added 20 points and eight rebounds to lead Rutgers to a 68-65 win over Vanderbilt in the first semifinal of the Barclays Center Classic.

"Both of these guys are battling some physical issues," Jordan said. "Myles had a serious toothache all day today, probably still has it. We had to rush him to the dentist and Kadeem is still recovering from his thumb and his conditioning. So what they did today was remarkable."

Mike Williams and Junior Etou had 11 and 10 for the Scarlet Knights (3-2), who bounced back from a 68-50 loss to St. Peter's Tuesday night.

Vanderbilt (4-1) lost for the first time in the 2014-15 campaign. Damian Jones led the Commodores with 23 points. Luke Kornet had 14 points and James Siakam added 10

The Commodores had three chances to win late in regulation, but Shelton Mitchell missed a driving layup and Siakam couldn't convert the putback. Following an inbounds, Mitchell had the ball stolen by Mack, who was fouled by Matthew Fisher-Davis. Mack made one of two free throws, and Rutgers knocked away the inbounds pass to seal the win.

"We talked about several things we did not accomplish," Stallings said. "We came out of timeouts on four occasions where we made a call and messed it up. That shouldn't be the case. We didn't play well enough to win.

"That is my biggest source of disappointment."

The first ever matchup between the SEC and Big 10 programs was an evenly contested affair throughout, with the biggest advantage for either team being Rutgers' 29-18 lead in the first half. Vanderbilt's 13-2 run in the final 6:12 of the first half forced a 31-31 tie at halftime. Jones and Siakam combined for 11 of the Commodores' 13 points in the surge.

BROOKLYN, N.Y. - To hear Kevin Stallings tell it, Damian Jones may be Vanderbilt's most indispensable player.

La Salle may agree with his viewpoint.

Jones' 16 points led four players in double-figure as Vanderbilt topped La Salle 68-55 in the consolation game of the Barclays Center Classic.

"Damian was pretty effective," Stallings said. "I thought he was very, very effective especially early on when we were able to take control of the game. He's getting better and better. The better he gets, of course the better it will be for our team."

Riley LaChance had 14, and Luke Kornet and James Siakam added 10 apiece as Vanderbilt improved to 5-1.

La Salle's Jarrell Wright led all scorers with 19 points, but the Explorers fell to 4-2 with their second loss in as many games. Steve Zack added 11 points.

"We need to get better," La Salle coach Dr. John Giannini said. "We came here to be tested and frankly we failed our test this weekend."

Vanderbilt turned its 30-20 halftime lead into a 17-point advantage (45-28) after Kornet's left-wing 3 4:14 into the second half. La Salle wouldn't get closer than 12 the rest of the way despite shooting 43.1 percent from the field.

Among the primary reasons was the Commodores proficiency from the foul line. Vanderbilt made six-of-nine from the stripe in the second half, including making five in the final 3:36. The Commodores finished 12-of-16 from the line

Wade Baldwin IV made five-of-six from the line for Vanderbilt. Jones was four-for-five, while Jeff Roberson was three-for-four.

By comparison, La Salle was only 7-for-11 from the line.

Vanderbilt also took care of the ball, committing just seven turnovers while recording 14 assists on 26 baskets. Baldwin and Shelton Mitchell tied La Salle's D.J. Peterson with a game-high four assists.

But La Salle committed 10 turnovers against 11 assists.

NASHVILLE - Baylor's 3-point shooters were too much for Vanderbilt.

The Bears made 10 of 18 shots from beyond the 3-point arc, leading Baylor to a 66-63 win over Vanderbilt in the Big 12/SEC Challenge at Memorial Gym.

Baylor forward Royce O'Neale scored 22 points and Taurean Prince added 19. O'Neale made four 3-pointers and Prince added three.

O'Neale, a 6-foot-6 forward, made 9 of 11 from the floor, including 4 of 5 from beyond the 3-point stripe.

Baylor (7-1) recorded its second road win over an SEC opponent, including a victory at South Carolina two weeks ago.

Vanderbilt's Damian Jones made two free throws to narrow the deficit to 65-63 with 15 seconds left.

Baylor's Lester Medford hit 1 of 2 free throws to increase the Bears' lead to 66-63 with 14.4 seconds left.

Vanderbilt's Riley LaChance missed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 1 second left as the ball bounced off the glass.

James Siakam's layup narrowed Baylor's lead to 61-59 with 1:41 left, but he couldn't convert the three-point play after missing a foul shot.

Jones, who entered the game as the Southeastern Conference's fourth-leading scorer, led Vanderbilt with 21 points. Luke Kornet, a 7-foot sophomore forward, added 13.

Vanderbilt made a 15-8 run in the second half to narrow Baylor's lead to 51-50.

A put-back by Siakam gave Vanderbilt its first lead, 54-53, since early in the game, prompting Baylor coach Scott Drew to call a timeout with 6:10 left.

Prince hit two free throws to put Baylor back on top, 55-54, with 5:22 left.

Vanderbilt cut the deficit to 48-46 with 9:33 left, but Al Freeman hit a 3-pointer to put Baylor up by five.

Baylor broke a 12-all tie with an 8-0 run to take control in the first half, and the Bears stretched their advantage to 34-25 by halftime.

Prince led the way in the early going with 13 points in the first half and O'Neale added 12.

Baylor hit 6 of its first 12 shots from beyond the 3-point arc.






