BOILERMAKERS TRAVEL TO LOUISVILLE FOR LONE NONCONFERENCE ROAD GAME

• After opening the season with home victories against Toledo and Eastern Illinois, Purdue travels to Louisville for the lone road game of the nonconference portion of its regular-season schedule. The Boilermakers are idle Sunday but have a busy stretch on tap next week, including three games in five days. Purdue opens its six-game homestand Aug. 29 against Butler.

• The Boilermakers opened the season 2-0 for the fourth time in program history and for the first time since 2009. The 2000 and 2004 teams also won their first two games of the season. The win over Toledo Aug. 17 allowed Purdue to improve to 9-5-1 in season openers all-time and 7-3-1 in season openers at home.

HAIRSTON'S GOLDEN GOAL LIFTS PURDUE TO FIRST OVERTIME WIN SINCE 2009

• **Alex Hairston** scored in the 106th minute of double overtime to propel Purdue to an overtime win against Eastern Illinois Aug. 22. It was the Boilers' first overtime win since November 2009, the regular-season finale against Iowa. Purdue had gone 0-4-4 in its eight games longer than 90 minutes since. All eight overtime affairs had been at home.

• An own goal was the difference in Purdue's last overtime win. Sylvia Forbes' golden goal four days earlier in an overtime victory at Indiana was the last of its kind credited to a Purdue player.

TWO GOALS IN SCHOOL-RECORD TIME

• **Alex Hairston** and **Hadley Stuart** scored 48 seconds apart in the second half to help Purdue defeat Toledo in shutout fashion in a season opener for the second year in a row. The 48 seconds elapsed represents the shortest amount of time between goals in program history. The previous program record for the shortest amount of time between two goals both scored by Purdue was 55 seconds. Shauna Stapleton and current assistant coach Parrissa Eyorokon scored back-to-back in a November 2007 blowout win against Indiana.

GAME-WINNING GOALS IN BACK-TO-BACK SEASON OPENERS & FIRST TWO GAMES

• With five game-winners among her team-high eight career goals, **Alex Hairston** has had made the most of her scores. She accounted for the game-winning goal in both games of the season-opening weekend. This marks the second year in a row she has recorded the first two game-winners of a season.

• Hairston is the first player in program history to account for a game-winning goal in back-to-back season openers. She's also the first player to score in the first game of consecutive seasons since Annette Kent scored in four straight from 2000-03.

• Jessica Okoroafo was the last Boiler to score the game-winning goal in each of the first two games of the season, accomplishing the feat in 2009. Hairston joined Okoroafo as the only players in program history to account for the first two game-winning goals of a season twice in a career. But since Okoroafo did it as a freshman (2005) and senior (2009), Hairston is the first Boiler to score the first two game-winners of a season in consecutive years.

INSTANT IMPACT FROM LANCASTER & PAWLIK

• Newcomers **Emma Lancaster** (a true freshman) and **Jordan Pawlik** (a junior transfer from Louisville) both started the first two games of the new season. Both players also finished the season-opening weekend with two assists. Lancaster helped setup each of **Alex Hairston's** goals and both scores proved to be game-winners. Pawlik, meanwhile, assisted on the goals scored by Hairston and **Hadley Stuart** a program-record 48 seconds apart against Toledo. Pawlik joined **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Jordan Frick** as active Boilers with a multi-assist game during their careers.

• **Kim Love**, **Melissa Casella**, **Makaela Nellams** and **Nicole Hively** also made their Purdue debuts during the season-opening weekend. Love went the distance at center back in both games. Hively saw her first action after redshirting in 2011 with a foot injury.

WARREN, FRICK & STUART AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Team captain **Jessica Warren** and fellow upperclassmen **Jordan Frick** and **Hadley Stuart** should prove critical to Purdue women's soccer's success in 2012 as indicated by their selections among the Big Ten Players to Watch as the new season begins.

• Warren was selected as team captain in the spring. She has played in 48 consecutive games and 59 of the 61 the last three seasons. This year she'll have an opportunity of adding her name to the list of Boilers that have scored a goal in each of their four years. Warren went the distance in 10 of the 12 games in which she started at center back last season. She could return to a midfield position this year but her versatility to play in either part of the field should be beneficial.

• Frick was one of three returning Boilers to start all 20 games in 2011. She and classmate **Mollie Kuramoto**, who will miss this season due to injury, demonstrated the highest level of consistency among the sophomore field players a year ago. The suburban St. Louis native ranked second on the team in minutes played last season while serving as an outside back and corner kick specialist. She helped setup four goals and scored for the first time as Boiler.

• The first week of October will mark the two-year anniversary of Stuart suffering a torn ACL in a Purdue loss at Minnesota. After missing the final month of her freshman year, she was able to return for the entirety of the 2011 campaign, scoring three goals while primarily coming off the bench. Now fully recovered from her knee injury, Stuart could enjoy a breakout season in an attacking role this season. She had three goals in the Boilers' two organized team scrimmages this month.

NELLAMS' HAT TRICK HIGHLIGHTS PURDUE'S PRESEASON SCRIMMAGES

• Freshman **Makaela Nellams** recorded a hat trick, scoring each of her three goals in the second period and carrying the Yellow Team to a 5-4 victory in Purdue soccer's second scrimmage of the preseason Aug. 12.

• **Hadley Stuart** scored twice for the Red Team, opening the scoring with a goal in the first minute on a nice rising blast into the top 90 on the left side of the net. **Alex Hairston** (Red), **Taylor Niewoit** (Yellow) and **Jordan Pawlik** (Red) also registered goals on the night.

• Hairston, Stuart & Niewoit each scored a second-half goal for the Yellow Team in the first scrimmage Aug. 7.

HAIRSTON BACK AFTER STRONG FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN

• **Alex Hairston** started all 20 games, one of only four Boilers to do so in 2011, becoming the first freshman to start every game since 2008. She ranked second on the team with six goals and four assists. She accounted for the game-winning goal in the first two victories of the year: the season-opener at Toledo and the first home night game against Colorado. In the process, she became only the third freshman in program history to account for the team's first two game-winners.

• With her goals against Michigan State in the Big Ten opener and Iowa, Hairston joined Katie Leinert as the only players in program history to account for Purdue's first two goals of the conference season. She was also the sixth player in program history to score in her collegiate debut, as well as the fifth freshman to account for Purdue's first goal of a season.

KRIDLER BACK PROTECTING THE NET

• **Clara Kridler** returns for her junior season after starting all 20 games in goal in 2011, her first season as the starting goalkeeper. Purdue has not had the same 'keeper serve as the regular starter in back-to-back years since Jenny Bradfish from 2007-09. With senior **Yana Lyon** still in the mix and freshmen **Samantha Rosa** and **Caitlyn McCullough** on the roster as well, the Boilers have seen the size of their goalkeeper corps double from 2011 when it was just Kridler and Lyon.

• Last season Kridler became the first Purdue goalkeeper to start every game since 2008. With 92 saves, she ranked second in the Big Ten and finished only five shy of the program's single-season record. She helped Purdue shutout Toledo and Colorado in 1-0 Purdue wins and also played 70 minutes in the rainy shutout of Indiana State.

PAWLIK LOOKS TO MAKE IMPACT AS TRANSFER

• Fort Wayne native **Jordan Pawlik** transferred to Purdue at the start of the 2012 spring semester, practicing and playing with the team throughout the spring. She played her first two college seasons at Louisville, starting 35 of the 39 games in which she played.

• Pawlik Scored three goals and assisted on four others as a sophomore at Louisville in 2011. She started 19 of the 21 games while helping the Cardinals reach the NCAA Tournament. She accounted for Louisville's lone goal in an overtime home loss to Illinois and had two assists in an overtime win at Villanova.

PURDUE SOCCER 2012 SEASON PREVIEW

• Purdue's new season features not only the customary influx of new players, but also a new look for the program's home field. The recently-renovated Varsity Soccer Complex now features a variety of new amenities and the Boilers will put their new home complex on display for 13 of their 20 regular-season games this fall.

• After graduating an eight-player senior class in 2011, 16 of the 26 players on the 2012 roster are underclassmen. But Purdue does feature some experience among the returning players. The Boilermakers return seven starters, including three that started all 20 games a season ago. **Alex Hairston** scored six goals and assisted on four others as a freshman. **Jordan Frick** was a constant on the back row and setup four goals, mostly as a corner kick specialist. Goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** became the team's first 'keeper to start every game since 2008.

• Senior **Jessica Warren** has been selected as the team captain. She has an opportunity to score a goal in each of her four collegiate seasons. Warren and classmate **Marta Lynch** both demonstrated the ability to be consistent presences on the pitch last season. Warren went the distance in 10 of the 12 games she started, finally seeing her streak of 33 consecutive games started end in late September. After returning from an early-season injury, Lynch was inserted into the starting lineup beginning for the third weekend of Big Ten play. She finished the season as a starting center back, going the distance in seven of the eight games she played.

• The 2011 season was a campaign that featured plenty of high points, but also its fair share of frustrations. Purdue battled until the end, but after winning back-to-back games only once all season missed out on qualifying for the eight-team Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 1999.

• High points from 2011 included: a season-opening win against a Toledo team that qualified for the NCAA Tournament, a 1-0 victory against Colorado in the first-ever night game at the Varsity Soccer Complex, an eighth straight win against Northwestern on a very windy night on the shores of Lake Michigan, a comeback win against Ohio State in the annual special uniforms game, a program-record eight goals in the rivalry win against Indiana and rebounding from a blowout loss at Wisconsin by defeating Minnesota in St. Paul for the first time since 2005.

• But Purdue also got shutout at home three times while only posting three defensive clean-sheet efforts of its own all season. The Boilermakers went to overtime four times over a stretch of seven games in September, but were unable to record a win in any of the extra-time affairs, losing heartbreakers to USC and Kansas on consecutive Sundays. After earning 10 standings points over the course of five games to get back in the Big Ten Tournament chase, the Boilers lost their home finale to a Michigan team they were tied with in the standings entering the day.

• Fifteenth-year head coach and program architect **Robert Klatte** has said he feels the new-look Varsity Soccer Complex is now one of the top soccer facilities in the Big Ten. New locker rooms, team rooms and a pressbox highlight the building behind the team benches on the west side of the field. He geared the 2012 schedule around the idea of showing off the new complex as often as possible. Even with six of the 11 Big Ten games being on the road this season, Purdue will still play 65 percent of its game at home this fall. Eight of the nine preseason dates will be played at home, the lone exception being an Aug. 24 game at Louisville. However, six of the 13 teams that will visit West Lafayette this fall played in the 2011 NCAA Tournament.

• Lights were installed one year before the renovations at the Varsity Soccer Complex. Purdue played five night games at home in 2011. That number will increase to eight this season. The hope is the additional 7 p.m. start times will attract larger crowds and create a more advantageous home-field environment.

• In Purdue's two preseason team scrimmages, returnees **Taylor Niewoit**, **Hadley Stuart** and **Hairston** have stood out after scoring multiple goals each. Louisville transfer **Jordan Pawlik** has experience as a starter at the Division I level and made an impact for the team during the spring season.

• Among the freshmen, **Makaela Nellams** posted a hat trick in the second team scrimmage. **Jessica Bernard**, **Melissa Casella**, **Kate Fowee**, **Emma Lancaster**, **Kim Love** and goalkeeper **Samantha Rosa** were also constants on the pitch among the freshmen during the two scrimmages.

• The Boilermakers lost two-year starter **Mollie Kuramoto** to a season-ending knee injury in the spring. She'll redshirt this fall and return to the lineup as a junior in 2013. Meanwhile, **Nicole Hively** returns from a foot injury that forced the California native to redshirt as a true freshman last fall.

PURDUE'S OVERTIME WINS
