#### **BOILERMAKERS OPEN BIG TEN PLAY VERSUS BADGERS**

- Purdue welcomes Wisconsin to the Boilermaker Soccer Complex for Sunday's Big Ten opener for both sides. This will mark the fifth time in the Boilers' 15 seasons of Big Ten competition that they have drawn UW for their conference opener. It also mark the fourth in the last seven years the two teams have squared off to begin Big Ten play. Purdue is 2-0-2 in its Big Ten openers against UW.
- · Wisconsin has outscored the Boilers 9-3 while winning the last two meetings. Purdue had never before lost back-to-back games against UW. Furthermore, the Boilers had only surrendered 11 goals to Wisconsin in the first 14 meetings. Purdue had managed to shut out UW eight times in those first 14 meetings before the offensive onslaught the last two years.

#### PAWLIK'S BIG GAME LIFTS PURDUE TO OVERTIME WIN AT MIAMI

- After equalizing three times in regulation. Jordan Pawlik's golden goal in the 102nd minute gave Purdue its first lead of 11 – Marquette 10, at Purdue 1 (1998) the day as well as a 4-3 overtime win at Miami (Ohio) Sept. 10 - at Purdue 8, Indiana 2 (2011) 15. She also scored the Boilers' second goal of the game on 9 - lowa 6, at Purdue 3 (1999) a penalty kick in the 62nd minute, posting her third multi-goal and at Purdue Pawlik joined Jessica Baumhoff (2002 at game at Purdue. Purdue posted its first overtime victory since winning at 7 - on 8 other occassions Nebraska in September 2012 on a golden goal from Taylor

Niewoit, who assisted on Pawlik's game-winner at Miami. Alex Hairston (2012 vs. Eastern Illinois) has also recorded an overtime game-winner as a Boilermaker.

- Pawlik was named the Big Ten Player of the Week by CollegeSportsMadness.com and selected to CollegeSoccer360.com's Primetime Performers list. She also helped the Boilers shut out IPFW Sept. 13 while playing outside back. The senior moved up to forward midway through the first half at Miami.
- Three times this season, Purdue has been a part of games that featured seven-plus goals. In program history, the Boilers have been involved in a game that has featured seven-plus goals 19 times, compiling a 12-7 record. The Xavier game (Aug. 25) marked only the third time in program history the Boilers have scored three goals in a loss. Entering the season, Purdue had only been involved in three games in program history in which both teams scored three-plus goals. It has already happened three times this year.

#### STUART LEADING NATION IN ASSISTS

- Hadley Stuart entered the week leading the nation with eight assists. She and Alex Hairston (6) are ranked one-two in assists among the Big Ten leaders as of Sept. 18. Stuart has recorded an assist in five of the eight games. Both players have tallied a point in every game but the loss at Kansas. Maddy Williams is fourth in the Big Ten with her six goals.
- · As a team, the Boilermakers are second in the Big Ten with 26 goals as of Sept. 18. Only Illinois (28) has scored more. Purdue leads the league in assists (27) and shots (174) while ranking second in corner kicks (51).

#### MOST GOALS SCORED ENTERING BIG TEN PLAY

- The Boilermakers have scored multiple goals in seven of their first eight games of the season. With 26 SEASON goals this year, Purdue enters Big Ten play just one goal shy of its season total from 2012. The 26 goals are also a program high entering conference play.
- The eight consecutive games with a goal is Purdue's longest streak since scoring in nine straight last year The 2000 (11), 2003 (17) and 2009 (12) teams also

- · Purdue's 13 goals in the first four games this year represented a program high to begin a new season. The 20 goals in the first six games were good for second most in program history.
- The 20 goals over the first six games were the Boilers' most in any six-game stretch since scoring 22 late in the 2007 season. November 2007 also marked the last time the team scored threeplus goals in three consecutive games as well, which Purdue accomplished this year in the games against Akron (5), Xavier (3) and Northern Illinois (4).

#### HAIRSTON SCORES IN THREE STRAIGHT, BREAKS MULTI-ASSIST GAMES RECORD

- Alex Hairston has found the back of the net in the last three games, becoming the first Boiler to accomplish the feat since Kellie Phillips scored in five straight in October 2011 to tie a program record. Since 2007. Hairston is the sixth Boiler to score in at least three straight games.
- · Hairston leads active Purdue players with 14 career goals. She has started every game in her first three seasons with the program. With 14 goals in 47 games, she has managed to score in 30 percent of the games she has played. Jordan Pawlik has scored in eight of the 25 games she has played in, making her the only active Boiler with a better percentage (32%) than Hairston.

· Meanwhile, Hairston has also posted multi-assist efforts in the wins against Northern Illinois and Dartmouth. With five career multi-assist games, she has established a new Purdue all-time record.

#### FIVE DIFFERENT BOILERS SCORE IN DARTMOUTH WIN

- Purdue matched its season high with five goals in the Sept. 6 home win against Dartmouth, receiving scores from five different players. It marked the first time since October 2011 and ninth time in program history that five Boilers found the back of the net in the same game.
- Purdue actually trailed 2-1 in the 58th minute against Dartmouth. But the Boilers scored three times in just over five minutes to take control of the game. Mollie Kuramoto accounted for the equalizer in the 60th minute, Hadley Stuart provided the go-ahead goal in the 64th minute and Chinyelu Asher scored what proved to the game winner early in the 66th min-

ute to cap the wild stretch. Freshmen Maddy Williams and Mikayla Lasky also scored in the victory.

#### WILLIAMS' SIX GOALS MATCHES PROGRAM HIGH IN FIRST SIX GAMES

- · With six goals over the first three weekends of the season, Maddy Williams matched Jessica Okoroafo (2009) for the most by a Boiler in the first six games of a season. Williams scored in four of the first six games, highlighted by multi-goal efforts in wins against Akron and Northern Illinois. Okoroafo scored in five of the first six games of 2009, including twice in game No. 2 at Butler, and finished her senior season with eight goals.
- · Last season, Jordan Pawlik scored six times in the first five games in which she played. She missed Purdue's fourth and fifth games of the season due to injury and scored her sixth goal in the team's seventh game. Pawlik finished the year with nine goals, the most by a Boiler since 2007.

#### STUART ASSISTS ON THREE SCORES FOR NEW SINGLE-GAME RECORD

· Hadley Stuart assisted on three of the Boilers' four scores in the Aug. 30 home win against Northern Illinois to establish a new Purdue single-game record. She also scored the team's fourth goal to cap off a five-point night. Stuart enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with seven assists, helping setup seven of the Boilers' 17 goals scored by teammates. With two goals and an assist for the second Friday in a row, Maddy Williams also had five points in the NIU win.

#### NINE GOALS AGAINST OVER A THREE-GAME STRETCH

- Purdue has surrendered nine goals over a three-game stretch twice this season, the most allowed over a three-game nonconference stretch since the 2003 NCAA Tournament (10). However, that three-game segment from 2003 featured a 7-0 loss at eventual national champion North Carolina in the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Tournament. The Boilermakers gave up 11 goals over the final three games of 2012 (vs. Big Ten rivals Wisconsin, Minnesota and Penn State).
- The 14 goals against was the most over the first six games of a season since Purdue's 1998 inaugural campaign (20). From 2001 through 2009, the Boilers surrendered four-plus goals in a game only three times. Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, it has happened 10 times.

#### **EARLIEST GOAL SCORED TO START A SEASON**

- · When Chinyelu Asher scored only 68 seconds after the opening kickoff of the season-opening win against Akron it marked the fastest that Purdue had ever scored to begin a new campaign. Previously, the quickest goal in program history came in 2003 when Jennie Moppert found the back of the net four minutes and 52 seconds after the opening kick. Overall, it was team's fastest goal since Kaitlyn Blacha scored 21 seconds into a Halloween 2010 home game against Penn State.
- · Xavier turned the tables on the Boilers Aug. 25 and scored only two minutes and 34 seconds into the game. It was the earliest goal that Purdue had allowed since Penn State found the back of the net only two minutes and 16 seconds after kickoff in the 2012 season finale.

#### SIX BOILERS SCORE IN SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND

- Six different Purdue players found the back of the net during the season-opening weekend. **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Maddy Williams** led the way with two goals apiece. Kuramoto matched her goal total from her underclassman seasons (2010-11) in one weekend while becoming just the third player in program history to score in each of the first two games of a new year.
- Williams had two goals and an assist in the season opener against Akron. She's became the seventh player in program history to score in her first collegiate game and joined Lauren Sesselmann, who currently plays professionally for FC Kansas City of the NWSL, as the only Boilers to post a multiple-goal effort in their debuts. Williams was the fourth Purdue player overall, and first since 2009, to score twice in a season opener.
- Hadley Stuart had a goal and two assists in the Akron win. She scored in a season opener for the second year in a row. Alex Hairston scored in the first game of the 2011 and 2012 seasons. Annette Kent is the only other Boiler to find the back of the net in the first game of consecutive seasons, scoring in four straight from 2000-03.

#### THREE GOALKEEPERS SEE ACTION IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- Each of Purdue's three goalkeepers Clara Kridler, Caitlyn McCullough and Jordan Ginther saw action in the first two games of the season. Since the start of the 2000 season, only four times prior had three different 'keepers taken the field in the same game. The 2009 season (vs. Ohio and vs. Ball State) marked the only time before that it happened in the same year, much less back-to-back games.
- Kridler, McCullough and Ginther teamed up to post a shutout in the season opener. It marked the fourth time in the last five years (and seventh time total) that the Boilers opened with a clean-sheet effort.

#### HAIRSTON SISTER ACT

- A group of 11 true freshmen joined the program this fall. Among that group is **Alex Hairston's** sister **Juliana**, giving the Boilers their first set of sister teammates since Karah and Tricia Henderson in 1998 and 1999 (the program's first two seasons).
- Jennie (2000-03) and Addie (2004-07) Moppert were also sisters that both played for Purdue, but their college careers did not overlap. However, Jennie Moppert was a volunteer assistant coach during the 2005 season while Addie was a sophomore.

#### **KURAMOTO RETURNS TO ACTIVE ROSTER**

- Mollie Kuramoto returned to the active roster as a redshirt-junior this season. She served as a team captain in 2012 despite missing the season due to a knee injury suffered in the spring of 2012. She led the team in assists in 2011 as one of the team's top central midfielders.
- Kuramoto started at center mid in the preseason exhibition game with Louisville and the first eight games of the new season. She started 35 of the 37 games in which she played during her underclassman season (2010-11).
- Kuramoto has compiled a 3.99 GPA through the end of the 2013 spring semester. She is a two-time
  Distinguished Big Ten Scholar and Academic All-Big Ten honoree. In the spring, she was one of three
  Purdue student-athletes selected for induction in the Mortar Board Class of 2013. Dating back to 1979,
  only 34 Purdue student-athletes have been inducted into Mortar Board. Honorees are selected for their
  superior scholarship, dedicated service to the university community, and outstanding and constant leadership.

#### HAIRSTON, PAWLIK & STUART AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- After teaming up to account for 17 of the Boilers' 27 goals as the top three point accumulators last season, **Alex Hairston**, **Jordan Pawlik** and **Hadley Stuart** have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch as the new campaign begins. **Jordan Frick**, **Mollie Kuramoto**, Pawlik and Stuart are serving as team captains this season.
- Hairston led the team with eight assists last year, four coming on game-winning goals. She also scored four times, including the game-winner in each of the first two contests of the season. The Portland, Ore., native tied a Purdue record with an assist in four straight games, helping setup seven goals over that stretch. She started all 39 games her first two seasons.
- Pawlik made an instant impact in her first season with the program. Her nine goals (in only 17 games) were the most by a Boiler since 2007. The Fort Wayne native posted the fourth hat trick in program history in a win against Missouri Valley Conference champion Evansville and also found the back of the net against Louisville, West Virginia, Michigan State, Wisconsin and Minnesota.
- Stuart was an ironwoman at the top of the Purdue attack until injuries caught up with her in October. She recorded a point (goal or assist) in five straight games early in the season, posting the longest such streak by a Boiler since 2009. She produced her four goals and seven assists in what amounted to only 15 games of action.
