# **BOILERMAKERS CONTINUE HOME-HEAVY STRETCH AGAINST NEBRASKA**

- · Currently in the midst of a home-heavy stretch in which the team plays five of seven games at home, Purdue hosts Nebraska Friday in the finale of a three-game homestand. The Boilermakers are also home for a pair of games the week of Oct. 21-27. Purdue is 6-2-1 at home this season and 12-6-2 since the start of the 2012 campaign.
- · Nebraska is tied atop the Big Ten standings with 12 points. The Huskers saw their seven-game win streak snapped Sunday by No. 21 Michigan. It was Nebraska's first home loss of the season. The Boilers and Huskers have split their first two meetings as Big Ten rivals, with the road team winning on both occasions. Taylor Niewoit's golden goal last season lifted Purdue to an overtime win in Lincoln.
- Nebraska swept its Northwestern-Illinois road trip the weekend of Sept. 27-29. The Huskers have been shutout only once in 13 games. Maddy Williams (9 goals) and Nebraska's Jaycie Johnson (7) are the top two goals scorers among freshmen in the Big Ten.

# PURDUE SWEEPS ILLINOIS-NORTHWESTERN WEEKEND TO EXTEND STREAKS

- Purdue won a pair of 1-0 games to sweep the Illinois-Northwestern weekend, Oct. 4-6. The Boilermakers extended their unbeaten streak at home against the Illini to eight (5-0-3), keeping Illinois winless all-time in West Lafayette (excluding neutral-site Big Ten Tournament results). Indiana (0-7-1) is the only other Big Ten team that has never won at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex. Purdue shutout the Illini for the first time this season, snapping their 20-game scoring streak that dated back to October 2012.
- Purdue won its 10th straight game against Northwestern. The longest win streak against any opponent in program history dates back to 2005. The Boilermakers are 7-1 all-time against the Wildcats in West Lafayette, posting five home victories against NU during the current streak.

#### WILLIAMS NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER & FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- After providing the only offense Purdue would need in a pair of 1-0 victories, becoming the first Boiler to score the game-winning goal GOALS in consecutive Big Ten games since 2001, Maddy Williams was Jessica Okoroafo recognized as the Big Ten Offensive Player and Freshman of the Maddy Williams Week Oct 7
- Williams is Purdue's first Player of the Week honoree since former goalkeeper Carianne Betts was recognized for consecutive shutouts in September 2010. Sylvia Forbes (Aug. 31, 2009) was the Boilers' last Offensive Player of the Week honoree. Williams joined Alex Hairston (2011), Chinyelu Asher (2011) and Kim Love (2012) as active Purdue players to garner Big Ten Freshman of the Week ac-
- · Williams scored her eighth and ninth goals of the season as the Boilers posted 1-0 wins against Illinois and Northwestern. She's now

only one goal shy of Jessica Okoroafo's Purdue freshman record from 2005. The Perrysburg, Ohio. native is third in the Big Ten in goals entering the week as the top freshman scorer in the conference.

· Williams became the first Boiler to account for a game-winning goal in consecutive contests since Hairston did so in the first two games of 2012. However, in Big Ten play, a Purdue player had not accomplished the feat since Lauren Sesselmann in 2001. Sesselmann was also a freshman in 2001 and finished her first season with nine goals. Williams tied Sesselmann's freshman record for points (24) Oct 6.

#### THREE STRAIGHT SHUTOUTS & THREE CONSECUTIVE BIG TEN WINS

- Thanks to 1-0 wins against Ohio State, Illinois and Northwestern, Purdue has posted its first threegame win streak in Big Ten play since October 2007. The 2007 team was also the last to record three straight shutout victories, tallying five shutouts in a row while posting a 4-0-1 record from Sept. 23 through Oct. 7. The Boilermakers had not won three consecutive 1-0 games since September 2006.
- Purdue's active consecutive scoreless minutes streak of 283 is the program's longest since going 338 minutes without giving up a goal in October 2009. The current streak ranks as the 12th longest in team history but could jump to fifth with a shutout against Nebraska this week.

#### **PURDUE SCORES IN FIRST THIRTEEN GAMES OF 2013**

- Purdue has scored a goal in every game this season. The 13 consecutive games with a goal is tied for the third longest singleseason streak in program history and is the Boilers' longest streak since scoring in 15 straight games in 2005. The 2000 (11), 2003 (17) and 2009 (12) teams also opened their campaigns with lengthy consecutive games with a goal streaks, as the Boilers have done this year.
- · With Purdue shutting out Illinois Oct. 4 and Minnesota blanking Penn State Oct. 6, Purdue and Iowa are now the only Big Ten teams that have not been shut out in 2013.

#### STUART LEADING BIG TEN IN ASSISTS

- · Hadley Stuart entered the week of Sept. 16-22 leading the nation with eight assists. With nine helpers as of Oct. 7, she continues to lead the Big Ten and now ranks eighth nationally this week. She's also seventh in the Big Ten with 19 points.
- Maddy Williams (9 goals, 6 assists, 24 points) and Alex Hairston (6, 8, 20) are both ranked among the Big Ten's leaders in goals, assists and points as of Oct. 7. Hairston is second in assists and Williams is third in goals this week. Hairston has recorded a goal or an assist in 11 of the first 13 games.
- · As a team, the Boilermakers are third in the Big Ten with 31 goals as of Oct. 7. Only Penn State (39) and Illinois (35) have scored more. Purdue is also second in assists (35).

#### HAIRSTON SCORES FOURTH QUICKEST GOAL IN PROGRAM HISTORY

• Alex Hairston scored only 31 seconds after the opening kickoff at Ohio State Sept. 29 for the fourth quickest goal in program history since 2000. Purdue went on to win 1-0 after the early goal held up. It marked the first time in which a Boiler found the back of the net in the opening minute that the goal ended up being the only score of the game. Hairston managed to score Purdue's first goal in Columbus since 2007. Sept. 26 in the loss at Penn State, Maddy Williams scored the Boilers' first goal at PSU's Jeffrey Field since the 2006 Big Ten Tournament and the first goal against the Nittany Lions on their home field since 2005.

· Meanwhile, goalkeeper Clara Kridler posted her seventh career solo shutout in the 1-0 win at Ohio State in the Columbus-area native's return to her hometown. She was one of five Ohio natives in Purdue's starting lineup. It was her first solo shutout since blanking Northwestern, 1-0, almost one year ago to the day (Sept. 28, 2012).

#### HAIRSTON SETS NEW RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A POINT

- · Alex Hairston recorded a goal or an assist in seven straight games (Sept. 6-29), establishing a new program record for consecutive games with a point. She found the back of the net in four straight games (Sept. 8-22) and five times total during the streak. She had an assist in the two games in which she didn't score. Maddy Williams has recorded a point in six straight games overall and eight straight in which she's played (missing the IPFW win due to injury).
- Hairston is also a co-owner of the program record for most consecutive games with an assist (four), established from Aug. 31 through Sept. 12 of last season.
- · Hairston became the first Boiler to score in four consecutive games since Kellie Phillips scored in five straight in October 2011 to tie a program record. Loredana Riverso also scored in five consecutive games in November 2007. Hairston is the fourth Boiler to score in at least four straight games

CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A POINT

Program History

- · Hairston leads active Purdue players with 16 career goals. She has started every game in her first three seasons with the program. With 16 goals in 52 games, she has managed to score in 31 percent of the games she has played. Jordan Pawlik has scored in eight of the 30 games she has played in, a 27 percent ratio. Excluding freshmen (Williams has scored in seven of her 12 games), Hairston and Pawlik are the team leaders for scoring in the highest percentage of games played.
- · Meanwhile, Hairston also posted multi-assist efforts in the wins against Northern Illinois and Dartmouth this season. With five career multi-assist games, she has established a new Purdue all-time record.

#### PURDUE SNAPS OSU'S BIG TEN STREAK WITH FIRST WIN IN COLUMBUS SINCE 2007

- The 1-0 win at Ohio State Sept. 29 was the Boilers first shutout victory on the road since the 2011 season opener at Toledo and their first at a Big Ten opponent since September 2008 at Wisconsin. With its first win in Columbus since 2007, Purdue also snapped the Buckeyes' 12-game (10-0-2) unbeaten streak against Big Ten opponents that dated back to September 2012. Ohio State had not lost any games at home since September 2012 as well.
- The Boilermakers posted their first road win in regulation since October 2011 at Minnesota. Purdue's two positive road results since had been overtime victories.

#### WISCONSIN'S LATE GOALS BURN BOILERS IN BIG TEN OPENER

· No. 24 Wisconsin scored twice in the final seven minutes to break open what was an otherwise tightly contested game throughout, defeating Purdue, 3-1, in the Big Ten Conference opener for both teams Sept. 22. The Badgers scored the go-ahead goal in the 84th minute off a corner kick-style set piece from the left endline. Excluding the team's last four overtime losses dating back to 2011, it marked the latest go-ahead goal the Boilers' had allowed in regulation since Ohio State scored in the 87th minute of an October 2010 game at Boilermaker Soccer Complex.

# NEW ATTENDANCE RECORD AT BOILERMAKER SOCCER COMPLEX

• Purdue's Big Ten opener against Wisconsin was played in front of a Boilermaker Soccer Complex-record crowd of 1,318 fans on Greater Lafayette Recreational Soccer Alliance day at the field. The previous attendance record (1,256) dated back to 2004.

#### MOST GOALS SCORED ENTERING BIG TEN PLAY

- · The Boilermakers have scored multiple goals in seven of their first 13 games. With 31 goals in the first 13 games, Purdue has already exceeded its season total from 2012. The 26 goals going into the Big Ten season was a program high 2007 entering conference play.
- Purdue's 13 goals in the first four games this year represented a program high to begin a new season. The 20 goals in the first six games were good for second most in program history.
- The 20 goals over the first six games were the Boilers' most

in any six-game stretch since scoring 22 late in the 2007 season. November 2007 also marked the last time the team scored three-plus goals in three consecutive games as well, which Purdue accomplished this year in the games against Akron (5), Xavier (3) and Northern Illinois (4).

#### PAWLIK'S BIG GAME LIFTS PURDUE TO OVERTIME WIN AT MIAMI

- After equalizing three times in regulation, Jordan Pawlik's golden goal in the 102nd minute gave Purdue its first lead of the day as well 11 – Marquette 10, at Purdue 1 (1998) as a 4-3 overtime win at Miami (Ohio) Sept. 15. She also scored the 10 - at Purdue 8, Indiana 2 (2011) Boilers' second goal of the game on a penalty kick in the 62nd minute, posting her third multi-goal game at Purdue. Pawlik joined Jessica Baumhoff (2002 at Oakland, also a 4-3 final) as the only players 8 – Purdue 8, Evansville 0 (2003) in program history to record a multi-goal effort in the same game in which she scored an OT game-winner.
- which she scored an OT game-winner.

   The four goals at Miami were the Boilers' most in a road game since also scoring four in an October 2005 win at Ohio State. Purdue 7 Purdue 4, at Miami 3 (2013) 7 Purdue 4, at Miami 3 (2013) 7 Xavier 4, at Purdue 3 (2013) posted its first overtime victory since winning at Nebraska in September 2012 on a golden goal from **Taylor Niewoit**, who assisted on 7 – Purdue 4, at Oakland 3 (2002) Pawlik's game-winner at Miami. Alex Hairston (2012 vs. Eastern IIlinois) has also recorded an overtime game-winner as a Boilermaker.
- · Pawlik was named the Big Ten Player of the Week by CollegeSportsMadness.com and selected to CollegeSoccer360.com's Primetime Performers list. She also helped the Boilers shut out IPFW Sept. 13 while playing outside back. The senior moved up to forward midway through the first half at Miami.
- Four times this season, Purdue has been part of a game that featured seven-plus goals. In program history, the Boilers have been involved in a game that has featured seven-plus goals 20 times, compiling a 12-8 record. The Xavier game (Aug. 25) marked only the third time in program history the Boilers have scored three goals in a loss. Entering the season, Purdue had only been involved in three games in program history in which both teams scored three-plus goals. It has already happened three times this year.

#### FIVE DIFFERENT BOILERS SCORE IN DARTMOUTH WIN

- Purdue matched its season high with five goals in the Sept. 6 home win against Dartmouth, receiving scores from five different players. It marked the first time since October 2011 and ninth time in program history that five Boilers found the back of the net in the same game.
- Purdue actually trailed 2-1 in the 58th minute against Dartmouth. But the Boilers scored three times in just over five minutes to take control of the game. Mollie Kuramoto accounted for the equalizer in the 60th minute, Hadley Stuart provided the go-ahead goal in the 64th minute and Chinyelu Asher scored what proved to the game winner early in the 66th minute to cap the wild stretch. Freshmen Maddy Williams and Mikayla Lasky also scored in the victory.

#### WILLIAMS' SIX GOALS MATCHES PROGRAM HIGH IN FIRST SIX GAMES

- With six goals over the first three weekends of the season. Maddy Williams matched Jessica Okoroafo (2009) for the most by a Boiler in the first six games of a season. Williams scored in four of the first six games, highlighted by multi-goal efforts in wins against Akron and Northern Illinois. Okoroafo scored in five of the first six games of 2009, including twice in game No. 2 at Butler, and finished her senior season with eight goals.
- · Last season, Jordan Pawlik scored six times in the first five games in which she played. She missed Purdue's fourth and fifth games of the season due to injury and scored her sixth goal in the team's seventh game. Pawlik finished the year with nine goals, the most by a Boiler since 2007.

#### STUART ASSISTS ON THREE SCORES FOR NEW SINGLE-GAME RECORD

• Hadley Stuart assisted on three of the Boilers' four scores in the Aug. 30 home win against Northern Illinois to establish a new Purdue single-game record. She also scored the team's fourth goal to cap off a five-point night. Stuart enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with seven assists, helping setup seven of the Boilers' 17 goals scored by teammates. With two goals and an assist for the second Friday in a row, Maddy Williams also had five points in the NIU win.

#### NINE GOALS AGAINST OVER A THREE-GAME STRETCH

- Purdue has surrendered nine goals over a three-game stretch twice this season, the most allowed over a three-game nonconference stretch since the 2003 NCAA Tournament (10). However, that three-game segment from 2003 featured a 7-0 loss at eventual national champion North Carolina in the Sweet 16 round of the NCAA Tournament. The Boilermakers gave up 11 goals over the final three games of 2012 (vs. Big Ten rivals Wisconsin, Minnesota and Penn State).
- The 14 goals against was the most over the first six games of a season since Purdue's 1998 inaugural campaign (20). From 2001 through 2009, the Boilers surrendered four-plus goals in a game only three times. Since the beginning of the 2010 campaign, it has happened 11 times.

#### **EARLIEST GOAL SCORED TO START A SEASON**

- When **Chinyelu Asher** scored only 68 seconds after the opening kickoff of the season-opening win against Akron it marked the fastest that Purdue had ever scored to begin a new campaign. Previously, the quickest goal in program history came in 2003 when Jennie Moppert found the back of the net four minutes and 52 seconds after the opening kick. Overall, it was team's fastest goal since Kaitlyn Blacha scored 21 seconds into a Halloween 2010 home game against Penn State.
- Xavier turned the tables on the Boilers Aug. 25 and scored only two minutes and 34 seconds into the game. It was the earliest goal that Purdue had allowed since Penn State found the back of the net only two minutes and 16 seconds after kickoff in the 2012 season finale.

#### SIX BOILERS SCORE IN SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND

- Six different Purdue players found the back of the net during the season-opening weekend. **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Maddy Williams** led the way with two goals apiece. Kuramoto matched her goal total from her underclassman seasons (2010-11) in one weekend while becoming just the third player in program history to score in each of the first two games of a new year.
- Williams had two goals and an assist in the season opener against Akron. She's became the seventh player in program history to score in her first collegiate game and joined Lauren Sesselmann, who currently plays professionally for FC Kansas City of the NWSL, as the only Boilers to post a multiple-goal effort in their debuts. Williams was the fourth Purdue player overall, and first since 2009, to score twice in a season opener.
- Hadley Stuart had a goal and two assists in the Akron win. She scored in a season opener for the second year in a row. Alex Hairston scored in the first game of the 2011 and 2012 seasons. Annette Kent is the only other Boiler to find the back of the net in the first game of consecutive seasons, scoring in four straight from 2000-03.


#### THREE GOALKEEPERS SEE ACTION IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- Each of Purdue's three goalkeepers Clara Kridler, Caitlyn McCullough and Jordan Ginther saw action in the first two games of the season. Since the start of the 2000 season, only four times prior had three different 'keepers taken the field in the same game. The 2009 season (vs. Ohio and vs. Ball State) marked the only time before that it happened in the same year, much less back-to-back games.
- Kridler, McCullough and Ginther teamed up to post a shutout in the season opener. It marked the fourth time in the last five years (and seventh time total) that the Boilers opened with a cleansheet effort.

#### **HAIRSTON SISTER ACT**

- A group of 11 true freshmen joined the program this fall. Among that group is **Alex Hairston's** sister **Juliana**, giving the Boilers their first set of sister teammates since Karah and Tricia Henderson in 1998 and 1999 (the program's first two seasons).
- Jennie (2000-03) and Addie (2004-07) Moppert were also sisters that both played for Purdue, but their college careers did not overlap. However, Jennie Moppert was a volunteer assistant coach during the 2005 season while Addie was a sophomore.
