GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 771-408 all-time
- Purdue is 185-89 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 302-154.
- Purdue is 93-27 in November, including a 57-6 record at home. The Boilermakers are 6-2 all-time on Nov. 23, including a 4-0 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is 29-11 all-time in the third game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 60-57 all-time against teams from Ohio.
- Purdue is 494-185 when playing in their home state.
- Purdue is 60-17 all-time against the Mid-American Conference, including a season-opening win at Ball State this year.
- The Boilermakers are 8-0 all-time against Toledo, including a 5-0 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Purdue was outrebounded for the first time this season, 36-33, led by 19 offensive boards by the Rockets.
- The Boilermakers limited Toledo to just 31 percent from the field, including 26.9 percent in the first half and just 21.4 percent from behind the arc.
- Purdue shot a season-best 49 percent (25-51) from the floor, including 52 percent (13-25) in the second half and 50 percent from three (5-10).
- The Boilermakers turned 19 Toledo turnovers into 21 points.
- Purdue had a balanced scoring effort as eight Boilermakers had between five and 12 points in the game.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- April Wilson led the team with 12 points and five assists, shooting five-of-10 from the floor.
- Hayden Hamby matched her career-high with 10 points, all in the first half, and dished out a career-high three assists with no turnovers.
- Andreona Keys had her second career game in double-figures, scoring 10 points on three-of-six shooting.

- Whitney Bays did a little of everything, finishing with six points, nine rebounds, four assists, three steals and a block.
- Torrie Thornton denied a career-best three blocks.
- Jay-Ann Bravo-Harriott led Toledo with a game-high 13 points.
