PURDUE HITS THE ROAD AFTER 3-1 HOMESTAND

• The Boilermakers closed out their season-opening four-game homestand with a pair of victories, out scoring Ball State (2-0) and SIU Edwardsville (4-1) by a combined 6-1 margin. Five different players scored during the homestand and goalkeepers **Jordan Ginther** and **Maddy Olsen** both saw action protecting the net.

• Purdue now hits the road to close out non-conference play. The Boilermakers will be visiting the campuses of Marshall and Youngstown State for the first time, with YSU also being a first-time foe overall. Both opponents are playing at new facilities that have opened within the last two years. Both stadiums feature artificial turf playing surfaces, which the Boilers will play on again Sept. 19 at Northwestern.

ARKANS NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

• **Erika Arkans'** multi-goal effort in the 4-1 victory vs. SIU Edwardsville earned the first-year Boilermaker Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. She scored Purdue's second and fourth goals in the win after entering the game as a substitute in the 26th minute. She went on to log 60 minutes off the bench and also hit the crossbar with her first shot of the game.

• Arkans shared Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors this week with Megan Schafer of Penn State. She joins **Maddy Williams** (2013), **Kim Love** (2012) and **Alex Hairston** (2011) as active Boilers to garner the honor. Williams is the only other current Purdue player with a multi-goal game during her career.

• Arkans is one of six freshmen that have started at least one game for Purdue this season.

SORAYA SCORES IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

• Senior **Soraya Toppin-Herbert** scored her first collegiate goal in the Aug. 29 win against Ball State in what was her 30th game as a Boilermaker. She wasted no time in scoring her second marker, opening the scoring in the Aug. 31 victory against SIU Edwardsville. In the process, she became the first Purdue player to account for consecutive goals and score in back-to-back games since **Maddy Williams** provided the offense in the consecutive 1-0 wins against Illinois and Northwestern last season.

• Though she was limited to 30 minutes due to illness, Toppin-Herbert got a chance to make her second career start in the SIUE victory. It was also her first-ever start at home as well as her first start overall since September 2012 at Iowa.

17TH CAREER GOAL FOR ALEX HAIRSTON

• **Alex Hairston** scored her first goal of the season and team-high 17th career in the second half of the SIU Edwardsville win Aug. 31. While remaining two assists shy of the Purdue all-time record, she's also looking to become only the third player in program history to join the 20-20 club for career goals and assists.

• Hairston's goal was her first since scoring the game-winner in the opening minute of the September 2013 win at Ohio State. The 11-game goal drought was the longest of her career. Previously, the longest goal-scoring drought she had experienced was seven (on three occasions).

TWO MULTI-ASSIST EFFORTS IN SAME MATCH

• **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Maddy Williams** both assisted on a pair of goals in the 4-1 win vs. SIU Edwardsville, each setting up a goal by **Erika Arkans**. Kuramoto recorded her second career multi-assist effort, and her first since a September 2011 home win against Indiana State. Williams posted her first multi-assist game as a Boilermaker after scoring her first goal of the season (and 11th career) in the Aug. 29 win vs. Ball State two days earlier.

• Twice in 2013, two Boilermakers recorded a multi-assist effort in the same game. **Alex Hairston** was involved in both instances on the way to breaking the Purdue all-time record for multi-assist games (five). Hadley Stuart and Hairston each had multiple helpers in a 4-1 win against Northern Illinois, a game in which Williams scored twice. Five different Boilers scored in a 5-3 victory against Dartmouth last year when Jordan Pawlik and Hairston had two assists apiece.

• **Gianna Milaro** and **Mikayla Lasky** recorded their first collegiate assists during the final week-end of August. Milaro had an assist in both wins.

OLSEN PRESSED INTO ACTION AFTER LIGHTNING DELAY

• The Aug. 29 win against Ball State was delayed about an hour and 45 minutes late in the first half due to lightning. **Jordan Ginther** had started the game in goal and kept it scoreless for the first 37 minutes. But a thigh injury flared up on her during the delay and she was not able to continue when play resumed. Freshman **Maddy Olsen** took over and ended up protecting the net for the final 143 minutes of the weekend.

• Olsen surrendered only one goal in the 143 minutes of game action and that marker was actually the first scored by an opposing player against Purdue this year after an own goal was the difference in the 1-0 season-opening loss to Miami. SIU Edwardsville's equalizer in the 34th minute ended Purdue's shutout streak at 259 consecutive minutes, which ranked as the team's fifth longest since the beginning of the 2008 season.

BOILERMAKERS SPLIT SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND

• Purdue opened its new season with a weekend split at the 14th edition of the Boilermaker Challenge Cup. After losing to Miami (Ohio), 1-0, on an own goal late in the first half, the Boilers rebounded with a 2-0 win against Ohio. **Jordan Ginther**, **Mikayla Lasky** and **Nicole Robertson** represented Purdue on the All-Tournament Team. The Boilermakers finished as the tournament runner-up thanks to a plus-1 goal differential. Freshmen **Erika Arkans** and **Robertson** scored the goals Sunday. Robertson also assisted on Arkans' game-winner. Ginther posted her second career solo shutout.

• Arkans became the sixth freshman to account for Purdue's first goal of the season, including the first since **Alex Hairston** in 2011.

• After suffering its first season-opening loss since 2010 (1-0 to Toledo in overtime, also the last time the team was shut out in an opener), Purdue fell to 10-6-1 all-time in season openers – including 8-4-1 at home. Purdue is now 18-7-3 all-time at the Boilermaker Challenge Cup, but has still not won the tournament since 2009.

ARKANS & ROBERTSON JOIN UNIQUE LIST

• With freshmen **Erika Arkans** and **Nicole Robertson** scoring the goals in the 2-0 win against Ohio Aug. 24, it marked only the seventh time since 2006 in which multiple Boilermakers scored their first collegiate goals in the same game.

• While **Maddy Williams** tied the Purdue freshman record with 10 goals last season, only three freshmen scored total and just once did two freshmen score in the same game.

Mikayla Lasky and **Williams** were among the five goal scorers in the Sept. 5, 2013 win vs. Dartmouth, 5-3.

• Freshmen **Andrea Petrina** and **Maddy Woolford** did also both score in the Aug. 15 exhibition win at Illinois State, but as a preseason scrimmage the goals do not count towards their official career totals.

OWN GOAL BURNS BOILERS IN OPENER

• An own goal late in the first half for Miami (Ohio) turned out to be the only score of the Aug. 22 season opener for both teams. It was the first own goal against Purdue since the loss at Penn State in September of last year. However, it marked the first time an own goal doubled as a game-winning marker since a 2009 NCAA Tournament loss to Central Michigan in South Bend. Own goals against were also the difference in losses at Michigan (1-0) in October 2001 and vs. Northwestern (2-1) in October 2003.

• Since 2000, the Boilermakers have enjoyed a 9-5 advantage in own goals. The last one that counted positively for Purdue was in September 2012 at Iowa. However, the Boilers have not emerged victorious in a game that featured an own goal for either team since the 2009 regular-season finale against Iowa, a match Purdue won in overtime on an own goal.

PURDUE WINS EXHIBITION GAME AT MVC FAVORITE ILLINOIS STATE, 2-0

• Freshmen **Andrea Petrina** and **Maddy Woolford** scored eight minutes apart in the first half and Purdue made the early hold up for a 2-0 victory at Missouri Valley Conference defending champion and preseason favorite Illinois State Aug. 15. **Alex Hairston** helped setup both goals, which were scored in the 16th (Petrina) and 24th (Woolford) minutes.

• Goalkeepers **Jordan Ginther** and **Erika Yohn** split time for Purdue. As the starter, Ginther made four saves in the first half, snuffing out a couple quality scoring chances in the final 10 minutes of the opening half. Yohn had six saves and was in good position multiple times as ISU began to shoot more liberally as the second half played out.

• **Vanessa Korolas** joined Petrina and Woolford as freshmen in the starting lineup for the Boilermakers. **Erika Arkans** and **Yohn** were the other newcomers to see action off the bench

HAIRSTON ENTERS SENIOR SEASON TWO ASSISTS SHY OF PROGRAM RECORD

• Hairston enters her senior season with 20 career assists, two shy of Lauren Sesselmann's program record. She has become only the third Boilermaker to reach the 20-assist benchmark thanks in part to a team-record five career multi-assist games. And with a point in seven consecutive games last year from Sept. 6-29, the Portland, Ore., native established a Purdue record. She contributed to 14 of the Boilermakers' 34 scores (41 percent) a year ago, scoring six goals to go along with eight assists.

• A significant Purdue all-time record has not been broken since Jessica Okoroafo surpassed Sesselmann in goals and points in 2009.

WILLIAMS BACK AFTER RECORD-SETTING FRESHMAN SEASON

• **Maddy Williams** had an instant impact in 2013 and enjoyed one of the best offensive seasons of any freshman in program history. Thanks to 10 goals and six assists, she set a Purdue freshman benchmark with 26 points while tying Jessica Okoroafo's freshman goals record from 2005. Perhaps more impressively, Williams became just the sixth player in program history to post a double-figure goal season. She contributed to 16 of the 34 scores (47 percent) last year.

LASKY & LOVE RETURN ON BACK ROW

• **Mikayla Lasky** and **Kim Love** were constants at the center back position on Purdue's back line last season. After playing every minute of 2012, Love missed the first three games last season due to injury. She returned to the lineup in time for the Kansas game, which was the same day in which Lasky was inserted into the lineup full-time (at halftime). The duo went on to play every minute of the final 15 games, logging 1,427 consecutive minutes together.

• Both saw action at outside back some during the season-opening homestand of 2014. Freshman **Vanessa Korolas** was also played center and outside back. She made an impressive diving team save to prevent a goal early in the second half vs. Miami (Ohio). Lasky was the only Boiler to go the distance in the first four games and has now played 1,787 consecutive minutes since 2013. Love left the field vs. Miami (Ohio) for the first time as a Boilermaker. She had gone the distance in each of the 35 games she had played the last two years.

GINTHER HIGHLIGHTS YOUNG GOALKEEPER CORPS

• With sophomore **Jordan Ginther** and freshmen **Erika Yohn** and **Maddy Olsen** comprising Purdue's goalkeeper corps this year, the position is young and relatively inexperienced at the college level for the first time since 2011. Ginther made four starts and played in nine games in 2013, helping the Boilers post wins against Dartmouth and IPFW along with a draw against Seattle.

• Ginther and Yohn split time in the Aug. 15 exhibition win at Illinois State, but Yohn suffered a shoulder injury in practice the following day and is expected to be sidelined for a couple games to begin the new season.

HAIRSTON, KURAMOTO & WILLIAMS AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Together accounting for a combined 31 goals as Boilermakers, **Alex Hairston**, **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Maddy Williams** were highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch entering the 2014 season. Each coaching staff selected three of its own players, leading to a list of 42 Players to Watch from around the newly expanded 14-team league. Kuramoto started all 19 games last year while Hairston and Williams were starters in all but one game in which they played. Entering their senior seasons, Hairston (57) and Kuramoto (54) have both started over 50 games in their careers. Hairston has never missed a game while starting 57 of the 58 games since the start of 2011.

INJURY LIKELY TO END CASELLA'S STARTING STREAK EARLY IN 2014

• **Melissa Casella** has been a constant at the defensive midfielder position for Purdue since joining the starting lineup in time for the fifth game of the 2012 season. She entered her junior year having started a team-high 34 consecutive games. She led the team in minutes played last season (1,679), going the distance in 15 of the 19 games. However, the junior has been battling a back injury early this year and was sidelined to begin the new season.

• **Mollie Kuramoto** and Casella were selected as team captains for the 2014 season. It marks the third year in a row that Kuramoto is a co-captain.

CANADIAN IMPORTS

• Canadians **Vanessa Korolas** and **Andrea Petrino** are part of Purdue's eight-player freshman class this year. They represent the Boilers' first Canadian players since Sylvia Forbes (Whitby, Ontario) and Loredana Rivero (Mississauga, Ontario) suited up for Purdue from 2006-09. Forbes and Rivero were both First Team All-Big Ten honorees during their careers. Korolas also hails from Mississauga, Ontario, a suburb of Toronto.

HAIRSTON SISTER ACT

• Sisters **Alex** and **Juliana Hairston** are teammates at Purdue for the second year in a row. They both played in the same game five times last year. They're Purdue's first set of sister teammates since Karah and Tricia Henderson in 1998 and 1999 (the program's first two seasons).

• Jennie (2000-03) and Addie (2004-07) Moppert were also sisters that both played for Purdue, but their college careers did not overlap. However, Jennie Moppert was a volunteer assistant coach during the 2005 season while Addie was a sophomore.

PURDUE TO HOST BIG TEN TOURNAMENT FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2001

• The Boilermaker Soccer Complex will serve as the host of the Big Ten Tournament this season for the first time since 2001. The top eight teams in the final standings qualify for the tournament, set for Nov. 5-9. All eight teams could receive NCAA Tournaments regardless of which team wins the event.
