THE NOTES TO KNOW

- Riding a five-game winning streak, the No. 17-ranked Purdue basketball team heads to the Pacific Northwest to face Washington and Oregon for the first time in Big Ten Conference action. The Boilermakers will face Washington in Seattle on Wednesday, then head to Eugene to face Oregon on Saturday. It marks Purdue's first trip to the Pacific Northwest since winning the Phil Knight Legacy in Portland in November 2022.
- The Boilermakers will be making their first appearance in historic Alaska Airlines Arena since **Rick Mount's** second and third career games on Dec. 8 and 9, 1967, when Purdue faced the Huskies on consecutive days during Mount's sophomore season. Mount would score 23 and 30 points in the two games as the Boilermakers and Huskies split the two-game series.
- Purdue is riding a five-game winning streak, its longest of the season, with all five wins coming by at least 18 points. The Boilermakers are also on a five-game Big Ten winning streak (Maryland, Minnesota, Northwestern, Rutgers, Nebraska), marking the 14th different five-game league winning streak of the Painter era. Purdue has had a five-game league winning streak in 12 of Painter's 20 years, including five straight seasons.
- Over the last four games (all Big Ten games), Purdue is allowing the opposing team's starting group to average just 35.8 points per game. The opponent starting five is shooting 52-of-136 (.382) from the field and 13-of-55 (.236) from 3-point range.
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue owns a 20-2 record in the month of January, having won 10 straight games. The 10-game winning streak in the month is the third longest nationally (Saint Mary's - 25; McNeese State - 11).
- Purdue has just 40 turnovers over the last five games. Purdue averaged 12.3 turnovers per game in the first 12 games of the season. In the last five games, Purdue has 107 assists against 40 turnovers (2.68). It has forced 68 turnovers in that span, a margin of plus-5.60 per game.
- In the last four years, Purdue has defeated teams ranked No. 1 (Arizona), No. 2 (Alabama), No. 4 (Marquette), No. 5 (Villanova), No. 6 (Wisconsin, Tennessee, Gonzaga), No. 7 (Tennessee), No. 8 (Duke) and No. 9 (Illinois). All but Alabama and Illinois came away from Mackey Arena.
- Since the calendar flipped to January, Purdue ranks third nationally in efficiency via BartTorvik.com, behind Houston and Kansas.
- Purdue is playing its best basketball of the season, winning the last five games by an average of 22.2 points per game. Purdue is shooting 52-of-130 (.400) from 3-point range, and 105-of-167 (.629) from inside the arc in that span.
- Purdue is now 105-23 since the start of the 2021-22 season, recording the second-most wins in the country (Houston - 109; Connecticut - 104) during that span. The senior class of **Caleb Furst** (only senior) became the seventh class in school history with 100 career victories.
- The starting backcourt of **Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** are 76-15 since their arrival at Purdue, starting every game of their tenure. The 76 wins since their arrival are the third most nationally (Connecticut - 81; Houston - 77).
- Braden Smith** is the only player in America with 250 points, 125 assists and 75 rebounds. Smith is on pace to become the first player since Loyola Marymount's **Terrell Lowery** (1990-91) to average 15.0 points, 9.0 assists, 4.0 rebounds and shoot over 40.0 percent from 3-point range.
- Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** both surpassed 1,000 career points in the last week, becoming the first junior teammates nationally to play at one school and reach the 1,000-point club. **Trey Kaufman-Renn** needs 294 points to join them.
- Trey Kaufman-Renn** is one of two players nationally (South Dakota State's **Oscar Cluff**) to average 17.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and shoot at least 60 percent from the field. In Big Ten history, only **Chris Webber**, **Evan Eschmeyer** and **Brad Miller** have done that.
- Purdue, Duke, Gonzaga and Houston are the only programs in America to have made at least a Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four during their last five NCAA Tournament appearances. Purdue reached the Sweet 16 in 2022, the Elite 8 in 2019 and the Final Four in 2024.

- Just the sixth meeting in series history, Purdue will head to Seattle for the first time in 57 seasons. The last regular-season meeting came on Dec. 9, 1967, in Seattle.
- The last meeting came in a Round of 32 game in the 2009 NCAA Tournament in Portland. The Boilermakers defeated the Huskies 76-74 to move to its first Sweet 16 under head coach Matt Painter.
- Purdue defeated Utah State, **Danny Sprinkle's** old school, in last year's NCAA Round of 32 game, 106-67, in Indianapolis.

▶▶▶ BOILERS FINDING THEIR GROOVE

- With the 104-68 win over Nebraska on Sunday, Purdue has now won four straight Big Ten games by 18 or more points, with two of the victories coming on the road. It marks the first time in school history that Purdue has won three straight Big Ten games by 18 or more points.
- Overall, the Boilermakers have won five straight games by 18-plus.
- Since Dec. 29, Purdue ranks third nationally in efficiency via BartTorvik.com, behind only Houston and Florida.

- In the win over Nebraska, Purdue held the league's third-leading scorer, **Brice Williams**, to just nine points and four turnovers on just 2-of-8 shooting.
- In the win over Rutgers, Purdue held two of the league's four leading scorers and likely NBA Lottery picks, **Dylan Harper** and **Ace Bailey**, to 23 combined points on 7-of-24 shooting with five turnovers.
- Purdue held Northwestern to 38.3 percent shooting and its two leading scorers, **Brooks Barnhizer** and **Nick Martinelli**, who entered the game averaging 40.2 points per game between them, to 21 points on 6-of-23 shooting with 10 combined turnovers.

- Over the last four games, opponents are shooting just 41.5 percent from the field, while averaging 60.8 points per game.
- Over the last five games, opponents are shooting just 24.5 percent (26-of-106) from 3-point range and Purdue is plus-28 in turnover margin (40 to 68 turnovers), forcing 13.6 turnovers per game.

▶▶▶ SUNDAY WAS ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

- Sunday's dominating performance against Nebraska was one for the record books.
- Purdue's 32 assists were the fifth most in school history. The 32 assists were the most in a conference game for Purdue while equalling the most in any Big Ten conference game since Northwestern had 33 assists against Rutgers on Feb. 27, 2016.

- Purdue's 19 made 3-pointers were the second most in school history and the third most in Big Ten history, behind the 20 made against Iowa on Jan. 20, 2018.

- Purdue's 63.1 field goal percentage was its second-highest mark of the **Matt Painter** era behind 64.3 percent against Auburn on Nov. 23, 2016. The Boilermakers shot over 60.0 percent in both halves for the first time since Feb. 5, 2020, vs. Iowa.
- Purdue's 104 points were the most in regulation in Big Ten play since scoring 104 against Iowa on Feb. 5, 2020. It marked the third 100-point game in regulation during Big Ten play during the **Matt Painter** era (107 vs. Rutgers on Jan. 18, 2016).

ON THIS DATE

▶▶▶ JANUARY 15 (7-4)

- Purdue is 7-4 all-time in games played on January 15, and 3-0 under head coach **Matt Painter**.
- Purdue's 35-point win over Rutgers in 2019 moved Purdue's Big Ten record to 4-2, and was the second win in an eight-game win streak. Purdue would win 12 of its next 14 games after the Rutgers win.

▶▶▶ TAKING CARE OF IT

- The Boilermakers have won 21 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent, and is 19-1 since the start of last season when having single-digit turnovers (lone loss: UConn in the National Championship game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, when Purdue has five or more turnovers than its opponent, Purdue is 20-15 (.571). In all other games, Purdue is 85-8 (.914).

• With 16 NCAA Tournament berths, seven Sweet 16 appearances, five Big Ten regular-season championships, two Big Ten Tournament titles, two Elite Eight appearances, a trip to the Final Four, an appearance in a National Championship game and an international gold medal on his résumé, 20th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter was named the 2019 and 2024 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to nine straight NCAA Tournaments – the fourth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in five of the last seven tournaments.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.

• Painter will enter the 2024-25 season second on the school's all-time wins list (447) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward "Piggy" Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

• Has averaged over 23 wins a season in his 19 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.3 wins per year over the last 18 seasons.

• Has won at least 25 games in 12 of his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

• Painter has averaged 11.9 wins per year in conference play, the third-best average in Big Ten Conference history.

• He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.

• Coach Painter's 16 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2024 – Painter is 53 years old).

• Purdue has finished first, second or third in Big Ten play in 11 of the last 17 years, including in eight of the last 10 years.
