– PURDUE OPENS NEW CAMPAIGN AT BIG TEN/BIG EAST CHALLENGE –

As Purdue baseball travels to the Carolinas for the first time since 2006, the Boilermakers are scheduled to square off against a pair of opponents that are also unbeaten on the young season at the four-team Keith LeClair Classic hosted by East Carolina.

Purdue (3-0) is slated to play ECU (4-0) Friday at 5 p.m., Maryland (2-1) Saturday at 11 a.m. and Western Carolina (4-0) Sunday at 10 a.m. at Clark-LeClair Stadium in Greenville, N.C. The Boilermakers (No. 26) and host Pirates (No. 20) are both ranked among Perfect Game USA's Top 50.

A March 2006 weekend series at North Carolina marked the last time Purdue traveled to the Carolinas. The Boilermakers played a series at East Carolina in 2000, but have not played Western Carolina since the 1987 NCAA Regional in Starkville, Miss. Maryland represents one of four first-time opponent on Purdue's 2012 regular-season schedule.

The Keith LeClair Classic, now in its ninth year, is named in honor of the former Western Carolina player and coach who later became the head coach at ECU. He passed away in 2006 after a lengthy battle with ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease). LeClair helped lead WCU to four straight Southern Conference titles as a player, and three more as head coach before taking over at ECU. Before stepping down in 2002, he led the Pirates to four consecutive NCAA Regional appearances.

Entering the weekend, the four teams participating in the Keith LeClair Classic this season are a combined 13-1. Maryland may have suffered the only loss so far but the Terrapins also posted the most impressive series victory of the season-opening weekend, winning two-of-three at UCLA. Purdue travels to Southern California to take on the Bruins in May.

The Boilermakers are off to their first 3-0 start since the 1991 team opened the year 5-0. Purdue had a base runner in 22 of the 25 innings in which the team batted at the season-opening Big Ten/Big East Challenge, scoring in 12 innings and batting .367 as a team. The Boilermakers were able to capitalize on extra opportunities afforded them by their opponents. Combined, Connecticut, Cincinnati and Notre Dame committed 14 errors and issued 16 free passes (11 walks, 5 HBP) over the three games. Even though Purdue has proven to be adept at working counts and putting pressure on opposing defenses, teams will play cleaner games against the Boilers as the season continues.

Meanwhile, Purdue will see some size on the mound this weekend. The probable starting pitchers for Maryland (senior right-hander David Carroll) and Western Carolina (freshman right-hander Jeremy Null) are both listed at 6-foot-8. The Boilermakers will face a left-handed starter for the first time this season Friday. East Carolina's Kevin Brandt worked 6 2/3 innings of three-hit ball, striking out nine, in the opening day win against Milwaukee. He has struck out over 200 batters in his ECU career.

Null also dominated hitters in his collegiate debut last weekend, helping WCU complete a series sweep of Fordham. He struck out eight and surrendered only one hit over 5 1/3 innings.

East Carolina won a midweek game at Old Dominion Wednesday after outscoring Milwaukee, 26-4, in the season-opening sweep. Six Pirates have already homered this year. Second baseman Tim Youngster, who is wearing LeClair's honorary No. 23 jersey this season, is off to a hot start while batting ninth in the lineup. The senior is 8-for-13 while playing flawless defense at second base.

Maryland only batted .211 as a team in its series at UCLA but managed to limit the Bruins to a

single run in both the series opener and finale. Lefty reliever Jimmy Reed closed out both wins, striking out six of the 11 batters he faced.

Western Carolina won a one-sided midweek game at Winthrop Tuesday, jumping out to a 10-0 lead. The Catamounts are led by second baseman Ross Heffley. The four-year starter was the team triple crown winner last season, batting .419 with 11 home runs and 65 RBIs. He is the NCAA Division I active career leader with 274 hits while ranking second with 179 RBIs. While batting cleanup behind Heffley, freshman Jacob Hoyle (9-for-16, 6 XBH, 9 RBIs) has made teams pay early this season for pitching around the accomplished senior.

With next weekend's four-team tournament at Auburn on the horizon, Purdue will have played each of its first nine games of the new season against nine different teams before its first traditional series against the same opponent.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS BOUND FOR CAROLINAS

• After being the only Big Ten team to finish the season-opening Big Ten/Big East Challenge 3-0, Purdue is off to its first 3-0 start since the 1991 team opened the year 5-0. The Challenge ended deadlocked 15-15 after both the Big Ten and Big East posted 15 wins. South Florida was the only other team to go 3-0.

• The Boilermakers outscored Connecticut, Cincinnati and Notre Dame at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge by a margin of 30-12. Purdue also posted its three wins in a span of just over 24 hours after Friday's opener against Cincinnati was postponed due to rain. The Boilermakers recorded back-to-back three-run rallies late in the game against UConn, led wire-to-wire in the shutout win against Cincinnati and used a nine-run sixth inning to surge past Notre Dame.

• Purdue travels to the state of North Carolina this weekend for the first time since dropping two-of-three in a weekend series at North Carolina in March 2006. The four teams participating in the Keith LeClair Classic are a combined 13-1. Maryland may have suffered the only loss so far but the Terrapins also posted the most impressive season-opening series win, taking two-of-three at UCLA last weekend.

• Both ECU (No. 20) and Purdue (No. 26) are ranked among Perfect Game USA's Top 50.

BREEDLOVE BESTOWED WITH PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS

• **Lance Breedlove's** career-high 11 strikeouts over his seven innings of two-hit ball in Purdue's shutout win of Cincinnati earned the senior right-hander National Pitcher of the Week honors from College Sports Madness as well as Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors.

• Breedlove was dominant in his fifth career start as a Boiler. He surrendered only a pair of two-out singles and did not allow a base runner to advance past first. His 11 strikeouts represented the most by a Purdue pitcher since Matt Morgan fanned 14 in a March 2010 win at Ohio.

• Breedlove would have retired the final 16 batters he faced if not for a two-out error in the fifth inning. The senior worked four 1-2-3 frames. He struck out the side in the first inning. Thanks in part to not issuing a walk, Breedlove only needed 89 pitches to complete his seven innings. Purdue's first shutout win since the 2011 Big Ten home opener against Michigan was played in two hours and two minutes.

PERKINS' GRAND SLAM HIGHLIGHTS NINE-RUN RALLY

• Highlighted by a nine-run sixth inning that featured a grand slam from **Cameron Perkins**, Purdue scored in each of the final five innings to overcome a four-run deficit and defeat Notre Dame, 15-8, on the final day of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge.

• Each of the nine players in the batting order reached base safely and scored a run before an out was recorded in the sixth inning, leading to the Boilers' biggest inning since also scoring nine times in a March 2010 home win against Chicago State. Perkins connected for the first grand slam by a Boiler since April 2010, giving Purdue a 9-4 lead with a blast to left field. He finished with five RBIs, one shy of his career high. The grand slam was his 17th career home run, tops among active Boilers.

CONSISTENT LINEUP LEADS THE WAY IN ST. PETE

• The Boilermakers scored in 12 of 25 innings in which they batted at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge, finishing the weekend with a .367 team batting average. **Eric Charles** (6-for-13), **David Miller** (6-for-13), **Kevin Plawecki** (5-for-13) and **Stephen Talbott** (4-for-11) hit safely in all three games. **Andrew Dixon** enjoyed a big night at the plate (4-for-4) in the Cincinnati win, finishing the weekend 5-for-8.

• Thanks in part to the opposition committing 14 errors and issuing 16 free passes (11 walks, 5 HBP) over the three games, Purdue had a base runner in 22 of the 25 innings in which the team batted. A trio of 1-2-3 innings in the shutout win against Cincinnati marked the only times the Boilers went in order. Conversely, Purdue only committed two errors and issued eight free passes (4 walks, 4 HBP). The Boilermakers did not make an error or issue a walk in the season-opening win against Connecticut.

BOILERMAKERS AMONG FAVORITES IN BIG TEN

• Tabbed first or second in the preseason predictions by nearly every college baseball publication and website, Purdue entered the 2012 season among the favorites in the Big Ten Conference. Baseball America and College Baseball Insider both predicted the Boilers will win the Big Ten and represent the conference at the NCAA Regionals. Baseball America also predicted Purdue would be a No. 3 seed at Regionals. The league coaches picked the Boilers second to defending conference co-champion Michigan State in the preseason poll.

• Although Purdue has not won a Big Ten title since 1909, the team has certainly come close quite a few times during head coach Doug Schreiber's 14-year tenure. Four times since 2001, the Boilers have either finished in second place (2001, 2005, 2008) or been just one game (or fewer) out of first place in the final standings (2001 & 2011).

• Purdue tied the program's single-season record with 37 wins in 2011. The Boilermakers led the Big Ten in victories and overall winning percentage (.649) a year ago.

STACKED RETURNING LINEUP FEATURES SIX ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

• The Boilermakers' opening day lineup is expected to feature all returning starters that are juniors or seniors. Purdue lost only three players that started games a season ago, with one of those graduated seniors, Payton Bieker, now an assistant coach.

• The opening day lineup is expected to feature six players that have earned All-Big Ten honors during their college careers. **Kevin Plawecki** (First Team catcher), **Barrett Serrato** (First Team outfielder), **Tyler Spillner** (Second Team outfielder), **Cameron Perkins** (Third Team third baseman) and **Stephen Talbott** (Third Team outfielder) were recognized among the best players in the conference at their positions in 2011. Second baseman **Eric Charles**, meanwhile, was a Third Team honoree as a freshman in 2009.

• All five aforementioned players started at least 55 games a season ago. Shortstop **David Miller**, designated hitter/first baseman **Angelo Cianfrocco** and first baseman **Ryan Bridges** are also back this season. Miller was a constant at shortstop and led the Big Ten in walks and on-base percentage in his first season with the program. Bridges and Cianfrocco are expected back at full strength after both missed long stretches of 2011 due to injuries.

• Outfielder **Andrew Dixon** also returns for his senior season. The left-handed hitter started 22 times, making at least one start at all three outfield positions, and played in a team-high 27 games off the bench.

• Plawecki and the outfield trio of Serrato, Spillner and Talbott made history last year. Plawecki was the first Purdue catcher to be named First Team All-Big Ten since 1960. The 1991 season marked the last time that three Purdue outfielders were All-Big Ten honorees in the same year.

FOUR STRAIGHT BIG TEN TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

• Purdue is the only Big Ten team to reach the league tournament in each of the last four seasons, a program-long streak. The Boilermakers have managed to win at least one Big Ten Tournament game each of the last four years, and in eight of their nine tourney appearances under head coach **Doug Schreiber**. Purdue's 58 conference victories over the last four years are also tops in the league.

WELCOME BACK BLAKE & BRIDGES

- While the Boilermakers will be without key starting pitcher **Brad Schreiber** this season due to offseason elbow surgery, Purdue does welcome back a pair of seniors who missed the final weeks of 2011. **Ryan Bridges** had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base when he suffered a broken leg in the finale of the Michigan series on April 10. He was batting .313 with 11 extra-base hits and 21 RBIs at the time of the injury. He had also impressed with his defense at first base.
- **Blake Mascarello** also returns to the active roster after missing the final month of 2011 due to a violation of team rules. The left-hander was a key member of the Purdue bullpen a year ago, compiling a 1.26 ERA in his six Big Ten appearances. Mascarello was a starting pitcher early in the season but proved most valuable in a relief role.
- Mascarello excelled in relief in the 2012 season-opening win against Connecticut, retiring 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings of relief to earn the victory. Bridges started all three games of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge at first base, finishing the weekend 3-for-12 with a walk and squeeze bunt.
- **MASCARELLO IN RELIEF IN 2011: 2-2, SAVE, 12 APP, 24 2/3 IP, 22 H, 5 BB, 24 K, 1.82 ERA**

WITTGREN STARTS SEASON ON STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- After leading the Big Ten with 12 saves and earning Second Team All-Big Ten honors in 2011, closer **Nick Wittgren** has received his fair share of preseason publicity this year. He was named to the NCBWA's Preseason All-America Third Team and was one of 45 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year preseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the list for the award that recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.
- Wittgren finished one save shy of the Purdue single-season record last year. He helped the Boilers establish a new program record with 21 saves as a team. But seven different relievers tallied at least one save, with all seven pitchers back this year.
- Twenty-four of Wittgren's 28 relief appearances on the mound saw him finish a game. He struck out 55 in 51 innings while issuing only 10 walks.

PERKINS' REACHES BASE SAFELY IN EVERY GAME OF 2011

- Highlighted by a 20-game hitting streak, **Cameron Perkins** managed to reach base safely in every game (56) in which he played in 2011. Dating back to 2010, he has reached base safely in 66 consecutive games. That ranked as the third longest active streak in the country entering the 2011 Big Ten Tournament.
- Perkins went hitless in the May 19 series opener against Iowa but his streak continued thanks to a dropped third strike on a passed ball. That was the opening play of a five-run eighth inning that allowed Purdue to rally for a victory.
- Perkins has reached base safely 126 times during his streak, collecting 96 hits, 12 walks and getting hit by a pitch 23 times. That's good for an on-base percentage of .419.
- In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 42 consecutive contests dating back to last season. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 49 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .425 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 94 times (70 hits, eight walks, 16 hit by pitch).

HAASE BEGINS 2012 AS SENIOR STAFF ACE

- Senior **Joe Haase** began the 2011 season in the bullpen but quickly emerged as one of Purdue's top pitchers and finished the year as the team leader in innings pitched. He started a game in each of the eight Big Ten weekend series and shared the team lead with 13 starts total. The right-hander begins the 2012 campaign as the team's Friday starter and ace of the pitching staff.
- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, a win against Minnesota at Target Field, Haase was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances during the first half of the season. He worked at least six innings in six of his nine starts against Big Ten rivals, finishing just one out shy of a complete game in the middle win game in the series sweep of Indiana.
- Haase also took the ball in the midweek games against nationally-ranked foes Louisville and Vanderbilt. He led the way in the win at Louisville, surrendering only two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings. He continued his mastery of Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament, keeping the gritty Gophers off the scoreboard until the seventh inning in a game the Boilers lost, 1-0.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT THIEF

- Purdue was active on the base paths for much of the 2011 season, successfully stealing at least one base in 42 of the 57 games. Twelve Boilermakers swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** led the way at a perfect 17-for-17. After stealing a pair of bases successfully at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge the junior is a perfect 24-for-24 in his career.
- Talbott was a Third Team All-Big Ten outfielder in 2011 thanks in part to ranking second in the conference with 54 runs scored. He did not bat any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he batted no higher than seventh in 46 of the 55 games he started.
- Talbott nearly single-handedly won the opener of the Illinois series (May 13) thanks to a solo home run, double, insurance run and throwing out a runner at the plate. In the third inning, he threw out a runner at the plate to end the top of the frame and homered to open the bottom half.

BREEDLOVE & GUNTER OPEN 2012 IN STARTING ROTATION

- As two of the 15 seniors on the 2012 roster, **Lance Breedlove** and **Calvin Gunter** earned the right to join **Joe Haase** in the starting rotation as the new season opens. Together they made 39 appearances last season, starting 12 games. In his first year with the program, Breedlove joined **Nick Wittgren** as the only Purdue pitchers to appear on the mound in every weekend of the 2011 season. The right-hander made starts against Lipscomb, Tennessee-Martin, Minnesota and Illinois-Chicago. Breedlove made 15 of his 24 appearances in Purdue wins.
- Gunter finished the 2011 season as a member of the starting rotation. He earned the right to replace the injured **Brad Schreiber** in the rotation thanks to a quality spot start (5 2/3 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 4 K) in the rubber game win at Northwestern. He followed up that performance with 6 2/3 innings of one-run relief over two appearances in the series sweep of Indiana, earning the win in the finale thanks to 3 1/3 innings of one-hit work. The left-hander struck out a career-high seven over 5 1/3 innings in the middle game of the Iowa series.

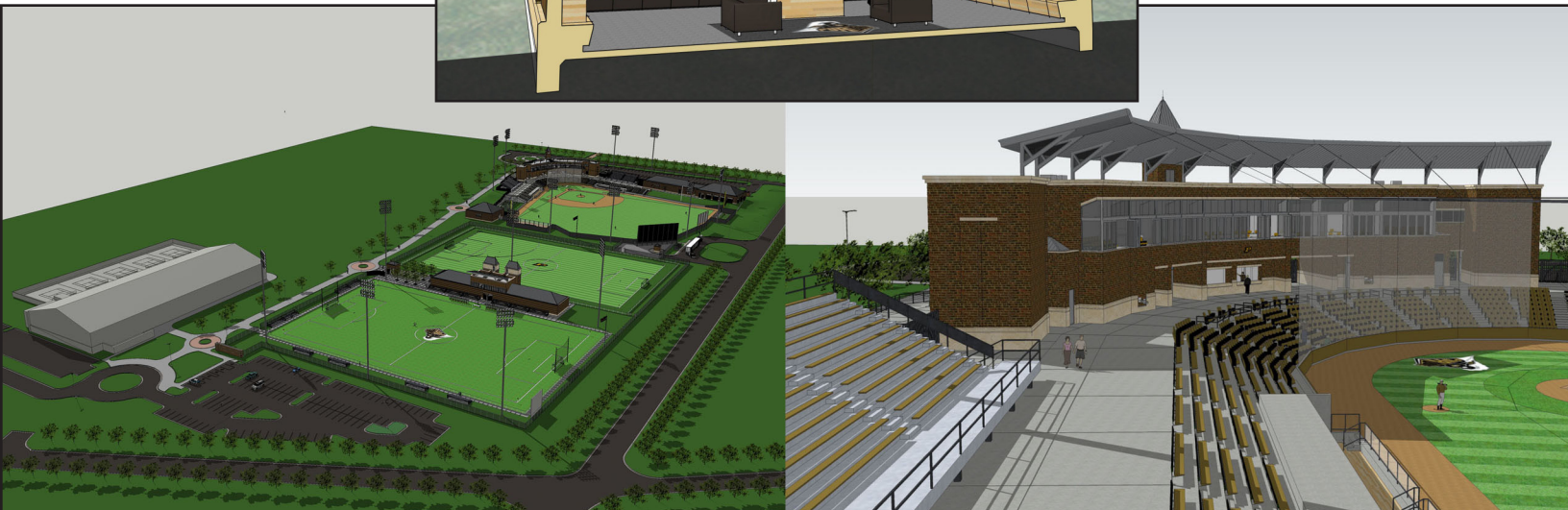
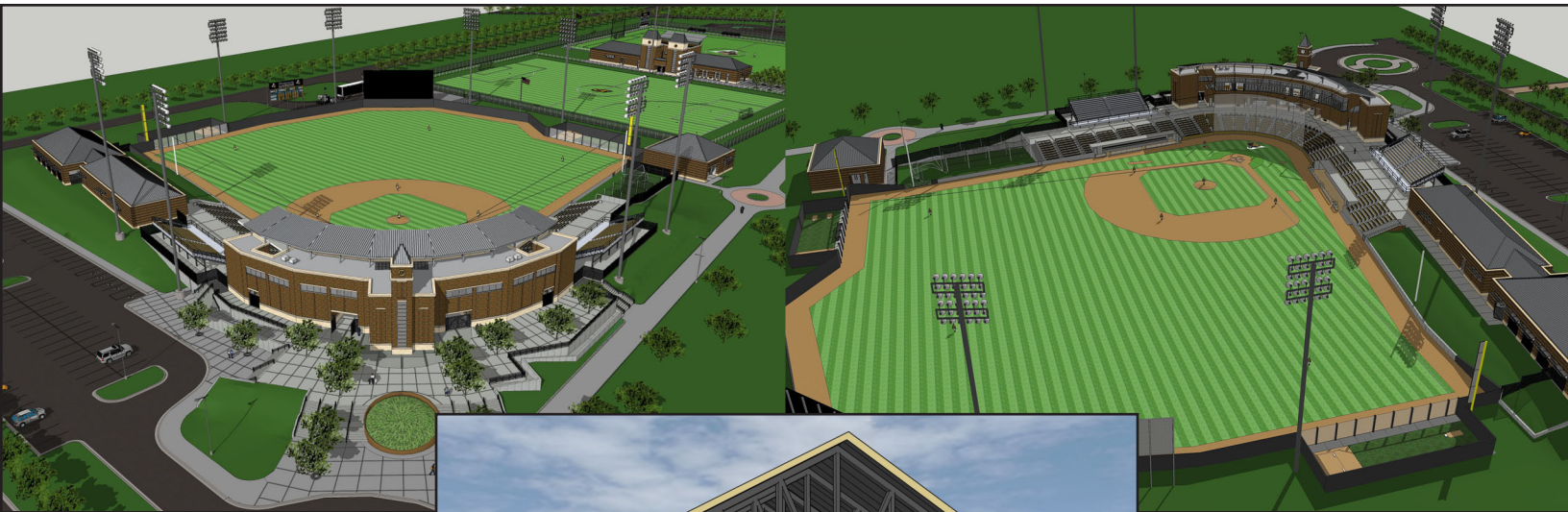

Coming Soon: Alexander Field at the Northwest Athletics Complex Construction Began in Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
