## **GAME NOTES**

- This is the third meeting between Purdue and Chicago State, the last time coming in 1977. With the win, Purdue now holds a 2-1 advantage.
- Purdue came out firing, rushing to a 14-1 lead in the first three and half minutes.
- Four different Purdue players (Rayburn, Moses, Houser and Samantha Woods) made three-point shots in the first half, which helped the Boilermakers to a 40-25 halftime score. A total of five Boilermakers made three-pointers in the game.
- The first four and half minutes of the second half saw Purdue go on a 14-6 run to gain a lead of 22 points.
- Every player saw double-digits minutes and every player scored at least two points. Rayburn and Houser both ended with double-digit point totals, 13 and 11 respectively.

## **TEAM HIGHS AND LOWS**

- Purdue forced 28 turnovers from Chicago State, which is an opponent high this season.
- The Boilermakers made a season-high six three-pointers and three-point field percentage of .500.
- Purdue also had its highest field-goal percentage of the season, .571, making 32of-56 shots on 26 assists.
- Dee Dee Williams picked up her first blocked shot of the season in the first half of the game. She also set a season-high point total with four points and nabbed her first steal of the season.
- Houser made her first blocked shot in her Purdue career. She set a career high for assists with seven.
- Liza Clemons set a career and season high point total with four. She also set a career and season high blocked shot total with two.
- Antoinette Howard made her first three-pointer of the season in the second half of the game.
- Torrie Thornton scored her first points of her career with two. She also set a season and career rebounding total with four.
- Purdue tied the school record for blocks in a game with 13. The last time the Boilermakers blocked 13 shots was against Indiana on Jan. 6, 2005.
