#### **BOILERMAKERS TRAVEL TO IOWA CITY FOR FOURTH TIME IN FIVE YEARS**

• Purdue continues Big Ten play and closes out the month of September with a Friday night game at lowa. The Boilermakers will be visiting lowa City for the fourth time in the last five years. The Hawkeyes played three games in West Lafayette while making a run to the championship game of the 2014 Big Ten Tournament, but have not played Purdue at Folk Field since 2011. The scheduling quirk is a by-product of Big Ten expansion the last few years and the shift from a 13-game to 11-game conference schedule starting in 2015. The two teams did not play last year. Oddly, the Boilermakers' 2015 and 2016 senior classes both never played lowa at home during their careers.

#### **GINTHER FINISHES WISCONSIN-MINNESOTA WEEKEND WITH 17 SAVES**

- Goalkeeper **Jordan Ginther** returned to the starting lineup for the first home weekend of Big Ten play, making a combined 17 saves in the losses to Wisconsin and No. 9 Minnesota. She made a career-high nine saves vs. the Badgers and followed that up with eight saves vs. the Gophers. With **Erika Yohn** also making nine saves in games at No. 4 West Virginia and Northwestern this month, a Purdue keeper has stopped nine shots on goal in three of the Boilermakers' last six games. Prior to this season, a Purdue keeper had not made nine saves since the 2012 season finale.
- Ginther's 17 saves were the most by a Boilermaker in consecutive games since Jenny Bradfisch made 19 in October 2008 vs. Minnesota (12) and Iowa (7). However, the Minnesota game went to overtime and was not decided until the 109th minute. Lauren Mason was the last keeper with at least 17 saves in consecutive 90-mintue games. Mason made 21 saves in October 2006 vs. Wisconsin (10) and Illinois (11).

#### SECOND-HALF GOALS BURNING THE BOILERMAKERS

• After giving up five second-half goals during the Wisconsin-Minnesota weekend, Purdue has now been outscored 13-3 in the second half this year. The Badgers rallied to win Sept. 23 at Folk Field thanks to three second-half goals, becoming the first visiting side to score three goals in a half in West Lafayette since Nebraska scored four in the second half of an October 2013 game.

• The Wisconsin game also marked the second time this season that Purdue led for at least half the game but ended up losing. Aug. 21 vs. Montana, the Boilermakers held the lead for 77 minutes but lost in overtime. Wisconsin scored the equalizer and go-ahead goal only one minute and 27 seconds apart. It was the shortest amount of time between goals conceded by Purdue since the Badgers also scored just 27 seconds apart in the first half of their October 2012 win in West Lafayette.

#### MILARO, KOROLAS SCORE FIRST COLLEGIATE GOALS IN BIG TEN PLAY

• Gianna Milaro (at Illinois) and Vanessa Korolas (vs. Wisconsin) both scored their first collegiate goals during the first two weekends of Big Ten play. They joined Hannah Mussallem (2015 vs. Illinois) as active Boilermakers to record their first collegiate goals in a Big Ten game. Prior to Mussallem, Makaela Nellams (2014 vs. Ohio State) and Kate Fowee (2012 vs. Wisconsin) were the last players to accomplish the feat. The 2009 season marked the last time at least two different Boilermakers did it – Jessica Warren (vs. Michigan), Roya Akhavain (vs. Illinois) and Remi Gibba (vs. Iowa).

#### **ALREADY HAD 19 PLAYERS START AT LEAST ONCE**

• With only four Boilermakers – Vanessa Korolas, Gabby La-Mere, Hannah Leinert and Hannah Mussallem – starting each of the first 10 games, Purdue has already had 19 different players start at least once this year. The Boilermakers have used the same starting lineup in consecutive games only once, Sept. 15 to 18 at Illinois and Northwestern (games 7 and 8). The 19 different players to start at least once is already more than last season's total and is just one player shy of the program record from 2001 and 2014.

#### PURDUE POSTS FIRST WIN VERSUS ILLINI IN CHAMPAIGN

• First-half goals from **Erika Arkans** and **Gianna Milaro** staked the Boilermakers to an early lead and the defense took care of the rest in a 2-0 victory at Illinois to kick off Big Ten play Sept. 15. The win was the first by the road team in the Purdue-Illinois series, which dates back to the Boilermakers' inaugural 1998 campaign. Purdue had not tasted victory in Champaign since defeating DePaul and Western Michigan in the first two rounds of the 2003 NCAA Tournament. Michigan and Penn State are now the only Big Ten opponents that the Boilermakers have never beaten on the road.

#### 2-0 HALFTIME LEADS ON THE ROAD ARE RARE

- In the victory at Illinois, Erika Arkans scored her fifth career game-winning goal and sixth career goal overall in Big Ten play.
   Gianna Milaro later scored her first collegiate goal of any kind.
   Milaro became the first Boilermaker to score her first goal this season.
   Vanessa Korolas later did so as well vs. Wisconsin.
- The scores gave Purdue a 2-0 lead at halftime, marking only the 11th time in program history (since 2000) that the Boilermakers have enjoyed a two-goal advantage at the break in a true road game. Purdue had not held such an advantage in a Big Ten road game since an October 2011 win at Minnesota.

#### STREAKS END DURING OPENING WEEKEND OF BIG TEN PLAY

- Three notable streaks came to an end during Purdue's Illinois-Northwestern road trip to begin Big Ten play. The Boilermakers ended their nine-game losing streak against the Illini in Champaign. Purdue also won its conference opener for the first time since 2008, ending a five-game losing streak and seven-game winless drought in the process.
- Unfortunately, the Boilermakers' five-game winning streak in Evanston also came to an end with the 2-0 loss at Northwestern. It was the longest win streak in program history vs. any opponent on that foe's home pitch. Purdue had never been shut out in Evanston until this year. But Northwestern was able to extend its program-record shutout streak to 627 consecutive minutes by keeping the Boilermakers off the scoreboard.

#### **UTAH GAME CALLED AFTER 60 MINUTES DUE TO T-STORMS & LIGHTNING**

- Purdue led Utah 1-0 at the top of the 61st minute in its September 9 non-conference finale when a long line of thunderstorms produced lightning that first delayed and later forced the cancellation of the game before it became official.
- Andrea Petrina scored in the 37th minute to give Purdue a halftime lead. But the storms arrived in full force about 8:20 p.m., leading to the lightning delay. By rule, the game was not permitted to be restarted three hours after kickoff (7 p.m.). Therefore, when lightning was still within 10 miles of the stadium at 9:30 p.m., the game was officially called and ruled a no contest because 70 minutes were not completed. It will not be rescheduled.
- It was the Boilermakers' first scheduled contest that did not go final since a 2012 home game against Milwaukee was canceled due to lightning before it could kick off. Two weeks ago, the opening kickoff of Purdue's road game at Baylor was delayed about 80 minutes due to lightning in Waco, Texas.

#### **PURDUE SHUT OUT AT DAYTON DESPITE RECORDING 23 SHOTS**

• The Boilermakers enjoyed an advantage in the shot count (23-17) and number of corner kicks created (10-6), but Dayton goalkeeper Kaelyn Johns made eight saves to help her team win the game 3-0. Purdue's 23 shots were its most in a loss since October 2013 and matched its most ever in a 90-minute game in which it was shut out.

 Purdue was shut out in both games of its Labor Day Weekend road trip, getting blanked in consecutive games for only the second time under second-year head coach Drew Roff. Led by Erika Yohn's career-high nine saves, the most by a Purdue goalkeeper since the 2012 season

finale, the Boilermakers played well defensively in the Sept. 1 loss at No. 4 West Virginia. The game remained scoreless until the 66th minute. But the loss kept Purdue winless against top-25 teams since August 2009 when the team posted an upset win at No. 6 Texas A&M.

#### PETRINA, LASKY SCORE IN FIRST TWO WINS

• In each of Purdue's first two wins this season the goals came from **Andrea Petrina** and **Mikayla Lasky**, in that order. It marked the fifth time in program history (since 1998) that the same two players both scored in each of the Boilermakers' first two victories, also happening in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2013. However, in each of the previous four occurrences, Purdue scored at least a combined six goals in those first two wins. This year it was only four goals, all from Petrina and Lasky.

#### **BIG TEN PRESEASON HONORS LIST**

- Returning starters **Vanessa Korolas**, **Hannah Leinert** and **Dannah Williams** were highlighted among the Big Ten's preseason honors list unveiled the week of the season opener by the conference office. They were among the Boilermakers' most consistent players last year, making a combined 51 starts.
- Korolas entered her junior season having started all 37 regular-season games at outside back the last two years. She and Williams are the most experienced part of the Purdue backline. Williams started 16 games as a freshman a year ago, making the move from midfielder to center back during the opening weekend of Big Ten play. She went on to play every minute of the remainder of the season after the transition. After starting the first two games this year, she has now logged 1,120 consecutive minutes. Korolas was second on the team in minutes played in 2015. Williams was one of only six sophomores on the Big Ten list.
- Leinert missed only one game in her first year as a Boilermaker, contributing to 12 of the team's 28 goals by scoring seven times and assisting on five other goals. She accounted for game-winning goals in victories vs. Evansville, Montana and Nebraska while also making significant contributions in wins vs. Illinois and Maryland. The Illinois State transfer has scored 36 goals during her college career.

#### PURDUE RALLIES FOR OVERTIME WIN VERSUS CINCINNATI

 The Boilermakers bounced back from their 5-1 loss at Baylor with an overtime win against a Cincinnati team that qualified for the NCAA Tournament last season and entered the day 3-0 on the young season. Mikayla Lasky's golden goal in the 97th minute lifted Purdue to its first overtime win at home since August 2012. However, the Boilermakers have now won at least one OT affair in each of the last five seasons

 Purdue won the game despite trailing 1-0 for 37 minutes until Andrea Petrina scored on a penalty kick in the 80th minute. In program history (since

2000), that represented the second longest amount of time the Boilermakers trailed in a game they ended up winning. Purdue was victorious after conceding the game's first goal for the first time since October of last year at Maryland. But the Boilermakers had not won at home after conceding the first goal since October 2011 vs. Ohio State. Coincidentally, current assistant coach Katie Baumgardner was the starting goalkeeper for OSU that day.

#### FIRST BLOWOUT LOSS IN A WHILE

- The 5-1 loss at Baylor on Aug. 26 in a game that was delayed about 85 minutes due to lightning was Purdue's most lopsided defeat in some time. The Boilermakers had not trailed by four goals since an October 2014 loss at No. 25 Rutgers and had not conceded five goals since a 6-1 loss at No. 8 Penn State in September 2013.
- · Purdue was competitive throughout its 2015 campaign, suffering only two losses by multiple goals and trailing by two goals or more for only 110 of the 1671 minutes of regular-season action.

#### PETRINA SCORES IN OPENING MINUTE OF SECOND HALF

 Andrea Petrina had a goal and an assist in the season-opening win, becoming just the fourth player since 2000 to accomplish the feat in the first game of the season. She also scored in the first game for the second year in a row. By scoring at the 45:57 mark, she accounted for the third fastest goal to begin the second half in program history (since 2000).
