BOILERMAKERS OPEN BIG TEN PLAY IN MICHIGAN

- · Purdue kicks off conference play by continuing its five-game road stretch with a visit to the state of Michigan. The Boilermakers played at Michigan in October 2015 but have not made the Michigan-Michigan State road trip since October 2013. Purdue has played regular-season road games in 20 different locations since its last trip to East Lansing. After this weekend, Nebraska (last visit in October 2014) will be the conference rival the Boilermakers have gone the longest without playing on the road. The Huskers travel to Folk Field next month.
- Purdue head coach Drew Roff is an Ann Arbor native and Michigan State alum, playing forward for the MSU men's team in the mid-90s. Sarah Clark (Brighton) and Maddy Olsen (Battle Creek) are also Michigan natives.

PURDUE PLAYING WELL ENTERING BIG TEN ACTION

 The Boilermakers begin conference play ranked tied for second in the Big Ten with 17 goals. Purdue has compiled a plus-10 goal differential entering the Big Ten season for the first time since 2009. Of the previous six teams in program history to compile a doublefigure goal differential entering league play, four went on to qualify for the NCAA Tournament. The 17 goals are the most since the 2013 team scored 26 in its eight non-conference games.

WILLIAMS' HAT TRICK LEADS TO BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

. Maddy Williams' hat trick in the win at Louisville earned the senior her second career Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor. She posted the fifth hat trick in program history, tying the Boilermakers' record for goals in a game. She scored three minutes and six seconds apart in the first half. The third score of the natural hat trick was also her 30th career goal and 10th career game winner.

· Williams was also named the Big Ten's Offensive Player of the Week in October 2013 after she scored the lone goal in consecutive 1-0 wins vs. Illinois and Northwestern. She joins Jessica Okoroafo (4) and Parrissa Eyorokon (2) as Boilermakers to win Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week multiple times during their careers. Goalkeepers Lauren Mason (6) and Jenny Bradfisch (2) were also Defensive Player of the Week winners on multiple occasions.

SCORED FIRST IN EVERY GAME; 9-GAME GOAL SCORING STREAK

- · Dating back to the 2016 season finale, the Boilermakers have scored first in eight consecutive games. That represents the longest scored-first streak in program history. The 2009 and 2015 teams scored first in their first six games. The 2002 and 2006 teams also posted six-game streaks in which they scored first.
- Purdue has also scored in the first half of all seven games, registering goals in the opening 10 minutes of a match three times. For the season, the Boilermakers have held the lead for 438 of the 630 minutes (70 percent) while trailing for just seven minutes.
- · Purdue has scored in nine straight games overall dating back to the penultimate game of the 2016 campaign. That's the team's longest streak since scoring in the first 13 games of the 2013 campaign. The Boilermakers are also currently riding a nine-game scoring streak at Folk Field dating back to October 2016.

WILLIAMS LEADS BIG TEN IN POINTS & GAME WINNERS

- · Maddy Williams enters Big Ten play leading the league with 16 points and four game-winning goals. She's also second with six goals. She registered a point in each of the first games this season, recording the second six-game point streak of her career. She's the only Boilermaker to accomplish that feat.
- · By scoring the game-winning goal in the victories vs. DePaul, Dayton and Louisville, Williams became the first Boilermaker since Shauna Stapleton in 2007 to account for the decisive score in three consecutive contests. Her four game winners are already good for fourth most in a season at Purdue.

PURDUE POSTS LONG SHUTOUT STREAK

- The Boilermakers won three straight games in shutout fashion for the first time since midway through the 2013 campaign. Purdue's shutout streak was snapped at 358 consecutive minutes when Louisville scored in the 87th minute. The streak ranked as the sixth longest in program history.
- The Boilermakers came within four minutes of recording four or more consecutive shutouts for only the fifth time in program history. The 2007 team, which won 20 games while conceding only 12 goals, accomplished the feat twice and was the last to do so.

TEN WINS UNDER ROFF WHEN GIVING UP A GOAL

• Including the preseason victory vs. Iowa State this year, Purdue has found a way to win 11 times when conceding a goal under third-year head coach **Drew Roff**. Seven of those victories have come in 2-1 fashion. Overall, the Boilermakers are 11-21-1 (.348) when conceding at least one goal under Roff (including preseason). From 2012 to 2014, Purdue was 9-32-5 (.250) when surrendering a goal.

MOOSE TO MADDY GIVES PURDUE A PAIR OF EARLY LEADS

- The Boilermakers held the lead for 166 of the 180 minutes during the DePaul-Dayton weekend after **Maddy Williams** scored in the opening 10 minutes of both wins. Right back **Hannah Mussallem** set up both goals with excellent long passes from the midfield stripe along the west sideline. Both passes beat the opposition's back line over the top.
- After also scoring in the win at Louisville, Williams recorded a goal in three straight games for the second time in her career.

PURDUE BLOWS OUT INDIANA STATE WITH MOST GOALS SINCE 2011

- The Boilermakers scored five times in a span of 25 minutes in the second half to turn a one-goal lead into a 6-0 victory vs. Indiana State on Aug. 27. The six goals were the team's most since 2011. **Sarah Griffith** scored in the sixth minute to give Purdue an early lead.
- With Hannah Mussallem, Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase also scoring in the ISU win, it marked the first time since a 2013 win vs. Dartmouth that four Boilermakers scored in the same game. The 2013 season also marked the last time six different players scored over Purdue's first three games, a feat accomplished this year after Hannah Melchiorre and Maddy Williams scored goals during the season-opening weekend.

FRESHMEN SCORE FIRST OFFICIAL GOALS IN SAME GAME

• Although **Sarah Griffith** scored in both preseason wins, her goal vs. Indiana State became her first official tally. With she and **Kylie Hase** both recording their first goals in the victory, it marked the first time two freshmen scored their first goals in the same game since an August 2014 win vs. Ohio (Erika Arkans, Nicole Robertson). Including the two preseason wins, a freshman scored Purdue's first goal in each of the first five games this year.

HIGH-SCORING SECOND HALF

- In the Indiana State win, the Boilermakers scored five goals in a half for the first time since a November 2007 win vs. Indiana. The six total goals represent the team's most since tying the program record with eight in an October 2011 victory vs. Indiana.

- Hannah Mussallem and Andrea Petrina both recorded their first collegiate multi-goal games, each scoring twice in the second half. The 8-2 win vs. IU in 2011 marked the last time Purdue had a pair of players record multi-goal

efforts in the same game. But it had been a decade, the 2007 win vs. IU, since two Boilermakers each scored twice in the same half.

MADDY WILLIAMS RECORDS 20TH CAREER ASSIST

- Maddy Williams recorded her 20th career assist on Sarah Griffith's goal early in the Indiana State win, becoming just the fourth Boilermaker to reach the benchmark. She also set up Hannah Mussallem's first goal of the second half to register her third career multi-assist effort.
- Williams has had a direct impact on 52 goals during her Purdue career, good for second most in program history. She's just one assist away from former teammate Alex Hairston's program record (23).
- Hannah Melchiorre set up goals by Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase in the Indiana State win, becoming the

first Boilermaker to assist on a pair of goals in a half since a September 2015 win at Montana. An August 2014 win vs. SIU Edwardsville marked the last time two Purdue players had multiple assists in the same game, a feat accomplished by Melchiorre and Williams vs. ISU.

MELCHIORRE THE FIRST FRESHMAN TO SCORE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- · Hannah Melchiorre accounted for Purdue's first goal of both games during the season-opening weekend. In the process, she became the first freshman in program history to score in each of the PLAYER first two games of a season. Classmate Sarah Griffith did likewise Hannah Melchiorre in both of Purdue's preseason wins, but as exhibition games those goals don't count toward Griffith's career total.
- Maddy Williams (2015) remains the only Boilermaker to ever Alex Hairston Jessica Okoroafo score in each of the first three games of a season.
- · Melchiorre is Purdue's first freshman to account for the Boilermak-
- ers' first goal of a season since Erika Arkans in 2014. However, Alex Hairston (in 2011) was the last Purdue freshman to score the team's first goal of a new campaign in a season opener.

LUCE ONLY THE THIRD FRESHMAN KEEPER TO START A SEASON OPENER

- · Katie Luce started in goal and played all 180 minutes of the season-opening weekend. She is only Purdue's third freshman to start a season opener at goalkeeper. Jocelyn Cavalier in the inaugural 1998 campaign and Lauren Mason in 2003 are the only other Boilermakers to earn the honor.
- · Luce finished the season-opening weekend with 10 saves, making six in the win vs. Kent State. Both total were the most by a Purdue keeper since Clara Kridler made eight and 14 in a 2011 seasonopening road trip to Toledo and West Virginia.

FOUR WINS VERSUS 10-WIN TEAMS FROM 2016

 The Boilermakers posted four of their August wins against teams that won at least 10 games in 2016. Notre Dame (13-3-5), lowa State (10-8-1), Kent State (15-3-2) and DePaul (10-6-3) were a combined 48-20-11 (.677) a year ago. Purdue nearly had another victory against a 10-win team from 2016, but Loyola Marymount (11-5-3) rallied to steal the game 2-1. It marked the only time this season the Boilermakers conceded multiple goals in a game.

FRUSTRATING SECOND-GAME SIMILARITIES

- · Hannah Melchiorre's first-half goal allowed Purdue to hold the lead for 48 minutes, but Loyola Marymount scored twice in the final six minutes to rally for the win Aug. 21 at Folk Field. The Lions scored a pair of quality goals only four minutes and 20 seconds apart, equalizing in the 84th minute and taking the lead in the 88th minute.
- · The Boilermakers also dropped their second game of the 2016 campaign 2-1 after holding the lead for more than half the game. Purdue lost to Montana in overtime after holding the lead for 77 minutes. By leading for 48 minutes, the LMU defeat ranks tied for third in program history among games Purdue ended up losing despite holding the lead for a long stretch.

LONG HOMESTAND TO BEGIN THE REGULAR SEASON

- · For the second time in three years, Purdue began the regular with five straight games at home. Including the Aug. 12 preseason exhibition win vs. Iowa State, it was a six-game homestand at Folk Field for the Boilermakers. In 2015, Drew Roff's first year as head coach, the Boilermakers also played six straight games at home. They went 5-1 during that stretch en route to posting their first winning season (9-8-1) since 2009.
- · During the homestand this year, Purdue hosted four teams that won at least 10 games in 2016 - Iowa State (10-8-1), Kent State (15-3-2), Loyola Marymount (11-3-5) and DePaul (10-6-3). Kent State and Dayton both qualified for the 2016 NCAA Tournament. DePaul (Alexa Ben) and Dayton (Alexis Kiehl) also featured players on the Hermann Trophy's preseason watch list.
