#### SCHREIBER'S MLB DRAFT PICKS

## HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extraining affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

#### - BOILERS TAKE ON NIU FOR SPLIT-SITE SERIES; HOME OPENER SUNDAY -

Purdue takes on Northern Illinois this weekend for the first time since 1999, squaring off against the Huskies Saturday for a neutral-site doubleheader at Grand Park and Sunday for the home opener at Alexander Field.

The first pitch of Saturday's doubleheader and Sunday's single game is slated for 1 p.m. The Boilermakers (5-9) will take on NIU (8-7) at field D-1 at Grand Park in Westfield, Indiana. Admission to the Grand Park complex is \$5 and parking is free. Normal ticketing procedures are in place for Sunday's home opener at Alexander Field, where parking is always free. Fans that had tickets for the originally scheduled games Friday and Saturday at Alexander Field this weekend can exchange them for general admission tickets to Sunday's home opener or any future home game this season.

Grand Park features numerous fields with artificial turf playing surfaces. Alexander Field's natural grass playing surface most likely would have been ready to go for Saturday if not for the steady rain showers in the Greater Lafayette area for much of Tuesday and again Friday morning.

The Wood brothers square off this week and both corner infielders are the reigning Players of the Week in their leagues. Purdue's **Kyle Wood** was 9-for-11 last weekend at Oklahoma to claim the Boilers' first Big Ten Player of the Week honor since April 1, 2013. NIU's Brad Wood, a freshman third baseman, was 6-for-11 in a series victory at Southern Illinois and was selected as the Mid-American Conference's West Division Player of the Week.

Entering the weekend, **Kyle Wood** is batting .426 for the season after recording multiple in his seven of his last 10 games. Brad Wood's collegiate career is off to a hot start as well. He's batting .333 with 11 RBI. Both brothers have also pitched three innings this season. Brad will face his former St. Laurence High School teammate, **Mike Kornacker**, in the opener of the series.

Northern Illinois is currently on its spring break trip and played each of its first five games of the trip on artificial turf in Carbondale, Illinois. The Huskies swept a March 8 doubleheader against Southern Illinois to win their weekend series with SIU. Midweek games against Murray State were also moved to Carbondale due to field conditions and the teams split a Wednesday doubleheader.

Purdue will play on artificial turf for the first time this season Saturday. But road games at Louisville (March 17), Indiana State (April 7), Illinois (April 11-13) and Michigan (April 17-19) in the coming weeks will also be on turf fields.

Northern Illinois played a three-game series against Bowling Green at Grand Park last year. Notre Dame also played two games against Virginia Tech in Westfield a year ago. The Huskies' first-year head coach, Mike Kunigonis, was an assistant at Virginia Tech last season. There is also a Youngstown State-Milwaukee series scheduled to be played at Grand Park this weekend.

Kunigonis took over the NIU program on January 5, 2015, after 12-year skipper Ed Mathey resigned in late November to become the head coach at North Central College in Naperville, Illinois, for the second time. Kunigonis has the Huskies playing well this season, as they've already enjoyed three winning weekends. Four of NIU's seven losses came at the hands of nationally ranked Texas Tech in Lubbock the weekend of Feb. 20-21.

Northern Illinois starting pitchers Dirk Ormsby (2.91 ERA, .235 B/Avg. in 21 2/3 innings) and Ryan Olson (1.76 ERA, .214 B/Avg in 15 1/3 IP) are both off to strong starts. Brian Sisler is batting .400 and leads the team with eight doubles and 13 RBI.

For Purdue, **Michael Vilardo** and Wood have reached base safely in 12 and 10 consecutive games, respectively. Vilardo has hit safely in 11 of his first 14 games as a Boilermaker and led off a game with a hit six times while batting in the leadoff hole every time. Kornacker has surrendered no more than one run in any of his three starts and earned his first collegiate win last weekend at Oklahoma after working a season-high 5 1/3 innings as he continues to be stretched out.

Dating back to the 2014 home opener, **Matt Gibbs** has only allowed 22 hits in 37 2/3 innings (5.26 hits per nine). The senior has been the Boilers' final pitcher in three of the first five wins this year, officially closing out a pair of victories.

A March 13 home opener would have matched the earliest in Purdue history. The Boilermakers also played their home opener on the 13th of March in 1996. The March 15 home opener would be the second earliest in the record book. During head coach **Doug Schreiber's** tenure (1999-present), the earliest Purdue has ever opened in March 20 (2002). However, throughout the 1990s, the Boilers annually opened at home from March 16-19.

Purdue is 12-4 in home openers under Schreiber, including 12-1 against non-conference opponents. NIU's Mid-American Conference rivals Kent State and Ball State are also on the Boilers' schedule this year.

Purdue is one of six Big Ten teams scheduled to play at home this weekend. Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Nebraska and Ohio State are also hosting home series.



#### PURDUE HOSTS NIU FOR DOUBLEHEADER IN SUBURBAN INDY, HOME OPENER SUNDAY

• The Boilermakers host Northern Illinois for the first time since
March 1999 this weekend. The series will begin with a Saturday
doubleheader at field D-1 at Grand Park in Westfield, Ind., due to
unfavorable field conditions at Alexander Field. But with the fore-
cast for Saturday calling for temperatures in the 60s and plenty of
sunshine, Alexander Field is expected to be ready for action Sun-
day. Northern Illinois played a three-game series against Bowling
Green at Grand Park in March of last season.

- Purdue is 12-4 in home openers under Schreiber, including a 12-1 mark when the home-opening opponent is a non-conference foe.
- The Boilermakers won the series opener at Oklahoma last weekend, 6-3, on the strength of a four-run first inning. It marked the third time Purdue has scored four runs in the first inning this year and the team has gone on to win all three games. The Boilers lost the series after being outscored 20-11 the rest of the weekend. Purdue was down 12-3 entering the sixth inning of the rubber game but scored seven times over the final four frames to pull within three at 13-10. After scoring five times in the top of the eighth, the Boilers' biggest rally since also enjoying a five-run inning at Michigan in May 2013, Purdue brought the potential tying run to the plate.
- In their first-ever trip to the state of Arizona the final weekend of February, the Boilers won their opener at the Phoenix Muni Classic by defeating Gonzaga, 5-3. But Purdue was outscored 33-11 the rest of the weekend to finish the tournament 1-3. The Boilers took a 4-0 lead into the ninth inning against CSU Bakersfield in their final game in Phoenix but were unable to close it out, losing in 11 innings.
- Purdue went 2-2 at the Kleberg Bank College Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas, the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The Boilers swept a doubleheader against three-time defending Southland Conference champion and 2015 preseason favorite Sam Houston State in thrilling fashion Feb. 21, winning both games in their final at-bat. **Michael Vilardo** recorded the game-winning RBI in each game on a sacrifice fly. Purdue lost to Missouri, 1-0, in its final game of the weekend. It was the Boilers' first 1-0 loss since the 2011 season finale against Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament. The Tigers escaped a bases-loaded jam in the sixth inning by turning an unconventional 5-2-3-2 triple play.

#### WOOD WINS B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR MONSTER SERIES AT OKLAHOMA

- **Kyle Wood** did something productive in 12 of his 14 plate appearances in Purdue's series at Oklahoma (March 6-8), earning the junior first baseman Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was 9-for-11 with a three-run double, two solo home runs, seven RBI, two walks and four runs scored. He had multiple hits in all three games, highlighted by his first collegiate four-hit effort Sunday.
- Wood put up his big numbers predominantly against a tough Oklahoma rotation. The Sooners' starting pitchers combined for 24 strikeouts over 17 1/3 innings in the series. But Wood also delivered an RBI single in his final at-bat of the weekend to win a lefty-lefty matchup vs. OU's closer in the eighth inning of Sunday's rubber game.
- Wood has reached base safely in 10 consecutive games, recording multiple hits in seven of those contests. After also putting together a three-hit effort Feb. 28 vs. CSU Bakersfield, he's 12-for-16 over the last four games.
- Wood is Purdue's first Big Ten Player of the Week honoree since **Kyle Johnson** was named Player and Freshman of the Week on April 1, 2013, following the Boilers' first-ever sweep at Penn State.

#### GIBBS THE FINAL PITCHER ON THE MOUND FOR THREE OF PURDUE'S FIRST FIVE WINS

- Matt Gibbs struck out Oklahoma's No. 3 hitter with the bases loaded to close out the Boilers' 6-3 seriesopening win in Norman. It was the only out he recorded, but he still managed to be the team's final pitcher in a win for the third time this year despite pitching only 3 2/3 innings. He was the winning pitcher in both games of the Feb. 21 doubleheader sweep of Sam Houston State.
- Gibbs has surrendered only two hits this year, the second of which was a line drive comebacker off his elbow that forced him to leave the game in the March 8 rubber game at Oklahoma. That runner came around to score and stands as the only run the senior has been charged with this season.
- Dating back to the 2014 home opener, Gibbs has given up only 22 hits in 37 2/3 innings (5.26 hits per nine). By surrendering only 5.77 hits per nine innings last year, he posted the sixth best single-season clip in Purdue history. His 4.91 hits per nine in Big Ten play was a new program record. He posted a streak of 17 consecutive scoreless innings over seven appearances from April 5-25, 2014.

#### **RUBBER GAME STRUGGLES**

• Purdue did not win a weekend series in 2014 due in part to an 0-6 record in rubber games. Four times the Boilers won the opener of the series, but ended up losing two-of-three. The same thing happened the at Oklahoma this year (March 6-8). Purdue has lost 10 straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on 12 occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Nine of those 12 series have been in Big Ten play.

#### 10 EXTRA-INNING GAMES SINCE ST. PATRICK'S DAY 2014; LOTS OF DOUBLEHEADERS EARLY THIS YEAR

- After blowing a four-run lead in the ninth inning en route to losing to CSU Bakersfield in 11 innings on Feb. 28, 10 of Purdue's last 51 games (20 percent) dating back to St. Patrick's Day 2014 have gone to extra innings. The Boilers' eight extra-innings games last year were the most during **Doug Schreiber's** 17-year tenure as head coach and are believed to be the most in program history overall. Purdue is 4-6 in the 10 extra-innings game, including 1-1 this year.
- The March 14 doubleheader vs. Northern Illinois will be Purdue's fourth of the season already. The Boilers played three doubleheaders over a span of 13 days from Feb. 14-26 and four in 29 days from Feb. 13-March 14. Purdue had not played a doubleheader in three consecutive weekends since 2008, the final year of the Big Ten schedule featuring a doubleheader of two seven-inning games every Saturday.

#### FRAWLEY STELLAR IN START VERSUS BAKERSFIELD

- Matt Frawley surrendered only three singles and one walk over seven shutout innings, striking out five and putting together the finest outing of the young season by a Purdue pitcher in the Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield in Phoenix. He worked three 1-2-3 innings and retired 15 of 16 batters from the second through seventh innings. His strikeout and innings pitched totals were career highs as a Boilermaker. It marked the first time a Purdue pitcher worked at least seven shutout innings in an outing since Lance Breedlove led the way in a 3-0 win against Indiana at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament with 7 1/3 shutout innings.
- Bakersfield opened the ninth inning with five consecutive hits to rally for four runs and tie the game. Purdue was fortunate to get the game to extra innings after CSUB had the go-ahead run on third base with no outs. **Alex Lyons** got out of the jam thanks in part to an inexplicable suicide squeeze attempt with an 0-2 count on the batter with one out in the inning. However, the game marked the first time the Boilers suffered a loss after taking the lead into the ninth since the finale of last season's series at Minnesota when they gave up a three-run lead.

#### FIVE DOUBLE PLAYS IN GAME ONE WIN, NINE FOR THE DAY VERSUS GONZAGA - BUT NONE SINCE

- Purdue tied a program record with five double plays in the game one win en route to finishing the Feb. 26 doubleheader vs. Gonzaga with nine twin killings. The five double plays were the most since the Boilers' turned four in a March 2012 win at Murray State. Gonzaga helped give Purdue a pair DPs in the game one win after an illegal slide into second base as the Boilers went for a 3-6-1 twin killing. An inning later, a runner tried to score from second base on a sac fly to right center after **Kyle Johnson** slipped while making the catch. But the quickly flipped the ball to **Jeff Evak**, who hit cutoff man **Cody Strong** and Purdue completed the F8-942 at Illinois St. 3/28/14 at Illinois
- Undoubtedly the most exciting double play of the nine was the game-ending line drive to **Harry Shipley** at shortstop. Gonzaga had the bases loaded with one out and Purdue was clinging to a 5-3 lead, but the Boilers successfully doubled off the runner at second base for the final out. It marked the second time this season that Purdue has won on a game-ending double play. Since the start of the 2012 season, the Boilers have turned a game-ending double play with a lead of three runs or fewer eight times.

• The Boilermakers turned 15 double plays in their first nine games season, but none since. Purdue still ranks second in the Big Ten in double plays turned behind only Nebraska (16 in 15 games). The Boilers turned 54 double plays in 2014 to lead the Big Ten. Purdue also ranks first in the league this year by throwing out 11 base stealers (11-of-23). **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out 7-of-12 base stealers to rank seventh nationally in caught stealing percentage (.583) entering the week.

#### KRIEG'S REACHED BASE SAFELY STREAK SNAPPED AT 26

- · Brandon Krieg hit safely in each of the first seven games this season, extending his reached base safely streak to 26 consecutive games dating back to 2014. It ranked as the 13th longest active streak in the country when it was snapped Feb. 26 in game one of the doubleheader with Gonzaga. He had hit safely in 20 of the 26 games and overtook Kyle Wood's 24-game run last year for the longest reached base streak by an active Boiler. Cameron Perkins reached base safely in 50 consecutive games in 2011.
- Even with the streak snapped, Krieg is still off to a much better start at the plate than a year ago. Through 11 games last season he was 3-for-38. But he batted .325 from April 15 through the end of the season in 2014 and has hit safely in nine of the first 11 games this year.

#### VILARDO, PICCHIOTTI & GIBBS STAR IN WILD DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP OF SHSU

- Purdue scored twice in the bottom of the 12th inning to rally for a 4-3 victory against Sam Houston State in the first DATE game of a neutral-site doubleheader in Corpus Christi Feb. 2/21/15 SHSU (G1) 4-3 (12) 21. Alec Olund scored the game-winning run as pinch runner on Michael Vilardo's sacrifice fly to right center field. Vilardo 4/15/14 joined Kyle Wood and Brandon Krieg as active Boilers with 5/15/12 a game-winning RBI in a walk-off victory.
- · In the nightcap of the doubleheader, Purdue overcame deficits of 3-0 and 7-2 to win 9-7 after scoring three times in the 4/29/11 top of the ninth inning. Vilardo again delivered the go-ahead 4/02/10 run with a sacrifice fly. Cody Strong led off the final inning of both games with a base hit against SHSU closer Ryan Brin-5/06/06 ley, who suffered both losses after giving up a combined five 4/12/06 runs. Brinley entered the day having not allowed a run in his 27 innings of relief for SHSU dating back to 2014.
- Jack Picchiotti drove in the game-tying run in both games 5/14/05 of the doubleheader. He came through with a pinch-hit, two- 5/14/05 lowa (G1) out RBI single in the seventh inning of game one. In the nightcap, he also singled home the tying run and later scored the go-ahead tally on Vilardo's sac fly. Daniel Sander's pinch hit
- double plated the game-tying run in the 12th inning of game one. It was Sander's first hit as a Boilermaker.
- · Of the 21 innings played in the SHSU doubleheader, Purdue only held the lead in the final inning of both games The Boilers had not swept a doubleheader since April 2012 vs. Illinois. Matt Gibbs earned the victory in both games of the twinbill after retiring seven of the nine batters he faced over three scoreless innings of relief. He induced and started a game-ending double play in the nightcap and became the first Purdue pitcher since Chris Toneguzzi in April 2006 to earn the victory in consecutive games. Krieg, Vilardo and Wood joined Gibbs on the All-Tournament Team.
- The five-run deficit (7-2) the Boilers overcame in game two marked their largest comeback since scoring 10 times in the ninth inning at UCLA in May 2012 to rally back from a 10-5 hole entering the frame. However, Purdue's last win after trailing in the ninth inning was a May 2012 victory against Indiana State, 2-1 in 10 innings, in the final game at Lambert Field. A May 2005 doubleheader sweep of Iowa at Lambert is believed to be the last time Purdue won two games on the same day in its final at-bat.

#### STRONG OUTINGS FROM HAAN, McELROY & BRYANT IN CORPUS CHRISTI

- · While Matt Gibbs garnered All-Tournament Team honors after earning the win in both games of the Sam Houston State doubleheaders, he was just one of a number of Purdue pitchers that strong outings in South
- · As the starting pitcher in game one vs. SHSU, Brett Haan escaped a bases loaded jam in the first inning and went on to retire 10 consecutive batters. Both runs he was charged with scored after he left the mound in the sixth with the game still scoreless. Tim McElroy retired nine of the 10 batters he faced in game one vs. SHSU to help get the game into extra innings. The lefty also pitched an inning of scoreless relief Sunday against Missouri
- Shane Bryant allowed a pair of inherited runners to score in game one vs. SHSU, but closed the weekend with four innings of two-hit relief, retiring 11 of the 13 batters he faced. The righthander retired the first seven batters he faced while working 1-2-3 innings in the sixth and seventh, Purdue's first 1-2-3 frames of the game.

#### PURDUE PITCHERS STRIKE OUT 15 IN GAME THREE WIN AT WCU

• Matt Frawley (5), Kyle Wood (7) and Joe Eichmann (3) teamed up to strike out 15 Western Carolina batters as Purdue won game three of the series in Cullowhee, 9-5. It ranked as the third-highest strikeout total in program history and the most since the Boilers fanned 16 in a March 2010 victory at Ohio. Frawley struck out four his first time through the lineup. Wood struck out seven of the 15 batters he faced, striking out the side in the sixth and seventh innings. Eichmann struck out WCU's 2-3-4 hitters in order after giving up a leadoff walk and a batter reaching on an error to open the ninth inning. The senior earned his first career save.

- · Wood's career-high strikeout total was the most by a Purdue pitcher since Jordan Minch and Connor Podkul both fanned seven as starters last season. However, they pitched at least six innings each time. Wood racked up his seven Ks in only three innings. Matt Gibbs and Tim McElroy both struck out six in a relief appearance last season, but Wood's seven Ks were the most by a Purdue reliever since Pat Gannon had seven over four innings in a March 2011 win at Tennessee Tech.
- · Overall, Purdue pitchers have been more aggressive in the strike zone than what they demonstrated for much of last season. The Boilers have recorded 87 strikeouts vs. 51 walks (a 1.71 K/BB ratio) over the first 14 games. A year ago, the pitching staff had only 17 more strikeouts (243) than walks (226), a 1.08 K/BB ratio.
