Getting To Mackey Arena

From the North

Take I-65 south to Exit 193 (US 231). There is more than one exit for SR 231. Take US 231 South to US 52 (approx. 13 miles to a red flashing light). Turn left on US 52 (approx. five miles veer right onto ramp for Purdue/West Lafayette, Northwestern Avenue) Now on Northwestern, go through second stoplight and Mackey Arena is on your right.

From the South

Take I-65 north to Exit 175 (SR 25). Off the exit, turn left at stoplight. Go to first stoplight, (US 52) and turn right. Go to fourth stoplight, Yeager Road, turn left. Go to next stoplight, Northwestern Avenue and turn left. Go through second stoplight and Mackey Arena is on the right.

From the East

Take SR 26 to West Lafayette (becomes State Street). Follow State Street to Grant Street and turn right. Turn left onto Northwestern Avenue. After the first stoplight, Mackey Arena is on the left.

From the West

Follow US 231 into West Lafayette. Road turns into South River Road west of the river. At the stoplight, turn left onto State Street. Turn right at Grant Street. Turn left onto Northwestern Avenue Mackey Arena is on your left.





Credentials

All media credentials and parking passes should be arranged by contacting (via mail, fax or e-mail) Mark Leddy in the Sports Information office. Requests should be made on office letterhead or e-mailed at least one week in advance of an event. All credentials for reporters and photographers are limited to professionals in the mass media and will be evaluated on a first-come, first-served basis with the following priority:

- 1. Local and metropolitan newspapers, wire services, television networks, national publications, opponent student and area news outlets.
- 2. Daily newspapers that regularly cover Purdue men's basketball.
- 3. Web sites affiliated with recognized and fully accredited local, state and national news organizations. However, credentials will not be granted to both a Web site and another medium of the same entity for the same game.
- 4. Other requests from television or radio stations and newspapers will be handled on a space-available basis, with preference given to those that regularly cover Purdue men's basketball.
- 5. Freelance reporters and photographers must be on assignment to receive credentials. Credentials must be visibly worn at all times.

Covering a Purdue Basketball Game

A media work room in Mackey Arena is available for all media members. The work room contains work space, phone lines, internet access and press materials, including stats, game notes and media guides. Phone lines will not be available on press row unless ordered in advance.

A media hospitality meal is served in the work room, courtesy of Purdue Sports Information.

Postgame press conferences take place adjacent to the media work room. All interviews, with the exception of opposing players, take place in the interview room. The postgame press conference order is determined prior to each game. Any additional one-on-one interviews with players should be arranged with the team's sports information director.

Midweek Interviews

Contact Mark Leddy in Sports Information to arrange interviews with head coach Matt Painter or Purdue players. Players will be available before practice throughout the week. All interviews must be arranged at least one day in advance. No interviews will be conducted with Purdue players on the day of a game.

Teleconferences will be held most Mondays and Thursdays during the season. For information on how to access the teleconferences, please contact Mark Leddy.

Practice Coverage

Purdue practices generally are closed to the media and public. If you wish to attend a practice, please contact Mark Leddy in advance, as some sessions will be open to the media.

Visiting Radio and Television

There are two ISDN telephone lines, as well as two analog telephone lines, available for use by the opponents' flagship radio station. Please contact Mark Leddy with any questions or concerns. All radio and television originations must be approved in advance by the Purdue Sports Information office.

Telephones

The Purdue Sports Information office provides 10 phone lines per game in the media work room in the lower concourse of Mackey Arena. The lines are available to all media.

Reporters who require a phone on press row will be charged for the phone. Phone rates are \$20 per game or \$120 for the season. To install a private telephone line on the Mackey Arena press row, please contact Debbie Wood with the Verizon business accounts office (765-423-3098) 661 Main Street, Lafayette, IN 47902.
