

Lucas Oil Stadium Guest Conduct Policy and Rules

Lucas Oil Stadium (LOS) has established Guest Conduct Policy and set of rules that will allow everyone in attendance at the stadium to enjoy all aspects of Saturday's Purdue-Notre Dame game. Any violations of these rules could result in immediate ejection from the stadium. These rules include, but are not limited to:

- * Entering the playing field or interfering with the progress of the game
- * Refusing to show ticket stub when asked by a stadium representative
- * Attempting to sit in seats for which you are not ticketed
- * Using foul or abusive language or gestures
- * Threatening other patrons with words and/or actions
- * Fighting
- * Throwing or kicking any object in LOS or onto the playing field
- * Interfering with other guests' ability to enjoy the game
- * Wearing clothing with abusive or vulgar terminology or inappropriate photographs or symbols.
- * Wearing obscene or indecent clothing
- * Standing on seats
- * Stepping over chairs from one aisle to another
- * Standing, sitting or loitering in aisles, ramps or other areas of conveyance
- * Placing food or beverages on walls, ledges or overhangs that may spill or drop on guests below
- * Running inside stadium
- * Disorderly conduct
- * Public intoxication
- * Possession or use of drugs
- * Public indecency
- * Obstructing justice
- * Criminal trespassing
- * Selling items or tickets on LOS property
- * Distributing or displaying handbills without prior consent
- * Smoking inside the stadium to include vapor cigarettes and smokeless tobacco

Those observing other guests violating these policies should report the incident to the nearest building representative, usher or security staff.

Items Not Permitted in Lucas Oil Stadium

For the protection of all fans, the following items are not permitted in Lucas Oil Stadium (LOS) and cannot be stored by LOS personnel:

- * Weapons or fireworks
- * Any object that can be used as a missile
- * Poles or sticks of any kind
- * Containers, bottles, cans, liquid containers and coolers (except for guests with special medical or dietary needs)
- * Food/beverages not dispensed by LOS concessionaire
- * Objects that obstruct another guest's view of the playing surface
- * Artificial noise makers (horns, whistles, electronic instruments)
- * Animals (except ADA service animals)
- * Anything that creates a nuisance or disruption
- * Large purses or backpacks
- * Video recorders
- * Cameras with lenses longer than four inches
- * Laser pointers
- * Promotional items with commercial slogans or identification

Purdue-Notre Dame at Lucas Oil Stadium Security Plan

Ticketing & Entry – At each of the entry points into the facility, ticket takers and searchers will complete a search for beverages, firearms, laser pointers, outside promotional items, prohibited signs/flags/banners and video cameras. Any items that fans attempt to bring in the facility will either be confiscated or the fan will be asked to return the items to their automobiles or hotel rooms. During the ingress period, a voice loop will be playing outside the stadium stating what items are prohibited.

General Public – At the ticket taking locations, **large bags and backpacks will not be allowed in to the stadium.** All smaller bags (purses, camera cases, etc.) will be inspected prior to the ticket scanning location outside of the gate. Ticket takers will use their discretion on the size and purpose of the bag as the stadium does not use a “bag template.” An audio loop will play outside that will include prohibited items. **If a fan approaches with a prohibited item, they will be required to discard the item or return it to the vehicle.**

Americans with Disabilities Act – Lucas Oil Stadium is in complete compliance with ADA and provides ample access to the seating, restroom, and concession areas of the stadium. All security personnel have received training in dealing with ADA issues such as special medical needs as well as service animal entry requests. Guest services personnel will be available to assist fans with wheelchair requests.

Demonstrations Outside the Facility – Lucas Oil Stadium maintains a relationship with the IMPD’s Intelligence Division, which monitors protests that take place in the Indianapolis area. As the event draws near, contact will be made to ask if any information has come to their attention concerning protests. If a group does plan to protest or a group appears without notice, they will not be able to hold their protest on the Indiana Convention Center & Lucas Oil Stadium property. They will be asked to leave the grounds by the Police Officers working the event as well as IMPD.
