## PURDUE HOSTS WISCONSIN & MINNESOTA IN NEED OF STANDINGS POINTS

• After losing all three games of a recent Big Ten road stretch, it's do or die time for the Boilermakers as they host Wisconsin and Minnesota this week to begin a three-game homestand. Purdue enters the week two standings points behind the three teams tied for seventh place and the final Big Ten Tournament berths. With a regular-season finale against league-leading Penn State on the horizon for next Friday, the Boilers need to earn as many points as possible against two opponents that are also in the Big Ten Tournament chase.

• Entering the weekend, Wisconsin (10 points), Iowa (9), Nebraska (9), Indiana (9), Purdue (7) and Michigan State (7) are jockeying for the final three Big Ten Tournament spots. The Boilermakers own a potential tiebreaker against Nebraska but would come up on the short end of tiebreakers versus Iowa, Indiana and Michigan State.

## SHUTOUT IN THREE STRAIGHT GAMES FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1999

• It has gone from feast to famine for Purdue when it comes to consistent goal scoring as of late. After scoring in nine straight games, the team's longest streak since 2009, the Boilers has now been shutout in three straight games for the first time since September 1999. **Alex Hairston** accounted for the team's last goal, scoring in the 21st minute of the Sept. 30 draw with Illinois. Entering the weekend, the current scoring drought stands at 359 consecutive minutes.

## INJURY BUG RESURFACES

• The injury bug once again hit Purdue during the road games at Indiana and Michigan the week of Oct. 8-14. **Hadley Stuart** was sidelined for the first time this season in the loss at Indiana and the Boilers played without **Jessica Warren**, **Jordan Frick** and **Emma Lancaster** in the loss at Michigan. Stuart was able to start in Ann Arbor but only played 10 minutes before having to leave the game.

• **Marta Lynch** did return to the lineup after missing five straight games due to a knee injury she sustained in the Sept. 21 overtime win at Nebraska. Frick suffered an ankle injury in the pregame warmups at Michigan. Her team-long streak of 39 consecutive games started when she was unable to play.

• The Boilermakers have had to use 11 different starting lineups in their first 16 games. Purdue has been able to use the same starting lineup in at least three consecutive games only twice this year.

• **Alex Hairston**, **Clara Kridler**, **Kim Love** represent the three Boilers that have started each of the first 16 games. **Taylor Niewoit** (14 starts), **Melissa Casella** (12 starts), **Chinyelu Asher** (8 starts) have also played in all 16 games.

• The injury bug also hit Purdue during the three-game road stretch to open Big Ten play. With **Mollie Kuramoto** already out for the season due to a knee injury suffered in the spring, the Boilers were also without four other players with starting experience – **Shae Desmond**, **Lancaster**, **Lynch** and **Warren** – in the Sept. 23 loss at Iowa. **Soraya Toppin-Herbert** stepped in and made her first collegiate start in the Iowa game, becoming the 16th Boiler to start this season. Sixteen of the 22 players that have seen action this year have started at least once. Purdue had 17 players make at least one start last season.

## UNBEATEN STREAK VERSUS RIVAL INDIANA ENDS

• Indiana scored three times in a span of 20 ½ minutes in the first half to defeat Purdue 3-0 Oct. 11, ending the Boilers' 15-game unbeaten streak in the series in the process. The Hoosiers posted their first win against Purdue since the inaugural meeting in 1999. Indiana also gained possession of the Golden Boot traveling trophy for the first time since it was introduced to the series in 2002.

• The 15-game unbeaten streak (12-0-3) was the Boilers' longest against any opponent in program history.

## SCORING STREAK SNAPPED AT NINE CONSECUTIVE GAMES

• Purdue scored a goal in nine consecutive games from Aug. 31 through Sept. 30, the team's longest streak since the 2009 team found the back of the net in its first 12 games. The nine-game streak, which was snapped in 1-0 loss at Ohio State Oct. 7, was the eighth longest single-season run in program history. The team record is 30 consecutive games with a goal, spanning the end of the 2002 campaign and the first 17 games of 2003.

• Six different players scored goals during the nine-game streak, helping Purdue record 17 goals in the nine games and outscore the opposition, 17-9. The Boilermakers recorded multiple goals in six of the nine games.

## BOILERS BLANK NORTHWESTERN FOR NINTH STRAIGHT WIN IN SERIES

• **Taylor Niewoit** scored a timely game-winning goal for the second Friday in a row, propelling Purdue to its ninth consecutive victory against Northwestern Sept. 28. The Boilermakers won in shutout fashion for the fifth time in their eight total home games this season. But it was Purdue's first shutout of a Big Ten opponent since also beating the Wildcats 1-0 in West Lafayette in September 2010.

• The nine-game win streak against Northwestern dates back to 2005 and ranks as the longest against any opponent in the history of the program. The final marked the team's first 1-0 win since defeating Colorado on Sept. 2, 2011 in the first home night game in the history of the Boilermaker Soccer Complex.

• Niewoit scored her fourth goal of the season in the 80th minute. Three of those four goals have proven to be game-winners. She enters the week fourth in the Big Ten in game-winners. **Alex Hairston** connected a left-to-right center pass to Niewoit on the move for her Big Ten-leading eighth assist of the season.

## PURDUE KEEPS ILLINOIS WINLESS ALL-TIME IN WEST LAFAYETTE

- Purdue held a 1-0 halftime lead thanks to **Alex Hairston's** 10th career goal but settled for a 1-1 draw with Illinois Sept. 30 at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex. While the Boilers were not able to post a win, they did keep the Fighting Illini winless in seven all-times meetings in West Lafayette. Purdue has never lost to Indiana or Illinois at home, posting an 11-0-4 all-time record against the two rivals at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex.
- Hairston's 10 career goals are most among active Boilers. She has scored five of her goals in Big Ten play. She has scored her Big Ten goals against Michigan State, Iowa, Northwestern, Nebraska and Illinois.
- Purdue has now played in six overtime games this season, posting a 2-2-2 record while tying a program record for overtime affairs. The 2002 and 2009 teams also played in six OT games.

## BOILERMAKERS NOT BEHIND MUCH IN FIRST 13 GAMES OF 2012

- Before the recent rough patch in which Purdue has been shutout in three straight games, the Boilers scored first in nine of their first 13 games this season, posting a 6-1-2 in those games. The Boilers trailed for only 135 of the 1256 minutes of game action during that stretch, due in part to suffering two overtime losses. Of the actual game action, the Boilers were behind for only 10.7 percent of the minutes they played.
- During the current streak of three straight shutout losses, Purdue has trailed for 150 ½ minutes of the 270 minutes of game action.
- While scoring first in seven of its first nine games, Purdue trailed for only 38 of the 865 minutes (4.4 percent) in those first nine games.
- However, the Nebraska-Iowa road trip (Sept. 21-23) turned out to be a different sort of weekend. Both opponents scored first and the Boilers trailed at halftime of both games, marking the first time this season that had happened. Purdue trailed for 97 of the 191 minutes of the road trip but still managed to get a weekend split.

## FIVE SHUTOUT WINS IN THE FIRST 12 GAMES

- With five of the Boilers' seven wins coming in shutout fashion, Purdue has already exceeded its 2011 total for team shutouts. After **Clara Kridler** went the distance in the Aug. 31 win against Tennessee-Martin, she was one of three Purdue goalkeepers to see action in the next game against Evansville, another shutout victory. In the process, Purdue recorded its first set of consecutive clean-sheet efforts since September 2010 (vs. Wisconsin and Northwestern). With that Wisconsin game ending in a scoreless draw, the Boilers had not won back-to-back games in shutout fashion since October 2009.
- The 2007 season marked the last time Purdue recorded four shutouts in its first eight games. The 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2006 teams also had four shutout victories in their first eight games of the year. The program record for shutouts is 14 from 2007.
- Purdue surrendered only three goals in 470 minutes of action (0.57 GAA) during the five-game homestand. For the season, the Boilers have given up only five goals in 866 minutes (0.56 GAA) at home overall in 2012. Two of those five goals were scored by West Virginia in the 2-2 draw on Sept. 9. The Mountaineers' first goal of the game, scored in the 53rd minute, ended Purdue's shutout streak at 255 consecutive minutes.

## NIWEOIT'S GOLDEN GOAL LIFTS BOILERS TO OVERTIME WIN AT NEBRASKA

- **Taylor Niewoit** headed in a **Jordan Frick** corner kick in the opening minute of the second overtime period, lifting Purdue to a 2-1 victory at Nebraska Sept. 21. The Boilermakers posted their second overtime win of the year while playing 90-plus minutes for the fifth time this season. It was Purdue's first overtime win on the road since November 2009 at Indiana. The five overtime games are the most since the 2009 team played in six.
- Nebraska scored in the 25th minute and the Boilers trailed at the half for the first time this season. But **Alex Hairston** equalized in the 51st minute with her third goal of the season and team-best ninth career. Niewoit joined Hairston as active Purdue players with an overtime goal on their college résumés. Hairston scored the golden goal in the Aug. 19 OT win against Eastern Illinois.
- Defensively, goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** made a career-high nine saves, the most by a Purdue 'keeper since Carianne Betts stopped 10 shots in an October 2010 loss at Michigan. Kridler enters the week leading the Big Ten with 63 saves.
- The Boilermakers posted their first win against Nebraska since 2005 and their first victory in three all-time meetings in Lincoln.

## PAWLIK SCORES IN HER BIG TEN DEBUT

- **Jordan Pawlik** leads the team with seven goals, scoring in four of the first seven games she played in for Purdue this season. She accounted for the team's lone goal in the Big Ten opener at Michigan State, scoring in her Big Ten debut. The junior transfer from Louisville joined **Alex Hairston** (2011), Jessica Stellinghorn (2007), Jessica Okorofao (2005), Annette Kent (2000) and Kate Queen (1999) as Boilers to score in their first Big Ten games.
- Pawlik has already exceeded her goal total in her two seasons at Louisville. She scored four times in 39 games (35 starts) for the Cardinals from 2010-11.
- Pawlik enters the week ranked ninth in the Big Ten with seven goals.

## PURDUE POSTS 3-1-1 MARK DURING FIVE-GAME HOMESTAND

- The Boilermakers closed out their season-long five-game homestand with a 3-1-1 record after shutting out Central Michigan, 2-0, Sept. 12. Purdue posted each of its three victories during the homestand in shutout fashion. The homestand was originally slated to be six games in length but it was shortened by one game after the Sept. 7 match against Milwaukee was postponed due to storms and lightning. It was the third longest homestand in program history.

## HAIRSTON SETS UP SEVEN GOALS IN FOUR GAMES

- **Alex Hairston** posted three consecutive multi-assist efforts during the five-game homestand, setting up six of Purdue's eight goals in the games against Tennessee-Martin, Evansville and West Virginia. She also assisted on Purdue's first goal in the homestand finale against Central Michigan.
- Hairston is the first player in program history with three multi-assist games in the same season, much less accomplishing the feat in three consecutive games. In the process, she became one of five Boilers all-time with three career multi-assist efforts, tying a program record. Shauna Stapleton (2007) was the last Purdue player to record back-to-back multi-assist games. Annette Kent (2003) and Kelly Haxton (2003) also accomplished the feat.
- Hairston also joined Kellie Phillips (2008 and 2010) as the only players in program history to register an assist in four consecutive games.
- Hairston enters the week leading the Big Ten with eight assists. She is one of five active Purdue players with a multi-assist effort on their college résumés.

## INJURY FORCES WARREN TO LEAVE FIELD FOR FIRST TIME IN 2012

- An ankle injury in the eighth minute of the Sept. 12 win against Central Michigan forced **Jessica Warren** to leave the field for the first time this season and sidelined Purdue's senior for the first three Big Ten games. She had gone the distance at center back in each of the first seven games of the season. Last season, Warren went the distance in seven of the first eight games.
- Purdue went on to not only defeat a quality CMU team, but also won in shutout fashion. **Marta Lynch** moved to center back and **Makaela Nellams** joined **Jordan Frick**, **Kim Love** and Lynch on the back row. Starting midfielder **Emma Lancaster** was also injured late in the CMU game and missed the first three Big Ten games.
- Love is now the only Boiler that has gone the distance in each of the first 14 games. The freshman has been a consistent performer at center back. Fellow freshman **Melissa Casella** has gone the distance in 10 consecutive games since joining the starting lineup in time for the Aug. 31 win against Tennessee-Martin.

## BOILERS SETTLE FOR DRAW AFTER WVU'S LATE EQUALIZER

- West Virginia scored in the 88th minute Sept. 9 at the Varsity Soccer Complex to tie the game in an eventual 2-2 draw. Purdue held the lead twice and had a chance to go up 3-1 on a penalty kick opportunity in the 64th minute, but the WVU goalkeeper made a nice save on **Jordan Pawlik's** PK shot attempt.
- Even though WVU was able to score late to tie the game, Purdue goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** played her finest game of the season in the draw. She finished with seven saves, one shy of her career high, highlighted by a stopping a number of 1-v-1 chances, both early and late in the game.
- The Purdue-WVU draw marked the second year in a row that the Boilers have played in a 2-2 tie at the Varsity Soccer Complex. Purdue and Cal State Northridge also finished deadlocked at 2-2 exactly one year ago to the day. Previously, high-scoring draws had been a rare occurrence. Prior to last year's game with CSUN, the Boilers had not played in a draw in which four goals were scored since August 2003 against Eastern Michigan.

## PAWLK'S HAT TRICK HIGHLIGHTS RAINY DAY WIN

- All four goals in the Sept. 2 win against Evansville were scored by Purdue players named Jordan, highlighted by a hat trick from **Jordan Pawlik**. After Pawlik's natural hat trick had given the Boilers a 3-0 lead early in the second half, **Jordan Frick** recorded her second career goal to cap the scoring.
- Pawlik's hat trick was only the fourth in program history, tying a program record for goals in a game. But it was also the fourth hat trick at the Varsity Soccer Complex in less than a calendar year's time. Purdue's Kellie Phillips (Oct. 13), Nebraska's Morgan Marlborough (Sept. 23) and Michigan's Nkem Ezurike (Oct. 16) also scored three goals in a game at the VSC last season. Of the four hat tricks in program history, only Courtney Coppedge also scored three goals in consecutive fashion to account for the other natural hat trick in the record book.
- Pawlik had missed the first two games of the team's six-game homestand due to an injury sustained in practice on Aug. 26. She now leads the team with six goals, five coming as part of multi-goal efforts. Lore-dana Riverso and Parrissa Eyorokon (2007) were the last Boilers to have at least two multiple-goal games in the same season.
- The Boilermakers had 13 corner kick opportunities in the Evansville win, the team's highest total since recording 16 in a 2009 win versus Evansville.

- **Kim Love** was selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after going the distance at center back as the Boilers surrendered only one goal in their three games the week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2.
- Purdue held Butler without a corner kick opportunity Aug. 29 in a frustrating 1-0 loss. The lone goal of the night was scored on a second-half penalty kick. Love then helped the Boilers post shutouts in weekend victories against Tennessee-Martin and Evansville. It was Purdue's first set of consecutive shutouts since September 2010. Purdue allowed only 13 shots on goal in the three games.
- Love joins **Alex Hairston**, **Chinyelu Asher** and **Jessica Warren** as active Purdue players to win Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. She is one four Purdue freshmen to start at least once (along with **Melissa Casella**, **Emma Lancaster** and **Makaela Nellams**) and is among the nine that have seen action this season. Love is also one of five players on the team overall that have started each of the first 13 games of 2012.
