

## **PURDUE BASKETBALL POSTGAME NOTES**

**Kansas (7-3) at Purdue (4-4)**

**December 11, 2014 • Mackey Arena • West Lafayette, Ind. • Attendance: 5,760**

**Purdue Boilermakers 61, Kansas Jayhawks 48**

### **GAME NOTES**

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 773-411 all-time, including a 405-126 mark at home.
- Purdue is 187-92 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 304-157.
- Purdue is 181-81 in December, including a 92-20 mark on its home court. The Boilermakers are 5-2 all-time on Dec. 11, including a 3-1 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is 26-14 all-time in the eighth game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 10-1 all-time against teams from Kansas.
- Purdue is 495-186 when playing in its home state of Indiana.
- Purdue is 18-11 all-time against the Big 12 Conference, including a 69-53 win over Texas Tech at the 2014 Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas.
- Purdue snapped a three-game losing streak with the win, its longest non-conference slide since 2010.
- The Boilermakers forced 23 Kansas turnovers, converting them into 24 points while committing just 13 of their own.
- Purdue held the Jayhawks without an offensive rebound for 30 minutes of play, and gave up only five for the game. The Boilermakers had a 12-0 edge in second-chance points.
- After leading for only 4:34 in their previous three games, Purdue led for 29:32 on Thursday.
- The Boilermaker bench had zero points, as Purdue's five starters all played 30+ minutes and scored all of their points.
- Purdue was 21-of-27 at the free throw line, finishing with a free-throw production rate of .429 (FTM/FGA).
- The Boilermakers assisted on 15-of-19 made field goals, good for a 78.9 assisted basket percentage.
- Purdue held Kansas to just eight points in the final 12 minutes of regulation.

### **GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS**

- Whitney Bays led all scorers with 19 points, in addition to six rebounds and a career-high three blocks.

- Bridget Perry had her second straight game in double figures, finishing with 13 points on four-of-seven shooting. Perry added four rebounds and two steals.
- April Wilson had 13 points (8-10 FTs), four rebounds and four assists.
- Ashley Morrisette had 12 points and four assists.
- Liza Clemons filled up the box score with four points, six rebounds, four assists, two blocks and a career-high four steals.
