• Purdue begins its month of May stretch run with its final short road trip of the season, traveling east for a three-game set at Ohio State. The road team has dominated the Purdue-OSU series in recent years. When the Buckeyes won the rubber game of the 2018 series in Columbus, it marked the first time the home team won a weekend set since 2006. The Boilermakers' two losses that weekend were their only two during a memorable 23-game stretch from April 20 to May 26, a 21-2 run that helped earn them an NCAA Regional bid. After the Boilermakers won the Big Ten Tournament matchup, they also beat OSU twice during that 23-game stretch.

• Ben Nisle went 7-for-12 with two doubles, four RBI and no strikeouts in Columbus in 2018. Skyler Hunter (3-for-8, 2B, 4 BB, HBP) reached base safely eight times in the series. A year earlier, Hunter's two-run single in the sixth inning was the difference in the Boilermakers' 2-1 rubber game win in Columbus.

- By pitching into the 9th vs. Michigan State, put together the longest outing by a Boilermaker since Tanner Andrews' CG on day 1 of 2018 B1G Tournament.
- Put together quality starts in each of his first 3 outings at Alexander Field, registering 11 strikeouts vs. 8 hits allowed over 12 1/3 innings vs Rutgers & Iowa.
- Defense did not do him any favors in his first 2 starts as a Boilermaker, with only 2 of the 8 runs he allowed vs. Nebraska & Michigan being earned.
- Pitched for Central Arizona College during the abbreviated 2020 season, registering a 0.49 ERA and 56 strikeouts in 36 2/3 innings.
- JUCO All-Star honoree gave up only 18 hits and 12 walks in 36 2/3 innings.
- Pitched in 7 games for USC in 2019, giving up only 1 extra-base hit.
- Struck out the only batter he faced in the 8th inning vs. UCLA in a game played at Dodger Stadium.
- Played baseball & basketball at Pinnacle High School on the Northeast Side of Phoenix, helping Pinnacle win the 2018 Arizona Class 6A state title in basketball.
- Pitched for USA Baseball's 17U National Team Development Program as a junior while posting a 3.32 ERA & 42 strikeouts in 31 innings during HS season.
- Named to Perfect Game's All-West Coast first team & honorable mention All-American as a senior; PG ranked him as Arizona's No. 2 pitcher in his class.
- Posted a 2.12 ERA as a sophomore on varsity
- Honored as team's hustle player of the year on basketball court as a senior.

- Just the 2nd Boilermaker this century to pitch on Opening Day in 4 straight years, earning the start in 2020 & 2021 after pitching in relief as an underclassman.
- 1st Boilermaker since Lance Breedlove in 2012 to have 2 10-strikeout games in his career (2019 at Northwestern in relief, 2021 vs. Penn State).
- His 9.73 strikeouts per 9 innings is a program record (minimum 125 innings).
- Also ranks among the program's top 10 in fewest hits per 9 innings (6.86, 2nd), ERA (3.15, 3rd) & WHIP (1.23, 7th).
- Recognized as the team's co-Pitcher of the Year honoree in 2019.
- Moved to Purdue's Friday starter role for the final weekend of April in 2019 after serving as the bullpen's fireman for the first 2 months.
- In Big Ten play in 2019, led the league with a .163 batting average against & ranked 2nd with a 1.67 ERA in league play.
- Just the 7th pitcher in team history to reach 100 career strikeouts as a sophomore & his 73 Ks were the most ever by a Purdue sophomore; his 10.89 Ks per 9 innings mark in 2019 remains a team record (minimum 60 innings).
- 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team as a starting pitcher, moving into the weekend rotation in mid-March and making 5 starts in Big Ten play.
- Surrendered only 21 hits in 41 innings for an impressive mark of 4.6 hits per (2nd in team history); did it while pitching 32 of his 41 innings away from home.
- First-team all-conference in football, basketball & baseball as a senior at CHS.
- Recorded 127 Ks as a junior & 124 Ks as a senior, leading the state both years.

- 1st Boilermaker since March 2017 & just the 17th since 2001 to work 8 shutout innings in an outing, pitching a gem in finale of Illinois series at Alexander.
- 1st man out of the bullpen in the 2021 season opener, working 2 2/3 innings of 1-run ball to help Purdue win in walk-off fashion.
- Opened 2020 strong with 3 consecutive 5-inning appearances, earning the win in his outings vs. Hofstra (relief) & Maine (starter).
- Redshirted in 2018 due to elbow injury, undergoing Tommy John surgery in May 2018; says he suffered injury in December 2017 during semester break.
- Made his collegiate debut in April 16, 2019 home win vs. Butler live on FS1.
- Pitched 11 consecutive scoreless innings to begin his college career.
- Came back from Tommy John in less than a year & wanted to pitch even sooner; projected as a likely midweek starter/weekend reliever for 2018.
- Ohio's Huntington Park Pitcher of the Year & Ohio Capital Conference Player of the Year as a senior.
- Went 10-1 with a 0.81 ERA as a senior to lead HDHS to conference & district titles; also part of conference championship teams in 2015 and 2016.
- Went 4-1 with a 0.44 ERA and 43 strikeouts in 31 innings pitched as a junior.

HEAD COACH GREG GOFF

Greg Goff joined Purdue baseball as an assistant coach in July 2017 and was promoted to head coach in June 2019. The 2021 season will be his 16th as a collegiate head coach.

Previously a head coach at four universities, Goff succeeded his friend and longtime colleague Mark Wasikowski, who returned to the University of Oregon as the Ducks' new head coach in June 2019.

Goff has previously served as the head coach at Campbell University (2008-14), Louisiana Tech University (2015-16) and the University of Alabama (2017) as well as Division II University of Montevallo (2004-07). He also helped lead the Boilermakers to a memorable 38-win season in 2018, punctuated by the program's third NCAA Regional bid in program history. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings and was also the runner-up at the Big Ten Tournament in Goff's first year with the program.

Along with bringing an upbeat personality to the dugout and contagious energy to his role as the first-base coach, Goff helped numerous Boilermakers develop offensively the last two years. He played a leading role in coaching the base running and outfield defense. He also filled in as the program's pitching coach for a few games during a 2018 home sweep of Michigan while Steve Holm was with his wife for the birth of their second child. Purdue has compiled a 28-15 record at Alexander since Goff joined the coaching staff, headlined by a program-record 13-game home win streak to close the 2018 campaign. That represents Purdue's best two-year mark at home since 2011 to 2012.

In his first two years at Purdue, Goff helped develop and organize new community events for the program like the preseason fan fest and first pitch dinner. Both events proved very popular and helped generate preseason interest going into the new campaign. He has also served as the director of Purdue baseball camps.

Twenty-six Boilermakers registered a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the 2019 fall semester. During the 2016-17 school year, Alabama's 3.259 team GPA established a program record.

Over 40 Purdue players completed at least 10 hours of community service during the 2019 fall semester as part of the program's increased emphasis in that aspect of the student-athlete experience. As a team, Goff's team logged over 450 hours of community service during the first half of the 2019-20 school year.

Goff and his wife, Tina, are the parents of four daughters: Kara, Kiley, Kolby and Kenzie. Kara plays softball at Louisiana Tech and Kiley joined Purdue softball for the 2020-21 school year.

SIX 40-WIN SEASONS

- As a head coach, Goff's teams have won over 40 games six times. Campbell was one of only eight Division I programs to win 40-plus games for three straight years from 2012 to 2014, posting 131 total victories during that span. The Camels enjoyed a historic 49-10 campaign in 2013.
- He also won 42 games in his final season at Louisiana Tech, helping lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional bid.
- Montevallo was a DII College World Series qualifier in 2006 under his guidance. As an assistant coach at Delta State, the Statesmen also qualified for the DII College World Series in 1994 and 1996.

ENDED NCAA REGIONAL DROUGHTS AT CAMPBELL & LOUISIANA TECH

- In Goff's final season at Campbell (2014), the Camels qualified for their first NCAA Regional in 24 years. Two years later, he led Louisiana Tech to its first Regional bid in 29 years. The 2014 Camels and 2016 Bulldogs both won at least one game in their Regionals, with La Tech coming through the loser's bracket to reach a Regional final at Mississippi State.

HISTORY OF TURNAROUNDS

- Goff's teams have had a losing record only five times in his 14 years as a head coach. Four of those five seasons were his first at a respective university. He has led his teams to some impressive turnarounds.
- In just two seasons, Louisiana Tech went from 15-35 the year before Goff's arrival to 42-20 in 2016, ending a 29-year NCAA Regional drought in the process. At Campbell, he inherited a team that was 11-45 in 2007. But under Goff, the Camels posted a winning record (27-24) in his second season and won 40 games by his fifth year (2012).
- Purdue's win total also jumped from 29-27 in 2017 to 38-21 in Goff's first year on the staff in 2018.

COACHING HONORS

- Goff was named the South Central Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association at both Louisiana Tech (2016) and Montevallo (2006). He was the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year at Campbell after leading his team to a school-record 49 wins and a conference title. Montevallo won a combined 100 games over his final two seasons, posting a new single-season record both years.

BEFORE BECOMING A HEAD COACH

- Goff has coached 10 future big leaguers and over 50 MLB Draft picks, highlighted by Cy Young award winner Brandon Webb while he was the pitching coach at Kentucky (2000-03). Longtime big leaguer and World Series champion Joe Blanton also pitched for Goff at Kentucky.
- Along with his years as the pitching coach at Kentucky, Goff served as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State (1998-99) and his alma mater Delta State (1994-97) before becoming a head coach for the first time in the summer of 2003 at Montevallo. It was at SEMO in the late 1990s where he first worked with Wasikowski. They helped lead the Redhawks to an NCAA Regional in 1998.

HUNTER'S PURSUIT

Skyler Hunter is chasing Purdue's all-time records for hits and triples as a fifth-year senior this season. He is the Big Ten's active career leader and ranks among the top 10 nationally in both categories. Hunter has been a starter in center field since the beginning of the 2017 season.

HOMECOMING FOR BROOKS

- Hilliard, Ohio, native **Cory Brooks** returns home this weekend. He was the 2017 Huntington Park Pitcher of the Year as a senior at Hilliard Darby High School on the northwest side of the Columbus area, winning 10 games with a 0.81 ERA. The right-hander claimed an award named after the Triple-A stadium where Purdue won the 2012 Big Ten Tournament title.
- Brooks has been Purdue's top performer on the mound over the last three weekends, working 18 1/3 innings of three-run ball while compiling a 0.98 WHIP and .190 batting average against. The opposition is just 2-for-20 with runners on base against him during that stretch.
- With his performance Sunday in the 1-0 loss to Illinois, Brooks became just the 17th Boilermaker since 2001 to work at least eight scoreless innings in an outing. He was also the first to do it since April 2017.

CAN'T KEEP BOLTON OFF BASE LATELY

- **Mike Bolton Jr.** has played his way into an everyday spot in the lineup over the last two weekends. In his last eight games, he's 9-for-20 with a .633 on-base percentage and six stolen bases. He has reached base safely in 19 of his last 31 plate appearances and reached safely to begin an inning in six of his seven opportunities. The speedy outfielder from Chicago's South Side has reached base safely at least twice in each of the last six games that he has started and been on base in eight consecutive games overall.
- At 7-for-7 on stolen bases this season, Bolton is looking to become the first Boilermaker since Stephen Talbott (17-for-17) in 2011 to steal at least 10 bags without being thrown out.

NOTABLES FROM 4-0 WEEKEND IN CHAMPAIGN

- Purdue was two outs away from losing its first game of the weekend in 1-0 fashion. By the time the bus headed east along I-74 back to Greater Lafayette on Monday, the Boilermakers had posted their first 4-0 weekend since March 2017 and become the first Big Ten team to sweep a three-team weekend pod this season. They beat Michigan State twice and Illinois twice.
- **Miles Simington** and **Zac Fascia** homered in the first two innings, powering Purdue to an early lead and 20-6 victory vs. Illinois on Monday to punctuate the perfect 4-0 weekend. The 20 runs were the program's most since scoring 27 in a May 2018 blowout of Purdue Fort Wayne at Alexander Field. Purdue had not scored 20 in a Big Ten game since a 25-8 win at Indiana in April 2006.
- Including a game-tying run Saturday in the 11-inning walk-off vs. Michigan State, the Boilermakers scored 13 runs in the ninth inning in Champaign and have registered 33 ninth inning runs in their first 25 games. That's the program's third most since 2001.
- **Evan Albrecht** recorded both RBI in the 2-1 win vs. MSU as Purdue won in walk-off fashion for the third time (most since 2017) this season. All three victories have come in three different stadiums. Also in all three walk-offs, **Ben Nisle** has scored the game-winning run and **Jackson Smeltz** has been the winning pitcher. **Miles Simington** delivered a go-ahead two-run double with the bases loaded in the ninth inning of the Sunday win vs. Illinois.
- **Calvin Schapira** pitched into the ninth inning in Purdue's weekend opener vs. MSU, surrendering just one run while striking out seven for the third time this season. It was the longest outing by a Boilermaker since Tanner Andrews' complete game on the opening day of the 2018 Big Ten Tournament.
- Purdue won a series vs. the Illini in Champaign for the first time since May 2010 and swept them for the first time since taking both games of a double-header in April 1988. Entering the weekend, the Boilermakers were 1-11 in Champaign since 2013.
- Purdue won three of four in the season series with MSU. By winning the final three meetings this year, it marked the first time since May 2005 (vs. Iowa) that Purdue rallied to win a four-game regular-season series vs. any opponent after losing the first game. Including a Big Ten Tournament matchup, the Boilermakers also won three straight vs. MSU in 2009 after dropping the series opener in East Lansing.

PITCHERS EXCELLED IN OFFENSIVE BALLPARK WHILE PURDUE SCORED 36 RUNS

- Perhaps overshadowed by Monday's 20-run outburst, Purdue's first in a Big Ten game since 2006, was the fact that the pitching staff surrendered only 24 hits over 38 innings during the 4-0 weekend in Champaign. The staff racked up 30-plus strikeouts in a four-game weekend for the third time this year, but this time the Boilermakers did it while giving up only 14 runs. The opposition's hits and runs totals were both the fewest in a four-game weekend since Purdue won three of four vs. Cal State Northridge (6 runs on 24 hits) at Alexander Field to close the 2016 season. Most impressively, the pitching staff did it in a ballpark that produced 90 runs over the course of the six games played at Illinois Field last weekend.

THREE LEFTIES HOMER IN SAME GAME FOR FIRST TIME IN AT LEAST 20 YEARS

• Purdue's 20-run outburst April 19 at Illinois was made possible in part by three different Boilermakers going deep to right field with runners on base. **Miles Simington**, **Zac Fascia** and **Jeremy Schork**, all left-handed hitters, each connected for their first home runs of the season. It marked the first time since April 2017 that three different Purdue players homered in a game. The Boilermakers did it again in the ninth inning of the April 23 game vs. Illinois at Alexander Field. In the BBCOR bat era (since 2011), it has only happened eight times. Meanwhile, going back to 2001, another game could not be found in which three lefties all went deep.

• Schork joined **Cam Thompson** as Boilermakers to hit a grand slam this season. Both slams came in the ninth inning and are a big reason why Purdue has scored 38 runs (including 13 during the 4-0 weekend in Champaign) in the ninth inning this year, already the program's third most since 2001. The Boilermakers had not hit multiple grand slams in a season since 2016. Dating back to Simington's grand slam during the opening weekend of the abbreviated 2020 campaign, each of Purdue's last three grand slams have doubled as the first home run for that Boilermaker.

SIMINGTON GOES 51 PLATE APPEARANCES WITHOUT A STRIKEOUT

• As Purdue's most consistent hitter this season, Miles Simington has also been the toughest Boilermaker to strike out. However, of his nine strikeouts, eight came in the first nine games of the season. March 19 through April 11, Simington went 44 consecutive at-bats and 51 straight plate appearances without going down on strikes. He became just the eighth Boilermaker since 2008 with a streak of at least 50 consecutive plate appearances without a K. Simington was 15-for-44 with seven doubles during his no-strikeouts streak.

• Ben Nisle also accomplished the feat during his memorable second-half surge in 2018, helping him become a unanimous selection for the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.

THE GOOD STRIKEOUTS

• Led by **Trent Johnson's** 10 strikeouts over six innings April 11 vs. Penn State, Purdue racked up 39 Ks over 35 innings in the four games in East Lansing. That's the program's third most in a four-game weekend since 2001. The Boilermakers already set what is believed to be a team record with 46 strikeouts in the season-opening, four-game series vs. Nebraska.

• Johnson's career mark of 9.75 strikeouts per nine innings is best all-time among Boilermakers with a minimum 125 career innings. With 10-strikeout outings vs. Northwestern (2019) and Penn State, he's also just the ninth Purdue pitcher since 2001 with multiple double-figure strikeout totals. As a team, the Boilermakers only had one individual 10-K performance from 2013 to 2018.

• **Jett Jackson** struck out 10 vs. Nebraska in his season debut this year. Jackson and Johnson have teamed up to give the Boilermakers two different pitchers with a 10-K performance in the same season for the first time since 2010.

• Rubber games weren't an issue during the middle weekend of April as Purdue played four games at both of its three-team pods. The Boilermakers had an opportunity to win four of their first five series this season, but they dropped a rubber game in three straight weekend once three game series began March 19 to 21. Since mid-April 2019, the program has lost six straight Big Ten rubber games. Purdue has also lost 10 of its last 11 Big Ten rubber games since mid-April 2017 and is just 8-26 in Big Ten rubber games since the beginning of the 2010 campaign. Coincidentally, Purdue went 5-0 in Big Ten rubber games in 2009.
