THE STARTING FIVE

- The Boilermakers square off with Georgia Tech in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge for the third time and welcome back former Purdue head coach Nell Fortner to Mackey Arena. Fortner guided the Boilermakers to the 1997 Big Ten regular season title.
- By beating No. 17/22 Florida State 66-61, Purdue recorded its first win over a ranked team in nearly three years. The Boilermakers overcame a scoreless second quarter by knocking down 12 3-pointers and committing just 10 turnovers. Purdue was one of 14 teams outside the AP Top-25 to receive a vote in the Week 4 poll.
- Cassidy Hardin has been lights out from distance shooting 44% from deep with 3.1 3-pointers per game this season.
- Offensively, Purdue ranks third in the Big Ten with 8.4 3-pointers per game, while its 3-point defense leads the league at 24.1%.
- Sophomore Madison Layden leads the Boilermakers in scoring (13), rebounding (6.1), minutes played (35.8) and steals (1.7).

KG Quick Hits

HEAD COACH KATIE GEARLDS

- Born - Oct. 26, 1984 (37 years old)
- Hired as associate head coach on March 26, 2021
- Elevated to head coach on Sept. 16, 2021
- Ninth season as a head coach, first at Purdue
- Youngest full-time Power 5 head coach this season
- Six-year professional basketball career
- College - Purdue '07
- High School - Beech Grove '03

AT PURDUE (2021-PRESENT)

- Elevated to head coach just 47 days before the 2021-22 season began
- Announced as the associate head coach on March 26, 2021, as part of a succession plan that, originally, would see her take over the head seat for the 2022-23 campaign
- Reconstructing offensive and defensive schemes, while creating an impactful recruiting strategy

AT MARIAN (2013-2021)

- Went 228-50 (82%) over eight seasons at Marian in the NAIA
- Won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2016 and 2017
- Led 12 All-America honorees and 28 All-Crossroads League selections
- Named NAIA National Coach of the Year three times (2016, 2017, 2020)

PROFESSIONAL CAREER (2007-2013)

- Played six professional seasons across the WNBA, Spain, Greece, Portugal and Slovakia
- Went 7th overall to the Seattle Storm in the 2007 WNBA Draft, the highest pick in program history. Played and learned from Sue Bird, Swin Cash, Lauren Jackson, Brian Agler and Adia Barnes

AT PURDUE (2004-07)

- 2007 All-America, 4-time All-Big Ten selection, 2007 Big Ten Champion
- Finished with 1,974 points, 238 3-pointers and 103 wins at Purdue
- Set the school record with 41 points in a game and 707 in a season
- Four NCAA Tournament appearances and a 2007 Elite Eight

AT BEECH GROVE HIGH SCHOOL

- 2003 3A Indiana State Champion, Indiana Miss Basketball
- 2,521 career points, sixth in state history, averaging 30.1 points per game
- 2003 McDonald's All-America Game MVP, alongside LeBron James

LAST TIME OUT

- Purdue picked up its first ranked win in nearly three years with a 66-61 victory over No. 17/22 Florida State to round out the St. Pete Showcase on Sunday.
- Cassidy Hardin led the way with 18 points on six 3-pointers. Madison Layden added 16 points with seven rebounds.
- Jeanae Terry notched a season-high 10 assists, as Purdue dished out 19 dimes on 25 made field goals.

1924 - The National Hockey League's first United States-based franchise, the Boston Bruins, plays their first game in league play at home, at the still-extant Boston Arena.

BACK AT IT

- Purdue Women's Basketball is in its 47th season in 2021-22.
- With an all-time record of 892-513, the Boilermakers are eight wins away from joining the 900-victory club.
- Purdue has reached the NCAA Tournament 26 times (last 2017), won the Big Ten Tournament nine times (last 2013) and the Big Ten regular-season title seven times (last 2002).
- The 1999 NCAA Champions, Purdue is the only program to win a national title as a member of the Big Ten.

THE KG ERA

- Katie Gearlds is in her first season at the helm of the Boilermakers, following eight successful campaigns at NAIA Marian.
- Gearlds is the ninth head coach in program history and the second alumna to take the helm, following Sharon Versyp.
- One of the all-time greats in program history, Gearlds took Purdue to four NCAA Tournament appearances during her playing career from 2003-07, finishing with an All-America honor and Elite Eight bid as a senior.
- Gearlds was originally slated to move into the head seat in 2022 as part of a succession plan, but Versyp's retirement on Sept. 16, 2021, moved that timeline up by six months.

THE BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

- After a year off, the Boilermakers will take part in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, going for just their fourth win in the event's history.
- Purdue faced Virginia Tech on the road in 2019 but fell 67-54 - Cassidy Hardin and Roxane Makolo are the only current Boilermakers who played more than five minutes in that contest.
- Purdue has split the last four challenge games, beating Miami and Pitt. Prior to that, the Boilermakers were 1-9 to start the event.
- Katie Gearlds is the third coach to lead Purdue into the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, following Lin Dunn (0-1, 1993) and Sharon Versyp (3-10, 2007-19).

QUASI-FAMILY REUNION WEDNESDAY NIGHT

- Wednesday night against Georgia Tech will be hodgepodge of connections between Purdue, Georgia Tech and the Indiana Fever.
- The easy one - Georgia Tech head coach Nell Fortner led the Boilermakers during the 1996-97 season, leading Purdue to a Big Ten regular season title and earning Big Ten Coach of the Year honors.
- Wednesday will be just the third time a former Purdue head coach has faced the Boilermakers as a head coach. The previous two instances were against Marsha Reall (1986-87 season), when the Boilermakers beat her Ohio squads in 1997-98 (W, 85-52) and 1998-99 (W, 92-52) - White averaged 20 points, six rebounds and 5.5 assists in those two games.
- Stephanie White - The GOAT - will be on the call for Big Ten Network. White, easily one of the best players in program history and led Purdue to the national title in 1999, started all 28 games for Fortner in 1996-97, averaging 16.4 points, 5.3 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game.
- The duo teamed up together again from 2000-03 with the Indiana Fever when Fortner was the GM and head coach for the last three seasons. The pair were made a trio by Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Tamika Catchings, a guest at Mackey Arena on Wednesday night, when she was drafted to the Fever in 2002.
- White rejoined the Fever as an assistant coach from 2011-14, before taking over as head coach in 2015 for two seasons, for the final six years of Catchings' playing career. White and Catchings, along with Georgia Tech Chief of Staff Mickie DeMoss (an assistant with the Fever from 2012-13), won the 2012 WNBA Championship.
- DeMoss served on White's staff at Vanderbilt for the 2018-19 season, before moving to Georgia Tech in 2019.
- All the while, current Purdue head coach Katie Gearlds long relationships with Catchings, White and DeMoss.
- >>> Catchings and Gearlds created a close bond when Gearlds joined the WNBA in 2007 as the seventh pick to Seattle, one before Indiana's pick.
- >>> Gearlds and White, two Purdue greats, have had a close relationship since Gearlds' freshman year. The duo are the third and fifth Indiana Miss Basketball honorees to play at Purdue.
- >>> Gearlds and DeMoss have known each other since Gearlds' high school recruitment, when the latter nearly wooed Gearlds to play at Tennessee. Gearlds found her home at Purdue and the rest is history.
- Current Purdue Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Mike Bobinski headed Georgia Tech's athletic department from 2013-16.
- Surely there are probably more connections that were missed here.

HARDIN HEAT CHECK

- Cass Hardin shoots threes. Cass Hardin makes threes. Pretty simple.
- Hardin, off to the best start of her career, ranks in the top 25 this season in 3-pointers made (13th with 22), 3-pointers per game (25th with 3.14) and attempts (21st with 50).
- Her six triples against Florida State, alongside a matching effort from Madison Layden, rank 11th in program history for makes in a game. The duo also posted the eighth most attempts in a game at Purdue with 12.
- Hardin is seventh in the nation with 93.2% of her shot attempts coming from behind the arc.
- The senior earned St. Pete Showcase All-Tournament Team honors after averaging 15 points and making 10 3-pointers over two games.

THE RANKINGS

- Purdue is in the midst of a challenging portions of its schedule with five straight games against teams ranked or close to cracking the AP Top-25.
- The Boilermakers snapped a 19-game losing skid to ranked opponents with its 66-61 win over No. 17/22 Florida State.
- Purdue is 114-186 all-time against ranked opposition, 54-55 at Mackey Arena, 28-89 on the road and 32-42 at neutral venues.
- A mainstay in the Associated Press Poll from 1989-2014, the Boilermakers were last ranked during Week 2 of the 2014-15 season. Purdue received one vote in the AP Top-25 Week 4 Poll.
- During her playing days, Gearlds led Purdue to a high No. 4 in the country and went 23-22 against ranked teams.

BLANKED BUT NO PROBLEM

- Against No. 17/22 Florida State, the Boilermakers jumped out to a 26-10 lead in the first, but failed to score for the next 12:39 and falling on the wrong side of a 27-0 run by the Seminoles.
- Purdue did not score in the second quarter, a first in program history.
- Despite the massive run, the Boilermakers only trailed by seven at the break and by 11 at the largest gap.
- With a massive caveat, through research and responses from SIDs across the country, Purdue's win is believed to be only the third since the implementation of quarters where a team was blanked in a period and still won the game. If there are more, email imacdoug@purdue.edu, please.

DEFENSIVE DEALING

- While still implementing her defensive philosophy after the 47-day prep period ahead of the season, Purdue has developed one of the better 3-point defenses in the Big Ten.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten with opponents making 24.2% of their 3-point attempts. The Boilermakers also leads the league with just 3.9 triples per game allowed.
- Only Dayton and Western Kentucky have made five or more 3-pointers in a game against the Boilermakers this season.

LAYDEN LEADERSHIP

- Madison Layden leads Purdue in points, rebounds, steals and minutes played this season.
- Layden has stepped into her expanded role as the go-to player on offense with 13 points, 6.1 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game.
- She sits third in the Big Ten with 35.8 minutes per game.
- The sophomore bounced back from two games without a triple to knock down two against West Virginia, and avoid the longest drought of her career.
- Layden has finished in double figures five times, led the team in scoring twice, rebounding three times, assists three times, steals twice and blocks three times.
- The sophomore already topped her career high with 20 points against Western Michigan.
- She is the first sophomore captain since FahKara Malone in 2007-08.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE CLUB

- Ra Shaya Kyle finally joined the double-double club with 15 points and 10 rebounds against Marshall.
- Since the end of the 2018-19 season, only four Boilermakers have recorded a double-double - Kyle, Tamara Farquhar, Fatou Diagne and the career record holder Ae'rianna Harris.
- Kyle added to the double-double list with a 13-point, 10-rebound outing against No. 17/22 Florida State.
- Kyle has led the Boilermakers in scoring twice, rebounding four times and blocks four times this season.

2021-22 PURDUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

SOPHOMORE JUMP

- Purdue's true sophomores of Madison Layden and Ra Shaya Kyle have had an impressive start to the season.
- Combined the duo are averaging 25.1 points and 12.1 rebounds per game.
- The duo accounted for 39 points in the win over Western Michigan.
- Both have hit career highs in points - Layden vs. WMU with 19 and Kyle against Dayton with 20.
- The pair are building off a successful freshman campaign when they combined for 14 points and seven rebounds per game.

LETTING IT FLY

- Purdue is tied for third nationally with six games of seven 3-pointers or more.
- The Boilermakers let it loose from distance with 27 made triples through the first three games, the most to start a season at Purdue.
- Six different Boilermakers have made a 3-pointer, led by and Cassidy Hardin's 22 and Madison Layden's 17.
- Purdue has made at least seven 3-pointers in five wins this season.
- Hardly surprising for a Katie Gearlds squad to shoot with confidence from distance. While at Marian, her team averaged seven 3-pointers a game and 20 attempts.
- As a player, Gearlds originally set the mark and now ranks third in Purdue history with 238 triples made in a career and second in attempts. She is tied for the record with 82 makes in a season from 2006-07.

A RIBBON FROM MUM

- Abbey Ellis has made an instant impact on both ends of the floor to start her Purdue career.
- The Aussie is shooting 50% from the floor and 90.5% at the line, with four games in double figures.
- Ellis is one of 15 players in the nation shooting 50% or better from the field and at least 90% at the line with at least 60 total points this season.
- Following 818 points in two years at Cal Poly, Ellis is the lone Boilermaker on track this season to hit 1,000 career points - currently 111 away.
- Ellis is averaging 10.1 points and 3.3 assists per game.
- The junior recorded 11 assists and five steals against Western Michigan. It was just the ninth time by a player in the Big Ten since 2009-10 and believed to be* the second Boilermaker to ever hit that line, joining Sharon Versyp (12 ast, 7 stls vs. San Diego State - 12/4/87).
- Ellis's 11-assist outing was the 28th time in program history a player topped 11 dimes in a game.
- Purdue's first Australian rocks a ribbon in her hair during games from a selection that her mother sends her to wear.

THE SPLASH IS BACK

- Cassidy Hardin has had an inspired start to her senior campaign, returning to the starting lineup for the first time since 2019-20.
- Hardin sits atop the team with 22 3-pointers at a 44% clip.
- In her career, Hardin has made 98 3-pointers and just 11 2-point shots.
- More impressive than her sharpshooting is her 3.94 GPA in HONORS biochemistry.

DAZZLING DEBUT

- Five of Purdue's six newcomers made their Boilermaker debut in the season opener against Western Kentucky.
- The quintet of Abbey Ellis, Jeanae Terry, Made Oriyomi, Jayla Smith and Ava Learn accounted for 42 points, 15 rebounds, 8 assists and 6 steals.
- Ellis and Terry earned spots in the first starting lineup of the year.
- Ellis finished with a team-high 17 points, while Oriyomi added nine points with six rebounds.
- Skye Williams was the lone newcomer to not play due to an injury.

WHAT'S UP SHAY

- Ra Shaya Kyle spent much of the offseason working on conditioning with Jason Pullara to extend her minutes, and it's already shown to start the year with career highs in points, rebounds and minutes played.
- In addition to improvements in scoring and rebounding, Kyle is playing nearly 19.2 minutes per game, compared to 11.3 last year.
- The sophomore has jumped up to 12.1 points and 5.3 rebounds per game and already set career highs in points, rebounds and minutes per game.
- She made 23 appearances, 5.3 points, 3.8 rebounds and 11.3 minutes per game in her freshman campaign.
- Kyle nearly recorded a double-double in her first career game against North Alabama on Nov. 29, 2020, going for 15 points and nine rebounds.
- The Marion, Ind., native is one of the Top-100 scorers in IHSAA history with 1,816 points behind a 52% clip. She had her number retired at Marion High School during the offseason.
- Kyle's cousin Dejah Cyrus, a 2019 NAIA All-American and two-time national champion, played for Katie Gearlds for four seasons at Marian.

RESURGENT RICKIE

- Rickie Woltman has flourished under Gearlds to star the season, recording career highs in points (9), rebounds (7) and blocks (4) and minutes played (33).
- Woltman played a career-high 33 minutes and scored a career-high nine points against West Virginia when Kyle dealt with foul trouble.
- The junior grabbed seven boards in the season opener at Western Kentucky.
- She provided to key baskets at Illinois State and blocked four shots in the win. Purdue's first four-block outing since 2019-20.
- With Woltman as the highest ranked recruit in program history, No. 25 player in the class of 2019, Gearlds has sought to put Woltman in positions that benefit her skill set.

OKAY JAY

- Jayla Smith made an impressive debut off the bench for the Boilermakers against Western Kentucky with 11 points and four steals in 27 minutes.
- The rookie was pivotal with six points in the fourth quarter against Marshall to help Purdue pull out the win.
- Since 2009-10, a Purdue freshman has recorded four steals just 14 times with Smith and Karissa McLaughlin (2017 vs. Central Michigan) doing so in their debuts.
- Smith scored over 1,000 points, won one IHSAA 4A State Championship (2020 over Layden's Northwestern) and was named Indiana Miss Basketball during her prep career.

THE NEXT GENERATION

- After hitting the recruiting trail hard in March, primarily focusing on the class of 20203, Katie Gearlds welcomed a trio of signees to the Boilermaker family on Nov. 10, the same day as the season opener.
- Lilly Stoddard, a 6-3 forward from Crown Point, Ind., is an Indiana Junior All-Star and 2021 IHSAA State Champion.
- Addison Potts, a 6-0 guard from Fort Myers, Fla., has played varsity ball since seventh grade and scored over 2,000 points in her prep career.
- Ainhua Holzer, a 5-9 guard from Martigny, Switzerland, has extensive international experience and played in the Swiss Basketball League as an amateur for the last few seasons.
- More information on the recruiting class on following pages.

47 DAYS

- The quick change to head coach gave Gearlds just 47 days between her elevation and the start of the 2021-22 season.
- Fortunately, Gearlds had extensive work with the team during the late spring and all of summer workouts to start forming an early bond.
- Here's a list of things that happened in less than 47 days - Beatles' recording of "Please Please Me" (13 hours), Apollo 11 landing on the Moon and returning safely (8 days), writing the Declaration of Independence (18 days), William Henry Harrison's presidency (31 days), average length someone sticks with a diet (36 days).

A BASKETBALL FAMILY

- Madison Layden comes from a basketball family. Her mother Kathie and father Jeff were both standout stars at Evansville back in the 1990s.
- While at Evansville, Kathie is seventh in career assists and fourth in triples, and Jeff was named to the Missouri Valley All-Bench Team twice
- As a head coach, Kathie has won five IHSAA State Championships, including two with Madison at Northwestern High School. She ranks second in IHSAA history in state championships.
- During Madison's career at Northwestern, which featured two state titles and three championship game appearances, her mother was her head coach, father was an assistant and her grandfather, Dave, was another assistant coach.
- Kathie's first of three straight Class A state titles at Tri-Central came in 2003, mere hours before Katie Gearlds dropped a then-3A record 33 points to lead Beech Grove to a state championship.

RESPECT THE SPECS

- Madison Layden is in her second campaign after one of the better all-around freshman seasons in program history.
- The Kokomo native finished with 8.7 points, 3.2 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.1 steals per game in 2020-21.
- Layden was the only rookie from the Big Ten with at least 65 assists and 45 steals during the regular season, totaling 69 dimes and 48 swipes.
- Layden was one-of-nine freshmen nationally to average at least 8.5 points, 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game.
- On the defensive end, Layden finished with 48 steals as a freshman in the COVID-19 truncated season, still good for seventh by a rookie in program history.
- Connecting from the outside, Layden drained 45 3-points in her rookie season at a 40.5% clip, ranking ninth among freshmen with at least 40 triples in 2020-21.
- The 2020 Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year has worn glasses when playing in games ever since she was a kid.

2021-22 PURDUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAINS

- First-year head coach Katie Gearlds picked a trio of first-time captains for the 2021-22 roster in Madison Layden, Cassidy Hardin and Jeanae Terry.
- Layden is the first sophomore captain since FahKara Malone in 2007-08.
- The trio were named captains ahead of the 2021 Big Ten Women's Basketball Media Day in October.

INDIANA MISS BASKETBALL

- Jayla Smith is the 10th Indiana Miss Basketball to play at Purdue, winning the award in 2021 after a senior campaign of 19.5 points and 4.6 steals per game at Lawrence North.
- The long history of Purdue welcoming the state's top player extended back to 2003, when Katie Gearlds became the fifth honoree to pick West Lafayette.
- Madison Layden nearly added to the tally in 2020, only to be edged by Hamilton Southeastern and Oregon Duck Sydney Parrish.
- Purdue holds the record for most Indiana Miss Basketball winners, followed by Indiana, Notre Dame, Tennessee tied for second with four.

- Layden was the first Boilermaker to be called up for a national team tryout since Karissa McLaughlin received a bid in 2018-19.

FRESH FACES

- The Boilermakers welcomed a trio of ranked rookies in the 2021 signing class – Jayla Smith (Lawrence North – Indiana), Skye Williams (Pickerington Central – Ohio) and Ava Learn (Our Lady of Lourdes – New York).
- Learn was tabbed the No. 153 player in the nation, the No. 41 guard from Girls Basketball Report. Smith was the No. 42 player in the nation, No. 13 guard and a 4-star recruit by Prospect Nation.
- Williams was tabbed was a 4-star recruit, the No. 93 player in the nation, the No. 38 guard and 91 rating by ESPN HoopGuriz
- The signing class was recognized by multiple national reports – No. 24 by ESPNW, No. 28 by Prospects Nation and No. 33 by All-Star Girls Basketball.

ROSTER FLIP

- The Boilermakers rolled into 2021-22 with a new-look roster, with six newcomers between a trio of freshmen and transfers.
- With the graduation of four players and two transfers out, the Boilermakers lost 52.5% points, 54.3% rebounding, 51.9% assists and 51.5% of minutes played from the 2021-22 roster.
- The freshman class features a trio of all-state performers in Jayla Smith (Indiana), Skye Williams (Ohio) and Ava Learn (New York).
- The Boilermakers hit the transfer portal hard after the 2020-21 season concluded, picking up a trio of names.
- Guard Abbey Ellis from Cal Poly joined Purdue after nearly 1,000 points for the Mustangs in two seasons. She's a native of Yallambie, Australia.
- Jeanae Terry traded in her jersey at Illinois for the Old Gold and Black. The Detroit native committed to the Boilermakers after two seasons as a starter for the Fighting Illini.
- Canadian international forward Mide Oriyomi joined the Boilermakers following a two-year spell at Northeastern.
- The transfer group of Terry, Ellis, and Oriyomi entered the 2021-22 season with a combined 151 games, 125 starts and 1,611 points in their careers.

THUNDER FROM DOWN UNDER

- Abbey Ellis is the first Australian in Purdue Women's Basketball history.
- Despite standing just 5-foot-6, the Aussie has shown she's one of the loudest and most energetic players on the team.
- In just two seasons at Cal Poly, including a shortened season in 2020-21, she tallied 818 points over 53 games.
- Outside of basketball, Ellis is a proud supporter of Melbourne-based teams – Carlton (AFL), Melbourne Stars (Big Bash Cricket), Melbourne United (NBL).

TOWERING SUPPORT

- Purdue boast a pair of forwards in support roles with Rickie Woltman and Nyagoo Gony.
- Woltman had a hot start to the year with a career-high seven rebounds in a career-high 18 minutes of work.
- While both saw limited minutes in 2020-21, the duo combined for 11.3 minutes, 1.5 points and 2.3 rebounds over the last three seasons.
- A point of emphasis for Katie Gearlds is putting the two forwards in positions that specifically benefit their abilities, rather than forcing them to fit a mold.

RO YEAH

- In her second season in West Lafayette, Rokia Doumbia expanded her role from a season ago, when she came off the bench in 15 games.
- Doumbia missed the start of the 2021-22 season after rolling her ankle during preseason.
- She averaged 3.8 points and 3.4 rebounds in 14.5 minutes per game last year, up to 8.3 points and 5.5 boards when playing over 20 minutes.
- Doumbia is one of two Boilermakers with NCAA Tournament experience, reaching the dance twice with Arkansas, while Brooke Moore made the tournament in 2019.

CHASING 900

- Purdue is tracking down the 900th win in program history.
- The Boilermakers are 40th in NCAA Division I history for total wins, which comes out to around 19.5 per season.
- Only one team has more wins and started after Purdue's inaugural season in 1975-76 – Notre Dame.

2021-22 PURDUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

BIGGEST BIG

- Ra Shaya Kyle is the tallest player in the Big Ten this season, standing at 6-foot-6.
- Kyle is the tallest player in program history club at 6-foot-6, along with Summer Erb (1996), Nora Kiesler (2016-19) and Michele VanGrop (1995-96).
- Including Rickie Woltman at 6-foot-4, only 17 players in program history have stood 6-foot-4 or taller.

HEIGHT & DEPTH CHART

- The Boilermakers' depth chart this season is fairly guard centric, with 11 players listed as a guard, one as a guard/forward, two as forwards and one as a center.
- Madison Layden and Ava Learn are the tallest guards in program history, listed at 6-foot-1.
- Ra Shaya Kyle is in the tallest player in program history club at 6-foot-6, along with Summer Erb (1996), Nora Kiesler (2016-19) and Michele VanGrop (1995-96).
- The Boilermakers have had 17 players listed as guards or guard/forwards that were 6-feet or taller, a list that includes Katie Gearlds, Katie Douglas and Brittany Rayburn.
- The average height of the 2021-22 Boilermakers is 5-foot-11.

AFROBASKET DUO

- Nyagoo Gony (South Sudan) and Rokia Doumbia (Mali) were called upon to represent their nations in the 2021 Women's AfroBasket Championship, a biennial tournament to crown the champions of Africa.
- Gony was named to the first ever competitive roster for South Sudan, since its independence in 2011. Gony's parents immigrated to the United States before she was born.
- The senior started every game during a qualifying tournament in July, winning the first jump ball in the nation's history. Unfortunately, her squad was unable to break out of the Zone 5 Qualifiers to reach the main tournament.
- Doumbia played in her second straight senior AfroBasket event, playing in the main event in Cameroon in September. Mali ran through their opening four games by an average winning margin of 24.3 points to reach the final, when a stout Nigeria squad won 70-53.
- Doumbia finished the tournament with 2.2 points, 1.8 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 15.4 minutes per game.

MEET MIDE (me-DAY)

- The Boilermakers added a new Canadian to the roster in 2021-22 with transfer Mide Oriyomi.
- The junior tallied nine points and six rebounds in her debut against Western Kentucky.
- Oriyomi played two campaigns at Northeastern, earning All-CAA honors in 2020-21.
- The Hamilton, Ontario, native averaged 8.0 points, 4.6 rebounds and 22.6 minutes per game at her first collegiate stop.

STELLAR STALLINGS

- Senior Ajah Stallings found the floor 15 times in 2020-21 with two starts, both career highs.
- The Indianapolis native is in her fourth year on the roster and, more impressively, her second year within the Purdue College of Pharmacy, a challenge rarely embraced by a student-athlete.
- Despite an injury at birth that resulted in no feeling and limited use of her right hand, Stallings has worked her way from walk-on to a scholarship during her career

WELCOME BACK, ROX

- Redshirt sophomore guard Roxane Makolo is back after missing last season due to a knee injury picked up during preseason camp.
- A little soreness and precaution limited her availability to start the year.
- Makolo came off the bench in 31 games as a freshman in 2019-20, averaging 1.0 points and 1.5 rebounds per game.
- The Canadian international represented her country in the U19 FIBA World Championships and the U18 FIBA Americas during her junior career.

INTERNATIONAL BOILERS

- Purdue's 2021-22 roster includes four international student-athletes – Roxane Makolo & Mide Oriyomi (Canada), Abbey Ellis (Australia), Rokia Doumbia (Mali).
- There have been just 10 international Boilermakers in program history from Russia, Canada, Mali, Senegal, England and Australia.
- Makolo and Oriyomi are the third and fourth Canadians, respectively, while Doumbia and Ellis are the first representatives from their countries.

PROBOILERS

- In addition to graduating two Rhodes Scholar finalists, doctors and lawyers, Purdue has sent its fair share of student-athletes to the professional level.
- Head coach Katie Gearlds played six professional seasons between the WNBA, Slovakia, Greece and Spain.
- Fifteen Boilermakers have played in the WNBA, last by Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton, current Boston College assistant coach, back in 2012.
- In addition to the 15 who reached the WNBA, 20 other Boilermakers have played professionally overseas.
- There are currently five former Boilermakers in the professional ranks.

- Purdue partnered with the Altius Group to teach Boilermakers the best and innovative approaches to engage external stakeholders, along with guidance on compliance legislation.
- Purdue recently partnered with The Brandr Group to launch a collective licensing program to use Purdue's official trademarks and logos. The creative opportunity requires at least three student-athletes from one team or six from multiple programs to take part.

HARD MAJORS? NO PROBLEM

- A staple throughout Purdue Women's Basketball's history is not shying away from a challenge, and several student-athletes have epitomized that throughout their athletic and academic careers.
- Senior Cassidy Hardin is a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree in biochemistry with plans to attend medical school and pursue a career, as of now, in anesthesiology.
- Senior Ajah Stallings enters her second year in the College of Pharmacy, pursuing a graduate degree that is one of the most difficult on campus, even for the general non-student-athlete.

- Following a six-year professional career, Gearlds took over the reins at Marian in Indianapolis, posting a 227-49 record over eight years, winning three NAIA Coach of the Year honors and claiming two national championships.

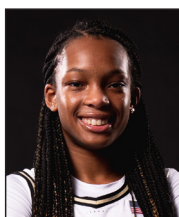

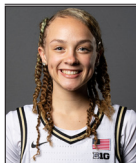
