STORY LINES	
• Following a difficult, last-second loss to Syracuse, Purdue Football returns to Ross-Ade Stadium to host FAU for Homecoming. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. ET.	
• The Boilermakers and Owls meet on the gridiron for the first time ever.	
• Purdue will be playing its 100th Homecoming game, holding a 52-43-4 record which includes seven victories over ranked opponents.	
• The last time the Boilermakers faced a non-conference opponent for Homecoming, they knocked off No. 23 Boston College 30-13 during Jeff Brohm's second season as Purdue head coach (Sept. 22, 2018).	
• Purdue was without three starters in the 32-29 road loss to Syracuse: King Doerue (RB), Jalen Graham (S) and Broc Thompson (WR).	
• The Boilermakers will wear special helmets for Homecoming, featuring an old logo of mascot Purdue Pete.	

• Purdue will welcome back former offensive lineman John Luckhardt as the Homecoming honorary captain. Luckhardt played center and linebacker during Purdue's historic 1966 campaign that ended with a 14-13 win in the 1967 Rose Bowl.	
• Charlie Jones leads the Big Ten in receptions (32), receiving yards (474) and receiving touchdowns (5). Jones leads the nation in receptions per game (10.7), while ranking second in receiving touchdowns and receiving yards.	
• Pacing the Big Ten in passing yards and total offense, Aidan O'Connell ranks top 10 nationally in both categories. His 1,000 passing yards rank fourth nationally, while he stands ninth in total offense with 330 yards per game.	
• Despite a pair of losses, Purdue has out-gained its opponents in each of its three games. The Boilermakers are averaging 477.3 yards of total offense, while allowing only 285.7 yards on defense (25th nationally).

1	Charlie Jones leads the Big Ten in receptions per game (10.7) and receiving yards per game (158.0), ranking first and second in the country, respectively.
5	Purdue is one of five teams in the country with multiple interceptions returned for touchdowns this season.
6	Purdue ranks sixth in the country in passing offense, throwing for a Big Ten-leading 359.3 yards per game.
400	Quarterback Aidan O'Connell has five 400-yard passing games over his career, ranking second in program history behind Drew Brees (7).

- With 32 receptions in his first three games at Purdue, Charlie Jones is one of only five receivers across the FBS over the last five years that have recorded 30 or more catches through their first three games. Two of those five receivers were Boilermakers.
- Since 2000, only four Big Ten wide receivers caught at least 21 passes through the first two games of a season, all of them being Purdue Boilermakers. Now, Jones is one of them.
- Rondale Moore, an All-American currently playing for the Arizona Cardinals, hauled in 24 receptions to kick off the 2019 season.
- Taylor Stubblefield made 23 catches in 2003 before becoming a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award at the end of the 2004 campaign.
- David Bell (Cleveland Browns), also a finalist for the Biletnikoff in 2021, caught 22 passes to start the 2020 season before ending his Purdue career as an All-American.

THE RECONNECTION

- Playing youth football together, Aidan O'Connell and Charlie Jones were reunited at Purdue this offseason. Years passed since they were teammates, but you would not have known it in the season opener versus Penn State.
- O'Connell found Jones 12 times in his Purdue debut, and the duo connected for 153 yards through the air, both career highs.
- A week later, the pair connected nine times for 133 yards and three scores against Indiana State.
- Jones notched his third straight 100-yard receiving game with a career-high 188 yards and a score from 11 receptions at Syracuse.
- It's safe to say Jones enjoys the Purdue offense. After making 21 catches for 323 yards and three touchdowns during the entire 2021 season, he has already surpassed last year's totals with the Hawkeyes.

BROHM QUICK FACTS

- Three fundamental concepts fuel Purdue under head coach Jeff Brohm - playing harder, tougher and smarter than the opposition.
- Brohm has led a trio of Boilermakers to All-America honors in Rondale Moore (2018 First Team), David Bell (2021) and George Karlaftis (2021).
- Of the 10 Purdue coaches who have spent at least five seasons in West Lafayette, Brohm has the best winning percentage (.692) and the most total wins (9) by a coach during his fifth year.
- Purdue has averaged over 300 yards passing per game each of the last four years under Brohm, a first in program history.
- During the Brohm era, eight Boilermakers have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including three in the 2022 NFL Draft (George Karlaftis - 1st Round, Kansas City Chiefs; David Bell - 3rd Round, Cleveland Browns; Zander Horvath - 7th Round, Los Angeles Chargers).
- A standout at Louisville, Brohm still ranks among the Cardinals' career leaders in touchdown passes (tied for seventh, 38), total offense (eighth, 5,410), completion percentage (ninth, .562), passing yards (ninth, 5,451), passing efficiency (ninth, 129.97), passing attempts (10th, 715) and completions (10th, 402).
- After getting drafted in the fourth round of the 1990 MLB Draft, Brohm played two summers of Minor League Baseball.

BOILER NOTES

BROHM AND THE BOILERMAKERS: YEAR 6

- Jeff Brohm is in his sixth year at the helm in West Lafayette.
- Brohm boasts a career record of 59-41, a .599 winning percentage, with nearly half of those wins coming at Purdue.
- A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season - a memorable 2021 campaign.
- The Boilermakers have made three bowl appearances in five years under Brohm, joining Joe Tiller and Jim Young as the only Purdue coaches to accomplish that feat.
- Over Brohm's six seasons at the helm, the Purdue offense has averaged 309 yards per game and 276 points per game.
- Purdue has had three All-Americans since Brohm's arrival; the Boilermakers only had three All-Americans from 2004-17.
- Boilermakers have won five individual Big Ten honors under Brohm's guidance: Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Rondale Moore - 2018, David Bell - 2019), Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year (Moore - 2018, Bell - 2021), Big Ten Tight End of the Year (Brycen Hopkins - 2019).

HOMECOMING

- Saturday's game will be Purdue's 100th Homecoming game.
- The Boilermakers are 52-43-4 in Homecoming contests.
- The last time the Boilermakers faced a non-conference opponent for Homecoming, they knocked off No. 23 Boston College 30-13 during Jeff Brohm's second season as Purdue head coach (Sept. 22, 2018).
- Seven of Purdue's Homecoming victories have been against ranked opponents.

AIDAN ADDING TO HIS LEGACY

- Beginning his career as a walk-on and eighth on the quarterback depth chart, Aidan O'Connell worked his way up to the starting role and didn't stop there. The sixth-year QB has etched his name in the school record books, and he continued to rise up the career charts early this season.
- O'Connell already ranks in the program's Top 10 in several career categories: completion percentage (1st - 67.9%), 500-yard games (11st - 2), 400-yard games (2nd - 5), 300-yard games (14th - 10), touchdown passes (6th - 51), passing completions (7th - 592) and passing yards (8th - 6,729).
- Leading the Big Ten in passing yards and total offense, O'Connell ranks top 10 nationally in both categories. His 1,000 passing yards rank fourth nationally, while he stands ninth in total offense with 330 yards per game.
- Since 2000, O'Connell is one of just three Big Ten quarterbacks to throw for 1,000 yards over the first three games of a season (Christian Hackenberg - 1,008 yards, 2014; Richard Lagow - 1,002 yards, 2016).
- In last week's matchup, he torched the Syracuse defense with 424 passing yards and three touchdowns.
- O'Connell now has five 400-yard passing games; only Drew Brees has more (7).

HONORARY CAPTAIN - JOHN LUCKHARDT

- Purdue will welcome back former offensive lineman John Luckhardt as the Homecoming honorary captain.
- Luckhardt played center and linebacker during Purdue's historic 1966 campaign that ended with a 14-13 win in the 1967 Rose Bowl.
- Luckhardt shared the field with College Football Hall of Fame inductees Leroy Keyes and Bob Griese.
- Following his playing days, Luckhardt was a stalwart on the Western Pennsylvania football scene for the better part of three decades.
- Luckhardt turned Washington & Jefferson and NCAA Division II member California University of Pennsylvania into national contenders.
- He amassed a 225-70-2 career coaching record over 27 seasons, winning 21 conference titles in the process.
- He will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame at the 64th NFF Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 6.

CHUCK'S SIZZLIN' START

- Wide receiver Charlie Jones has gotten his Purdue career off to a strong start, leading the Big Ten in receptions (32), receiving yards (474) and receiving touchdowns (5) through the first three games of the season.
- He is the only wide receiver in the country with at least 400 yards and five touchdown receptions.
- Jones' 474 receiving yards are most by a Big Ten player through the first three games over the past 15 seasons, and he joined former Purdue All-American David Bell as the only two Big Ten receivers to haul in at least 30 receptions over the first three games since 2000.
- Jones ranks among the nation's best in several statistical categories, including leading the country in receptions per game (10.7).

PURDUE vs. CONFERENCE USA

- Saturday's matchup will be only Purdue's sixth against a current member of Conference USA.
- Four of the five previous meetings were against Rice, with the Boilermakers splitting the series.
- The last time the Boilermakers faced a Conference USA team, they opened the 2011 season with back-to-back C-USA opponents, beating Middle Tennessee 27-24 before falling on the road to Rice.

WALK-ONS

- While Aidan O'Connell has gone from a former walk-on to one of the best quarterbacks in the country, another walk-on is becoming a factor in the Purdue offense.
- Redshirt freshman Devin Mockobee leads the Boilermakers' ground attack, despite playing in only two games.
- Mockobee's 100 yards are a team-high, and his 4.8 yards per carry sits atop the running back room.
- Against Indiana State, Mockobee made his Purdue debut by rushing for 78 yards and his first career touchdown.
- With starting running back King Doerue missing the Syracuse game, Mockobee found the end zone from 15 yards out for Purdue's first touchdown of the game and the walk-on's second of the season.

DON'T FORGET ABOUT THE DEFENSE

- While a Jeff Brohm team is usually known for its offense, the Purdue defense is making its presence felt this season.
- The Boilermakers have forced four turnovers, including a pair of interceptions that were returned for touchdowns.
- Purdue is one of five teams nationwide with multiple pick sixes.
- The Purdue defense ranks 15th nationally in red zone defense, while allowing only 285.7 yards per game to rank 25th in the country.

- Purdue receiver Elijah Canion and FAU wideout BJ Alexander played for Chaminade Madonna in Hollywood, Fla.
- Canion and FAU offensive lineman Kamaar Bell crossed paths for the 2020 season at Auburn.
- Purdue cornerback Jamari Brown and FAU's BJ Alexander played the 2018 and 2019 seasons together at Kentucky.
- Purdue linebacker OC Brothers and FAU defensive end Dorien Josey are both played at Rockledge in Southwest Brevard County, Fla.
- Boilermaker running back Kobe Lewis and FAU defensive back Daemon Hill spent two seasons together at Central Michigan.
- Purdue defensive lineman Prince James Boyd Jr. and quarterback Tyriq Starks played the 2021 season together at Independence CC.
- Purdue defensive lineman Joe Anderson and defensive lineman Keem Green played the 2020 season together at South Carolina.
- Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm was the quarterbacks coach at FAU for the 2009 season.

THE WKU CONNECTION

- A trio of coaches will roam the sidelines who each served as the head coach at Western Kentucky for all but one year from 2003-16. All three were first-time head coaches in Bowling Green, Ky.
- Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm led the Hilltoppers to back-to-back Conference USA Championships from 2014-16. Brohm was 30-10 in three campaigns at Western Kentucky.
- FAU head coach Willie Taggart, a WKU Hall of Fame quarterback, led his alma mater from 2010-12. Taggart finished 16-20 over three seasons.
- Purdue linebackers coach David Elson preceded both at Western Kentucky, serving as the head coach from 2003-09. Elson went 39-44 over seven seasons.

PAYNE TRAIN

- Tight end Payne Durham broke his early season scoring drought with a pair of touchdown receptions on the road at Syracuse.
- Durham moved into a tie for 13th in program history with 15 receiving touchdowns.
- Durham is now fourth on the career list for touchdown receptions by a tight end, trailing Dave Young (27, 1977-80), Jim Beirne (17, 1965-67) and Dustin Keller (16, 2004-07). He is tied with Tim Stratton (15, 1998-01).

BROHM AIR RAID

- Head coach Jeff Brohm's offensive air-raid style has produced dividends over his coaching career at Purdue and Western Kentucky.
- Over his two coaching stops, Brohm's offenses have accounted for 16 400-yard passing games (8 at Purdue, 8 at WKU).
- Since Brohm got his head coaching start in 2014, only two coaches have had more 500-yard passing games than him - Mike Leach (14) and Kliff Kingsbury (11).

SMILE FOR THE CAM

- Senior safety Cam Allen factored in two of Indiana State's three turnovers, recovering a fumble on the first play of the game before returning an interception for a touchdown in the third quarter.
- The interception was Allen's eighth of his career, but his first pick six.
- Allen became the first Boilermaker to record an interception and fumble recovery since Anthony Brown accomplished the feat, also against Indiana State (Sept. 12, 2015).

PICK SIX CITY

- The Purdue defense has returned interceptions for touchdowns in back-to-back games for the first time since 2010 when Ricardo Allen had a pair of pick sixes against Michigan and Michigan State.
- Chris Jefferson's 72-yard pick six against Penn State (Sept. 1) was the longest by a Boilermaker since Ja'Whaun Bentley went 76 yards versus Minnesota (Oct. 7, 2017).
- In the shutout victory over Indiana State (Sept. 10), Cam Allen's eighth career interception became his first pick six as he scampered 65 yards to the end zone.
- Purdue is one of five teams (Pitt, Texas, USC and Western Kentucky) that have taken multiple interceptions back for touchdowns this season.
- Allen's interception return for a touchdown against Indiana State was the 55th by a Boilermaker since 1950.

EVERYBODY LOVES CHRIS

- Chris Jefferson made the most of his first start at Purdue with a pick six against Penn State.
- Jefferson's pick six was the second of his career, following a 92-yard score when he played at Findlay against Walsh in the spring of 2021. He finished the spring campaign as the G-MAC Defensive Player of the Year and First Team AP Division II All-America.
- Jefferson now has 14 interceptions in his career.

HURRY HURRY

- The Boilermaker defense has made habit of living in the offensive backfield with 14 tackles-for-loss, seven sacks and 17 quarterback hurries.
- Prince James Boyd Jr. and Kydran Jenkins leads the team with a pair of stops behind the line, while eight different players have helped tally a sack this year.
- Purdue's linebacker and defensive line corps applied pressure in the backfield against Penn State, notching eight quarterback hurries, led by three from Kydran Jenkins, matching the season high in 2021.

TRACKING THE TARGETS

- Aidan O'Connell wasted no time spreading the ball around in the opener against Penn State, going 30-for-60 for 365 yards and a touchdown.
- O'Connell directed 19 of his 60 attempts towards childhood teammate Charlie Jones in the opener against Penn State.
- Sixteen different Boilermakers have caught a pass with 12 making two or more grabs.

SYCAMORE SHUTOUT

- Purdue's 56-0 win over Indiana State was the largest margin of victory since beating Southeast Missouri 59-0 in 2011.
- The victory was the second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era, joining the 49-0 win over UConn last season.
- Purdue allowed only 145 yards of total offense, the lowest output by an opponent since Oregon mustered just 143 yards in 1979.
- The Boilermakers held the Sycamores to just 51 yards on the ground, the third time in the Brohm era that Purdue has held an opponent to less than 60 rushing yards (Nov. 11, 2021 vs. Indiana, 58; Oct. 28, 2017 vs. Nebraska, 40).

• King Doerue has been off to a flying start out of the backfield in 2022. The senior found the endzone three times on the ground in the first two games, eclipsing his total from 2021.

• Doerue had 18 carries for 64 yards through in the first two games before missing at Syracuse due to injury.

• Dylan Downing scored for the second time in his Purdue career when he ran for 55 yards on 11 touches against the Sycamores.

• Walk-on redshirt freshman Devin Mockobee found pay dirt for the first time in his career and led the team in rushing with 78 yards against Indiana State.

• Boilermaker fans also got their first look at Central Michigan transfer Kobe Lewis when he carried the ball 12 times for 37 yards in the second half in the shutout win against Indiana State.

ATTACK FROM THE AIR

• Over the Jeff Brohm era, the Boilermakers have averaged 306.1 yards passing per game at a 64.7% completion clip with 139 touchdowns.

• Purdue's passing attack trails only Ohio State and ranks in the top 20 nationally over the last five years, also considering the program played just six games in 2020.

300-YARDERS

• Aidan O'Connell started his 2022 campaign with 365 yards passing against Penn State for his ninth career 300-yard game, before adding his 10th with a 424-yard performance at Syracuse.

• Last year, he joined Drew Brees as the only Purdue quarterbacks to record multiple 500-yard games over a career, while becoming the only one to reach the 500-yard mark twice in a single season.

• O'Connell threw for a career-high 536 yards in an upset victory over No. 3 Michigan State before ending the year with 534 passing yards to help Purdue beat Tennessee in the Music City Bowl.

• The gunslinger produced six 300-yard games in 2021, the third-most in a single season and the first Purdue quarterback to accomplish the feat since Curtis Painter in 2007.

• O'Connell is tied for fourth in program history with 10 career games of 300 yards passing or more. Drew Brees owns the record with 16.

• All 10 of O'Connell's 300-yard passing games have been for 350 yards or more.

BIG PLAY POTENTIAL

• So far this season, Purdue has seven plays of 30 yards or more, including a quartet of passes from Aidan O'Connell to Charlie Jones and both interceptions returned for a touchdown.

• The Boilermaker offense tallied 29 plays of 30 yards or more last season, as well as 11 of 50 yards or more.

• O'Connell has 33 career throws of 30 yards or more and 11 over 50 yards.

• Purdue's three longest plays from 2021 all came in that exhilarating TransPerfect Music City Bowl with O'Connell finding Broc Thompson for touchdowns of 75 and 70 yards and Durham for a 62-yard catch-and-score.

• When Thompson arrived in West Lafayette in 2021, he elected to wear No. 29 to honor the number of chemotherapy rounds Cade endured.

• Cade was declared cancer-free in April of 2021.

• Thompson switched back to No. 13 for the 2022 season.



BOILER NOTES

99th SEASON AT ROSS-ADE STADIUM

- The Boilermakers call Ross-Ade Stadium home for the 99th season in 2022.
- A roughly two-year construction process for \$237,500 (\$3.76 million) with funds raised by Purdue alumni David E. Ross and George Ade helped replace Stuart Field, which had hosted Purdue Football since its inception.
- Ross-Ade Stadium had the perfect dedication and opening, a 26-7 drubbing of Indiana for homecoming on Nov. 22, 1924.
- Originally seating 13,500 with an additional 5,000 standing spots, Ross-Ade Stadium now can hold up to 61,320, including non-ticketed personnel.
- Purdue has an all-time record of 295-199 at Ross-Ade Stadium.

REMEMBERING LEN DAWSON

- The Boilermakers bid farewell to one of the iconic greats and a pioneer of the Cradle of Quarterbacks in Len Dawson, who passed away Aug. 24 at the age of 87.
- A three-year starter at Purdue, Dawson was named All-Big Ten and led the conference in passing and total offense all three seasons. He set then-records at Purdue with 3,325 yards and 29 passing touchdowns.
- Over a 19-year career for Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Houston/Kansas City, Dawson threw for 28,711 yards and 239 touchdowns and netted numerous honors, including a win in Super Bowl IV, Super Bowl IV MVP honors, his No. 16 retired by the Kansas City Chiefs and induction to the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- Following his playing career, Dawson served several roles as a broadcaster around football, hosting HBO's "Inside the NFL" for 25 years, landing him back in Canton for a second time as a broadcaster.

NATIONAL LEADERS IN 2021

- Completing 70.8 percent of passes, Purdue led the Big Ten and ranked second in the country.
- The Boilermakers limited making penalties, committing a conference-low 4.5 per game that was the 10th-fewest nationally.
- Purdue's passing offense ranked fifth in the country and second in the Big Ten with 355.4 yards per game.
- Opponents were only been able to convert 8 of 22 fourth down attempts for a .364 conversion rate, putting the Boilermakers 11th nationally in defending fourth downs.
- Purdue's red zone defense also ranked 23rd in the country.

GETTING THE SQUAD BACK TOGETHER

- With the newest additions from the transfer portal, several Boilermakers reunited with old teammates from their youth football days.
- Quarterback Aidan O'Connell connected with his old youth receiver Charlie Jones from their time together on the Buffalo Grove Jr. Bisons.
- Receivers Broc Thompson and Tyrone Tracy and defensive back Reese Taylor reunite from their days playing in the Indiana Elementary Football Association. All three started their careers at different schools, but transferred to Purdue over the last two years. Taylor was the quarterback during their youth careers playing with a powerhouse trio of receivers in Tracy, Thompson and David Bell. In high school, Taylor was named Indiana Mr. Football at Ben Davis and Tracy was tabbed Indiana Gatorade Player of the Year in 2017 at Decatur Central.
- Two other players who started their careers elsewhere have reunited at Purdue. Running back Dylan Downing (UNLV) and defensive tackle Cole Brevard (Penn State) led Carmel High School to an Indiana State Championship in 2018.

ALL-AMERICANS TO THE NFL

- Purdue had to replace a pair of All-Americans in WR David Bell and DE George Karlaftis as the two were taken in the 2022 NFL Draft (Karlaftis - 1st Rd, 30th, Kansas City, Bell - 3rd, 99th, Cleveland).
- A finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, Bell was named First Team All-America from four (AFCA, AP, FWAA, Walter Camp Football Foundation) of the five outlets recognized by the NCAA to just miss out on being a unanimous selection; however, the Purdue wide receiver became the 21st consensus All-American in Purdue history.
- Bell earned the Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year as the best receiver in the Big Ten, leading the conference in catches per game (8.5) and receiving yards per game (116.9); both marks ranked Top 5 in the country.
- Karlaftis became the first defensive Boilermaker to earn All-America honors since Ryan Kerrigan (2010).
- Karlaftis led the Boilermakers in tackles for loss (11.5), sacks (5.0), forced fumbles (3), fumble recoveries (2) and quarterback hurries (8), earning First Team All-Big Ten honors along the way.
- Along with the two All-Americans, Zander Horvath (7th Rd, 260th, Los Angeles Chargers) gave Purdue three Boilermakers taken in the 2022 NFL Draft; it marked the most Boilermakers selected in a single draft since 2008.

2021: A HISTORIC SEASON

- Purdue finished the 2021 season with nine wins for the first time since 2003, when the Boilermakers also were 9-4.
- The nine wins were second-most in program history, as the Boilermakers record at least nine wins for the 12th time in the team's 134-year history.
- Two of those victories were over previously unbeaten No. 2 Iowa (Oct. 16) and No. 3 Michigan State (Nov. 6), giving the Boilermakers two wins over Top 5 teams for the first time since 1960.
- Purdue finished with a record of 6-3 in Big Ten play, the most conference wins in a season since the 2003 team went 6-2.
- The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, finishing in the division's top three for the third time in five seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm (2017, 2018, 2021).
- Purdue won five games away from home for the first time since 1943, going 5-2 away from Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Purdue entered the College Football Playoff rankings at No. 19 on Nov. 9, the first-ever in the CFP era for the Boilermakers.
- The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl.
- The Boilermakers held four opponents to fewer than 10 points in 2021, the first time it has achieved the feat since 1978, when six opponents were held to single-digit point totals.

HARD KNOCKS BOILERS

- The long-running HBO series Hard Knocks has several ties to the Purdue Boilermakers during the 2022 season.
- Quarterback David Blough was featured on the preseason edition while with the Detroit Lions. The show highlighted his preseason campaign, as well as his relationship with his wife Olympic sprinter Melissa Gonzalez. After training camp, Blough joined the Minnesota Vikings as a member of their practice squad.
- Wide receiver Rondale Moore is slated to be a part of the in-season version of Hard Knocks later this year. The 2018 consensus All-American is in his second season with the Arizona Cardinals.

PRESEASON HAUL FOR AOC

- Leading into the season, it seemed that Aidan O'Connell landed on a different watch list or preseason team every week.

CRADLE OF QUARTERBACKS

Many schools boast of tradition. But none can match Purdue's tradition of turning out top-flight quarterbacks.

The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last half century as a defining feature of Purdue football. Boilermakers have set numerous NCAA and Big Ten Conference records, many have been chosen as All-Americans and national awards winners or finalists.

In the early 1970s, Purdue Athletics commissioned a university artist named Keith Butz to create a poster featuring outstanding Boilermaker quarterbacks of the previous 30 years. That poster featured Bob DeMoss, Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bernie Allen, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson.

AIR IT OUT AIDAN

- Starting his career as a walk-on before taking over the starting duties, Aidan O'Connell put together a memorable 2021 campaign.
- O'Connell earned Second Team All-Big Ten honors from the conference coaches and media, the first Purdue quarterback to be named to one of the first two All-Big Ten teams since Kyle Orton in 2004.
- O'Connell's 71.8% completion percentage set a new school record and ranked fourth in the country.
- Despite splitting time at points of the season, O'Connell threw for 3,712 yards (11th) and 28 touchdowns (17th).
- In games against Top 5 competition (at No. 2 Iowa, No. 3 Michigan State, and at No. 4 Ohio State), O'Connell threw for 1,301 passing yards (433.7 avg.) and completed 110-of-146 pass attempts (.753). For those three games, O'Connell had a 9-0 TD-INT ratio.

BOWLING WITH BROHM

- The Boilermakers have been to three bowls in five seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm.
- Purdue closed out 2021 with a 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee in the Transperfect Music City Bowl.
- The Boilermakers capped the first season of the Brohm era with a 38-35 win at the Foster Farms Bowl in San Francisco against Arizona.
- Prior to the Foster Farms Bowl, Purdue had not reached a bowl game since 2013 in the Heart of Dallas Bowl and had not won a bowl game since the 2011 Little Caesars Bowl.
- The Boilermakers have gone bowling 20 times with a record of 11-9.

NEW FACES ON STAFF

- Purdue's five new assistant coaches on the sidelines in 2022:
- David Elson (Linebackers) - a former head coach at Western Kentucky and a defensive coordinator at several stops, spent the 2021 campaign with Purdue as a defensive quality control coach.
- Garrick McGee (Wide Receivers) - joined the Boilermakers with 26 years of coaching experience, including time as the head coach at UAB, where Jeff Brohm was his offensive coordinator, and several stints as an offensive coordinator; he most recently coached quarterbacks at Florida in 2021.
- Ryan Wallace (Tight Ends) - has spent the past five seasons on Brohm's staff, serving as an offensive and special teams assistant.
- Aston Youboty (Cornerbacks) - was an All-Big Ten cornerback at Ohio State and played five seasons in the NFL before making the transition into coaching; he coached cornerbacks at Youngstown State and was as a quality control coach at Wisconsin.
- Karl Maslowski (Special Teams/Linebackers) - joined Purdue after spending three seasons at Louisville. He was an All-American linebacker at Western Kentucky from 1999-03.

SECOND SEASON WITH ENGLISH/HAGEN

- Purdue is in its second season with co-defensive coordinators Ron English and Mark Hagen. The duo, along with fellow co-defensive coordinator Brad Lambert who left for Wake Forest during the offseason, provided some much-needed stability to the defensive side of the ball.
- With Hagen's focus on the defensive line and English handling the defensive backs, Purdue trimmed opponents' passing yards per game down to 208.7 yards, which ranked fifth nationally and second in the Big Ten.
- The Boilermakers also posted their first shutout since 2011 with a 49-0 drubbing of UConn.

EXPERIENCED LINE

- Center Gus Hartwig (6-5, 310), guard Spencer Holstege (6-5, 310) and tackle Eric Miller (6-7, 305) team up for their second campaign in the trenches.
- The trio anchor the left side of the line with a combined 55 starts.
- Redshirt freshman guard Marcus Mbow (6-5, 305) solidified his spot after playing well in the Music City Bowl last December and having a solid spring and camp.
- Redshirt junior Cam Craig (6-5,310) started a pair of games in 2021 after missing 2020 due to injury. The Dublin, Ohio, native has emerged as the top right tackle heading into the year.

RECORD BREAKERS

- The Boilermakers produced several new school records during the 2021 campaign, courtesy of the passing game.
- Purdue broke the school record for passing yards in a season with 4,620 to top the previous record of 4,208 set in 1998.
- The Boilermakers broke the program record for passing yards per game with 355.3 to eclipse the previous mark of 341.8 set in 1985.
- Purdue totaled 221 passing first downs to best the original record of 204 set in 1998.
- Boilermaker quarterbacks recorded 407 completions to pass the previous record of 377 set in 1998.
- Purdue quarterbacks also completed 70.8 percent of their passes, including 70.2 percent by Aidan O'Connell; both percentages are new school records.



BOILER NOTES

ARSENAL OF RECEIVERS

- Despite the departures of David Bell, Jackson Anthrop and Milton Wright, Aidan O'Connell has an overabundance of targets to catch his passes.
- O'Connell has more than 15 potential targets split between the wide receivers, tight ends and running backs this season.
- Instant impact transfers from Iowa, Charlie Jones and Tyrone Tracy are the elder statesmen of the receivers room. The duo combined for 87 catches, 1,194 yards and eight touchdowns during their time in Iowa City.
- Big-bodied receivers in Broc Thompson, Mershawn Rice, Auburn transfer Elijah Canion, Collin Sullivan and Abdur-Rahmaan Yaseen all stand 6-foot-2 or taller to give some height on the perimeter.
- Shifty slotmen TJ Sheffield and Deion Burks will also get in on the action in different packages.

OLD RELIABLE AT TIGHT END

- Trusty veteran tight end Payne Durham is in his final season in West Lafayette after an All-Big Ten campaign in 2021 that saw him haul in 45 passes for 467 yards and six scores.
- Durham's progression in college from backup to all-conference caliber is made more impressive when you consider he played one year of high school football after playing lacrosse all his life.
- Joining Durham as the front line tight ends will be Paul Piferi, who made five catches for 61 yards and a score last season. A former three-star quarterback, Piferi transitioned to tight end during the 2020 season.
- The only setback in the tight end room came during preseason camp when Garrett Miller suffered a season-ending knee injury.
- To provide more depth at tight end, the Boilermakers will look to walk-on redshirt sophomore Ben Buechel and sophomore Drew Biber.

THE RUNNING BACK ROOM

- King Doerue heads a stable of running backs. The senior from Amarillo, Texas, crossed the 1,000-yard mark for his career last season when he ran for 530 yards on 135 carries as Purdue's primary rusher.
- Doerue split time with Zander Horvath in 2021, who was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Los Angeles Chargers.
- Joining Doerue will be Dylan Downing, who carried the ball 44 times for 178 yards and a score last season. When Horvath went down with an injury, Downing stepped up to be the Boilermakers' second back. During the offseason, Downing dropped nearly 20 pounds in an effort to be leaner and more agile, thanks to a refocus on nutrition.
- Central Michigan transfer Kobe Lewis will look to make his mark in West Lafayette. The Americus, Ga., product rushed for over 1,500 yards and 18 scores in his career.
- One player who has turned some heads during camp is walk-on Devin Mockobee. The shifty redshirt freshman from Boonville, Ind., did not see action in 2021, after winning the Indiana high school state long jump and finishing second in the 110-meter hurdles.

REPLACING THE GREEK FREAK

- 2021 All-American George Karlaftis, who was selected 30th overall by the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2022 NFL Draft, left a large void at the end of the defensive line.
- Karlaftis led the Boilermakers in tackles-for-loss with 11.5 and tied for the team lead in sacks with five. Totalling 41 tackles, 31 solos, Karlaftis drew the attention of most offensive fronts.
- The West Lafayette product closed his career ranked 18th in program history with 30.5 tackles-for-loss.

SPECIALIST TRIO RETURNS

- The Boilermakers have stability in 2022 with veterans at kicker, punter and long snapper all returning.
- Long snapper Nick Zecchino, one of two seventh-year players on the roster, handles the short and long snapping duties for the fourth straight year.
- Fifth-year kicker Mitchell Fineran was named to the Lou Groza Award Watch List ahead of his second season in West Lafayette.
- Fineran had a huge 2021 season, making 82.8 percent of his field goal attempts (24-of-29) and earning All-Big Ten Honorable Mention accolades.
- Sophomore punter Jack Ansell completes the returner trifecta, as the Aussie looks to improve upon his campaign last year.

NEW SPECIAL TEAMS COACH

- Head coach Jeff Brohm welcomed in Karl Maslowski as the Boilermakers' new special teams coach during the offseason.
- Maslowski was a senior quality control specialist at Louisville for the last three seasons after coaching special teams at Northern Michigan from 2013-18.
- Under his direction, his punt units ranked top 30 nationally in six out of nine seasons, while his kickoff return units finished in the top 30 eight times.

IMPROVING THE RETURN

- Purdue ranked last in the Big Ten and 129th nationally in yards per kickoff return last season with 12.4 and 11th in the Big Ten with 6.2 yards per punt return.
- To bolster their return game, the Boilermakers brought in two of the best returners in the Big Ten in Charlie Jones and Reese Taylor.
- Jones was one of the most electric returners in the nation last season. Jones was named to the Paul Hornung Award Watch List, Preseason Second Team All-America returner (Walter Camp), Fourth Team All-America returner (Athlon), First Team All-Big Ten returner (Phil Steele) and Second Team All-Big Ten (PFF).
- Last season, Jones took in an impressive award haul as the Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist of the Year, First Team All-Big Ten return specialist, First Team All-Big Ten kick return specialist by Phil Steele, Second Team All-Big Ten by the Associated Press and Fourth Team All-Big Ten punt return specialist by Phil Steele.
- Taylor garnered Big Ten accolades after his 2020 campaign as a Third Team All-Big Ten punt returner by Phil Steele and honorable mention by the Big Ten coaches and media.
- The pair will join TJ Sheffield, one of Purdue's primary returners the last two seasons, as the Boilermakers' primary rotation.

- From playing to coaching to administration, head coach Jeff Brohm and his family were made for football.
- Jeff Brohm's playing accolades include being named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and Kentucky Mr. Football for 1988. He was a three-year starter at Louisville named to the Louisville Cardinals Ring of Honor and embarked on a eight-year professional career.
- Co-offensive coordinator Brian Brohm was named Kentucky Mr. Football in 2003, played in the U.S. Army All-American Bowl and started three years at Louisville to earn Conference USA Freshman of the Year and the 2007 Orange Bowl MVP.
- Executive Director of Football Administration & Operations / Chief of Staff Greg Brohm was an all-state receiver in high school and a four-year letterwinner (three as a starter) at Louisville.
- Oscar Brohm, the patriarch of the family, was an AP first team all-state quarterback in Kentucky and quarterbacked two seasons at Louisville, including the first year of the Lee Corso era.

BOILERMAKERS BACK IN THE RANKINGS

- The Boilermakers received votes in the preseason AP and Coaches polls heading into the 2022 campaign.
- Purdue's two wins over top-5 opponents last year saw the Boilermakers crack into the national rankings for the first time since 2007.

GAME 4 NOTES • Purdue vs. FAU

HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM

Jeff Brohm enters his sixth year at the helm of the Purdue Football. A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season – a memorable 2021 campaign – as the Boilermakers continue to be on the rise under Brohm's leadership.

Brohm's three fundamental concepts – playing harder, tougher and smarter than the opposition – have been the benchmarks for his program. His calling cards of creative play-calling and an explosive, high-powered offense has led Purdue to average 419.8 yards per game and 276 points per game in his first five seasons.

Playing in Brohm's offense, Boilermakers have been recognized across the league and nationally. They have collected a variety of individual honors, including back-to-back Big Ten Freshman of the Year awards (Rondale Moore – 2018, David Bell – 2019), two Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year awards (Moore – 2018, Bell – 2021), the Big Ten Tight End of the Year award (Brycen Hopkins – 2019), and the 2018 Paul Hornung Award winner (Moore) as the nation's most versatile player.

Three Boilermakers have become All-Americans during Brohm's tenure in West Lafayette. Rondale Moore became first true freshman consensus First Team All-American in Big Ten history in 2018 before wide receiver David Bell and defensive end George Karlaftis earned All-American honors following the 2021 season. Bell was a consensus All-American, joining Moore as the second under Brohm and the 21st in Purdue history.

Brohm and his staff continue to make moves on the recruiting trail, signing two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in school history 2019 and 2020. Purdue's 2019 class was ranked 25th nationally - the highest since Joe Tiller inked the No. 20 class in 2004.

The 2021 season featured a 9-4 record, the second-most wins in a single season in Purdue history. The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, which included a pair of Top 5 victories over No. 2 Iowa and No. 3 Michigan State. The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee at the TransPerfect Music City Bowl in Nashville.

Purdue exceeded all expectations in his first season in 2017 and made noise throughout college football. The Boilermakers won seven games, recaptured both of its rivalry trophies (the Cannon and the Old Oaken Bucket), and capped the season with Foster Farms Bowl victory over Arizona. They followed that up in 2018 with another Bowl appearance, and Top 25 victories over Boston College, Iowa, and a historic victory over No. 2 Ohio State.

Brohm was hired Dec. 5, 2016, as the 36th full-time head football coach in Purdue history. Widely regarded as one of the most innovative offensive masterminds in college football, he became the first former quarterback to engineer the Boilermakers since Bob DeMoss in 1970.

Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record from 2014 to 2016. The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016. They

won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl, as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl.

Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons. Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Western Kentucky ranked in the top 10 nationally in scoring offense, passing offense and total offense each of Brohm's three seasons as head coach.

Previously, Brohm served as an assistant coach at Louisville (quarterbacks 2003-06, assistant head coach/passing game 2007, assistant head coach/offensive coordinator 2008), Florida Atlantic (quarterbacks 2009), Illinois (quarterbacks 2010-11), UAB (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2012) and Western Kentucky (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2013). He began his career as the head coach of the Louisville Fire in the af2 in 2002.

Brohm enjoyed an outstanding collegiate career at Louisville from 1989 to 1993. A three-year starter, he still ranks among the Cardinals' career leaders in touchdown passes, total offense, completion percentage, passing yards, passing efficiency, passing attempts and completions through the 2020 season. Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player during both his junior and senior seasons, and his number 11 became part of the Louisville Ring of Honor in 2006.

Brohm played in the NFL six different franchises. In eight career games - all with the 49ers - he completed 37 of 58 passes (63.8%) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception. His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19 of 30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers. In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first-team All-XFL.

Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky. He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season. Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 2014.

A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke. Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville - father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greg (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07). The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

A late Penn State touchdown with 57 seconds remaining sent the Purdue football team to a 35-31 loss in the 2022 season opener at Ross-Ade Stadium.

The Boilermakers (0-1) held a 31-28 advantage after Chris Jefferson intercepted Penn State (1-0) quarterback Sean Clifford and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown with 8:29 to play. Purdue held Penn State to just seven plays and 14 yards on its next two possessions, taking the ball back on offense with 4:28 on the clock. Penn State's defense forced Purdue to punt with 2:22 remaining.

The Nittany Lions then took eight plays to cover 80 yards in 1:25 with Clifford hitting Keyvone Lee for 10 yards and the game-winning score.

Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell finished the night going 30-59 passing for 365 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. The sixth-year thrower crossed the 300-yard mark for the ninth time in his career, moving him into sole control of fifth in program history. Running back King Doerue found the end zone twice for his second career multi-score game.

Clifford threw for 282 yards on 20-of-37 passing with four touchdowns and an interception.

Both sides had one giveaway that led to points. Purdue's fumble with 30 seconds remaining in the second saw Penn State score with two seconds left in the first half, while Jefferson's interception return for a touchdown swung the momentum in the fourth.

O'Connell connected with former youth football teammate Charlie Jones in his Purdue debut 12 times. Jones posted a career night receiving with 12 receptions for 153 yards and a touchdown.

Purdue's defense forced a fumble on the opening play of the game to set the tone in a 56-0 rout of Indiana State on Saturday at Ross-Ade Stadium. The 56-point margin of victory was the largest for Purdue since a 59-point shutout win over Southeast Missouri in 2011.

The Boilermakers (1-1) tallied 521 yards of total offense with a balanced 232 on the ground and 289 through the air. Purdue's defense held the Sycamores (1-1) to 145 yards of total offense.

The defense posted its second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era. Purdue racked up seven tackles-for-loss, three sacks, two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Sanoussi Kane delivered a punishing hit to Indiana State Tee Hodge on the opening play of the game to pop the ball up in the air into safety Cam Allen's arms.

In the third quarter, Allen picked off an Indiana State pass and took it to pay dirt for a 65-yard touchdown. It marked the first time Purdue has interception returns for a touchdown in back-to-back weeks since Ricardo Allen achieved the feat in 2010.

Offensively, Purdue scored a touchdown on seven of its first nine drives. The only two drives the Boilermakers failed to score on started inside their own two-yard line.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell was efficient in his one half of action with four touchdowns and 211 yards on 17-of-19 passing. Charlie Jones added to his early haul as a Boilermaker with his second straight 100-yard receiving game. The Deerfield, Ill., native snagged nine passes for 133 yards and three touchdowns.

Redshirt freshman Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 78 yards on 13 touches with one score. Dylan Downing added 55 yards from 11 rushes. Purdue topped 200 yards rushing for the first time since Oct. 13, 2018, in a win over Illinois.

A Syracuse touchdown with seven seconds left to play handed Purdue a 32-29 loss in its road opener on Saturday in the JMA Wireless Dome.

The Boilermakers (1-2, 0-1 B10) held a 9-3 lead over the Orange (3-0, 1-0 ACC) at the end of the first half thanks to a Devin Mockobee 15-yard touchdown run and a Mitchell Fineran 41-yard field goal in what looked to be a defensive dogfight. Purdue's defense held quarterback Garrett Shrader and the Syracuse offense to just 134 total yards and a field goal in the first half of play.

The script would flip in the second half however, as both offenses exploded for a combined 49 points, 42 of which came in the fourth quarter. Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell posted season highs in completions and yards as he finished 39-of-55 for 424 yards, three touchdowns and one interception.

A back and forth second half saw the lead change hands on five different occasions. The teams traded touchdowns until O'Connell's first career pick-six gave the Orange a 25-15 lead with 8:08 left in the game. The Boilermakers would battle right back, as O'Connell found Charlie Jones for a 55-yard bomb to cut the deficit to three before tight end Payne Durham caught his second touchdown of the day to give Purdue a 29-25 lead with just 51 seconds remaining.

Penalties against Purdue aided Syracuse on their final possession as they took five plays to go fifty yards capped off by Shrader finding wide receiver Oronde Gadsden II for a 25-yard touchdown to win the game for the Orange.

O'Connell's connection with Charlie Jones continues to drive the Boilermaker offense. Jones racked up a career-high 188 yards and added a touchdown to become just the fifth power five player to have 100 yards receiving and a touchdown in his team's first three games. Two 50-plus yard strikes from O'Connell to Jones sparked Purdue's fourth quarter comeback bid that ultimately fell short.
