STORY LINES

- · After back-to-back road wins in conference play, battle between two teams atop the Big Ten West. The Boilermakers and Cornhuskers are set to play in front of a sellout crowd at Ross-Ade Stadium, kicking off at 7:30 p.m. ET on BTN.
- Purdue is 4-2 for the second consecutive season. The last time the Boilermakers were 4-2 in back-to-back seasons was when Joe Tiller led the program to consecutive eight- averaging 311.8 ypg to also rank ninth nationally. win campaigns (2006-07).
- The Boilermakers are coming off a 31-29 victory at outscoring the opposition 50-10 in the first quarter. Maryland, their third straight win. The last time Purdue over No. 2 Ohio State.
- Purdue has won three of the past four meetings with Nebraska, including a 28-23 victory in Lincoln last year.

- Cam Allen, Jalen Graham and Chris Jefferson recorded Purdue Football returns home to host Nebraska in a interceptions in last season's win over the Cornhuskers. Graham had two INTs, including a pick six that helped him earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week accolades.
 - Purdue has scored 24 out of 25 times (96%) to have the nation's eighth-best red zone offense. Even better, 21 of those 24 red zone scores have been touchdowns (88%).
 - Aidan O'Connell paces the Big Ten in passing yards,
 - · Purdue has gotten off to fast starts this season,
- Rob Ninkovich will serve as the Purdue's honorary won three games in-a-row came during the 2018 season, a captain for Saturday night's contest. A member of the Den four-game winning streak that included a 49-20 thumping of Defensive Ends, he recorded 16 sacks in two seasons as a Boilermaker. Ninkovich earned First Team All-Big Ten accolades during the 2005 season before taking his talents to the NFL and winning a pair of Super Bowls with the New England Patriots.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Cam Allen, who blocked a crucial extra point in the victory over Maryland, leads the B1G and ranks eighth nationally with three interceptions on the season.



Four of the Boilermakers' six games have been decided by four points-or-less. Purdue is 2-2 in those contests.



Purdue has 11 rushing touchdowns through the first six games, already the most in a single season since recording 20 throughout the 2018 campaign.



Aidan O'Connell has recorded 11 300-yard passing games over his career, throwing for more than 350 yards in all 11 of them.

RECEIVER U

- With 47 receptions to begin his Purdue career, Charlie Jones became the only Big Ten receiver since 2000 to haul in 45 or more passes in the first five games of a season.
- After Jones, David Bell caught 43 passes to start the 2020 season; now a member of the Cleveland Browns, Bell was a 2021 consensus All-American and Biletnikoff Award finalist.
- Minnesota's Eric Decker hauled in 43 receptions in 2009 to break up the list of Boilermakers, while Rondale Moore rounds out the top five with 41 catches to begin the 2018 season.
- Jones joined Taylor Stubblefield as the only receivers from the Big Ten to record seven touchdown catches in the first four games of a season. Stubblefield, currently the wide outs coach at Penn State, was a consensus All-American in 2004.

THE RECONNECTION

- Playing youth football together, Aidan O'Connell and Charlie Jones were reunited at Purdue this offseason. Years passed since they were teammates, but you would not have known it in the season opener versus Penn State.
- O'Connell found Jones 12 times in his Purdue debut, and the duo connected for 153 yards through the air, both career highs.
- A week later, the pair connected nine times for 133 yards and three scores against Indiana State.
- Jones notched his third straight 100-yard receiving game with a career-high 188 yards and a score from 11 receptions at Syracuse.
- · It's safe to say Jones enjoys the Purdue offense. After making 21 catches for 323 yards and three touchdowns during the entire 2021 season, he has already smashed last year's totals with the Hawkeyes.

ADDED TO BILETNIKOFF

- As one of the nation's leaders in multiple receiving categories,
 Purdue Football wide receiver Charlie Jones was added to the
 Biletnikoff Award Watch List.
- The Boilermakers have a history with the Biletnikoff Award. Taylor Stubblefield won the honor in 2004, while David Bell was a finalist just one season ago. The duo became consensus All-Americans, and Jones is on pace to put up better numbers than both. Jones joined Stubblefield as the only receivers from the Big Ten to record seven touchdown catches in the first four games of a season.

- Brohm has led a trio of Boilermakers to All-America honors in Rondale Moore (2018 First Team), David Bell (2021) and George Karlaftis (2021).
- Of the 10 Purdue coaches who have spent at least five seasons in West Lafayette, Brohm has the best winning percentage (.692) and the most total wins (9) by a coach during his fifth year.
- Purdue has averaged over 300 yards passing per game each of the last four years under Brohm, a first in program history.
- During the Brohm era, eight Boilermakers have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including three in the 2022 NFL Draft (George Karlaftis - 1st Round, Kansas City Chiefs; David Bell -3rd Round, Cleveland Browns; Zander Horvath - 7th Round, Los Angeles Chargers).
- A standout at Louisville, Brohm still ranks among the Cardinals' career leaders in touchdown passes (tied for seventh, 38), total offense (eighth, 5,410), completion percentage (ninth, .562), passing yards (ninth, 5,451), passing efficiency (ninth, 129.97), passing attempts (10th, 715) and completions (10th, 402).
- After getting drafted in the fourth round of the 1990 MLB Draft. Brohm played two summers of Minor League Baseball.

BROHM AND THE BOILERMAKERS: YEAR 6

- · Jeff Brohm is in his sixth year at the helm in West Lafayette.
- Brohm boasts a career record of 62-41, a .602 winning percentage, with more than half of those wins coming at Purdue.
- memorable 2021 campaign.
- The Boilermakers have made three bowl appearances in five years under Brohm, joining Joe Tiller and Jim Young as the only Purdue coaches to accomplish that feat.
- · Over Brohm's six seasons at the helm, the Purdue offense has averaged 309 yards per game and 27.6 points per game.
- · Purdue has had three All-Americans since Brohm's arrival; the Boilermakers only had three All-Americans from 2004-17.
- · Boilermakers have won five individual Big Ten honors under Brohm's guidance: Big Ten Freshman of the Year (Rondale Moore
- 2018, David Bell 2019), Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year (Moore - 2018, Bell - 2021), Big Ten Tight End of the Year (Brycen Hopkins - 2019).

LAST TIME WE MET NEBRASKA

- Behind four interceptions from the defense, Purdue went on the road and defeated Nebraska 28-23 (Oct. 30, 2021) in the previous matchup between the two Big Ten West foes.
- Jalen Graham led the way with a pair of INTs, including a pick six that helped him earn Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week
- Cam Allen and Chris Jefferson hauled in picks as well.
- · Aidan O'Connell completed 34-of-45 passes for 233 yards and two touchdowns, while King Doerue added 74 yards on the ground to lead the Boilermakers offensively.
- · The victory was Purdue's third in the past four meetings with Nebraska.

THREE IN-A-ROW

- · Purdue returns home riding a three-game winning streak for the first time the 2018 season.
- · The Boilermakers won four straight games in 2018, which included the memorable 49-20 victory over No. 2 Ohio State.
- · Purdue has won three games in-a-row only three times over the past 15 seasons, two of them being under Jeff Brohm. In the previous nine seasons prior to Brohm's arrival, the only Boilermakers' three-game winning streak occurred during the end of the 2012 season to earn bowl eligibility.

RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS

- · While Purdue is primarily known for its passing game, the Boilermakers have rushed for 11 touchdowns compared to 13 through the air.
- Just six games into the season, the 11 rushing TDs match the total from the previous two seasons combined (7 in 2021, 4 in 2020).
- · The total is already the most in a season since Purdue rushed for 20 touchdowns in 2018.
- · The Boilermakers have six rushing touchdowns over their three conference games, ranking second in the Big Ten behind Ohio State (8).

WELCOME BACK 6

- The Boilermaker defense welcomed back one of their leaders, Jalen Graham, in the 31-29 win over Maryland.
- Graham, who missed the previous four games due to injury, returned to record a team-high nine tackles to go along with one tackle-for-loss and one pass breakup.
- · Despite playing in just two games this season, the senior ranks eighth on the team in total tackles (15); his 7.5 tackles per game pace Purdue.

HONORARY CAPTAIN ROB NINKOVICH

- A member of the Den of Defensive Ends, Rob Ninkovich will serve as Purdue's honorary game captain for Saturday's game against Nebraska.
- A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior . Ninkovich spent two years in West Lafayette (2004-05), to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season - a recording eight sacks in each season to tally 16 for his career and cracking the Top 10 on the Purdue all-time list.
 - · His biggest games came in battles for the Old Oaken Bucket, making four sacks in each victory over the Hoosiers.
 - In the 2005 contest, his final game as a Boilermaker, Ninkovich tallied a Purdue single-game record 7.0 tackles-for-loss to help the team keep the Bucket in a 41-14 victory in Bloomington.
 - Ninkovich went on to have an 11-year career in the NFL, which included winning a pair of Super Bowls with the New England Patriots.

CHUCK'S SIZZLIN'

- Wide receiver Charlie Jones has gotten his Purdue career off to a strong start, ranking third nationally in receptions per game (8.3) and fourth in receiving touchdowns (7), while ranking 10th in receiving yards (603).
- It's safe to say Jones enjoys the Purdue offense. After making 21 catches for 323 yards and three touchdowns during the entire 2021 season, it only took him three games to surpass last year's totals with the Hawkeyes.
- Jones' 47 receptions were most by a Big Ten player through the first five games since 2000, ahead of fellow Boilermaker David Bell (43 - 2020) and Minnesota's Eric Decker (43 - 2009).

AIDAN ADDING TO HIS LEGACY

- Beginning his career as a walk-on and eighth on the quarterback depth chart, Aidan O'Connell worked his way up to the starting role and didn't stop there. The sixth-year QB has etched his name in the school record books, and he continued to rise up the career charts early this season.
- O'Connell already ranks in the program's Top 10 in several career categories: completion percentage (1st - 68.0%), 500-yard games (T1st - 2), 400-yard games (2nd - 5), 300-yard games (4th 11), touchdown passes (6th - 53), passing completions (7th -649) and passing yards (8th - 7,288).
- Aidan O'Connell paces the Big Ten in passing yards and total offense. His 311.8 passing yards per game rank ninth nationally, while he stands 17th in total offense with 306.8 yards per game.
- O'Connell has kept up his game against conference opponents as the only Big Ten guarterback to average more than 300 yards passing in league play (308.0 ypg). His 297.33 yards of total offense in B1G action also lead the conference.
- · Since 2000, O'Connell became one of just three Big Ten quarterbacks to throw for 1,000 yards over the first three games of a season (Christian Hackenberg - 1,008 yards, 2014; Richard Lagow - 1,002 vards, 2016).
- · He torched the Syracuse defense with a season-high 424 passing yards and three touchdowns.
- O'Connell now has five 400-yard passing games; only Drew Brees has more (7).

SO CLOSE

- While Purdue is 4-2 on the season, the Boilermakers are 64 seconds away from being 6-0.
- Both losses came to teams that are currently ranked and unbeaten.
- No. 10 Penn State scored a go-ahead touchdown with 57 seconds to go to leave West Lafayette with a season-opening victory (Sept. 1)
- In the first road game of the season, the Boilermakers suffered a heartbreaking loss to now-No. 21 Syracuse after the Orange found the end zone with just seven seconds left in the ballgame.
- Four of Purdue's six games have been decided by four pointsor-less.

SPOIL FRMAKERS

- Purdue has become known as the Spoilermakers under Jeff Brohm, collecting six wins over ranked teams during the head coach's tenure following the 20-10 win at No. 21 Minnesota.
- Five of the six wins have been by double digits, the biggest being a 29-point victory over No. 2 Ohio State in 2018.
- Three of those victories were against Top 3 teams, while Purdue handed five of those ranked teams their first loss of the
- · Last season, Purdue knocked off previously unbeaten No. 2 Iowa (Oct. 16) and No. 3 Michigan State (Nov. 6), giving the Boilermakers two wins over Top 5 teams for the first time since 1960.
- The Boilermakers beat three ranked teams during the 2018 campaign, Brohm's second season, for the most victories over ranked teams in a single-season since 2003.
- Prior to Brohm's arrival in West Lafayette in 2017, Purdue only won two out of 27 games against AP-ranked teams over the previous 10 seasons.

WALK-ONS RUNNING

- · With starting running back King Doerue missing the last four backfield.
- Dylan Downing and Devin Mockobee have rushed for 524 yards this season, including 377 yards over the past four weeks with Doerue out of the lineup.
- Downing ran for a career-high 113 yards in the win over FAU, the first 100-yard game of his career.
- One week later, Mockobee led the way with 112 yards on the ground that included a pair of rushes for 70 yards that resulted in a touchdown and clinched Purdue's victory over No. 21 Minnesota.

· Downing and Mockobee's performances gave the Boilermakers different 100-yard rushers in consecutive games for the first time since 2017 when Markell Jones recorded 217 yards in a win over Indiana and D.J. Knox added 101 yards in a Foster Farms Bowl victory (vs. Arizona).

FAST STARTS

- · Whether it's the beginning of the game or coming out of the locker room, Purdue has gotten off to fast starts.
- The Boilermakers are outscoring the opposition 50-10 in the opening quarter.
- Purdue has scored a touchdown on three of its six opening
- On the other side of the ball, Purdue's defense has forced a fumble and four three-and-outs by the opposition to kick off games; only Maryland found success on the opening drive, scoring a touchdown.

RED ZONE, END ZONE

- · The Boilermakers have been successful in the red zone this season, scoring 24 out of 25 times for a 96 percent rate and ranking No. 8 in the country.
- Even better, 21 of those 24 red zone scores have been touchdowns (88%).
- The Boilermakers are 12-for-12 (9 touchdowns, 3 field goals) in the red zone against B1G foes, one of three teams to be perfect in conference play.
- · Purdue was a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone against Maryland, punching in four touchdowns and adding one field goal.

BIG WINS AWAY FROM HOME

- Playing on the road in Big Ten play hasn't fazed Purdue lately. The Boilermakers have won six of their past seven conference games away from home, including the past two weeks against Minnesota (Oct. 1) and Maryland (Oct. 8).
- Two of those victories were over ranked teams. Purdue beat No. 2 Iowa 24-7 last season (Oct. 16, 2021), while knocking off No. 21 Minnesota this October.
- · Last season, Purdue went 3-1 in B1G games away from home, which included a neutral site win over Northwestern at Wrigley Field. The Boilermakers ended the 2021 campaign with five victories away from Ross-Ade Stadium, their most since 1943.

DON'T MOCK HIM

- · Don't underestimate redshirt-freshman Devin Mockobee. The walk-on running back leads the Purdue rushing attack with 275 yards and three touchdowns, averaging 5.5 yards per carry.
- In his Purdue debut, Mockobee rushed for a team-high 78 yards and a touchdown against Indiana State.
- Two weeks later versus FAU, he caught four passes out of the backfield to match Charlie Jones in the team high receiving yards (59) for the contest.
- Mockobee had his biggest game as a Boilermaker at No. 21 Minnesota, recording a career-high 112 yards rushing on only 11 carries to average 10.2 yards per rush. Late in the fourth quarter with Purdue ahead by three points, Mockobee broke free for a 68-yard run and motored into the end zone from two yards out on the following play to put the game on ice.
- Mockobee became the first Purdue freshman to rush for 100 | yards since Brian Lankford-Johnson in 2016 (127 yards at Illinois | F Oct. 8, 2016).
- The 68-yard rush at Minnesota was the longest run by a games due to injury, a pair of walk-ons have taken over the Boilermaker since Rondale Moore scampered 76 yards against Northwestern (Aug. 30, 2018).

- · The Purdue defense has recorded eight interceptions through the first six games, ranking third in the Big Ten and 13th nationally.
- · Two of the interceptions have been returned for touchdowns, one by Chris Jefferson against Penn State and the other by Cam quarter. Allen versus Indiana State.
- Allen leads the way with three interceptions, while Jefferson is close behind with two
- · With 15 interceptions for his career (13 at Findlay, 2 at Purdue), Jefferson ranks second on the NCAA active career list across all divisions
- Allen has 10 as a Boilermaker, ranking 10th in program history.
- As a whole, the Purdue secondary has 43 career interceptions.

STRENGTH ON THE LINE

- · Purdue veteran offensive line has been a major factor for success on that side of the ball.
- · The Boilermakers allow only 3.83 tackles-for-loss per game, ranking 15th in the nation.
- The trio of Gus Hartwig, Spencer Holstege, and Eric Miller have the way with 24 straight starts, followed by Hartwig (22) and longest pick six by a Boilermaker since 2017. Miller (21).

YOU'LL GET NOTHING AND LIKE IT

- Purdue has produced one of the best red zone defenses in the country. With opponents scoring only 71 percent of the time in the area, the Boilermakers rank third in the Big Ten and 14th in FAU, returning it 55 yards into opposing territory. the country.
- · The defense also is efficient in getting off the field with a third down defense that ranks 23rd nationwide. Opponents are ATTACK FROM THE AIR converting 30 percent of the time on third down.
- surrendering less than 100 yards per game (96.7) to rank 17th touchdowns. nationally and only allowing 2.9 yards per rush.
- · Purdue's rush defense has been even better in conference games, limiting the opposition to 71.3 yards on the ground per program played just six games in 2020. contest (2.6 yards per carry).
- The Boilermakers are one of 19 teams to allow three or fewer rushing touchdowns this season, and only one of those touchdowns has been by a running back.
- In the win over No. 21 Minnesota, Purdue held the Golden Gophers to 44 rushing yards on 26 carries; Minnesota entered the contest with the nation's No. 2 rushing attack with 294.5 yards per game.

PAYNE TRAIN

- Tight end Payne Durham once again came through in the clutch, catching the go-ahead touchdown pass before rumbling 56 yards to set up another late Purdue touchdown to help the team beat Maryland.
- Against the Terps, Durham made seven catches for 109 yards, both team highs, to record the third 100-yard game of his career.
- Durham moved into a tie for 11th in program history with 16 receiving touchdowns.
- Durham is now third on the career list for touchdown receptions by a tight end, trailing Dave Young (27, 1977-80) and Jim Beirne (17, 1965-67).
- · He enters the week five receiving yards shy of 1,000 for his career, which would make him the eighth 1,000-yard receiving tight end in Purdue history.
- The senior tight end sits second on the team this year with 28 receptions for 280 yards and three touchdowns.
- · Durham's progression in college from backup to all-conference caliber is made more impressive when you consider he played one year of high school football after playing lacrosse all his life.

SMILE FOR THE CAM

- Senior safety Cam Allen factored in two of Indiana State's three turnovers, recovering a fumble on the first play of the game before returning an interception for a touchdown in the third
- After recording a pair of interceptions to help Purdue earn a 20-10 victory at No. 21 Minnesota, senior safety Cam Allen was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week.
- Allen earned the accolade for the second time in his career. His other weekly award came following a two-interception game against a ranked opponent as well, Purdue's win over No. 2 lowa (Oct. 16, 2021).
- · Against Indiana State, Allen became the first Boilermaker to record an interception and fumble recovery since Anthony Brown accomplished the feat, also against Indiana State (Sept. 12, 2015).

The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last half century as a defining feature of Purdue football. Boilermakers have set numerous NCAA and Big Ten Conference records, many have been chosen as All-Americans and national awards winners or finalists.

In the early 1970s, Purdue Athletics commissioned a university artist named Keith Butz to create a poster featuring outstanding Boilermaker quarterbacks of the previous 30 years. That poster featured Bob DeMoss, Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bernie Allen, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson.

- · The Boilermakers bid farewell to one of the iconic greats and a pioneer of the Cradle of Quarterbacks in Len Dawson, who
- · A three-year starter at Purdue, Dawson was named All-Big Ten and led the conference in passing and total offense all three seasons. He set then-records at Purdue with 3,325 yards and 29 passing touchdowns.
- Over a 19-year career for Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Houston/Kansas City, Dawson threw for 28,711 yards and 239 touchdowns and netted numerous honors, including a win in Super Bowl IV, Super Bowl IV MVP honors, his No. 16 retired by the Kansas City Chiefs and induction to the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

- Completing 70.8 percent of passes, Purdue led the Big Ten and ranked second in the country.
- The Boilermakers limited making penalties, committing a conference-low 4.5 per game that was the 10th-fewest nationally.
- Purdue's passing offense ranked fifth in the country and second in the Big Ten with 355.4 yards per game.
- Opponents were only been able to convert 8 of 22 fourth down attempts for a .364 conversion rate, putting the Boilermakers 11th nationally in defending fourth downs.
- Purdue's red zone defense also ranked 23rd in the country.

All-AMERICANS TO THE NFL

- Purdue had to replace a pair of All-Americans in WR David Bell and DE George Karlaftis as the two were taken in the 2022 NFL Draft (Karlaftis - 1st Rd, 30th, Kansas City, Bell - 3rd, 99th, Cleveland).
- A finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, Bell was named First Team All-America from four (AFCA, AP, FWAA, Walter Camp Football Foundation) of the five outlets recognized by the NCAA to just miss out on being a unanimous selection; however, the Purdue wide receiver became the 21st consensus All-American in Purdue history.
- Bell earned the Richter-Howard Receiver of the Year as the best receiver in the Big Ten, leading the conference in catches per game (8.5) and receiving yards per game (116.9); both marks ranked Top 5 in the country.
- Karlaftis became the first defensive Boilermaker to earn All-America honors since Ryan Kerrigan (2010).
- Karlaftis led the Boilermakers in tackles for loss (11.5), sacks (5.0), forced fumbles (3), fumble recoveries (2) and quarterback hurries (8), earning First Team All-Big Ten honors along the way.
- Along with the two All-Americans, Zander Horvath (7th Rd, 260th, Los Angeles Chargers) gave Purdue three Boilermakers taken in the 2022 NFL Draft; it marked the most Boilermakers selected in a single draft since 2008.

2021: A HISTORIC SEASON

- Purdue finished the 2021 season with nine wins for the first time since 2003, when the Boilermakers also were 9-4.
- The nine wins were second-most in program history, as the Boilermakers record at least nine wins for the 12th time in the team's 134-year history.
- Two of those victories were over previously unbeaten No. 2 Iowa (Oct. 16) and No. 3 Michigan State (Nov. 6), giving the Boilermakers two wins over Top 5 teams for the first time since 1960.
- Purdue finished with a record of 6-3 in Big Ten play, the most conference wins in a season since the 2003 team went 6-2.
- The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, finishing in the division's top three for the third time in five seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm (2017, 2018, 2021).
- Purdue won five games away from home for the first time since 1943, going 5-2 away from Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Purdue entered the College Football Playoff rankings at No. 19 on Nov. 9, the first-ever in the CFP era for the Boilermakers.
- The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee in the TransPerfect Music City Bowl.
- The Boilermakers held four opponents to fewer than 10 points in 2021, the first time it has achieved the feat since 1978, when six opponents were held to single-digit point totals.

DEGREES IN HAND

- Purdue's 2022 roster features 18 college graduates.
- Thirteen of those graduates obtained a Purdue undergraduate degree, while five transfers graduated from their previous school.
- Quarterbacks Aidan O'Connell and Austin Burton have both earned their master's degrees at Purdue.

- The long-running HBO series Hard Knocks has several ties to the Purdue Boilermakers during the 2022 season.
- Quarterback David Blough was featured on the preseason edition while with the Detroit Lions. The show highlighted his preseason campaign, as well as his relationship with his wife Olympic sprinter Melissa Gonzalez. After training camp, Blough joined the Minnesota Vikings as a member of their practice squad.
- Wide receiver Rondale Moore is slated to be a part of the inseason version of Hard Knocks later this year. The 2018 consensus All-American is in his second season with the Arizona Cardinals.

BOWLING WITH BROHM

- The Boilermakers have been to three bowls in five seasons under head coach Jeff Brohm.
- Purdue closed out 2021 with a 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee in the Transperfect Music City Bowl.
- The Boilermakers capped the first season of the Brohm era with a 38-35 win at the Foster Farms Bowl in San Francisco against Arizona.
- Prior to the Foster Farms Bowl, Purdue had not reached a bowl game since 2013 in the Heart of Dallas Bowl and had not won a bowl game since the 2011 Little Caesars Bowl.
- The Boilermakers have gone bowling 20 times with a record of 11-9.



- The approval granted for Ross-Ade's phase one includes plans for renovations including the construction of a new team entrance/tunnel from the Kozuch Football Performance Complex to Rohrman Field, the conversion of the existing team store into a student-athlete nutrition/dining facility and the construction of a stadium addition adjoining seating in the south end zone.





HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM

Jeff Brohm enters his sixth year at the helm of the Purdue Football. A program with a combined nine wins in the four seasons prior to Brohm's arrival, Purdue matched that output in one season - a memorable 2021 campaign - as the Boilermakers continue to be on the rise under Brohm's leadership.

Brohm's three fundamental concepts - playing harder, tougher and smarter than the opposition - have been the benchmarks for his program. His calling cards of creative play-calling and an explosive, high-powered offense has led Purdue to average 419.8 yards per game and 27.6 points per game in his first five seasons.

Playing in Brohm's offense, Boilermakers have been recognized across the league and nationally. They have collected a variety of individual honors, including back-to-back Big Ten Freshman of the Year awards (Rondale Moore - 2018, David Bell - 2019), two seasons as head coach. Big Ten Wide Receiver of the Year awards (Moore - 2018, Bell -2021), the Big Ten Tight End of the Year award (Brycen Hopkins - 2019), and the 2018 Paul Hornung Award winner (Moore) as the nation's most versatile player.

Three Boilermakers have become All-Americans during Brohm's tenure in West Lafavette, Rondale Moore became first true freshman consensus First Team All-American in Big Ten history in 2018 before wide receiver David Bell and defensive end George Karlaftis earned All-American honors following the 2021 season. Bell was a consensus All-American, joining Moore as the Brohm enjoyed an outstanding collegiate career at Louisville second under Brohm and the 21st in Purdue history.

Brohm and his staff continue to make moves on the recruiting trail, signing two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in school history 2019 and 2020. Purdue's 2019 class was ranked 25th nationally - the highest since Joe Tiller inked the No. 20 class in 2004.

The 2021 season featured a 9-4 record, the second-most wins in a single season in Purdue history. The Boilermakers tied for second in the Big Ten West, which included a pair of Top 5 victories over No. 2 Iowa and No. 3 Michigan State. The season was capped off with a thrilling 48-45 overtime victory over Tennessee at the TransPerfect Music City Bowl in Nashville.

Purdue exceeded all expectations in his first season in 2017 and made noise throughout college football. The Boilermakers won seven games, recaptured both of its rivalry trophies (the Cannon and the Old Oaken Bucket), and capped the season with Foster Farms Bowl victory over Arizona. They followed that up in 2018 with another Bowl appearance, and Top 25 victories over Boston College, Iowa, and a historic victory over No. 2 Ohio State.

Brohm was hired Dec. 5, 2016, as the 36th full-time head football coach in Purdue history. Widely regarded as one of the most innovative offensive masterminds in college football, he became the first former quarterback to engineer the Boilermakers since Bob DeMoss in 1970.

Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record from 2014 to 2016. The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016. They

won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl, as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl.

Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons. Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach,

offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Western Kentucky ranked in the top 10 nationally in scoring offense, passing offense and total offense each of Brohm's three

Previously, Brohm served as an assistant coach at Louisville (quarterbacks 2003-06, assistant head coach/passing game 2007, assistant head coach/offensive coordinator 2008), Florida Atlantic (quarterbacks 2009), Illinois (quarterbacks 2010-11), UAB (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks 2012) and Western Kentucky (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks 2013). He began his career as the head coach of the Louisville Fire in the af2 in 2002.

from 1989 to 1993. A three-year starter, he still ranks among the Cardinals' career leaders in touchdown passes, total offense, completion percentage, passing yards, passing efficiency, passing attempts and completions through the 2020 season. Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player during both his junior and senior seasons, and his number 11 became part of the Louisville Ring of Honor in 2006.

Brohm played in the NFL six different franchises. In eight career games - all with the 49ers - he completed 37 of 58 passes (63.8%) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception. His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19 of 30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers. In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first-team All-XFL.

Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky. He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season. Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in

A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke. Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville - father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greg (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07). The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

A late Penn State touchdown with 57 seconds remaining sent the Purdue football team to a 35-31 loss in the 2022 season opener at Ross-Ade Stadium.

The Boilermakers (0-1) held a 31-28 advantage after Chris Jefferson intercepted Penn State (1-0) quarterback Sean Clifford and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown with 8:29 to play. Purdue held Penn State to just seven plays and 14 yards on its next two possessions, taking the ball back on offense with 4:28 on the clock. Penn State's defense forced Purdue to punt with 2:22 remaining.

The Nittany Lions then took eight plays to cover 80 yards in 1:25 with Clifford hitting Keyvone Lee for 10 yards and the game-

Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell finished the night going 30-59 passing for 365 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions. The sixth-year thrower crossed the 300-yard mark for the ninth time in his career, moving him into sole control of fifth in program history. Running back King Doerue found the end zone twice for his second career multi-score game.

Clifford threw for 282 yards on 20-of-37 passing with four touchdowns and an interception.

Both sides had one giveaway that led to points. Purdue's fumble with 30 seconds remaining in the second saw Penn State score with two seconds left in the first half, while Jefferson's interception return for a touchdown swung the momentum in the fourth.

O'Connell connected with former youth football teammate Charlie Jones in his Purdue debut 12 times. Jones posted a career night receiving with 12 receptions for 153 yards and a touchdown.

Purdue's defense forced a fumble on the opening play of the game to set the tone in a 56-0 rout of Indiana State on Saturday at Ross-Ade Stadium. The 56-point margin of victory was the largest for Purdue since a 59-point shutout win over Southeast Missouri in 2011.

The Boilermakers (1-1) tallied 521 yards of total offense with a balanced 232 on the ground and 289 through the air. Purdue's defense held the Sycamores (1-1) to 145 yards of total offense.

The defense posted its second shutout of the Jeff Brohm era. Purdue racked up seven tackles-for-loss, three sacks, two interceptions and a fumble recovery. Sanoussi Kane delivered a punishing hit to Indiana State Tee Hodge on the opening play of the game to pop the ball up in the air into safety Cam Allen's

In the third quarter, Allen picked off an Indiana State pass and took it to pay dirt for a 65-yard touchdown. It marked the first time Purdue has interception returns for a touchdown in backto-back weeks since Ricardo Allen achieved the feat in 2010.

Offensively, Purdue scored a touchdown on seven of its first nine drives. The only two drives the Boilermakers failed to score on started inside their own two-yard line.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell was efficient in his one half of action with four touchdowns and 211 yards on 17-of-19 passing. Charlie Jones added to his early haul as a Boilermaker with his second straight 100-yard receiving game. The Deerfield, III., native snagged nine passes for 133 yards and three touchdowns.

Redshirt freshman Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 78 yards on 13 touches with one score. Dylan Downing added 55 yards from 11 rushes. Purdue topped 200 yards rushing for the first time since Oct. 13, 2018, in a win over Illinois.

A Syracuse touchdown with seven seconds left to play handed Purdue a 32-29 loss in its road opener on Saturday in the JMA Wireless Dome

The Boilermakers (1-2, 0-1 B10) held a 9-3 lead over the Orange (3-0.1-0 ACC) at the end of the first half thanks to a Devin Mockobee 15-yard touchdown run and a Mitchell Fineran 41-yard field goal in what looked to be a defensive dogfight. Purdue's defense held quarterback Garrett Shrader and the Syracuse offense to just 134 total yards and a field goal in the first half of play.

The script would flip in the second half however, as both offenses exploded for a combined 49 points, 42 of which came in the fourth quarter. Purdue quarterback Aidan O'Connell posted season highs in completions and yards as he finished 39-of-55 for 424 yards, three touchdowns and one interception.

A back and forth second half saw the lead change hands on five different occasions. The teams traded touchdowns until O'Connell's first career pick-six gave the Orange a 25-15 lead with 8:08 left in the game. The Boilermakers would battle right back, as O'Connell found Charlie Jones for a 55-yard bomb to cut the deficit to three before tight end Payne Durham caught his second touchdown of the day to give Purdue a 29-25 lead with just 51 seconds remaining.

Penalties against Purdue aided Syracuse on their final possession as they took five plays to go fifty yards capped off by Shrader finding wide receiver Oronde Gadsden II for a 25yard touchdown to win the game for the Orange.

O'Connell's connection with Charlie Jones continues to drive the Boilermaker offense. Jones racked up a career-high 188 yards and added a touchdown to become just the fifth power five player to have 100 yards receiving and a touchdown in his team's first three games. Two 50-plus yard strikes from O'Connell to Jones sparked Purdue's fourth guarter comeback bid that ultimately fell short.

Behind a balanced offensive attack, the Purdue football team capped the 100th Homecoming celebration with a 28-26 win over FAU on Saturday night at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers used a trio of defensive stops in the fourth quarter along with a four-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Austin Burton to TJ Sheffield to hold on for the two-point win.

Twice in the fourth quarter, Purdue's defense stepped in front of passes from FAU (2-3) quarterback Nkosi Perry to keep the Boilermakers (2-2) in the lead. Midway through the period, Chris Jefferson intercepted a pass at the Purdue 10-yard line and returned to the FAU 35-yard line. Jefferson's second pick of the season led to a four-yard touchdown catch by TJ Sheffield to extend the lead to 28-20.

Following FAU's touchdown with 5:21 to play that cut the Boilermaker lead to two, Cam Allen dove in front of a doublepass on the Owl's ensuing two-point conversion in the endzone to keep Purdue ahead.

The defense stopped FAU's final drive cold on fourth down with 46 seconds remaining. As Perry reached over a pile on fourthand-one, linebacker Jacob Wahlberg punched the ball free, and Sanoussi Kane pounced on the loose ball to seal the win.

Purdue quarterback Austin Burton, starting in place of the injured Aidan O'Connell, threw for a career-high three touchdowns on 21-for-29 passing and 166 yards. The sixth-year passer worked around an interception in the third quarter to lead Purdue to a scoring drive in each quarter.

The Boilermakers finished with more rushing yards than passing for the first time since 2018 against Eastern Michigan, ending with 188 yards on the ground and 166 through the air. Running back Dylan Downing crossed the century mark for the first time in his career to end the night with 133 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown.

Downing was the first Boilermaker to rush for over 100 yards since Zander Horvath ran for 101 yards against Rutgers in 2020.

Purdue's defense intercepted three passes, while the offense rushed for 160 yards and two scores to pull off a 20-10 win over No. 21 Minnesota on Saturday afternoon at Huntington Bank Stadium. The Boilermakers moved to 3-2 on the year and 1-1 in Big Ten play with their first win in Minneapolis since 2007.

Purdue's defense stymied Minnesota (4-1, 1-1) all afternoon long with a trio of interceptions, seven tackles-for-loss, two sacks and six pass breakups. Safety Cam Allen delivered a pair of momentum swings with an end zone interception in the second quarter, before the game-sealing pick late in the final

Facing an offense that averaged 294.5 yards rushing over its first four games, the Boilermakers were stout defensively, limiting the Golden Gophers to just 47 yards rushing. It was the first time Purdue held a team to 50 or fewer rushing vards since 2017 when Nebraska recorded 40 yards on the ground.

Linebacker Semisi Fakasiieiki led the way defensively with eight stops, including a pair behind the line. Seven different Boilermakers contributed to a tackle-for-loss. Purdue's defense allowed just three points off three giveaways on Saturday.

The Boilermakers jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter. Running back Dylan Downing pounded his way into the end zone for a two-yard touchdown to start the scoring. Mitchell Fineran later added a season-long 43-yard field goal. The defense meanwhile stood tall on Minnesota's opening four drives, forcing a three-and-out, interception by Jacob Wahlberg,

Purdue's offense found its rhythm in the fourth. Fineran put the Boilermakers back in front with a 25-yard field goal with 4:57 to play. The Boilermakers made it a 10-point gap when redshirt Devin Mockobee found the end zone with 3:13 left on a twoyard rush, following a career-long 68-yard carry.

Back-to-back fourth quarter touchdown drives for Purdue sandwiched in between two straight stops on point after attempts gave Purdue a 31-29 victory over Maryland on Saturday at SECU Stadium.

The defense for Purdue came up big for the second straight week against a potent offense. The Boilermakers produced three sacks to go with six tackles for loss and four break ups.

Head coach Jeff Brohm's squad produced two crucial stops with their backs against the wall. Safety Cam Allen blocked an extra point in the fourth that kept it at a six-point game. Then the Terrapins were turned away by a stout defensive effort on their two-point attempt to tie it up with 0:35 seconds left.

Senior linebacker Jalen Graham returned to the field for his first action since the opener against Penn State and led the team with nine tackles (one for loss). Defensive end Khordae Sydnor had a big day of his own, recording a career high two sacks.

Redshirt senior cornerback Cory Trice nabbed his first interception of the year to give Purdue a pick in five of six games this season. Trice's takeaway led to the first touchdown of the day for the Boilermakers.

Quarterback Aidan O'Connell led the way for the offense, going 30-of-41 for 360 yards and two touchdowns. He found ten different receivers on the day to drive Purdue another crucial conference victory at the midway point of the season.

His primary target on the day was tight end Payne Durham. The big man went for 109 yards on seven catches and a touchdown and his huge fourth quarter helped seal the win for the Boilermakers. An endzone snag with 3:19 left tied the game and then a season-long 56 yard catch and rumble down to the two yard-line led to a Devin Mockobee touchdown that sealed the game.
