BOILER NOTES

TEAM

- Captains: Devin Mockobee, Gus Hartwig, Kydran Jenkins, Dillon Thieneman.
- Michigan State won the toss and deferred. Purdue elected to receive in the south end zone.

OFFENSE

- Hudson Card threw for a career-high 342 yards on 26-of-47 passing. It was the most passing yards under head coach Ryan Walters.
- His passing attempts were a career high and his completions were a season high.
- Card's performance was the first of 300-plus since he threw for 323 on Sept. 16, 2023 against Syracuse (21 games).
- Devin Mockobee moved up to ninth in program history with 2,445 rushing yards, 10th with 491 rushing attempts and is tied for 10th with 19 rushing touchdowns.
- Mockobee climbed to 16th in all-purpose yards with 3,107 behind a season-high 47 receiving yards.
- Max Klare recorded seven catches for 83 yards and a touchdown. He led Purdue in receptions for the 10th time this season.
- With 649 receiving yards, Klare moved up to seventh in single-season program history by a tight end. He improved by three spots on Friday night passing Tim Stratton (1999, 2000) and Brycen Hopkins (2018).
- Klare is one of two Boilermaker tight ends in the last 25 years to record at least five catches and 70 yards in the same game five times, joining Brycen Hopkins (2019).
- He is one of five Purdue tight ends with 80-plus receiving yards in at least three games since 2000. The mark was achieved seven times by the five different tight ends.
- Jahmal Edrine had a game-high 87 receiving yards and tied a season high with five receptions.
- Edrine led Purdue in receiving for the second time this season.
- Jaron Tibbs had a 38-yard reception in the fourth quarter - the eighth-longest play of the season for Purdue.
- Tibbs finished with a career-high 73 receiving yards.
- Purdue scored a touchdown on its first possession of the second half for the third time this season. The 10-play, 73-yard drive was Purdue's fifth touchdown drive of at least 10 plays.
- The Boilermakers converted two fourth downs after entering the night with two through the first 10 games of the season.
- Purdue started a different offensive lineup for the first time in four games. Freshman Shamar Rigby drew into the starting lineup at wide receiver for the fifth time this season.

DEFENSE

- Kydran Jenkins jumped two spots in the career tackles-for-loss rankings to No. 10 with 43.5. He recorded the 11th multiple tackles-for-loss game of his career.
- Dillon Thieneman had 11 tackles for the seventh double-digit effort of his career and third of the season.
- Thieneman has led Purdue in tackles for the seventh time this season and fourth consecutive game.
- Hudson Miller set a season-high in tackles for the second consecutive week with 10 on Friday night.
- Miller is the fourth Boilermaker with double-digit tackles in a game this season.
- Miller and Antonio Stevens combined for a sack in the third quarter to mark the first one in each of their respective careers. Miller added another half tackle for loss later in the game.
- Trey Smith recorded the first tackle-for-loss of his career.
- Purdue allowed 293 total yards of offense against, its fewest against an FBS opponent this season.
- 159 passing yards against is the fifth-fewest under coach Walters.
- Purdue shut out an opponent in a half for the fourth time this season after shutting out Nebraska in the first half on Sept. 28 and shutting out Indiana State in both halves on Aug. 31.
- The Boilermakers held Michigan State to 0-for-7 on third down in the second half.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Ben Freehill converted a season-long 40-yard field goal in the first quarter. It is the second-longest field goal by a Purdue kicker this season.
- Keelan Crimmins had three punts for a 44-yard average with a long of 56 yards.
- Crimmins has averaged at least 44 yards per punt in four consecutive games.
- Andrew Sowinski had two punt returns for 14 yards. It was his second game this season with 14 total punt return yards.
